Minutes will be provided.</li> <li>○ No password will be required for City public meetings.</li> <li>○ Staff will take minutes and facilitate meetings.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• COVID- specific updates:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ No officers yet to test positive for COVID-19.</li> <li>○ Portland Police Bureau (PPB) is working with the City to open three sanctuaries areas for the houseless.</li> <li>○ PPB is working with the Sunshine Division to provide food to the community.</li> <li>○ PPB is not responding to minor calls.</li> <li>○ No data has been analyzed for crim during COVID.</li> <li>○ Shootings are up compared to what the city has experienced.</li> <li>○ PPB has started a <a href="#">podcast</a> that discusses COVID and other related topics.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>Subcommittees Community Engagement Plans</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Steering committee will communicate with subcommittee chairs.</li> <li>• Every subcommittee has a community engagement budget of \$3,500.</li> <li>• Expectation for subcommittees to draft plans during the month of May.</li> <li>• Set a deadline for the community engagement plans to be submitted.</li> <li>• Have at least one person per subcommittee attend steering committee meetings and share follow-up information with their subcommittees.</li> </ul>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The goal is for the steering committee to review plans in May.</li> <li>• The Settlement Agreement and Policy Subcommittee will modify their plan, but it can be used as a guide for other subcommittees.</li> <li>• The Behavioral Health Subcommittee will need more time to develop a plan as they begin to relaunch the subcommittee as of April 21<sup>st</sup>.</li> <li>• The \$3,500 budget will hopefully be on-going for each fiscal year.</li> <li>• PCCEP will need to wait for the Mayor’s budget to pass.</li> <li>• It’s important to engage with the most affected communities (e.g. houseless and communities of color).</li> </ul>

With the support of staff and other committee members.</li> </ul>
