We recommend that the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) adopt and implement a Procedural Justice Statement Policy requiring officers to provide a procedural justice statement during vehicle and pedestrian stops and searches of community members.

I have reviewed the Procedural Justice Statement Policy Recommendation and greatly appreciate PCCEP's work resulting in this proposal.

I accept the concept that procedural justice is extremely important and should be embedded in PPB policy. I am asking PPB's Policy Team to develop a draft Procedural Justice directive and to collaborate with a couple of representative PCCEP members among others in the process of doing so. The new policy will likely draw from some existing directives as well as potentially incorporating new material. I believe it is premature to determine the specific content of the Procedural Justice directive, but acknowledge PCCEP's recommendations on content and look forward to further discussion between PCCEP and the PPB Policy Team on the language of a draft directive. PPB will engage the community at large via its established Universal Review process and the PPA as well. I believe a decision as to whether the new directive would complement or replace other directives should be deferred to permit full evaluation of that question.
