PPB Contact Survey Recommendation

- Mayor Wheeler issued formal response in January
- Available for review on PCCEP website
- Mayor Wheeler accepted recommendation and laid out plans to move forward; PCCEP must choose representative to serve on workgroup.

Contact Survey Recommendation – Mayor's Response

I have concluded that a vendor contract, managed by the Community Safety Division, is the most appropriate path forward. Because this contract would advance through the City's procurement process, I would like to convene a workgroup to draft a Request for Proposals, which will provide potential vendors with an overview of the program and set the requirements for potential vendor qualifications and capabilities.

I've tasked my Community Safety Director Stephanie Howard with leading this workgroup starting in January. I would like to include a representative from PCCEP, the Training Advisory Council, Portland Police Bureau, Community Safety Division, the Portland Police Association, Portland Police Command Officers Association, and a labor and employment attorney from the City Attorney's office who can help the workgroup navigate any legal questions that may arise. I believe this group will provide key perspectives and insight to make this a meaningful and successful program.

PPB DIRECTIVE REVIEW PROCESS

What is a Directive?

“The Portland Police Bureau directs member action through the establishment of policy, procedure, and rule, as found within Directives. Directives serve as the foundation for all Bureau operations, which is then elaborated upon by way of member training and supervision.”

How does PPB Review & Revise Directives?

“When a directive is identified for review or is newly created, the Bureau designates two timeframes - the First and Second Universal Review and Public Comment Periods - in which community members can comment on the Bureau's policies.”

First Universal Review & Public Comment Period



~30 days long



“Community members and other stakeholders can submit comments through the "Provide Feedback" link included at the end of the directive. Comments should be limited to a substantive review of the directive content or proposals for additional related content.”



“After the close of this public review and comment period, all comments received are discussed during PPB’s internal review process for potential inclusion in a draft containing proposed changes to the directive. An updated draft reflecting changes to the current directive will be posted on the PPB's website at the start of the Second Universal Review and Public Comment Period.”

Second Universal Review & Public Comment Period



~30 days long



“The proposed draft(s) reflect(s) changes made to the current active directive(s) as a result of feedback received during the First Universal Review and Public Comment Period, analysis of best practice standards and internal discussions with subject matter experts.”



“After the close of this public review and comment period, all comments received are again discussed during the Bureau’s internal review process for potential inclusion in the final version.”
