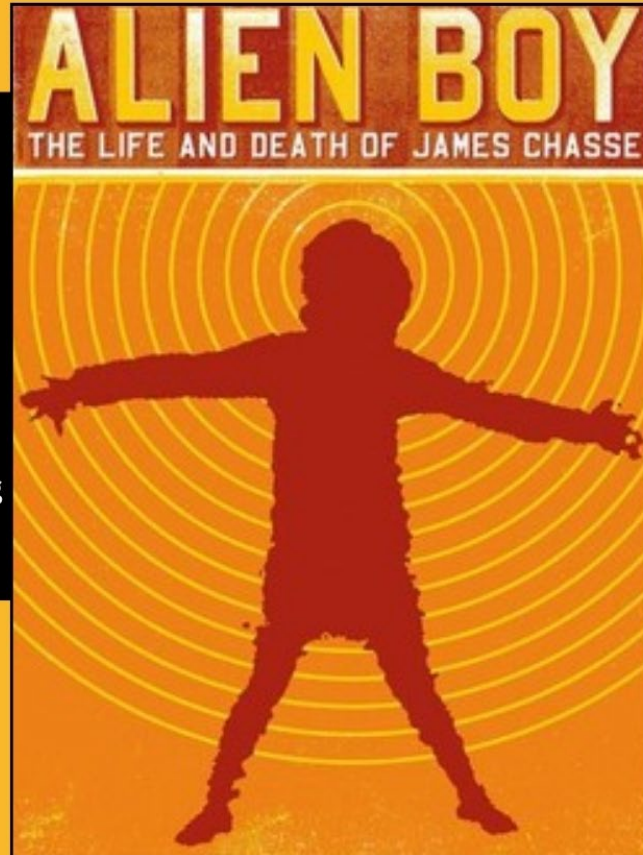

Is there a standard number of officers or cars dispatched to any given incident? How does PPB determine what the scale of response should be to an incident?

What was the original complaint or call type for this incident? Were any arrests made or charges filed?



FINAL REPORT ON PCCEP RESTRUCTURE

Community Engagement Subcommittee

Core Tasks

- Identification of/relationship building with priority community partners and a broad spectrum of Portlanders, especially using a District-based approach.
 - Priority = communities identified by Settlement Agreement
- Relationship-building with Council and Mayor to learn about public safety priorities and constituent needs.
 - Will help ensure PCCEP's work is relevant and timely; will help elected officials improve responsiveness to public.
- Community engagement event at least once every 2 months in community spaces
 - Town hall, listening session, open house, supporting another org, etc.
- Evaluation of PPB's community engagement work
 - How is PPB engaging with community to build trust and transparency?
- Recommendations based on community engagement work and findings

Policy & Reform Subcommittee Core Tasks

- Keep up to date on PPB directives and keep members & community informed
- Work on writing public comment on directives involving use of force, stops data, & any directives relating to the settlement agreement during public review periods
- Keep track of remedies completed in the settlement agreement & not yet completed
- Address issues that arise in the moment for public input and next steps as warranted
- Facilitate ongoing discussions of city code, directives, reporting, and evaluation as needed
- Work with community and any relevant organizations in making recommendations.
- Conversations & relations with various first responders including PPB
- Connect or work with other police councils/committees (BHUAC, CAG, PEAC, TAC, PAC, etc.)
- City Council/ Mayor's office include with Stakeholders

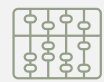
Regular report-outs from subcommittee chairs on progress and work products

Steering Committee Core Tasks

- Strategic Guidance and Direction
 - Establishes the high-level priorities that guide the work of the full committee and its subcommittees.
- Coordination and Communication
 - Ensures that the work of subcommittees is consistent with their missions and that there is no overlap or redundancy in efforts.
- Evaluation and Continuous Improvement
 - can recommend improvements in the work of the subcommittees, committee meetings, or overall operations.
