As owner/lessee of the above address, I agree to participate in the graffiti removal project with the following considerations:

1. Owner/lessee grants permission for the City to enter the property listed above to remove any graffiti. The City may contract with an independent contractor, consisting of crew leaders and staff, to perform the actual graffiti abatement. Owner/lessee understands that the contractor will not enter the property if it is determined that conditions on the property are not safe for performing the graffiti removal.
2. The City will provide any labor and materials needed to remove the graffiti free of charge. The performance of work is not dependent upon any reimbursement.
3. Neither the Contractor nor the City of Portland has, or will have, any responsibility or obligation, legal or otherwise, in connection with the work performed, or with the materials or equipment supplied, except as expressly stated herein.
4. The City cannot guarantee an exact paint match. Property owners are encouraged to provide paint if a closer or exact match is desired.

Eligibility Criteria for Graffiti Removal Service

The City of Portland provides no-cost or reduced-cost graffiti removal assistance to:

- Anyone impacted by hate graffiti and most gang graffiti.
- Businesses with 10 employees or fewer (cannot be a corporate franchise).
- Nonprofit organizations with 100 employees or fewer.
- Houses, condos, or apartment buildings with 1-10 units.

If you do not qualify for City assistance, there are businesses you can hire to remove the graffiti on your property. Find more information at www.portland.gov/graffiti-removal-service

Tips for Preventing Graffiti

The following actions can help prevent future graffiti:

- Plant fast-growing, low-maintenance bushes or trees along the sides of buildings. For example, “Rosa Rugosa” helps protect buildings and doesn’t need much attention once it is planted.
- Install lattice-work trellises on the side of your building and plant fast-growing vines beneath them to create a wall of leaves.
- Improve outside lighting.
- Commission a local artist to paint a mural on your building.

These suggestions come from Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design, a method used by city planners, landscape designers, and law enforcement to create a safer community.
