Requesting Inclusion Services

To help ensure equal access to City programs, services, or activities, the City of Portland reasonably provides: translation and interpretation, modifications, accommodations, auxiliary aides, and services and alternative formats.

Follow these steps to request inclusion services;

1. Choose and register for any activity at [**portland.gov/parks/recreation**](http://portland.gov/parks/recreation).
2. Contact inclusion services at 971-284-5060 or [**parksair@portlandoregon.gov**](mailto:parksair@portlandoregon.gov) at least 10 working days prior to the activity.
3. Complete an accommodation form by email, in person, or by phone. This step helps determine what level of accommodation is needed.

During the Request Process

Program coordinators will;

- Connect with families requesting support to discuss options,
- Determine appropriate support to be provided,
- Share determined support plan with families,
- Communicate support plan to PP&R site and inclusion staff.

Participants need to;

- Meet program registration requirements,
- Adhere to PP&R code of conduct,
- Be able to remain with other program participants and staff in a safe and healthy way,
- Have fun!
