

OVERVIEW

Significant events in this reporting period

Governor Brown announced that Oregon will begin its 2-week freeze and Multnomah County will be on a 4-week freeze starting on November 18; The State of Washington allocates \$50 million to businesses affected by shutdown; Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) is running close to full capacity.

Local and Regional News

- As of November 17, there are 378 confirmed Coronavirus hospitalizations in Oregon. The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) releases these numbers daily.
- On November 17, <u>Fox 12 News reported</u> that about 100 Camas and Washougal school district employees were furloughed due to low enrollment.
- On November 17, Governor Brown announced that Oregon will commit \$55 million in financial assistance will support Oregon business impacted by COVID-19 restrictions.
- On November 16, <u>Fox 12 News reported</u> that Washington State allocated \$50 million to businesses affected by shutdown.
- On November 16, <u>KOIN reported</u> that COVID-19 testing in Portland is up twenty percent.
 Additionally, the Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) is experiencing increased wait-times for testing.
- On November 15, Washington Governor, Jay Inslee, announced 4-week, statewide restrictions

- in response to the increased spread of COVID-19.
- On November 15, OregonLive reported that a Clackamas County leader says she'll celebrate Thanksgiving with as many family and friends as she can find, defying governor's orders.
- On November 14, KGW reported that OHSU is running close to full capacity.
- On November 13, the <u>Oregon Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) shared</u> temporary COVID-19 rules for Oregon businesses.
- On November 13, <u>Governor Brown announced</u> that Oregon will begin its 2-week freeze and Multnomah County will be on a 4-week freeze on November 18.
- On November 13, OregonLive reported that COVID-19 cases are spiking in the Portland area, surpassing the rest of Oregon as holidays loom.
- On November 13, <u>OregonLive reported</u> on what Oregon's new COVID-19 freeze means for restaurants and bars.
- On November 12, <u>KATU reported</u> some Portland hospitals are halting elective surgeries amid the rise in COVID-19 cases.
- On November 12, KGW reported that Oregon and Washington are in the midst of developing new tools to assist in COVID-19 tracking.

- On November 17, <u>CNN reported</u> don't rely on a negative test result to see your family for Thanksgiving.
- On November 16, Moderna announced that its COVID-19 vaccine is 94.5 percent effective.
- On November 16, <u>Yahoo News reported</u> that COVID-19 infections are soaring. Lockdowns could be coming. A list of restrictions in each state is included.
- On November 16, <u>Yahoo News reported</u> that Manitoba contact tracers face ugly side of frustrated Canadians; Ontario premier warns residents to be super cautious for holidays.
- On November 16, CNN reported that a huge wave of evictions is possible in January.
- On November 15, <u>USA Today reported</u> that small-town hospitals are being overwhelmed by COVID-19 deaths.
- On November 14, <u>CNN reported</u> that a physician predicts unprecedented surge in US COVID-19 cases after Thanksgiving.
