# What are Core Patrol Services?

- Officers respond to emergency or non-emergency calls for service;
- Conduct preliminary investigations;
- Enforce traffic and criminal laws;
- Provide a visible presence within the community; and
- Participate in community events

June 2020 – November 2020: Research, Convene, Scope, and Propose Project for PCCEP Review and Approval

December 15, 2020: Present to PCCEP for Review and Comment

January 15, 2021: Comment Link Goes Live on MapApp!

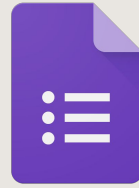
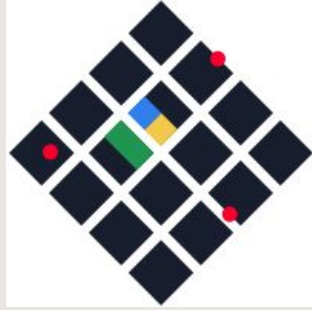
**Publish draft recommendations — Opened Apr 21**

June 2021: City Council Hearing





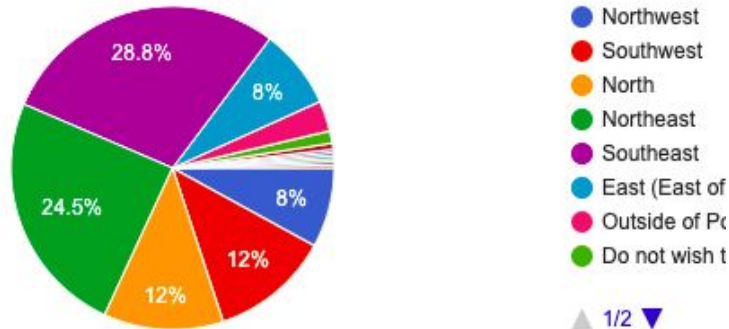

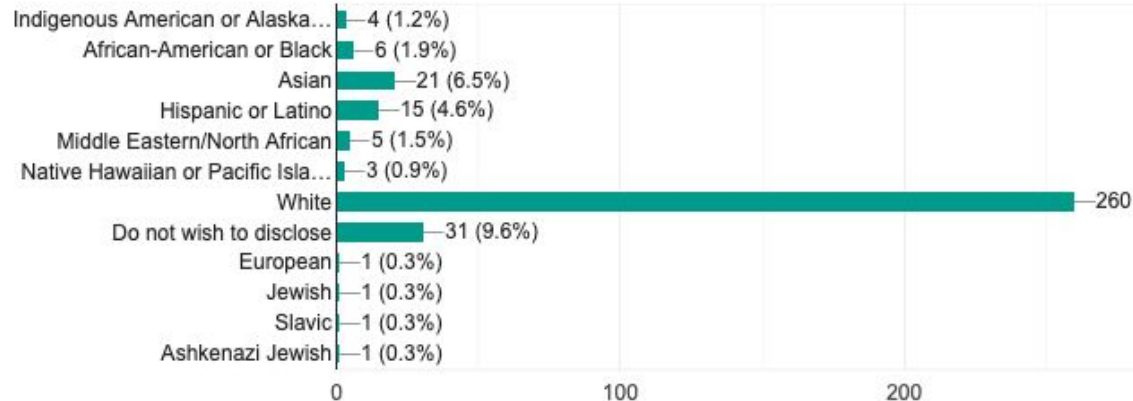

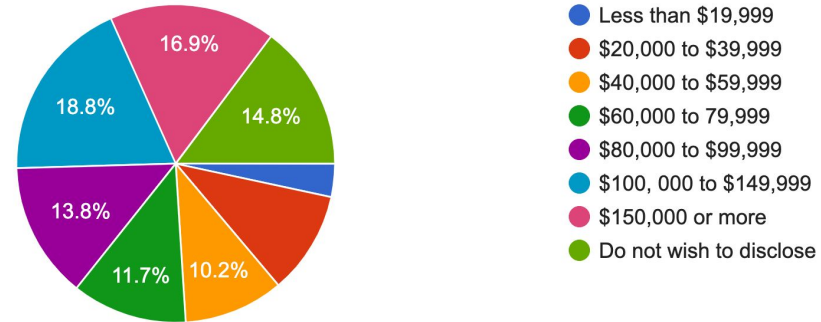

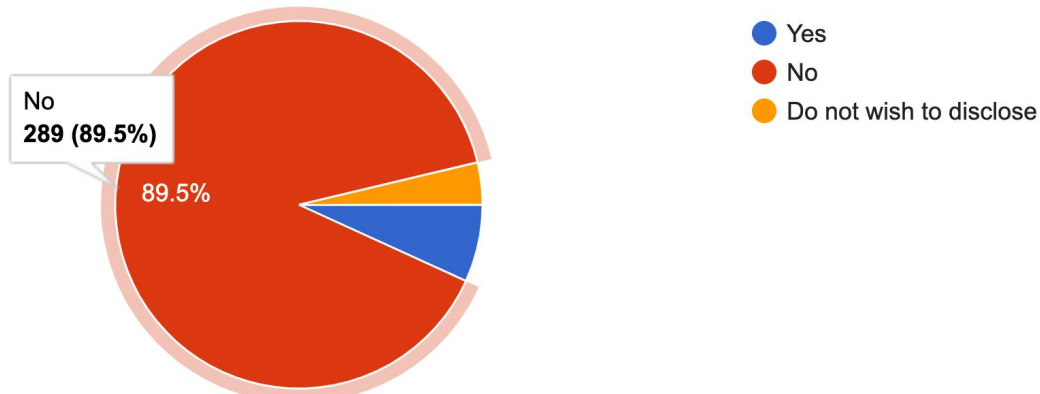
## What is your total household income?

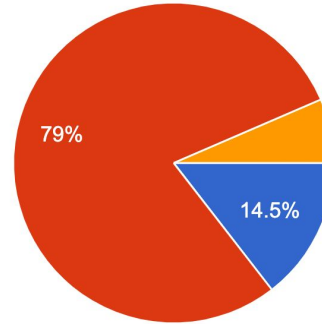
## Have you ever experienced or currently experience houselessness?

## Do you live with a disability?

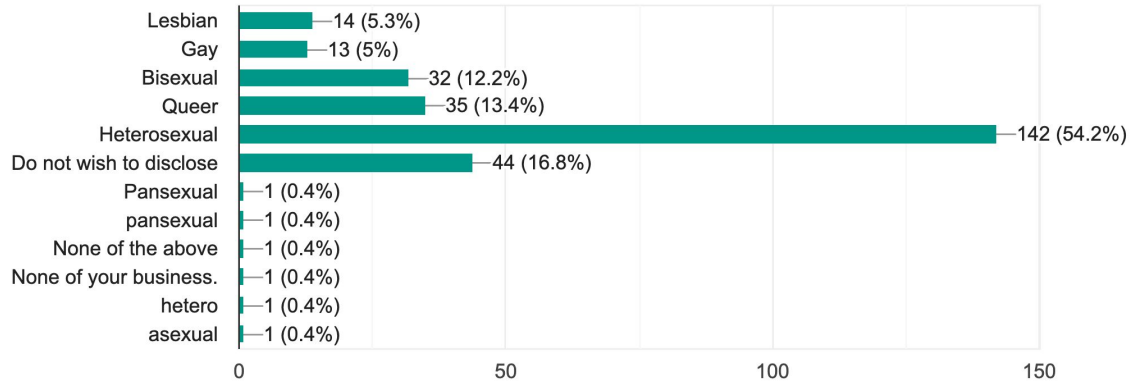

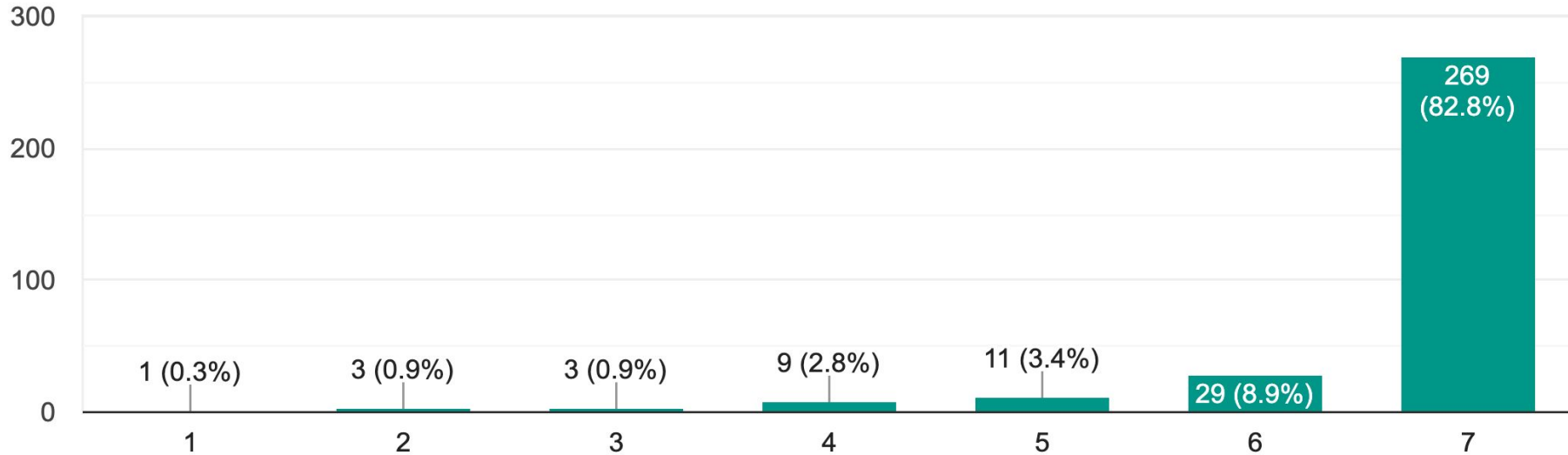
## Do you identify with any of the following? (Please click all that apply.)

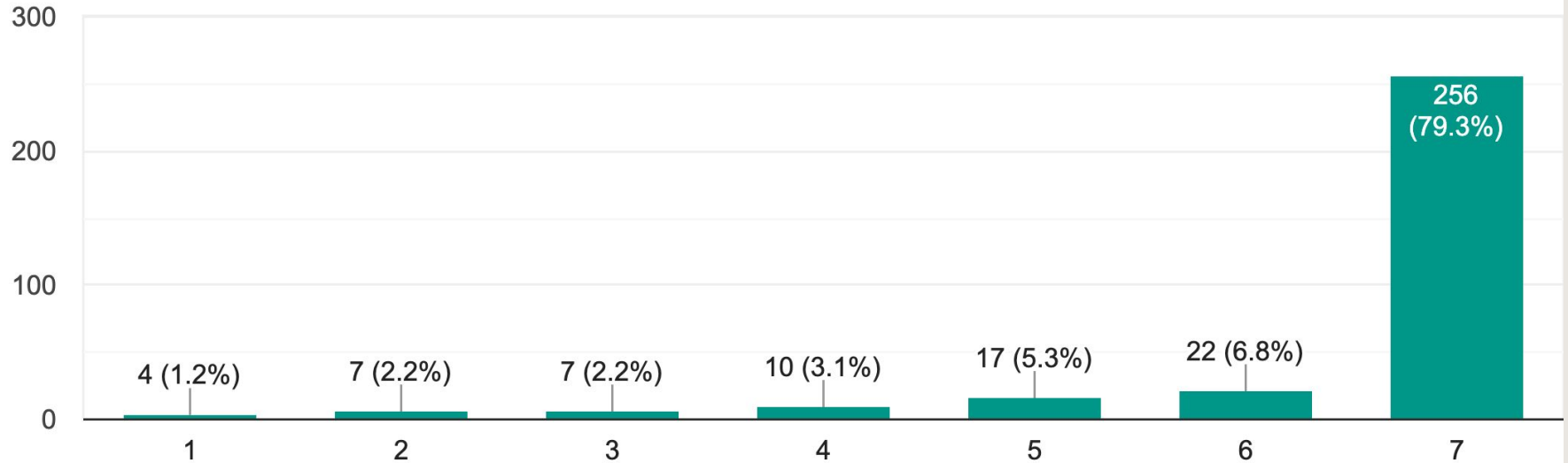

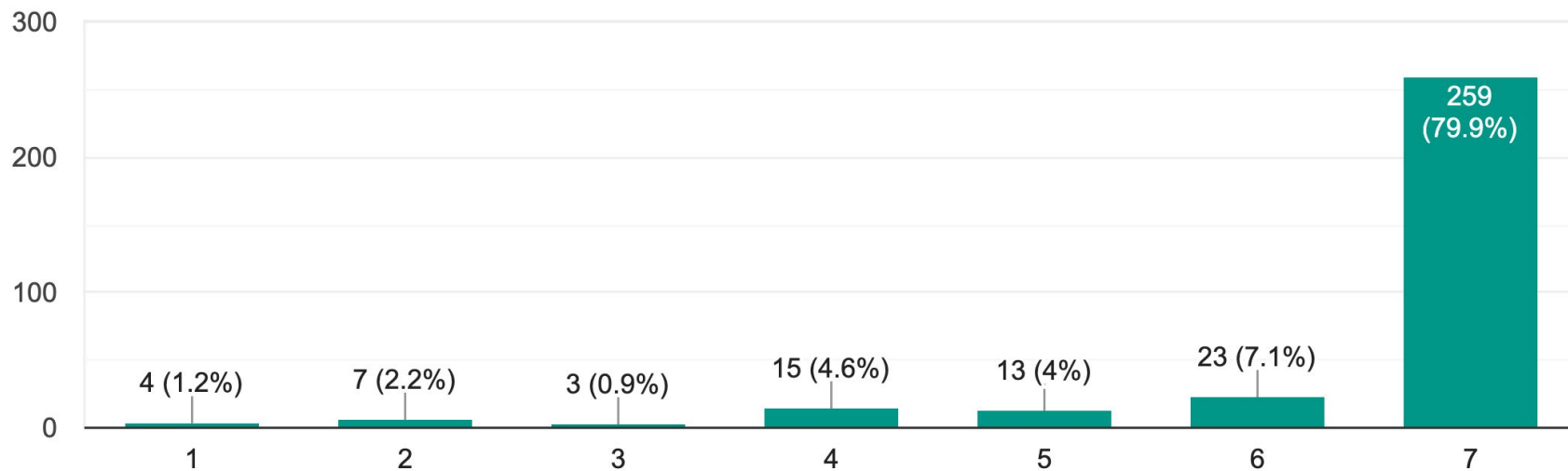
PCCEP is considering recommending that the city increase access to unsheltered and houseless community resources. Would you be supportive of this?

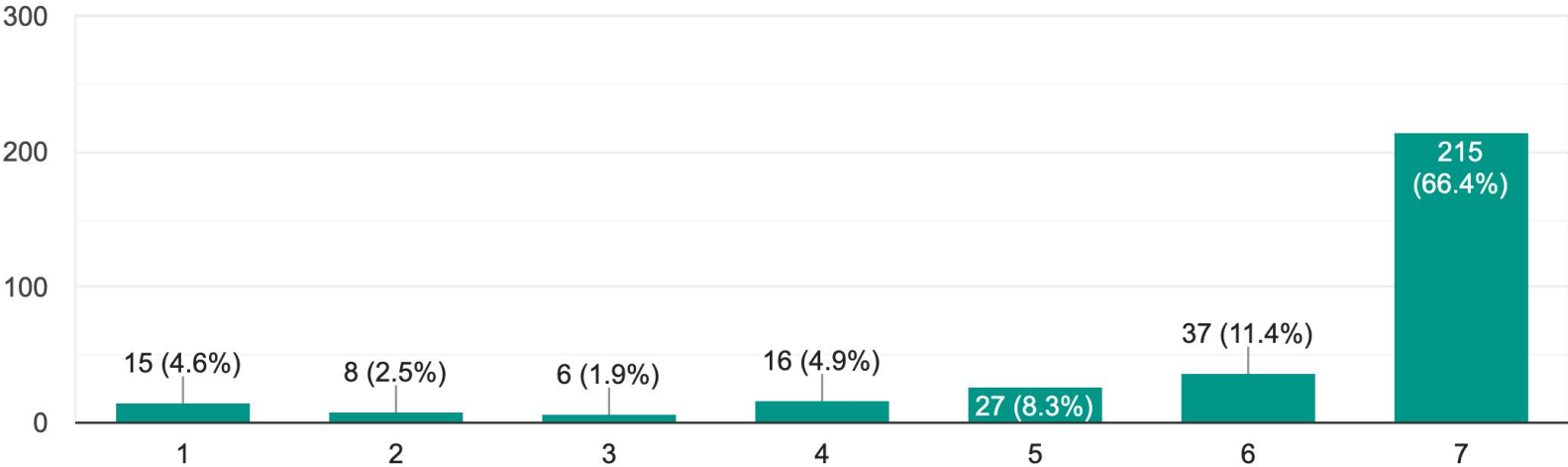
PCCEP is considering recommending a more rapid citywide expansion of the Portland Street Response program. Would you be supportive of this?

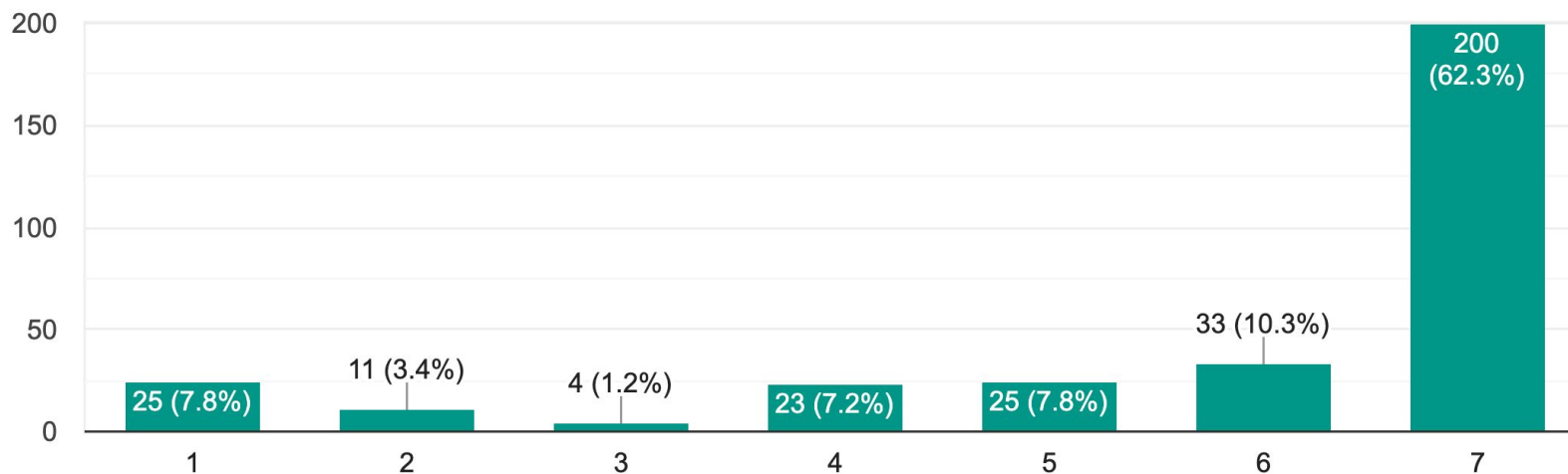
PCCEP is considering recommending the city ensure the Behavioral Health Unit remains fully funded and maintained. Would you be supportive of this?

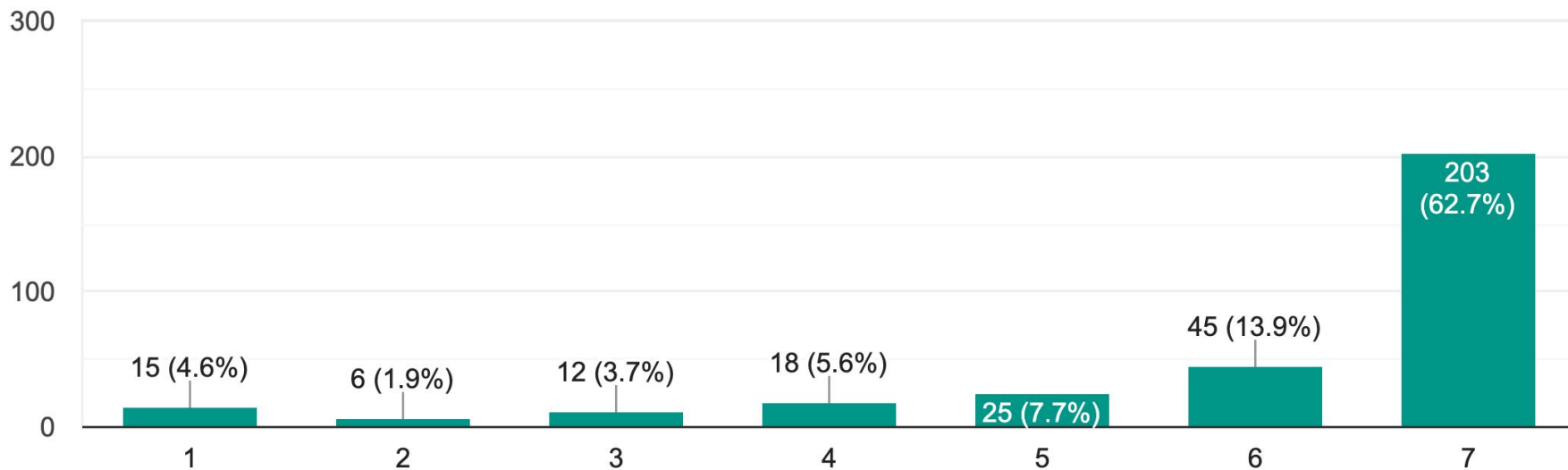
PCCEP is considering recommending the police increase the number of officers who receive enhanced crisis intervention training. Would you be supportive of this?

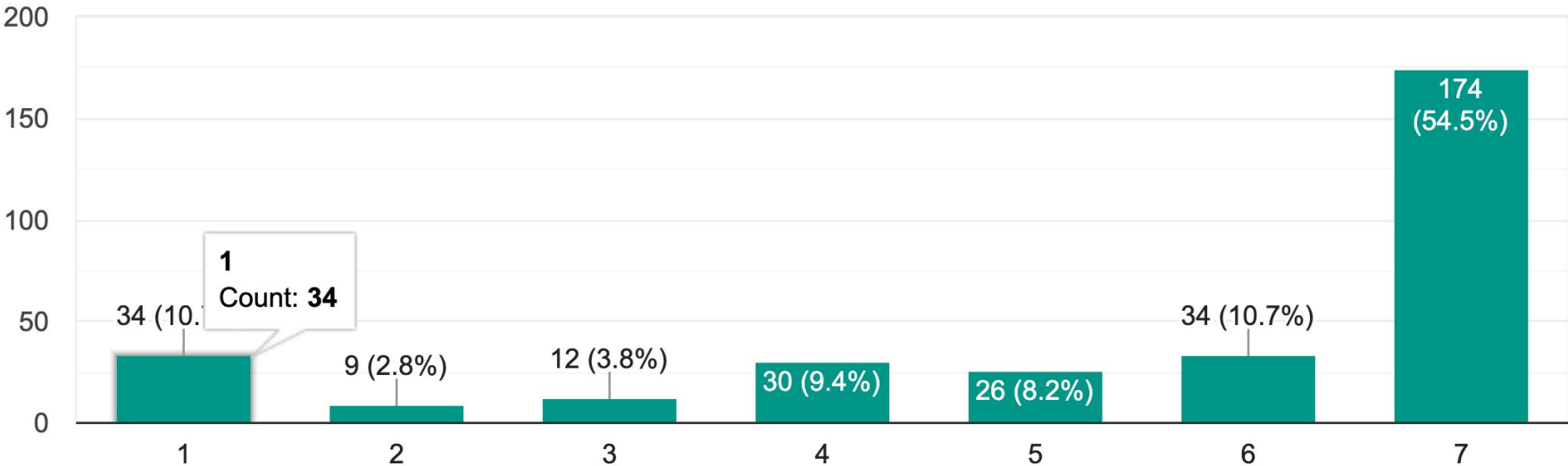

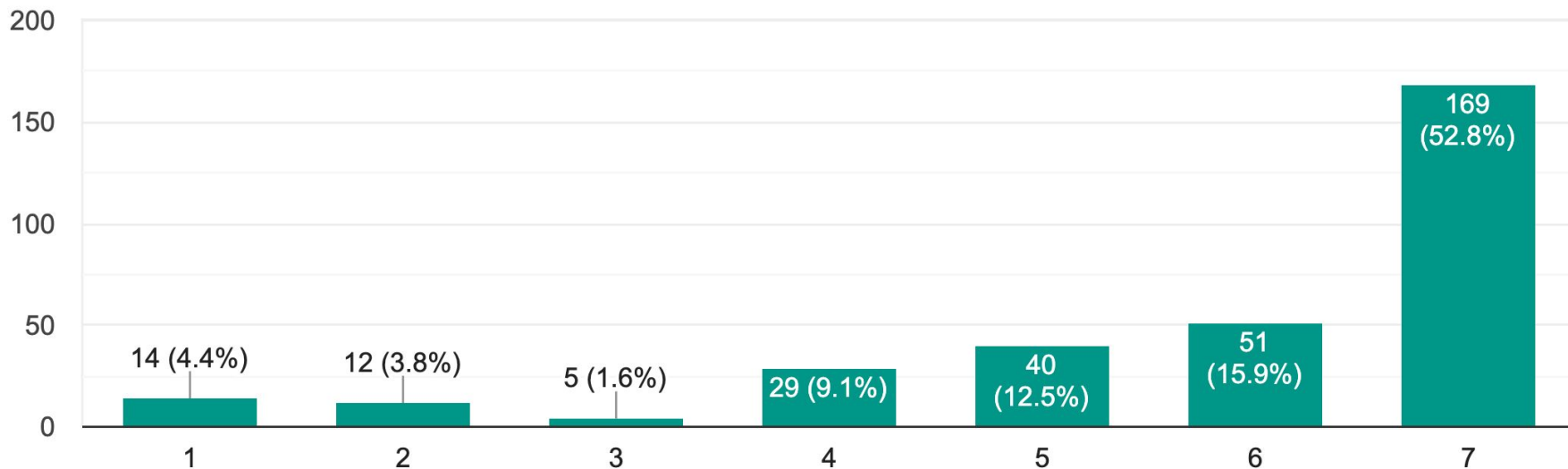
PCCEP is considering recommending that private security patrols be removed from public spaces, replaced by PS3s or a similar city run program. Would you be supportive of this?

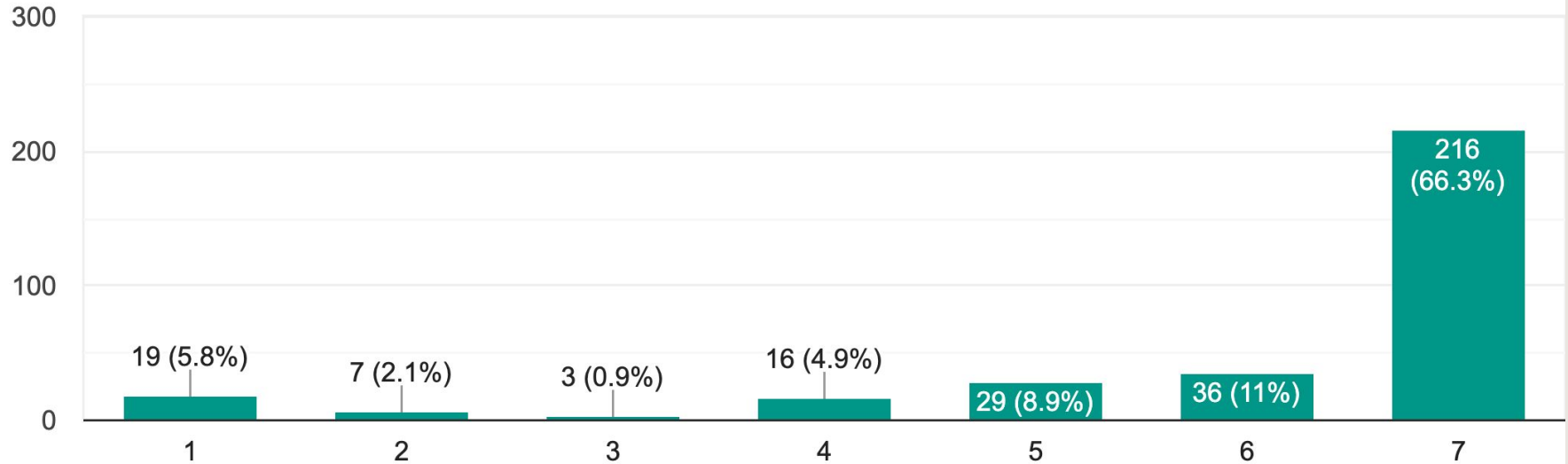
PCCEP is considering recommending that the city significantly increase funding to the Office of Violence Prevention on a permanent basis. Would you be supportive of this?

PCCEP is considering recommending that the city partner with community organizations to form a restorative justice program that moves away from ...s incarceration. Would you be supportive of this?

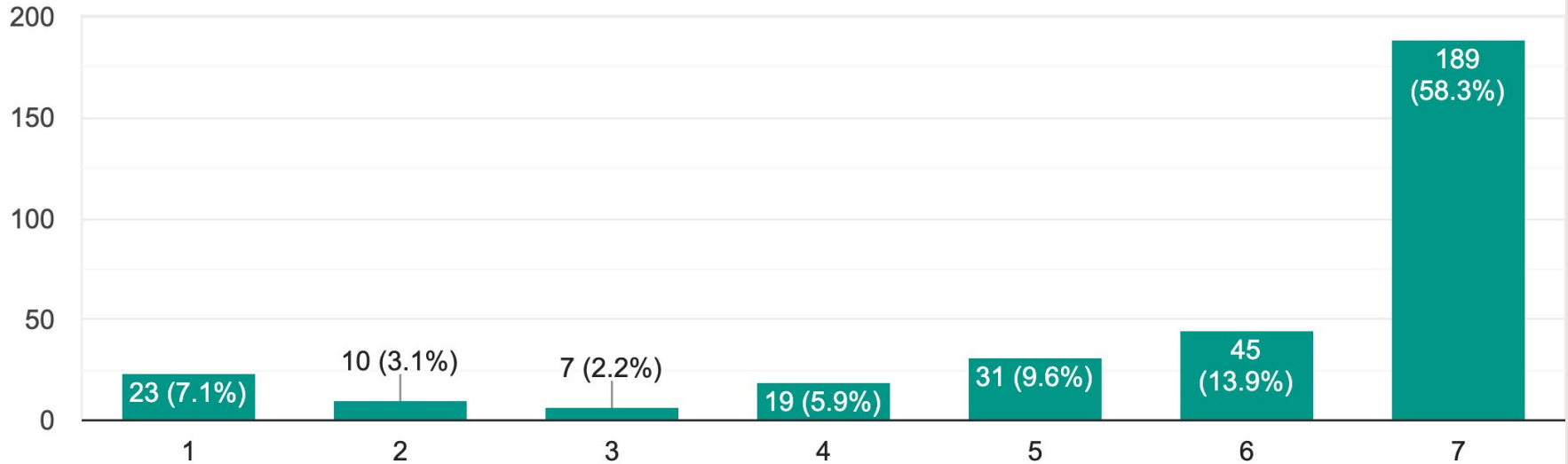

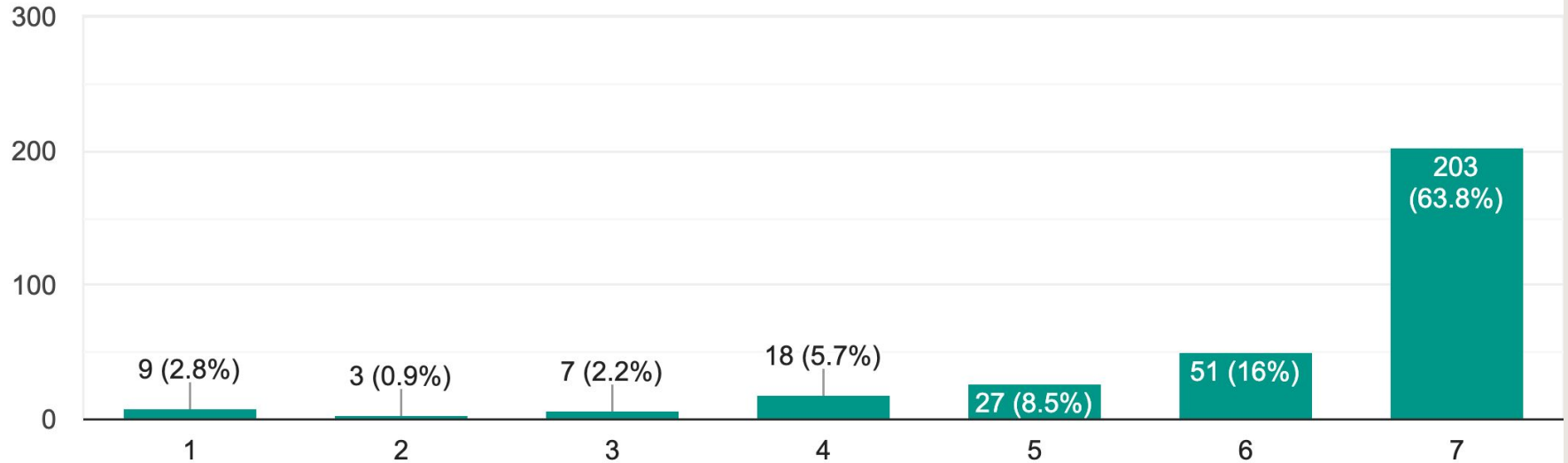
PCCEP is considering recommending that the city create an alternative body of people who would handle traffic safety. Additionally, we would require traffic enforcement. Would you be supportive of this?

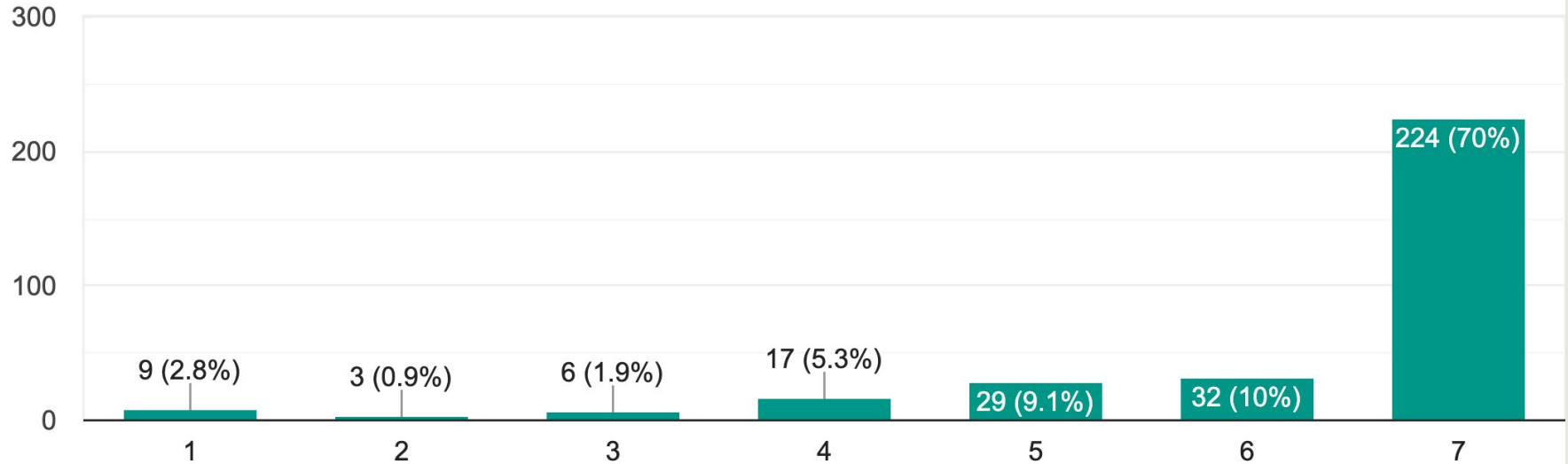

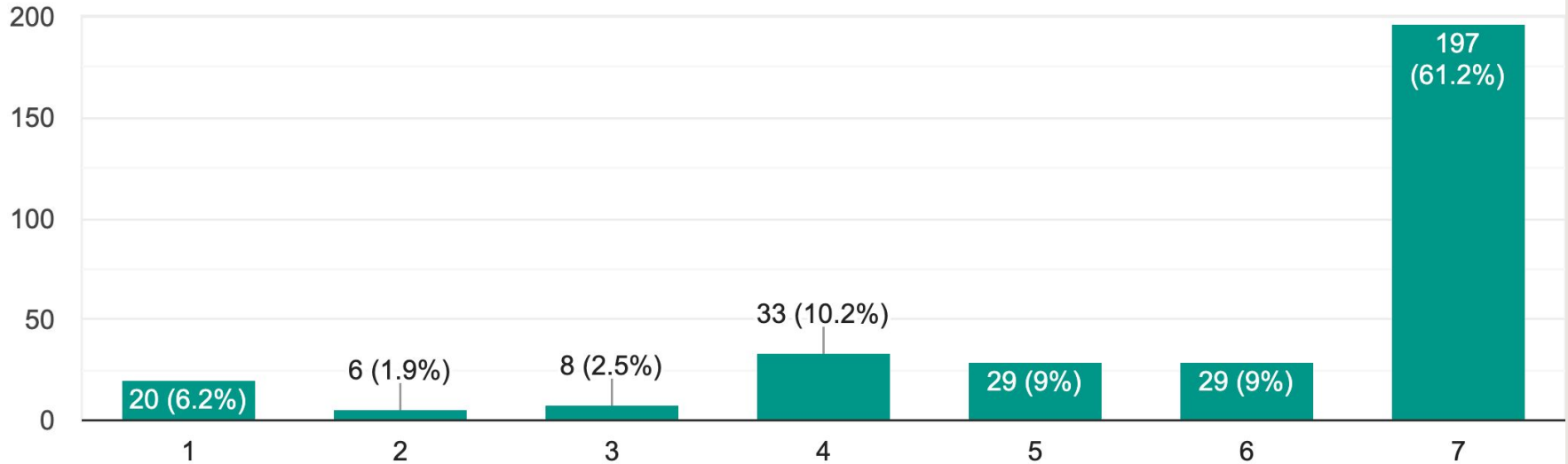
PCCEP is considering recommending that the city invest in an improved police records system to allow for greater transparency and less harmful policing. Would you be supportive of this?
