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## About PCEF

- Invests in efforts to address the climate crisis in ways that advance racial and social justice.
- Ballot measure passed by more than 65% of Portlanders in November 2018.
- First climate fund measure created and led by communities of color in the US.
- Generates over \$100M annually in Portland
- 1% gross revenue surcharge on Portland sales by corporations with \$1B+ sales nationally and \$500k+ in Portland. Exemptions for items like groceries, utilities, medicine.



## What is the Climate Investment Plan?

- A 5-year plan that sets funding priorities and levels:
  - What we are funding:
    - outcomes and goals for community responsive grants *and* strategic programs
  - How much:
    - allocations for community responsive grants *and* strategic programs
  - Who is eligible for funding:
    - eligibility criteria for strategic programs only

Community Responsive Grant Solicitations





## Funding levels determined in the CIP



- The CIP directs how much funding is distributed through community responsive grants and/or strategic programs
- Listening and understanding priorities → funding levels come towards April/May as the full plan comes together for public comment.
