SUBCOMMITTEE DISCUSSION

Status Update



In the February full committee meeting, PCCEP voted to move forward with a Policy & Reform Subcommittee and the concept of a community-focused subcommittee



There was agreement that the current iteration of the Community Engagement Subcommittee needs improvement and clarity about work product, process, and mission



Members also expressed a desire to change the name of the subcommittee and ensure that equity and communities identified by the Settlement Agreement are intentionally centered in its work

Possible Tasks for Community-Focused SC

1. Host a series of district-specific listening sessions and let emergent topics inform agendas.
2. Assign member(s) to attend local org meetings and make connections (NAYA, Latino Network, Imagine Black, etc.).
3. Partner with local orgs to host listening sessions/events specific to their needs onsite (i.e., a listening session at Blanchet House about policing, houselessness, and related issues. A listening session with a group of neighborhood associations about policing needs in their area).
4. Bringing City leadership to events to answer questions and share information (“PCCEP as clearinghouse”).

Possible Path

PCCEP can elect all leadership positions tonight. Inaugural subcommittee meetings in March could be spent developing mission statement, vision, goals, and new name (if needed) for each subcommittee.

Process and outputs can be as formal or informal as PCCEP wants.

Guidelines

No member may serve in the same position for more than two consecutive terms.

Members may only occupy one chair seat at a time; if a member does not win their first-choice seat, they may run again for a different position in the course of this meeting.

The chat will be turned off during elections out of respect for all candidates.

Unlike all other votes, PCCEP does not take public comment prior to electing leadership.

Guidelines

1. Members interested in running for a position will be invited to nominate themselves.
Members may also nominate each other.
2. Each candidate will be asked 3 questions they have received in advance. For each round of positions, candidates will answer question 1 until everyone has gone. Then we'll move on to question 2, and so on. 3 minutes per question.
3. Members will vote for up to 2 candidates;
Candidates *may* vote for themselves.
4. Votes are cast confidentially but become a part of the public record and are available upon request.
5. Results will be announced for each set of positions at the end of the voting break.
