# How the City is funding arts and culture grants in FY 25

**\$1,821,538**

## **General Fund**

**\$811,538** for General Operating Support, including grants for established organizations

**\$1,010,000** for Small Grants Program, including grants for individual artists

**\$3,637,000**

## **Arts Access Fund**

**\$3,287,000** for General Operating Support

**\$350,000** for access as described in Portland City Code 6.10.

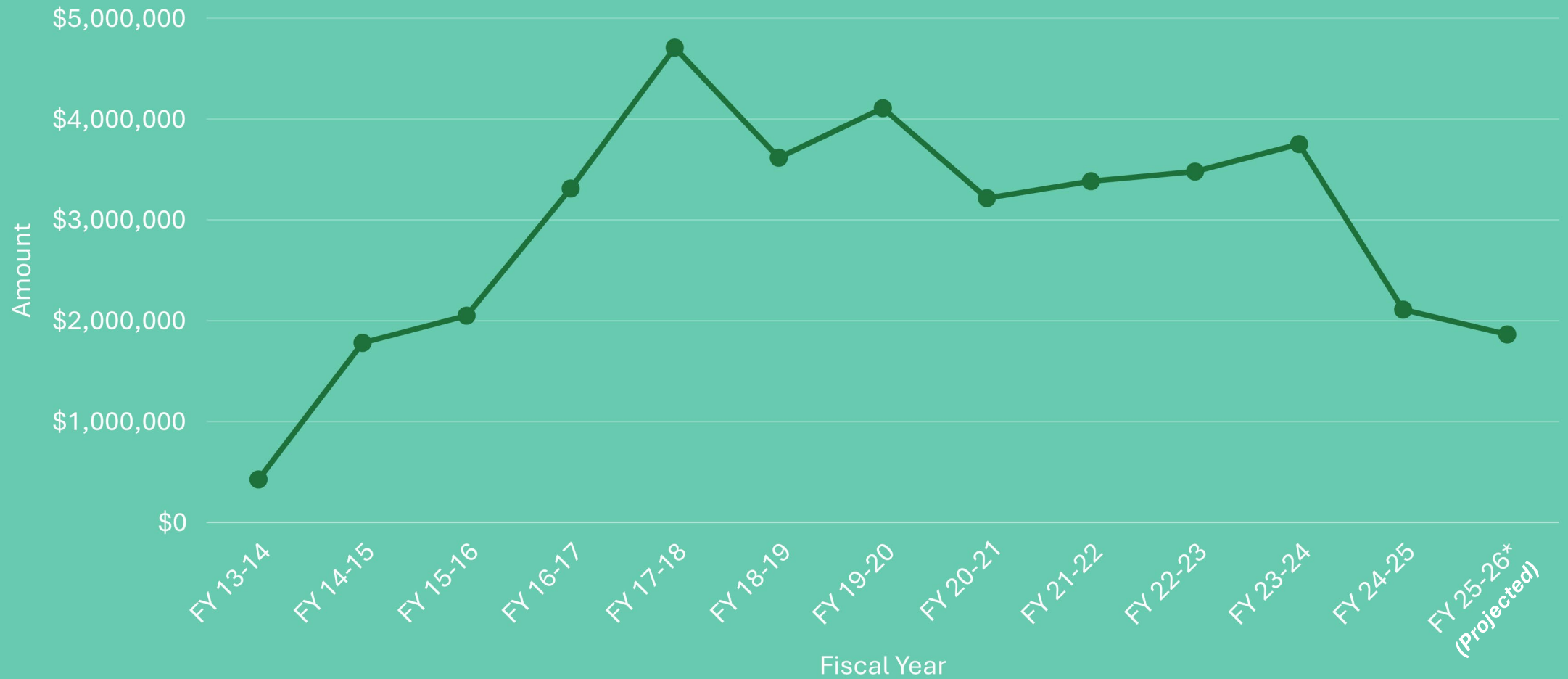

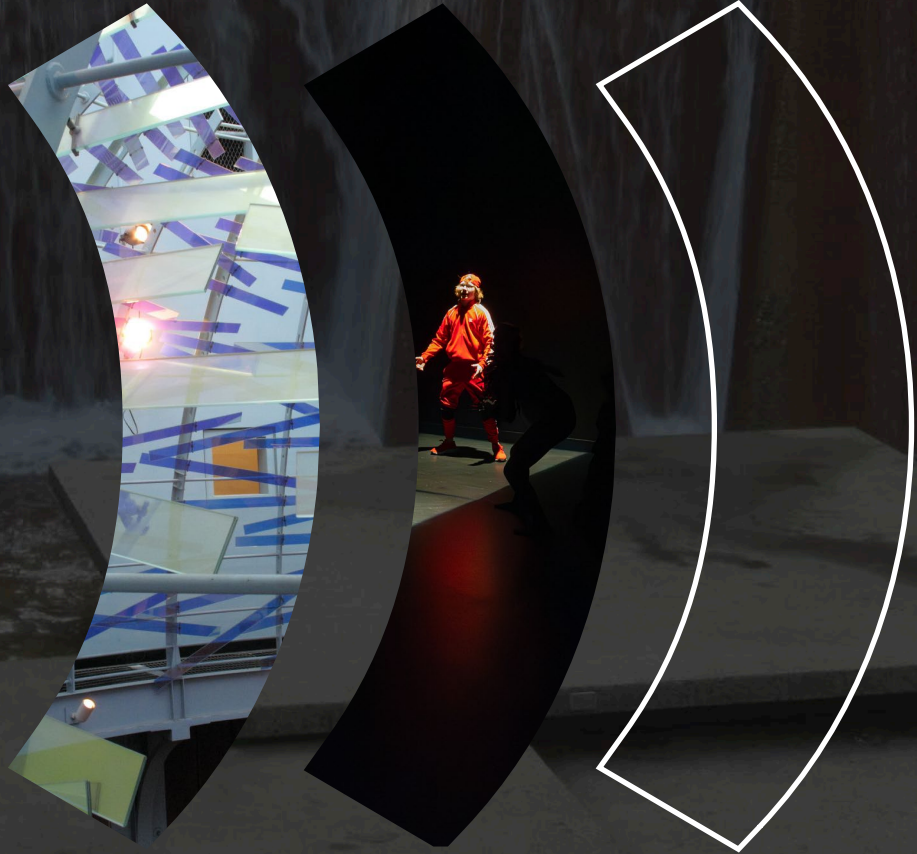

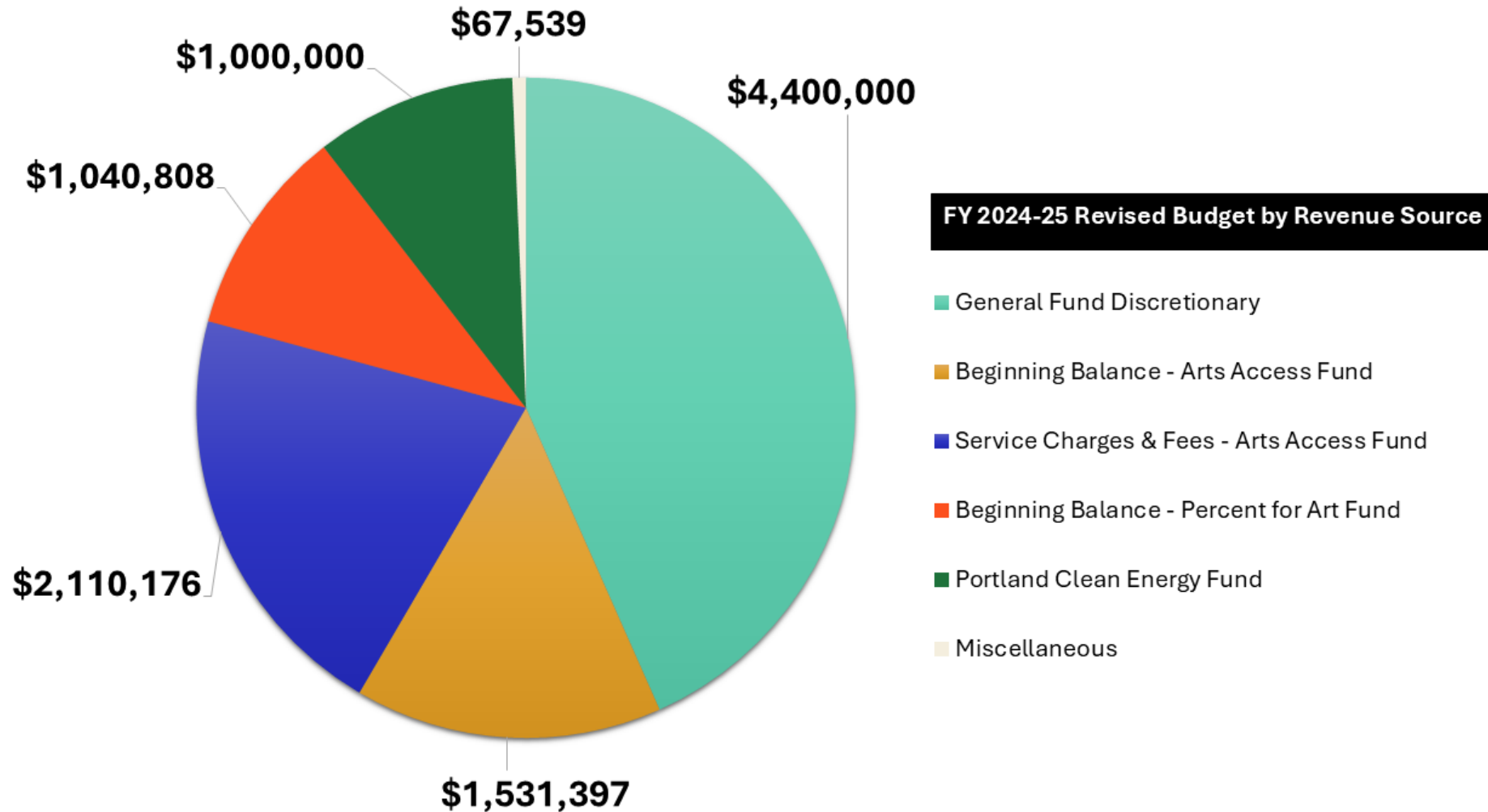
