SUBJECT: Parking garage headroom clearance

QUESTION: Are any projections allowed into the 7' - 0" headroom clearance

required in the pedestrian and vehicular circulation areas in a

parking garage?

RESPONSE: Wall mounted shelves, storage surfaces, cabinets, piping or

ductwork located at the head of a parking space may encroach

into the required 7' - 0" vertical headroom clearance required in a parking garage


under the following conditions:

1. The shelving, storage surface, cabinet, piping or ductwork does not project more than 24" into a parking space.

- 2. The shelving, storage surface, cabinet, piping or ductwork has a minimum of 48" vertical clearance above the floor.
- 3. In buildings of Type I or Type II construction the shelving, storage surface, cabinet, piping, or ductwork shall be of noncombustible material or shall be protected by automatic sprinklers as required by the Fire Marshal's Office.
- 4. No obstruction by shelving, storage surface, cabinet, piping, or ductwork shall be permitted in spaces and aisles designated for van-accessible parking.
- 5. No obstruction by shelving, storage surface, cabinet, piping, or ductwork shall be permitted into pedestrian circulation areas or into vehicular drive lanes or maneuvering areas.
- All piping or ductwork projecting into vehicle parking spaces shall be protected against damage by vehicle contact in a manner approved by the Bureau of Development Services.
