The Portland Housing Bureau (PHB) is pleased to submit its Over Expenditure Ordinance (OEO) report. The following represents the key highlights.

BUDGET ADJUSTMENT REQUESTS

PHB's OEO submission includes the following:

- 1. Joint Office for Homeless Services (JOHS) Advance \$350,000 General Fund One-time (moved from Grants Fund)
- 2. Adjust Cash Transfer to Interfund Loan from Housing Investment Fund to Affordable Housing Development Fund and Grants Fund) \$1,785,675
- 3. Increase in Portland Housing Bond Issuance Fee \$1,145,000
- 4. Housing Project Re-budgets \$86,727; various funding sources

 This request adjusts budgets for affordable housing projects (multi-family and single family) across fiscal years to better reflect when funds will be spent, taking advantage of better construction schedule information.
- 5. Housing Program resource adjustments \$190,000;
 This request adjusts budgets for non-General Fund programs, including adjustments to various PHB owned building budgets and homeownership programs.
- 6. Technical Adjustments (\$0 various funding sources)

 This request includes several adjustments moving funds for better tracking of costs. These adjustments represent no net change to the budget.
