Permit Improvement Task Force Activity

Highlights:

- Endorsed resolution to bring to City Council re: streamline code and fee timing
- Endorsed recommendation for structure changes - hybrid with elements from multidisciplinary team and infrastructure development manager models; one point of contact for customer (dependent on financial feasibility)
- Beginning to see improvement from intake folder metrics related to Objective 1 projects
- Permit Timeline Dashboard - Average Time from Application Submittal thru Permit Issuance (rolling 12-month period)

Structure Elements

TEAMS

- Multi-disciplinary onboarding and training for all development review employees that creates a common understanding of what we are trying to accomplish
- Cross-training and cross-coverage
- Multi-disciplinary review teams
- Specialists and generalists, with floaters who can backfill
- Adequate staff capacity to meet quality, efficiency and equity goals

DECISIONS

- Clear, single, designated decision makers with final authority
- Defined processes to resolve conflict between bureaus, e.g., resolve repeating conflicts, analyze decisions over time, codify decisions/policy
- Council offices don't steer one-off situations

ACCESS & INTAKE

- Single point of contact for customers (Concierge/Navigator)
- Customer prescreen, early assistance and expedited feedback on the front end before application submittal e.g., subject matter experts earlier and/or technology pre-screen

CODE

- Interdisciplinary code/policy evaluation, creation and review

MULTI-LANE PROCESSING

- Multiple lanes that recognize different project types and applicant needs, such as: Licensed Design professionals, Historically underrepresented communities, New Construction, Affordable Housing, etc.
- Establish equitable access

TECH

- All bureaus share same technology

Task Force Immediate Next Steps

- Introduce recommendations to City Council
- Budget hearings on May 5 and May 11. Public testimony in support of Permit Improvement work across all Bureaus.
- Develop and lead integrated strategic plan to implement Task Force recommendations and create infrastructure to sustain Task Force momentum and focus
