	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public Comments: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Concerns on the communication strategies to reach the whole Portland community when sharing information on PPB’s community engagement methods ○ Concerns with the trust issues that still arise within the Latino community when creating a Hispanic Advisory group ○ Concerns with the Behavioral Health Unit not being open for the public to attend their meetings (lack of community engagement) ○ Concerns for a lack of accessibility to provide ADA accommodations for community engagement meetings • PPB Response: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ On-going discussion around the accessibility for the Behavioral Health Unit meetings to be open to the public ○ Currently working on a shared platform to reach various groups /communities with clear messages to support community needs ○ PPB is working on communication strategies to further support community engagement outlet methods • PCCEP Comments: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The issue of the Behavioral Health Unit meetings not being open to the public should be explored to make these meetings public ○ Text messages could be an effective communication method to help reach the community ○ Language concerns in the Community Engagement Plan (e.g. timelines / deadlines to reach community engagement goals) ○ Accessibility concerns surrounding public meetings engagement with the disability community
