Deployment and Operations PLAN

1. Immediate Responsibilities Following a Disaster:

- Members check themselves and persons in their household for injuries
- Members ensure their home/property are secure
- Member or person of the household should attempt to contact their emergency outof-state (family) contact
- Member to don PPE and follow communications protocols, once above responsibilities are met and deployment is possible.

2. Communications Protocols:

- Members attempt to contact each other via GMRS radio (use CHANNEL 4; alternate CHANNEL 2)
- On the **RADIO**:
 - ✓ State your first name and cross street;
 - ✓ listen for team ARO or TL to confirm they read your transmission
 - ✓ Incident Team Leader (Bricca) will get on the air and initiate a general checkin, and then confirm the order to deploy to NET staging area, or ITL may ask members to stand by.
- 3. **Deployment Protocols:** Remember that members may self-deploy only if:
 - A disaster is taking place
 - Communications systems are down

> You have received no message from PBEM or ITL (Bricca)

- En-route to NET staging area (NSH-1, Wilshire Park), members use "ICS Form -1 Damage Assessment" to note/document damage in the neighborhood. (*This* information gathered by team members as they make their way to staging area will later be used by the ITL to determine and delegate assignments for volunteers.)
- If members encounter Spontaneous Unaffiliated Volunteers (SUV's) while proceeding to NSA-1, request that the volunteers accompany you so that NET member assigned to manage SUV's (Fiedler) can check them in/process/assign.

 If NSA-1 is not safe/secure for NET operations or if volunteers are unable to reach NSA-1, or if another site is preferable: RADIO other members if possible and proceed to NSH-2 Beaumont School field, NHS-3, Madeleine School, NHS-4, Alameda School, or designated safe site.

4. On-Site Management Protocols:

- The first member arriving at the NET Staging Area will serve as ITL until designated ITL (Bricca or Stewart) arrive on scene.
- Neighborhood damage assessment forms (completed by members) will be submitted to ITL.
- Establish radio communication (by ARO on scene), with the PBEM NET Coordinator to report team status and request/await instructions.
- ITL will work with the team to prioritize and delegate assignments as quickly as possible, once damage forms are reviewed. Assignments will be delegated to functional teams that are no smaller than two (2) persons.
- Functional teams will carry out their assignments using proper ICS documentation and staying in touch with the NET Staging AREA (NSA) via GMRS radio (CHANNEL 4).
- Once assignments are completed, members report back to NSA for further instructions.

5. Spontaneous Unaffiliated Volunteers (SUV'S):

- Team SCRIBE will check in volunteers using the "PERSONNEL RESOURCES INTAKE FORM". Information provided will include: name of volunteer, whether volunteer has training/no training, volunteer contact information, special skills of the volunteer.
- Volunteers will be placed on "stand by": PRIOR to volunteers being assigned tasks, SUV's will be advised about response safety and non-interference with emergency responders. As the ITL develops NET assignments, appropriate tasks will be delegated to SUV's.

6. Potential Neighborhood Vulnerability:

 Our local schools have a dense concentration of people located in a small area. If a disaster occurs during school hours, the school yard may become our "staging area", due to the possible designation of this locale as a **priority focus** region for initiating the NET process.

• A meeting with the school principal may benefit the NET team (and the school) in preparing for this potentially crucial need.
