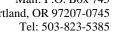

Expenditure Discussion

Personnel services were underspent due to vacancies including a Director position and other program staff. Materials and services were underspent due to less than anticipated service contracts, largely in IA funded programs, as well as internal service billings that were less than anticipated.

Revenue Discussion

Intergovernmental revenues fund MHCRC administration and compliance activities, and were underspent in FY 2018-19 due to less than anticipated contract activity and vacancy savings.

Date of Budget Note: July 1, 2018 in the FY 2018-19 Adopted Budget

Budget Note Title: Office for Community Technology

Budget, an external consultant was engaged to evaluate options and make recommendations to Council on the optimal location and structure for the Office for Community Technology (OCT) within the City's organizational framework. Based on these recommendations and consultation with City staff, Council directs that the Office for Community Technology be established as a stand-alone office beginning in September 2018. Council directs the Revenue Division and OCT staff to bring forward budgetary and position changes in the FY 2018-19 Fall Budget Monitoring Process for Council consideration. Council further directs OMF-Facilities to develop options and plan for the physical relocation of OCT staff, with the relevant budgetary actions also brought forward during the FY 2018-19 Fall Budget Monitoring Process.

Summary Status: Underway

Budget Note Update: September 9th, 2019

The Office for Community Technology was established as a City Bureau September 1, 2018. Appropriation and Position changes were requested and approved by Council in the FY 2018-19 Fall Budget Monitoring Process, moving 9.0 existing FTE and creating a new Bureau Director position.

Plans are underway for the physical relocation of the Office to a dedicated space in the Columbia Square Building. Due to the Portland Building move, a moratorium was placed on all moves requiring extensive work by BTS. The Office for Community Technology did not receive an exception from OMF, however after some discussion, the technology needs for the move are minimal and do not fall under the moratorium.

The Bureau anticipates a physical move in January-March 2020. We have chosen a tentative location in the Columbia building previously occupied by the Water Bureau on the 6th floor and already has an INET connection. The Water bureau team is anticipated to move December 2020.

The Bureau is working with facilities and an outside consultant on the layout and furniture needs for the new office.

Decision Package Updates, Fall BuMP FY 2019-20

FY 2019-20 Fall BuMP

OCT Relocation \$432,000

This decision package realigns existing resources and requests new one-time general fund resources to support the relocation of the newly re-established OCT. Physical relocation is necessary and critical because the Integrated Tax System project will soon begin in earnest, and the Revenue Division's staffing levels are expanding substantially and will occupy the space currently filled by OCT staff. Additionally, the security clearance required by Revenue Division for employees and guests is an unnecessary and inequitable hurdle for future employees and community outreach expected to be provided by the bureau. Last, the physical move will help legitimize the bureau. Due to vacancies in the bureau (e.g., newly-created director position, OCT manager) and some materials and services underspending, OCT will be able to contribute \$175,000 of general fund and \$50,000 MHCRC revenue to this project. The balance (\$262,000) is requested from General Fund one-time resources.

This request is informed by a cost estimate provided by OMF Facilities. That estimate included a 30% contingency line-item that OCT is not requesting at this time. Should relocation project costs exceed budget and OCT is unable to absorb the overage, the bureau will return to City Council to request additional resources. Additionally, the estimate signals that OCT may incur INET fiber connectivity costs of \$50,000 ongoing. Again, once actual costs are known and should OCT be unable to absorb that additional cost, the bureau will return to Council with a request for ongoing resources.

Status for Fall Performance Report:

FY 2018-19 Spring BuMP

Program Carryover: Utility & Franchise Audit - \$118,730

OCT is requesting that the unspent funding amount for this decision package be carried forward into FY 2019-20 to carry out the original intent of the decision package. Because of competing priorities due to the reorganization and reestablishment of OCT as a stand-alone bureau, dealing with federal proposed and actual preemptions affecting future and ongoing general fund revenue, and coping with high level management vacancies, OCT has not had the opportunity to hire for this position.

Status for Fall Performance Report:

Status In progress

Recruitment is in progress. Job posting closed 9/19/19, and staff are reviewing eligible applicants. Selection phase expected to begin approximately 9/26, with a potential job offer anticipated mid-late September.
