Subject:	Spring BMP — Bureau of Planning and Sustainability	

With this memo, I am conveying the FY 2021-22 Spring BMP submittal for the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, the Solid Waste Management Fund, the Community Solar Fund, and the Portland Clean Energy Community Benefits Fund.

As per the Mayor's guidance, BPS' requests are focused on completing one-time projects along with technical adjustments to our current year budget and include requests for carryover to continue council directives related to the Climate Emergency and Historic Resource Preservation.

BPS' add requests for this Spring BMP include:

- \$503,000 through program carryover for the Clean Industry Hub that council funded in FY 21-22 Fall BMP. Delays in contracting have slowed this project.
- \$300,000 carryover request to partially replace requested funding for the Climate Emergency package in FY 22-23 Decision Package 12993. This Decision Package follows the City's adopted climate goals by adding needed capacity to implement the Council Adopted Climate Emergency Declaration in two key areas: decarbonizing the grid and decarbonizing the transportation systems.
- \$276,680 carryover request to partially replace requested funding for the Climate Resiliency package in FY 22-23 Decision Package 12991. This Decision Package will guarantee staffing capacity to continue the Floodplain Resiliency Plan.
- \$90,000 carryover request to fully replace requested funding for the Equitable Historic Preservation package in FY 22-23 Decision Package 13092. This work follows city council's adoption of the Historic Resources Code Project in January 2022.



• \$234,236 Compensation Set Aside and Contingency requests (\$154,777 from General Fund Compensation set-aside, \$79,459 from General Fund Contingency) to cover bureau non-rep merit, DCTU/PPA COLA and 1x current year recently bargained expenses.

We are also making minor technical adjustments amounting to \$153,111 in General Fund to appropriately resource existing programs and requesting a transfer of \$40,000 to the Bureau of Transportation for a historic blocks reclamation project.

Package Description

Due to a delay in processing with procurement, the RFP for the study is not expected to be completed until July. We have hired a coordinator for this work, but the start date is later now because of the procurement delays. We are seeking to carrying over these allocated funds into FY 22-23 so that we can implement the clean industry hub study then.

Request Name: 13509 -Floodplain

Package Description

Due to an unusually high level of staff turnover, and slower recruitment and procurement timelines this year, we have accumulated salary savings that we will be unable to spend before July. We propose to move \$276,680 from the FY 21-22 Planning and Urban Design personnel budget forward to the FY 22-23 budget. This can replace requested funding for one of the three staff positions in FY 22-23 Decision Package 12991, and reduce the requested amount of that DP by the amount of this carryover. This will secure funding for the existing Environmental Planner II position that is part of that decision package, which supports the completion of the one-time Floodplain Resilience Plan and the identified follow-up work plan in 2022-24.

Due to an unusually high level of staff turnover, and slower recruitment and procurement timelines this year, we have accumulated materials and services budget savings that we will be unable to spend before July. This request would replace requested funding for the Equitable Historic Preservation package in FY 22-23 Decision Package 13092.

The package will expand BPS' Planning Program capacity to advance equitable historic preservation projects that respond to public testimony submitted to City Council during the adoption of the Historic Resources Code Project. These projects elevate and protect the historic significance of under-represented histories through landmark designations.

Package Description

This request would partially replace requested funding for the Climate Emergency package in FY 22-23 Decision Package 12993. City Council's priorities include economic recovery while adopting a more sustainable and resilient way of life. A durable economic recovery includes rapidly shifting away from a reliance on fossil fuels and reducing carbon emissions for a more resilient community. Additionally, the Mayor's budget guidance includes compliance with the City's adopted climate goals. This Decision Package follows the City's adopted climate goals by adding needed capacity to implement the Council Adopted Climate Emergency Declaration in two key areas: decarbonizing the grid and decarbonizing the transportation systems. Supporting this decision package will help put Portland on a path to meeting the Council-adopted 2030 carbon reduction goals.

Revenue Discussion

BPS requests carryover of approximately \$1.170,000 from the General Fund discretionary resource to continue Floodplain Regulations (\$503,000) funded in 2021-22 and fund Climate Emergency (\$300,000), Clean Industry Hub Study (\$276,780) and Equitable Historic Preservation (\$90,000) of decision packages requested in FY 2022-23. The bureau also requests from General Fund comp set-aside and contingency resources to fund healthcare increases/non-represented COLA, bureau non-rep merit, DCTU/PPA COLA and any 1x current year recently bargained expense.

BPS anticipates to fully collect the bureau-to-bureau interagency revenues with BES, PBOT, and City Energy Saving partner bureaus.

BPS forecasts to fully spend its budget except \$1,170,000 in program carryover requests listed above. In addition, the bureau has requested to fund the Belgian Blocks Reclamation project (\$40,000) thru PBOT and reallocate contract and bureau overhead budgets to appropriate budget programs. These General Fund program carryover and budget adjustment requests are included in this BMP.

Revenue Discussion

The Community Solar Fund accounts for expenses and revenues associated with the installation of solar electric systems on community buildings. The accrued revenue is used to install new, small-scale solar electric systems on community building. The fund receives revenue from the electric utility companies in the form of a 15-year stream of incentive payments based on the energy produced from each solar energy system.

Revenue Discussion

The Portland Clean Energy Community Benefits Initiative is the result of Ballot Measure 26-201 that was passed by Portland voters in November 2018. The Portland Clean Energy Community Benefits Fund represents an estimated \$80 million to \$90 million in new annual revenue for clean energy and clean energy jobs in Portland, with a focus on benefitting low-income residents and communities of color. The initiative will provide grants from the fund to qualified nonprofit organizations carrying out programs to deliver on the goals of the measure.

Personal Services will be underspent due to a longer-than-usual hiring processes. External Materials and Services will also be underspent, caused by the team not being fully staffed to spend contracted work. Delays in grantmaking due to modifications in the grant review process will result in grant awards being executed later than expected at the start of the next fiscal year. PCEF plans to encumber grants totaling \$26.7 million by year-end with funds expensed over time based on grant duration. In addition, PCEF plans to request \$33.6 million in fund program carryover thru Fall BMP.

Both residential franchise and commercial tonnages fees are scheduled to be fully collected in FY2021-22.

BPS anticipates about \$1 million in expenditure savings/reductions in Personal Service and Materials and Services budgets, mainly from vacancy savings, delays in contracting in procurement, and reduction in P&D.

For contracts procured, but not invoiced by year-end, BPS would request encumbrance carryover in Fall BMP to carryover the budget.
