
- Mayor and City Commissioners share responsibilities


NEW GOVERNMENT: MAYOR-COUNCIL Appointment authority breakdown

Primary (May) & General election (November)


DISTRICTS, EXPANDED COUNCIL

TIMELINE:




CRITERIA:
