Last two webinars will be workshops with community and local guest sharing experiences and ideas around TRC.</li> </ul> </li> <li>● Portland Police Bureau (PPB) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ PPB and the Mayor held a press conference on two new policy changes surrounding traffic stops that work to address racial disparities and an increase in traffic-related deaths in the city.</li> <li>○ This change will allow for data to be collected and exam for best outcomes.</li> <li>○ PPB is also revising consents searches. This section needs further explanation and clarification.</li> </ul>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Report does not talk about the specific officer involved shootings aside from the mention on the two officer involved shootings.</li> <li>• Report does not mention the murder of George Floyd was done by police officers.</li> <li>• I need for more focus on Portland officer and their use of violence and deadly force.</li> <li>• Does not talk about the subject matter of the civil unrest – people are upset that police use too much violence especially among African Americans in our community.</li> <li>• Individual cases of deadly force should be included in the report</li> <li>• Hope PCCEP will make formal recommendations on the report</li> <li>• Paragraph 150- Precinct meetings discussions should be included in the report</li> <li>• Report can be improved by adding more information on the topic of use of force during the protest (analysis and reflection)</li> <li>• Greater need to inform the public about the report and opportunities to give feedback during precinct meetings</li> </ul>
