The **Community Board for Police Accountability** will independently investigate Portland Police Bureau officers and their supervisors, impose discipline when appropriate, and make recommendations regarding police policies and practices, with a primary focus on community concerns.

This board is a governing body, not an advisory one, and will have significant influence on ensuring that community needs and concerns are addressed in policing decisions.

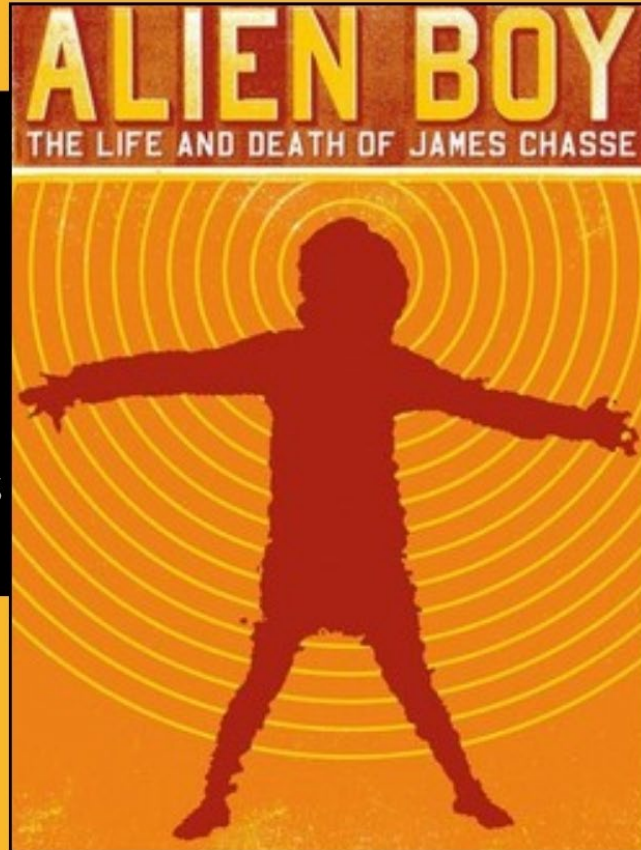

Recently, PPB officers attended community engagement events associated with two City Council members, Councilor Kanal and Councilor Morillo

The officers who attended did not speak at the events.

The PPA has been outspoken about some initiatives supported by the councilors, including closer scrutiny of the PPB budget and proposed adjustments to the CBPA (future accountability board).

PCCEP full committee co-chairs have invited PPB leadership to the meeting on March 26th to discuss questions that this has raised about PPB's approach to community engagement, trust, and transparency.

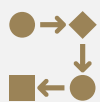
GOALS FOR DISCUSSION



Achieve consensus on some core tasks and general vision for the work of this subcommittee.



Be able to present summary of core tasks and vision to full committee on March 26 for feedback and approval.



Accept non-closure. A lot of things might make more sense or fall into place once you're actually doing the work!

Proposed Core Tasks

- Identification of/relationship building with priority community partners
 - Priority = centering key communities under Settlement
 - Looks like assigning subcommittee members to attend other org meetings to network?
- Relationship-building with Council and Mayor to learn about public safety priorities and constituent needs
 - Will help ensure PCCEP's work is relevant and timely; will help elected officials improve responsiveness to public.
- Community engagement event at least once every 2 months in community spaces
 - Town hall, listening session, open house, supporting another org, etc.
 - Community engagement events can support work of rest of committee (i.e., a town hall to gather info for Policy & Reform subcommittee recommendation) *and* can also stand alone (i.e., an open house to educate public about alternative response; a wellness walk with community and first responders; etc).
- Evaluation of PPB's community engagement work
 - How is PPB engaging with community to build trust and transparency?

Subcommittee Name Change



Still possible at any time, but not prepared to discuss in this meeting. Until further notice, name will remain the same.



Staff solicited feedback on alternatives via email but subcommittee does not have concrete options to consider at this time.



BRAINSTORMING FOR UPCOMING EVENT



PCCEP often tries to bring together multiple stakeholder perspectives at community engagement events to share information and invite dialogue.



Initially, the full committee co-chairs discussed having a panel as part of the *Alien Boy* after program, but decided it was not suitable due to time constraints and out of respect for the subject matter.



Some members have now suggested the possibility of hosting a follow-up event to bring together different stakeholders relevant to the themes of the film.
