This report details my response, witness interview, and officer interview associated with an Officer Involved Shooting that resulted in a fatality. Refer to all additional law enforcement reports for further details.

Narrative

On June 9th, 2019 at about 1036 hours, I was paged out by Detective Sergeant Michele Hughes to respond and investigate a fatal Officer Involved Shooting incident at 1331 NW Lovejoy St as part of the on call homicide detail. I arrived on the scene at about 1120 hours and sat in on a briefing with several additional investigators and the initial responding patrol officers in the mobile command precinct. I learned a male subject threatened a female subject with a knife in the stairwell of the building when police contacted them. The male subject was subsequently shot by police and was pronounced deceased at the scene.

EDWARD MICHAEL CONNORS, JR. interview

Detective Vince Cui and I contacted EDWARD MICHAEL CONNORS, JR. at 1331 NW Lovejoy St in the southwest corner of the building on the ground floor lobby area as he waited with Officer Jared Abby. I introduced ourselves as police detectives, gave CONNORS my business card, and asked if we could conduct a recorded interview with him regarding this incident. CONNORS agreed to conduct an interview with us and invited us up to his ninth floor office for privacy. This interview was audio recorded and later transcribed. The following is a brief summary of the key points of this interview. Refer to the transcript and or the audio recording, (Exhibit 1, Item #1), for this interview in its entirety.

Detective Vince Cui and I interviewed CONNORS at about 1247 hours in a conference room of his law firm located on the ninth floor of 1331 NW Lovejoy St. CONNORS told us he works as an attorney at "Hathaway and Larson", which is a real estate law firm. CONNORS told us this building consists of the Safeway Grocery Store on the bottom two floors, then a parking garage from floors three through sixth, and business offices from floors seventh through ninth. CONNORS told us

he arrived this morning at about 0940 hours and parked on either the 5th or 6th floor, as he was not positive, in the southwest corner of the parking garage, near the southwest stairs. CONNORS told me as he exited his vehicle he heard a fight or scuffle in the southwest stairwell. CONNORS told me he called 911 at about 0943 hours and reported a fight in this stairway area. CONNORS told us he decided to announce that he called 911 with the intent of interrupting this fight.

CONNORS told us he opened the stairwell door from the parking garage and poked his head inside and yelled down that he call 911 and the police were on the way. CONNORS told us he could still hear a scuffle going on down below his floor in the stairwell, but he could not see anyone. CONNORS told us he heard a male voice yell up to CONNORS something similar to, "I have a knife! I have a bomb! And, I have a hostage! Bring it! Do you know who I am?" CONNORS told us he yelled down, "No," in response to the unknown male subject's question, "Do you know who I am?" CONNORS told me next he heard a female voice yell, "Help!". CONNORS told us after he heard this subject say he was armed with a knife, a bomb, and a hostage, that he closed the stairwell door and moved away from it. CONNORS told us he next called 911 back at about 0943 hours to update them with the additional information. CONNORS told us he then took the elevator up to his office on the 9th floor.

CONNORS told us he then realized the police would likely need his access security card to make access to the elevators and stairwell areas. CONNORS told us he took the elevator down to the ground floor and then met with the police outside.

CONNORS told us he gave the police his access security card and the police entered the southwest corner entrance to the elevator access. CONNORS told us he stayed outside and later was directed by police to move to the southeast corner of the building. CONNORS told us he later saw police and paramedics attempting to assist the female victim in this incident.

CONNORS described her as a white female, about 5'7" to 5'8" tall, with a medium build, long brown hair, in her 20's, with unknown clothing. CONNORS told us this female was not cooperating with the paramedics and police as they attempted to render medical care to her. CONNORS reiterated that he never saw the male suspect during this incident.

We ended our interview with CONNORS at approximately 1306 hours.

Officer ALEXANDER QUINSLAND interview

Detective Billy Winters and I contacted and interviewed Officer ALEXANDER QUINSLAND, as a witness officer, along with his Portland Police Association representative, Officer Darryl Turner, in a private office area of the Detective Division. This interview was audio recorded and later transcribed. The following is a brief summary of the key points of this interview. Refer to the transcript and or the audio recording, (Exhibit 1, Item #2), for this interview in its entirety.

We began our interview at approximately 1441 hours. Officer Quinsland told us he works as a patrol officer at Central Precinct on the day shift from 0700 to 1700 hours. Officer Quinsland told us he has been a sworn Portland Police Officer for ten (10) years now. Officer Quinsland told us he attended a uniformed patrol roll call earlier this morning with his patrol officer coworkers. Officer Quinsland told us he was assigned to Central Precinct District 811. Officer Quinsland told us he responded to Officer Cassandra Wells request for cover in the area of NW 13th Avenue and NW Lovejoy St to a subject in the building stairwell allegedly armed with a knife, a bomb, and with a hostage. Officer Quinsland told us he arrived and met with Officers Cassandra Wells, Jackson Oldham, Amelia Flohr, and Nathan Kirby-Glatkowski. Officer Quinsland told us they made a plan to contact the suspect in the building stairwell.

Officer Quinsland told us they rode the southwest elevator to the ninth floor as the witness, (CONNORS), believed the suspect was on either the fifth or sixth floor southwest stairwell. Officer Quinsland told us they entered the stairwell from the ninth floor and descended as a group to approximately between the seventh and eighth floors stairwell area. Officer Quinsland told us the way the stairwell was configured they were able to look down the center area of the stairwell from their location between the seventh and eighth floor stairwell area and see the suspect and the female victim below them.

I asked Officer Quinsland to draw a diagram sketch of the stairwell, (Exhibit 1, Item #3). Officer Quinsland hand drew a sketch diagram of the stairwell area from their location perspective looking down approximately one and a half floors to the

suspect and the victim. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Wells and Flohr were initially in front of them looking down at the suspect and victim, with Officer Wells assigned as the contact officer and Officer Flohr assigned as the lethal cover. Officer Wells told us Officer Oldham was positioned in between Officers Wells and Flohr assigned as less lethal cover. Officer Quinsland told us he was on the left and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski was on the right behind them assigned as the custody team and Officer Quinsland was also assigned to give radio broadcasts.

Officer Quinsland told us he could see the suspect standing below them on what he thought was the sixth floor, blocking the victim's access to the stairwell door or the stairs going up or down. Officer Quinsland told us the victim was crouched in the right corner below them and he thought Officer Kirby-Glatkowski saw that the female was completely naked from the waist down. Officer Wells and Flohr announced the suspect was armed with a knife. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Wells gave several commands to the suspect to drop the knife he was holding. Officer Quinsland told us the suspect was very aggressive and uncooperative with Officer Wells' repeated commands to drop the knife. Officer Quinsland told us possibly Officer Wells told them that the female victim was bleeding. Officer Quinsland told us the suspect was wielding his knife in his right hand, with his chest out and arms out, in a challenging stance.

Officer Quinsland told us he announced on the radio that they were challenging the suspect in the southwest sixth floor stairwell area and for cover to respond to the eighth floor. Officer Quinsland told us Sergeant Israel Hill radioed that he could not respond without the access security card. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Flohr left the scene with the access card to let Sergeant Hill in and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski took Officer Flohr's position as lethal cover to the right of Officer Wells. Officer Quinsland told us Officers Wells and Kirby-Glatkowski were both in kind of a prone position looking down at the suspect. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Wells continued to challenge the suspect without any success. Officer Quinsland told us next Officer Oldham announced "Less Lethal". Officer Quinsland told us Officer Oldham's first two (2) less lethal shots appeared to have absolutely no effect on the suspect. Officer Quinsland told us he suggested Officer Oldham change his position while firing the less lethal as it appeared they were having no effect on the suspect. Officer Quinsland told us he thought maybe the less lethal rounds Officer Oldham fired initially at the suspect may have deflected off something. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Oldham changed his position higher and fired two (2) more less lethal rounds for a total of four (4) rounds.

Officer Quinsland told us possibly, simultaneously to Officer Oldham changing his position and deploying possibly the third or last (fourth) less lethal round, that he saw the suspect move to the female victim and place his left arm around her neck from behind her, and point the knife in his right hand toward the area of the female victim's neck using her as a human shield and began moving to their left or the suspect's right side. Officer Quinsland next heard a single gunshot. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Kirby-Glatkowski shot the suspect. Officer Quinsland saw the suspect had been shot in the head as there was blood coming from his head and saw blood hit the wall behind the suspect. Officer Quinsland saw the suspect fall in the general area where they initially contacted him at the scene. Officer Quinsland marked the suspect's resting position with an arrow on his diagram. Officer Quinsland told us the suspect was obviously deceased.

Officer Quinsland told us the female victim walk away descending down the stairs after the shot. Officer Quinsland told us he ran down the stairs and caught up with the female victim. Officer Quinsland told us the female victim was naked from the waist down and he thought her pants were down around her ankles. Officer Quinsland told us he told the female victim to pull up her pants. Officer Oldham then contacted the female victim and stayed with her. Officer Quinsland told us he saw the knife lying on the first or second stair going down to the left of their location or to the right of the suspect's resting position. Officer Quinsland marked his diagram with an arrow pointing to the location of the knife. Officer Quinsland described the knife as a tactical folding, serrated, maybe four (4) inch blade knife, with possibly a red handle, but he was not sure. Officer Quinsland described the male suspect as a white male, balding with brownish hair, and about 6'00" tall. Officer Quinsland told us he believed this male suspect was very agitated, aggressive, and a threat to the female victim.

Officer Quinsland told us he requested Code 3 Medical. Officer Quinsland told us they announced shots fired on the radio and that the suspect was deceased. Officer Quinsland told us Officer Oldham escorted the female victim downstairs to Medical. Officer Quinsland also began to direct resources on the radio.

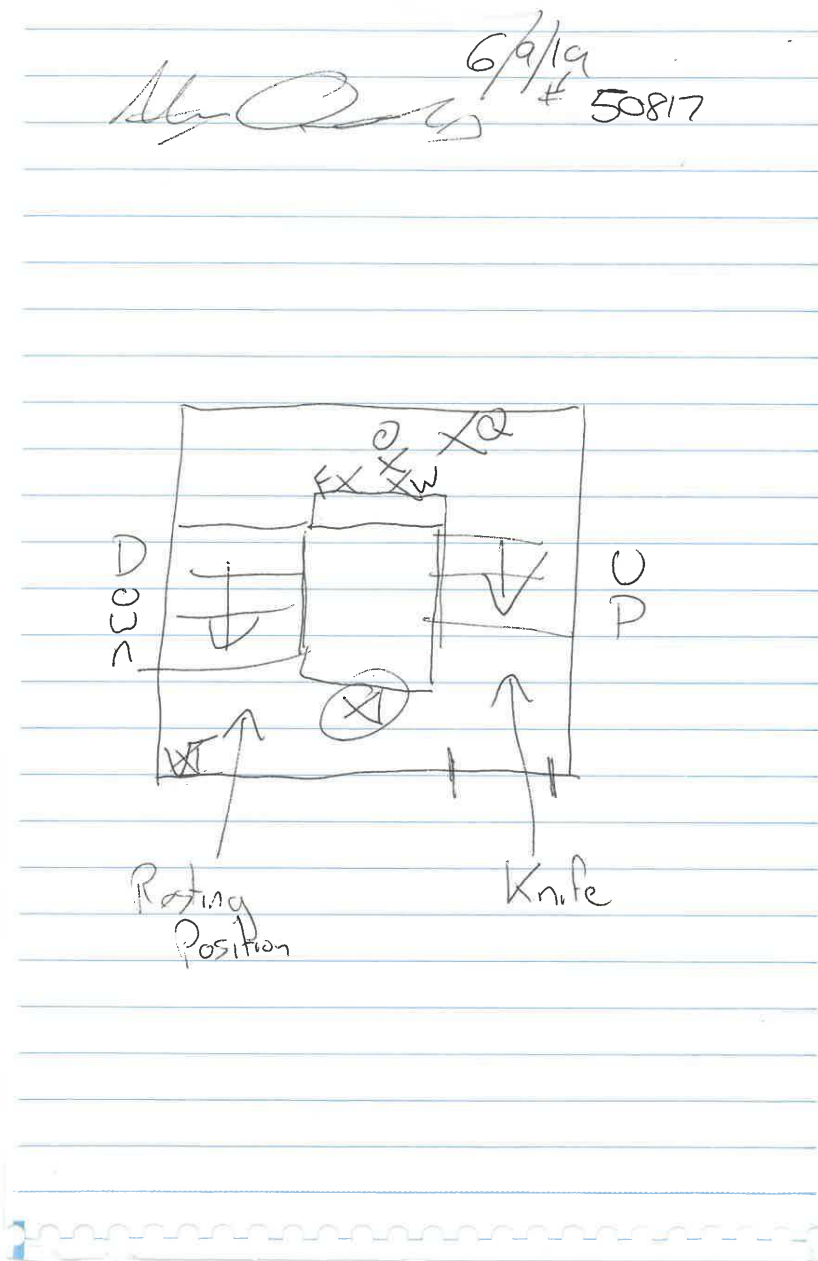

DUFFY told me she did not hear anything of note. DUFFY told me she saw police cars and crime scene tape once she awoke.

I spoke with Brandon ATWELL who lived at the Enso Apartments (1400 NW Marshall Street, Apartment [REDACTED], Portland). ATWELL told me he had been at the gym and walked back to his apartment at around 1000 hours. ATWELL told me he observed police Officers putting up crime scene tape. The interior windows inside ATWELL'S apartment faced east towards 1331 NW Lovejoy Street, where the incident took place. ATWELL gave me permission to take photographs of the view from his apartment window. I took several photographs of 1331 NW Lovejoy Street, which I later uploaded onto DIMS.

I knocked on apartment #509, with no response.

On June 9, 2019 at 1439 hours, I entered the crime scene with Detective Sergeant Hughes. My role was crime scene support.

Narrative:

On 06/09/2019 at approximately 1030 hours I responded to assist on a report of an officer-involved shooting at 1331 NW Lovejoy St. The A/Sgt., Criminalist Paul Ware, asked me to begin by taking photographs of a woman at Emanuel Hospital, who'd reportedly been held at knifepoint by the man who was shot by an officer.

Upon arrival at Emanuel Hospital I was directed by nursing staff to ER Room #6, where Ms. Bethanie Marie Johnson (F/W, DOB: [REDACTED]), was recovering. Ms. Johnson had been sedated, but was awake and aware of her surroundings enough to persistently refuse to allow nursing staff to clean the wound on her forehead. I was assisted by Nurse Brittany Atkinson, who told me the wound did not look like a cut to her, but a laceration. Nurse Atkinson conducted an examination of Ms. Johnson, and said she did not appear to have any injuries other than to her head/face, and some significant bruising on her outer right arm below the elbow.

Nurse Atkinson provided me the clothing items they'd removed from Ms. Johnson in order to conduct an examination. Officer Simmons (#51897) assisted me as I bagged the items and completed a property sheet (PER #A134729). I provided the yellow copy of the receipt to Ms. Johnson.

Using a Nikon D850 digital camera I took color digital photographs of Ms. Johnson's face, neck, hands, and right forearm.

Nurse Atkinson was present to assist me. Ms. Johnson refused to allow nurses to clean her head wound so I was not able to see it completely, but it appeared to be at least one inch wide and one half inch tall and was located at her hairline in the center of her forehead. The bruising on her right forearm was bright reddish-purple, and was approximately four inches long and three inches tall. Ms. Johnson refused to answer when I asked if she had pain or injury elsewhere.

I drove to the site of the shooting, 1331 NW Lovejoy St., to assist other criminalists with processing the scene. Using a Nikon D850 digital camera I took color digital photographs of the scene. After detectives had reviewed the scene and items of evidence were placarded I photographed the scene again. I completed property sheets, and with the help of Criminalists McIntyre, Becker, and Ware, I collected and secured the above listed items of evidence. Criminalist Ware transported the items on PER #A130561 to the blood evidence locker at Rivergate. I secured the remaining items in the FED vault overnight, and submitted them to PED via the FED outgoing locker the next day, after taking color digital photographs of Ms. Johnson's clothing items.

I uploaded the photos into DIMS for archiving.

On June 9th, 2019, at approximately 0943 hours, Central Precinct Officers were dispatched to 1331 NW Lovejoy in the parking garage on the report of a disturbance of a male and female yelling possibly on the 5th or 6th floor. Officers arrived and located a male and female in the stairwell. During the contact with officers the male subject took the female hostage while holding a knife. Officers attempted to get the male to release the female and at some point a officer involved shooting occurred. The subject was deceased from the shooting. I was notified by Detective Sergeant Hughes to respond to assist with the investigation of the Officer Involved Shooting. I was directed to respond to 1331 NW Lovejoy Street to assist. I was notified at 10:36 hours to respond and I arrived at 11:20 hours. I was assigned to interview Bethanie Johnson who was the female that was taken hostage by the suspect in the stairwell. I learned she had been transported to Emanuel Hospital due to the injuries she had received from the suspect prior to the shooting.

The following will be a brief summary of the interview with Bethanie Johnson and for full details listen to the audio recording of the interview. For additional details see other reports written related to this incident.

On June 9th, 2019, at approximately 12:13 hours, Detective Sergeant Santos who was assisting with the Officer Involved Shooting investigation requested Detective Law and I respond to Emanuel Hospital to interview Bethanie Johnson who was the female victim that was taken hostage by the suspect in the stairwell and was being held at the time of the shooting. Bethanie had been transported by AMR to Emanuel Hospital because of the injuries she had received by the suspect prior to the shooting. At approximately 12:25 hours, Detective Law and I arrived at Emanuel Hospital and we went to the Emergency Room to meet with Officer Simmons who was with Bethanie. I spoke with Officer Simmons who told me, Bethanie has [REDACTED]. Officers Simmons told me Bethanie had been yelling and screaming at staff preventing any kind of treatment to her injuries at the time. Officer Simmons told me he had learned the doctor had [REDACTED] on Bethanie at time.

Officer Simmons told me he was able to get a brief interview with Bethanie while she was calm in the waiting room #7.

After the briefing from Officer Simmons, I observed Bethanie who was acting out and yelling at the nurses to leave her alone and Bethanie was making statements to the nurses that she wanted to leave the hospital. I was able to introduce myself to Bethanie and told her I was a Detective. I explained to Bethanie I need to talk to her about what had happened today. Bethanie told me okay. Bethanie explained she yells at times, [REDACTED].

Bethanie explained she lives downtown on the street and hangs out in Old Town / Chinatown. Bethanie stated today (referring to June 9th) she met a guy near the Greyhound bus mall and they agreed to walk up to Safeway. Bethanie stated the guy she met was a white guy, with brown hair, 5'10, brown eyes, maybe he was wearing a plaid shirt and unknown pants. Bethanie stated she had never met the guy before. Bethanie stated when they got to Safeway, they were going to shoot up. Bethanie stated she did not shoot up but the guy did. Bethanie stated they had been up in the stairwell for about twenty minutes and the guy started to get mad and threw her up against the wall three or four times. Bethanie stated she had not done anything

wrong, and the guy threw her against the wall. Bethanie stated she screamed out. Bethanie explained that she had taken her clothes off on her own and was messing around with the guy prior to him throwing her against the wall. Bethanie stated the guy punched her with a fist three or four times across the forehead.

Bethanie stated she was not was not free to go because the guy was blaming her for taking his stuff. Bethanie stated she remembers the police coming. Bethanie stated the guy did not have a knife at first but then pulled out a knife and held her against him with the knife to her throat and the person shot from up above them. Bethanie stated she was being held by the guy, when she was shot. Bethanie thinks the police were a couple flights up. Bethanie stated the knife was at my throat when they were yelling at him and he was yelling back. Bethanie stated she thought the guy was holding the knife to her throat for a few minutes.

Bethanie stated she was not free to go and he wouldn't let her go.

I concluded my interview with Bethanie at that time. For full details listen to the CD/R or read the transcription of the interview.

This case is still on going.

Summary

This report details a recorded interview with Central Precinct Officer Amelia Flohr regarding an Officer Involved Shooting that occurred on June 9, 2019 at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street.

Narrative

On June 9, 2019, I responded to a homicide call-out from Sgt. M. Hughes regarding an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. Upon arriving, I attended an onscene briefing and learned Central Precinct Officers responded to an active disturbance in a stairwell of 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. A 911 caller (identified as Edward "Mike" Conners Jr) reported a disturbance in the stairwell of the location involving a male and female (refer to Det. Merrill's report regarding Conners' statement). The officers used both less and lethal force against the male subject, who was reported to have a knife and threatened that he had an explosive device. The female victim (identified as Bethanie Johnson) was subsequently transported to the hospital (refer to Det. Winters report for Johnson's statement).

I assisted Det. Merrill with a recorded interview of Conners, who heard the disturbance after he parked his car at location to do some work at his law office (which is located on the 9th floor).

Det. Law and I were assigned to interview Ofc. Amelia Flohr, who worked a partner car with Ofc. Cassandra Wells. This report is a brief summary of Ofc. Flohr's recorded interview and not meant to be verbatim. Please refer to the recording and/or transcript for complete details.

OFC AMELIA FLOHR STATEMENT

On June 9, 2019, at approximately 1509 hours, Det. Law and I did a recorded interview with Ofc. Flohr at the Detective Division. Ofc. Flohr was represented by PPA President Daryl Turner. The interview has two recorded files because the

digital recorder battery died during the interview. The recordings were placed on a disk and submitted as evidence under PED Receipt #A003930.

Per Ofc. Flohr, she and Ofc. Wells were in a partner car she when they responded to a radio call regarding an argument in the SW stairwell of 1331 NW Lovejoy. While enroute, Ofc. Flohr said they read an update that the caller had yelled down the stairwell to the people arguing and that someone yelled back that he had a knife, a hostage, and a bomb. The person in the stairwell also said he was ready for the police to come get him. As they got to scene, Ofc. Flohr said she had coordinated with the 911 caller to gain access to the building, and met him at NW 13th and Marshall.

Ofc. Flohr described their planning process and how they entered the stairwell from the 9th floor. She said she was assigned to be lethal cover while Ofc. Wells was the contact officer (commands), Ofc. Oldham was less lethal, Ofc. Quinsland was the radio contact, and Ofc. Kerby was going to be "hands on" (custody). Ofc. Flohr mentioned that she heard a male voice as they entered the stairwell say something like, "Get out."

Ofc. Flohr mentioned they ended in between the 7th and 8th floors when she saw male's head. She described the male as a balding white male with an orange t-shirt. She said she could see a fixed blade knife in one hand and a "dead-man" switch in the other as he was waving arms towards them. Although she couldn't see the female half, Ofc. Flohr said she knew the female was there because the other officers were verbalizing the female's location. Ofc. Flohr drew a diagram detailing their positions (which was submitted as evidence).

Ofc. Flohr said Ofc. Wells was giving the male commands to drop the weapon and warnings that they might have to use force, but he was not complying. When asked if the male appeared agitated, Ofc. Flohr said, "Oh yeah he seemed to be really worked up. Um, I could see like spit coming out of his mouth when he was yelling." She said Ofc. Oldman tried to hit him with less-lethal, and she thought the male was hit once or twice. She said the male bent over and she thought he was going to comply but he continued to wave both of his hands around again with the knife and "dead-man switch." Ofc. Flohr stated, "Um, so at that point I was getting ready to shoot him if he turned around and tried to uh, stab the girl... Or like run at us or something." Ofc. Flohr said she had her gun out but holstered it because the male took a step back, and she did not have a clear shot anymore.

Ofc. Flohr described trying to find a new spot to be useful, but then was tasked with using the access card to let additional arriving officers into the building. She said she went back upstairs and was entering the elevator when she heard a radio update that shots were fired. Ofc. Flohr brought the additional officers back to the 9th floor where they accessed the stairwell. She mentioned that as she came down, she noticed the less-lethal canisters on the stairwell as well as a shell casing (which she placed a business card over).

Ofc. Flohr said she saw the male on ground who appeared obviously dead (she described a pool of blood around him and noticed he wasn't moving). Ofc. Flohr stated she never saw the female victim because she had been taken out of the stairwell by the time she returned. Ofc. Flohr said she secured the scene by putting tape up. She mentioned she had to step over the male to get out because he was on a landing.

Ofc. Flohr said they were separated and she was initially with Ofc. Wells, but they didn't communicate other than asking if each was okay. Ofc. Flohr was then brought to the Detective Division and waited in the large conference room pending her interview with us. After the interview, Ofc. Flohr was sent back to the conference room where she was issued a communication restriction and released back to Central Precinct.

As mentioned above, this report is a summary of Ofc. Flohr's interview and any omissions were not intentional. Refer to the recording/transcript for complete details.

SUMMARY

On June 9, 2019, at approximately 1036 hours, I was called out to assist with an officer involved shooting at 1313 NW Lovejoy St. I arrived on-scene and attended a briefing where I learned that a subject, later identified as David Downs, had been shot and killed by Officer Kirby-Glatkowski after holding a knife to Bethanie Johnson's neck. Sergeant Hughes asked Detective Gradwahl and I to interview Officer Bob Miller. This report contains a summary of Officer Miller's statement; the complete interview can be reviewed on a CD that was submitted into evidence on the listed receipt. The interview was also transcribed and will be available for review.

NARRATIVE

On June 9, 2019, at approximately 1540 hours, Detective Gradwahl and I interviewed Officer Miller at the Portland Police Detective Division in an interview room regarding his actions at the scene of an officer involved shooting that occurred earlier in the day at 1313 NW Lovejoy St. Officer Miller was represented in the interview by Portland Police Association President Daryl Turner. Officer Miller told Detective Gradwahl and I the following.

Officer Miller said he was currently assigned to North Precinct afternoon shift but also had a detached position with the Portland Police Explosive Disposal Unit (EDU) as a bomb technician. Officer Miller said earlier today he received a page from EDU Sgt. Steve Collins requesting a bomb tech who was available to respond to an officer involved shooting at 1313 NW Lovejoy St. where the suspect might have a bomb. Officer Miller responded to the call where he met up with Sgt. Collins who informed him that the suspect, who was now deceased, told officers he had a bomb and was holding something in his hand that officer(s) believed could be a "dead-man" switch. Officer Miller explained that a "dead-man" switch detonated an explosive device when pressure was released from a button/switch.

Officer Miller said he and Sgt. Collins consulted with Detective Kammerer and then went to the sixth floor so they could observe the subject and look for any explosive devices. Officer Miller said the plan was to observe the scene and then take photographs prior to moving or disturbing anything. Officer Miller said he and Sgt. Collins went to the sixth floor and observed the subject, who was deceased, in the landing of the stairwell on the sixth floor. Officer Miller said Sgt. Collins took three photographs of the scene on Officer Miller's bureau issued cell phone. Officer Miller said he did not locate an explosive device, however, he did observe a flashlight that was approximately six to seven inches long with a button on the end lying near the suspect. Officer Miller said he observed a plastic cup with something electronic stuck in it behind the suspect. Officer Miller said the plastic cup was behind the suspect along the north wall. Officer Miller said clothing was covering most of the plastic cup but he could see what appeared to be a wire sticking out from under the clothing. Officer Miller said he was concerned the wire could possibly be an antenna for a radio controlled IED so he moved the clothing to have a better look. Officer Miller said the wire was actually Para cord and confirmed the plastic cup was not a device.

Officer Miller said while he was inspecting the area for explosive devices he also observed a knife lying on the stairs near the suspect. After Officer Miller and Sgt. Collins determined the scene was safe they returned to the staging area and waited to be interviewed. Detective Gradwahl and I concluded the interview.

I was at Central precinct as an Acting Sgt. when BOEC broadcasted a call re: HEARING SOUNDS OF A FIGHT FROM SW CRNR STAIRWELL. THINKS NEAR 4-5TH FLOORS...

I then heard an Officer state he was going as less lethal and another Officer was enroute as cover in addition to the two-person car that was initially dispatched. I felt that this call could possibly ramp up due to my training and experience. It sounded like a physical altercation that was still active and needed Police.

On my way to the call I advised via radio that I was en route and asked if there was any updated information about weapons scene or known of. Officer Wells updated me that they were actively hearing voices but had not made contact with the subjects yet, and unknown if weapons were a factor.

Upon my arrival, I observed Ofc Moussallem at the front entrance of the listed address with a male later known to me as Conners. Conners was the original caller. I asked Officer Moussallem where the other responding Officer were and he informed me they were already upstairs attempting to contact the suspect due to the rapidly evolving nature of the call. I went inside to the lobby and attempted to take the elevator to the 6th floor but the entire building was secured with entry only via secured key cards.

As I was coming back out to the street from inside the lobby I asked via radio if someone could break off from the contact team, and bring the secure key card to give me access to the floor they were on. I did not get a response. I asked Conners if he had an alternate way to get me into the building. Conners and I went outside to attempt access to the parking garage through Safeway which is connected to the building. I heard an Officer then say they had eyes on the suspect, who had a knife to the victims throat. The Officer then updated that he deployed less lethal but they were still engaging the suspect. I knew at that point I needed to make a SERT Sgt notification for an activation, as I reached for my radio, I heard an Officer transmit that a SERT notification needed to be made. I then observed Officer Moussallem who was also outside the building with no access in, state that Officers are in the stairwell and he was standing at the only first floor exit so he would stay there and challenge the suspect if he ran down the stairs.

(This entire call to this point had evolved in less than 3 minuets). There was no time to stage for a tactical plan, and time was not on our side.

I attempted to again make my way to Safeway to enter the building through the parking structure and I heard another radio transmission stating there were shots fired and the suspect was down and most likely deceased. I again got on the radio and told them I still do not have good access to them. Officer Flohr was able to get the secure key card and come down the elevator to take me up with her. I am unsure of which floor we got off on but I remember exiting the elevator and running down approximately two flights of stairs.

I observed a male laying on the ground inside the 6th floor stairwell with a very large pool of blood and I heard an Officer state the suspect was deceased. I asked for medical to start via radio. I told all officers to back out of the stairwell, string up crime scene tape and start a crime scene log. I identified and separated the involved Officer and the witness Officers. I notified my Lieutenant and Homicide detectives immediately. Union representatives were notified, I requested IPR PSD, EAP, and the PIO. I also formed a plan with Captain Crooker and Sgt Carroll of what streets to block off for the Mobile Command Centers and the media staging area.

I later learned that AMR went to the female victim who was still on scene on the first floor with Officer Jones. It appeared that the suspect was clearly deceased from his head injury and the amount of blood underneath is head. The suspect also did not respond to Officers movements or voices.

Within minuets, Captain Crooker arrived and took over as the IC via radio

Once the scene had been established and all resources were on scene or en-route, I contacted Conners via phone. Conners stated, this building is a business, not an apartment complex. Conners works for a law firm on the 9th floor but was walking towards a fifth floor elevator when he heard a commotion in the SW stairwell. Conners called dispatch and simultaneously yelled out of the elevator that Police were on their way. Conners stated he heard a male yell something to the effect of, "Tell them to come on, I've got a bomb, a hostage, and knife!" Conners relayed that to dispatch as well. Conners stated Police arrived shortly after. Conners noted that a safeway employee stated they had seen the woman walking around the store before but she appeared to be in a [REDACTED] whenever they saw her, but never noticed her being with a male at any time.

I heard Officers indicate that they had deployed less lethal and that they were ineffective. I also heard the suspect was holding a knife to a female's throat. I also responded in case assistance was needed.

While enroute I heard officers state that shots had been fired. I also heard officer request that medical respond and that he suspect was deceased.

I arrived on scene and advised I was taking charge of the scene as incident commander. I could see an AMR medic coming from the area of the stairwell. I confirmed that the subject was deceased and that the involved officers were uninjured.

I spoke briefly with Sgt. Hill and Sgt. Sutton to coordinate notifications. I then pulled the involved officers to the far end of the parking garage as more units arrived.

As units arrived I separated the involved officers and paired them with officers that were not involved. I then assisted officers in setting up crime scene and putting up tape.

We took the 6th floor as well as the 7th floor and 5th floor. The adjacent business (Safeway) was also closed. I then called and notified PIO Officer Ibarra and set up a media staging area.

I then coordinated having the North and East Mobile precincts respond. I also spoke with Sgt. Slyter of East precinct and asked if they could assist with monitoring calls. (Sgt. Sessions supervised regular Central traffic) When PPOA representatives arrived I directed them to the involved officers. Detectives arrived and took over the investigation.

I then assisted in making sure that uninvolved officers that were securing the crime scene were relieved and brought food and water.

At 1607 hours I turned over command of the crime scene to Sgt. Maxey.

On June 9, 2019, while in uniform and operating a marked police vehicle I was assigned as one of three patrol supervisors for Central Precinct Day shift. At about 0943 in the morning I heard a call for service come out at 1331 NW Lovejoy St regarding the "sounds of a fight."

After a minute or so I heard Officer Wells tell dispatch she copied the update in the call even though the update was not put out over the air. At that point I looked at the call to read the update. The update on the call stated one of the individuals involved in the disturbance had told the caller "Tell the cops I'm waiting for them and I have a hostage and a bomb" and also mentioned having a knife. At that point I asked Officer Wells over the radio if she had a less lethal operator on the call. Officer Oldham was then dispatched as a less lethal operator.

I was inside Central Precinct when I heard updates on the call stating they had made contact with the subjects and a male was holding a female hostage with a knife to her throat. They requested SERT be activated then stated less lethal rounds had been deployed and were not effective. At that point I began going Code 3 to the location. While on my way there I heard that shots had been fired.

When I arrived, I had a difficult time finding an entrance to the building and had to ask Officer Walz who showed me the way. I also verified with her officers had fired shots and the suspect was deceased. I arrived on the 6th floor of the parking garage of the location listed above along with A/Sergeant Carroll, who stated over the radio he would be the Incident Commander.

I immediately noticed Officer Wells was standing near the entrance to the stairs along with Officer Kirby-Glatkowski, Officer Quinsland, and Officer Oldham. They all still had their rubber gloves on. I motioned to all four of them to walk toward me and away from the location of the shooting. I asked them if and how they were involved. Officer Wells told me Officer Kirby-Glatkowski had fired his handgun, she stated she'd instructed him to do so after they'd discussed it and formulated a plan, Officer Oldham had fired less lethal 40 millimeter rounds, and Officer Quinsland had witnessed the shooting. I asked if there were more witness officers and was told there were not.

I reminded them all they were not to discuss the incident, and requested additional officers and vehicles to come up to the 6th floor of the parking garage in order to keep them separated.

I instructed Officer Bonczijk to stay with Officer Kirby-Glatkowski, Officer Flohr to stay with Officer Wells, Officer Ivarsson to stay with Officer Quinsland, and Officer Miller to stay with Officer Oldham. Each pair was separated into different cars until detectives, union representation, and their attorneys arrived.

Following that, I spoke with A/Sergeant Carroll and A/Sergeant Hill to verify we had made all the necessary notifications. Upon that review, I learned most of the notifications were already made, but that we still needed to make contact with our chain of command, the Professional Standards Division and Independent Police Review. I then made contact with my lieutenant and my captain. I asked one of the sergeants, who was talking on the radio at the time, to ask for the Professional Standards Division and the Independent Police Review to be paged to my cell phone. I received a call from Lieutenant Bates from PSD and he told me he would contact Internal Affairs and IPR.

A/Captain Crooker informed me he was on the way, and asked I page the Explosives Disposal Unit to my cell phone due to the bomb threat and make sure it was documented we had established a "one point in, one point out" location for the crime scene log. We'd already established that, but hadn't stated it over the radio. I did both of those things following those requests. I also verified we had officers guarding the stairwell on the floors above and below the 6th floor.

Soon after that, A/Captain Crooker arrived and took over command of the incident. He requested I stay with him for the duration of the incident. I followed all instructions from him from that point on. I was tasked with delegating one officer, Officer Abby, to take full control of the elevators. Officer Abby accompanied every person who needed access to the building to every floor and back down to the bottom floor. Officer Jones guarded the door leading to the elevators while Officer Abby was escorting people in the elevator.

Once EDU had arrived I briefed them. I also instructed Officer Flohr to provide a description of the suspect to the EDU sergeant.

I stayed on scene doing menial tasks such as bringing snacks and water to the involved and witness officers until I was relieved from the scene by detectives.

On 6/9/19 I responded as a cover officer to a call of a disturbance at 1331 NW Lovejoy St.

Call information stated that the caller heard two people fighting in the stairwell of the apartment building at this location. The caller stated that he yelled down the stairwell that he was calling the police. A male yelled back that he had a knife and a bomb and would be waiting for police.

When I arrived on scene we made contact with the caller who confirmed that he had yelled down the stairwell that he was calling police. He told us that he heard a male and female voice and the male replied by saying that he had a knife, a bomb, and that he would be waiting for police. The caller also told us that he heard a female yell that she needed help.

Once Officer Oldham arrived with a less lethal we made a plan to enter the stairwell in order to make contact with the involved subjects. I volunteered to stay outside and cover the exterior exit. (Later Officer Abbey also arrived on scene and joined me at my position.)

The caller informed us that access to the building was restricted to residents with a key card. As a result, he provided officers with his key card so that they could access the sixth floor where the subjects were.

As I covered the exterior door I could hear over the radio as officers made contact with the subject, state that he was armed with a knife, and that he was uncooperative.

Officers asked for medical to stage nearby. I then heard as officers stated that they were utilizing a less lethal round and I could hear a single less lethal round deploy. I heard officers state that the round was ineffective and that they were utilizing a second round as I heard another less lethal round deploy.

However, I then heard an officer state that less lethal rounds had been ineffective and the male subject was holding the knife to the female's throat.

I then heard a single round from a firearm and then officers call "shots fired" followed by officers stating that the subject was "55."



I attached to assist with the priority disturbance call after other officers had called out shots fired on the radio. When I arrived I took a position outside of the listed address with Officer Jones and the female victim, Bethanie JOHNSON.

JOHNSON was on the sidewalk of the southern side of the location when I arrived. She was bleeding from the forehead and looked extremely distraught. JOHNSON was screaming incoherently and appeared to be in shock.

AMR staff and Officer Jones tried to talk JOHNSON into going to the hospital but she kept screaming that she was fine and didn't need to go. JOHNSON was jumping up and down and acting very erratic. I was concerned that she was in such a state of shock that she could not make rational decisions for herself. If her head injury was left unchecked she could be in danger of a serious medical incident.

JOHNSON said she wanted to leave and started walking away. Officer Jones advised SGT's on scene that JOHNSON was leaving. SGT's told us not to let JOHNSON leave the scene.

Officer Jones and I re-contacted JOHNSON about 1 block east of the location. At this time I placed JOHNSON into custody [REDACTED]. JOHNSON continued jumping up and down [REDACTED] but she did not resist or fight custody in any way. JOHNSON was sedated by AMR and transported to Legacy Emanuel [REDACTED].

While enroute to Emanuel I was told a SANE Nurse was responding for a sexual assault kit. I requested a SAVA advocate respond as well. Later the SANE nurse was cancelled when JOHNSON indicated to medical staff that no sexual assault had occurred. SAVA was also cancelled.

When we arrived at Emanuel JOHNSON was well sedated and not communicating. She was placed in a hospital room. Doctors removed her clothing to examine her and make sure she had no other injuries.

FED responded and took control of JOHNSON's clothing from the incident after it was determined SANE Nurses would not be responding. FED also took pictures of JOHNSON's injury while at Emanuel.

Once the sedative wore off JOHNSON began indicating she wanted to leave the hospital. I notified Homicide Detectives that she wanted to leave and I wasn't sure if she would be [REDACTED] by the hospital. SGT Carroll asked me to attempt to get a statement from JOHNSON if she was coherent.

See statement attachment for JOHNSON's statement. JOHNSON was not very cooperative and the interview was cut short when she started yelling, "Ouch! Ouch! I want to leave!" and demanding her clothing be returned.

Homicide detectives arrived and took over at Legacy Emanuel at approximately 1300 hours. At that time the medical staff at Legacy Emanuel had decided to keep JOHNSON on [REDACTED].

The [REDACTED] paperwork was entered as an orphan document at Central Precinct.

I interviewed Bethanie JOHNSON while she was under the care of Legacy Emanuel. JOHNSON is [REDACTED] and was not very cooperative with the interview.

JOHNSON told me she was inside a stairwell with the male suspect. JOHNSON said she had not met the suspect before but and didn't know his name. She told me he was smoking meth in the stairwell of the building. She described him as a white male, 6' tall, brown hair, brown eyes, and wearing a long sleeve button up shirt.

JOHNSON told me, "The guy got mad because he thought I took his dope so he punched me."

I asked JOHNSON how many times she was punched and she responded, "Three times."

I asked JOHNSON if the suspect had any weapons and she responded, "Yeah. It's like a silver pocket knife."

JOHNSON initially told me she didn't remember what the suspect did with the knife but when I asked her if she was sure she said, "He held it to me." I asked JOHNSON where it was held and she said, "My neck." I asked where the man was standing when he held the knife to her neck. JOHNSON replied, "Behind me."

On the above date and time I heard a call go out over the radio involving a disturbance at a garage at NW 14th and NW Lovejoy. I heard the primary officer handling the call ask for a less lethal officer to respond. I also heard the officer say that the building was large and she was having difficulty figuring out where the disturbance was taking place. As a result I began to respond to the location to attempt to assist officers. As I was nearing the location I heard officers state that they could hear a male and female arguing in the stairwell nearest NW Lovejoy and NW 14th. As I arrived I observed OFC MOUSSALLEM standing by a stairwell exit door. He advised me this was the stairwell that the disturbance was occurring in. I posted at the bottom of the stairs with him to cover him in the event the suspect attempted to flee through the dooor.

At that time I heard officers engaging the suspect over the radio. It was updated that he was non-compliant and was armed with a knife and was holding that knife to a females throat. I could heard two distinct shots, as I heard officers state that they fired less-lethal munitions at the suspect, but they were not effective. A few seconds later I heard a much louder bang come from the stairwell and then an update that an officer fired a shot and that the suspect was running down the stairwell. I held my handgun at a low ready position in the event that the armed suspect exited the stairwell. It was then updated that the suspect was deceased.

At that time I immediately began to set up crime scene tape. The office building this occurred in takes up an entire square city blocks. I surrounded the entire building with crime scene tape and then extended the crime scene to cover NW 14th ave, from NW Lovejoy st to NW Northrup st. I returned to the corner of NW Lovejoy and NW 14th when I was approached by an EDWARD MICHAEL CONNERS JR. CONNERS stated he was the one who called 911 and wanted to check to see if everything was alright. I asked him what exactly happened this morning. CONNERS explained that he works on the 9th floor of the building. He stated he came to work this morning around 0947 hours. CONNERS stated he parks on the 5th floor and takes the elevator to the 9th. He stated that as he was walking to the elevator he heard, what he believed to be two people fighting. CONNERS stated that he continued to his officer to drop off his bag and called 911. CONNERS stated he returned to the stairwell and yelled "BETTER BREAK IT UP GUYS I CALLED THE POLICE". CONNERS said he was surprised when a males voice answered and said "THAT'S FINE, BRING IT ON, I HAVE A KNIFE, A BOMB, AND A HOSTAGE". CONNERS stated this prompted him to call 911 a second time to give an update to what he had heard the first time. CONNERS said he realized that police wouldn't be able to access the building without a key card so he went downstairs and waited for officers to arrive. I explained to CONNERS that this became a major incident and that detectives would want to get a

statement from him. CONNERS was cooperatvie and agreed to wait on location until he could be formally interviewed.

At that time I was approached by a JAMES LaBIANCO. JAMES explained that he was the district manager for safeway and requested access to that portion of the building so that he could turn off all of the heating elements so there wasn't a fire. I escorted JAMES inside of the store where he was left to do his business.

For the remainder of the time on scene I assisted officers with elevator access and maintained crime scene integrity.

I dispatched to 1331 NW Lovejoy St after the report of "shots fired." There I initially helped Ofc Jackson with dealing with a female victim of an assault, Ms Bethanie M JOHNSON. She was outside the location on NW Lovejoy between NW 14th Ave and NW 13th Ave. She had a fair amount of dried blood on her forehead and face which appeared to come from her hairline. She was highly animated and later said [REDACTED]. Medical was attempting to get her to go to the hospital which she adamantly refused. She stated she did not want to be touched even to help her with her head injury. I took pictures of her injuries and later uploaded them into DIMS.

I was able to ask her a few questions. She said she did not know the suspect prior to today and did not know his name. She said he hit her with his fist. I asked her how many times and she said "like 3 or something." She was more concerned with her left behind personal items which she said included a gray bag with white letters on it, a small red/burgundy purse, 3 t-shirts and a pair of corral pink shoes around size 8.5.

I asked her if she had a phone number which she said she does not but she had an email and she said she usually sleeps in Old Town on the street.

She seemed to be in shock and fearful of medical/fire taking her to the hospital which she said she doesn't do well in enclosed spaces. I was unable to ask further questions because she started to walk away.

I followed her on NW Lovejoy St to about NW 12th St where she stopped again. Over the radio SGT Carroll said to detain her and place her in handcuffs if necessary. Ofc Simmons and I placed JOHNSON in an escort hold and AMR was able to give her a sedative. She did not resist our control. Medical assisted her to the gurney. Ofc Simmons said he would follow AMR to Emanuel Hospital and place her [REDACTED] (see his report for further). [REDACTED]

On Sunday, 6/9/19 at approximately 1036 hours, I received a page from Portland Police Homicide Sergeant Michele Hughes regarding an officer involved shooting that occurred at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. I responded to the location to assist in the investigation and arrived at approximately 1145 hours. Upon arriving, I learned the incident transpired in "Stairway 1" of the address. I determined "Stairway 1" was located in the southwest corner of the building (Refer to Exhibit A). Subsequent to the investigator's briefing, Detective Broughton and I were assigned by Sergeant Hughes to assist Forensic Evidence Division personnel in processing and documenting the crime scene. At 1316 hours I attended the scene walk through along with other investigators that was conducted by Officer Cassandra Wells.

Upon entering the scene I observed the deceased male laying on the "P6" stairwell landing. A number of items were in the immediate vicinity of the subject. In addition, evidence items were also observed in the stairwell from the landing between the eighth and seventh floors, down to the fifth floor landing. Criminalist Walker Berg documented the scene using the Leica scanning station. Evidence items were subsequently placarded and recovered by FED personnel. Refer to crime scene legend for the list of items.

I subsequently prepared five diagrams, labeled Exhibits #1 to #5. The prepared diagrams are only a generalized graphical representation of the scene and evidence items. For measurement details of the evidentiary items, refer to Leica scan data.

The exhibits are listed as follows:

Exhibit #1: Cross section of the scene and identified to be "Stairway 1" of the location.

Exhibit #2: Diagram of mid-landing between the 8th floor and 7th floor.

Exhibit #3: Diagram of mid-landing between the 7th floor and 6th floor.

Exhibit #4: Diagram of 6th floor landing

Exhibit #5: Diagram of 5th floor landing

I took general measurements of the stairwell and determined the following:

Stairwell overall width: 122"

Stair width: 50"

Central gap between stair columns: 22"

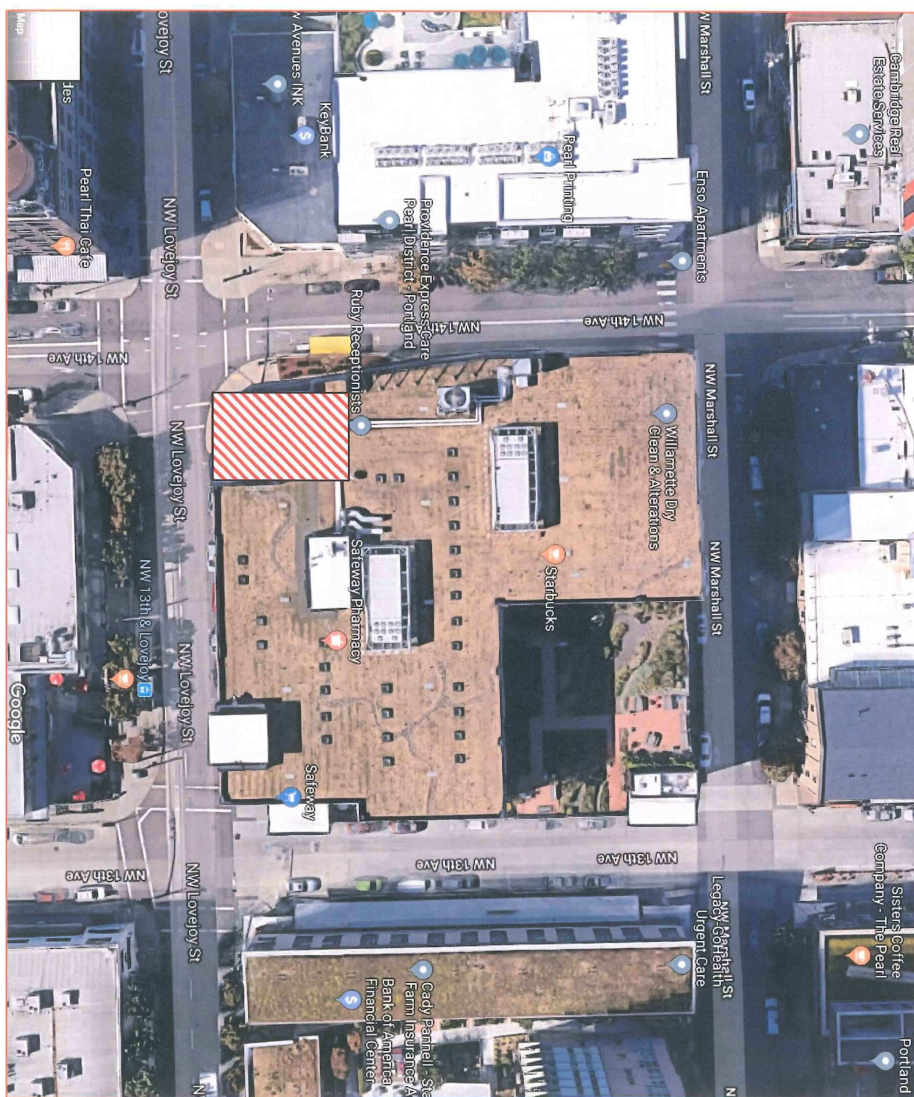

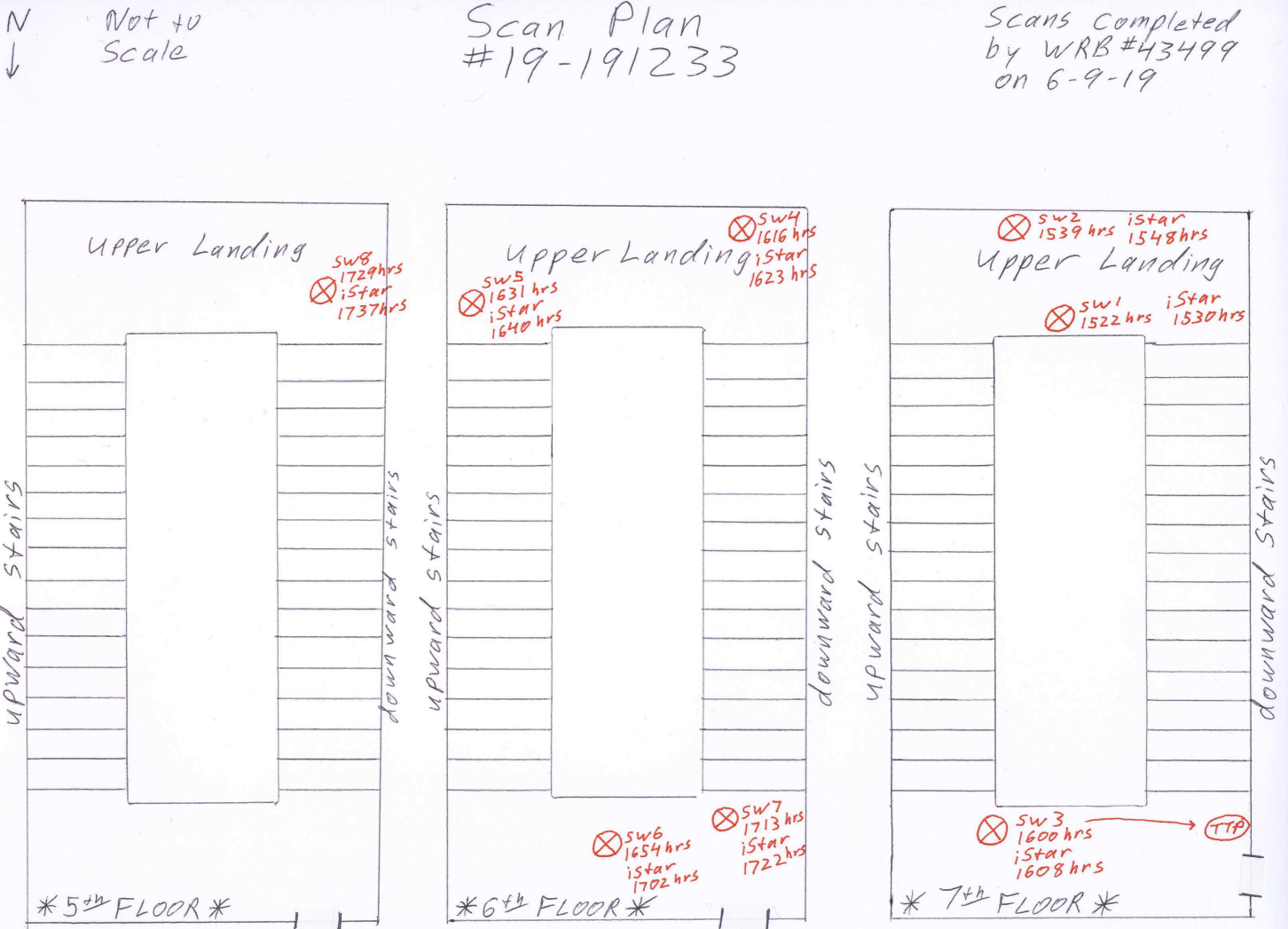

SUMMARY

Central Precinct officers received a 911 call regarding a disturbance in the stairwell of a building located at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. Officers Kirby-Glatkowski, Wells, and Oldham all responded to the call, and eventually made contact with two subjects in the stairwell, one male and one female, later identified as DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON respectively. During that contact, the officers observed BETHANIE JOHNSON was bleeding from her face/neck area, was in the corner of the stairwell landing, and appeared to be a hostage. The officers also observed DAVID DOWNS was holding a knife in one hand and what he claimed was a detonator for a bomb in the other hand. DAVID DOWNS was directed several times to drop the knife, which he refused to do. Concerned for BETHANIE JOHNSON's safety, Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal launcher four separate times, with no effect. DAVID DOWNS then grabbed BETHANIE JOHNSON, keeping her between himself and the officers, and holding the knife to her throat and the "detonator" over his head. Officers Wells and Kirby-Glatkowski discussed the need to use lethal force against DAVID DOWNS to save BETHANIE JOHNSON's life, and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski ultimately discharged his handgun once, striking DAVID DOWNS in the head and fatally wounding him. BETHANIE JOHNSON was then rescued and transported to the hospital for treatment for her injuries. This report documents the initial steps of the investigation at the scene.

NARRATIVE

On June 9th, 2019, at approximately 1015 hours, I received notification from Detective Sergeant Hughes to respond to 1331 NW Lovejoy Street to investigate an Officer Involved Shooting at that location. Upon arrival, I learned a male had been holding a female hostage at knifepoint, and also claimed to be armed with an explosive device. The male was subsequently fatally wounded by responding officers and the female was transported to the hospital for treatment for her injuries. I learned the involved officers were Officer Kirby-Glatkowski, Officer Wells, and Officer Oldham, and all three were currently on the fifth floor of the location. I ensured all three officers were separated and someone was assigned to observe each of them. I then coordinated with uniform personnel on establishing the crime scene and preserving evidence, and ensured an officer was responsible for maintaining a log of the scene. I learned Officer Flohr and Officer Quinsland were witnesses to the actions surrounding the events preceding the shooting, and I ensured both officers were separated and someone was assigned to observe each of them.

Once they had arrived, I met with my partner, Detective Slater, and Sergeant Hughes, and the decision was made to proceed to the fifth floor and conduct a countdown of Officer Kirby-Glatkowski's, Officer Wells', and Officer Oldham's firearms.

Detective Slater and I then coordinated with Criminalist Berg to conduct the countdowns (see Supplemental Report for the details of the weapons countdowns). While the weapons countdowns were occurring, I directed Detectives Winters and Law

to interview, if possible, BETHANIE JOHNSON at the hospital (see Supplemental Report by Detective Winters for details of the interview).

Once the weapons countdowns had been completed, I learned from Sergeant Collins that he and Officer Miller, both members of the Metropolitan Explosives Disposal Unit (EDU), had entered the scene and assessed the alleged detonator and items surrounding the deceased in the stairwell, and determined no explosive threat existed, and the male had been lying about being armed with an explosive device. Because Officer Miller had moved items in the scene during his assessment, I requested he be interviewed by Detectives.

Detective Slater and I then conducted a walkthrough of the scene with Officer Wells at 1315 hours. Officer Wells was accompanied by her attorney, Nicole Robbins. DDA Marrero was also present. We stood on the landing of the stairwell between floors seven and eight at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street, and Officer Wells showed us the following: Officer Wells showed us where she, Officer Kirby-Glatkowski, Officer Quinsland, Officer Oldham, and Officer Flohr had been standing at the time they were confronting the male. Officer Wells also showed us where the male and the female were positioned on the sixth floor landing during the confrontation. Based on the positions of everyone involved as provided by Officer Wells and the significant downward angle between the landing on the sixth floor and the landing between the seventh and eighth floors, the field of fire would have been toward the sixth floor landing, with a potential backdrop of the concrete walls of the stairwell and the concrete floor of the landing. Officer Wells was then directed to proceed to the Detective Division to be interviewed by Detectives (see Supplemental Report for complete details of the interview).

Once the walkthrough had been completed, Detective Slater and I met with the other members of the investigative team, and we attended a briefing conducted at 1340 hours. Detective Winters briefed us on the results of his interview with BETHANIE JOHNSON. Detective Merrill also briefed us on his interview with EDWARD CONNORS, the 911 caller (see Supplemental Report by Detective Merrill for details of the interview). During that same briefing, I learned the following from Acting Sergeant Hill: Acting Sergeant Hill heard the initial 911 call being dispatched and began driving to that location from Central Precinct. As he was driving, Acting Sergeant Hill was monitoring the radio transmissions of the responding officers. Acting Sergeant Hill was aware the responding officers had formed a hasty team and were actively searching for the disturbance, and the officers had subsequently located the disturbance in the stairwell. Acting Sergeant Hill was aware the officers had located a male armed with a knife and a female victim in the stairwell, and she was being held hostage by the male. Acting Sergeant Hill was also aware Less Lethal had been deployed against the male when he arrived on scene. Acting Sergeant Hill was still attempting to gain access to the locked building when he heard via the radio shots had been fired by the police. Acting Sergeant Hill made his way to the officers, and began to identify and separate the involved and witness officers and make notifications (see Supplemental Report by Acting Sergeant Hill for complete details).

At the conclusion of the briefing, investigatory assignments were made. Sergeant Hughes coordinated the interviews of all civilian witnesses (please refer to the Supplemental Reports by the above listed Detectives for complete details of all of the interviews). Officer Flohr, Officer Quinsland, and Officer Miller were directed to proceed to the Detective Division to be interviewed by Detectives (please refer to the Supplemental Reports by the above listed Detectives for complete details of all of the interviews). Detective Beniga, Detective Broughton, and Detective Greenlee were assigned to assist with documenting and processing the scene. Detective Stenzel was assigned to canvass for and obtain any relevant surveillance video.

Detective Slater and I then observed the scene, and I noted the following: 1331 NW Lovejoy Street is a commercial-use building occupying an area one-square block in size between NW 13th Avenue and NW 14th Avenue, and NW Lovejoy Street and NE Marshall Street. The building contains a Safeway grocery store on the first and second floors, a parking garage on floors three through six, with the third floor dedicated to Safeway parking, and multi-use office space on floors seven through nine. The floors above street level are accessed via secured elevators and stairwells. The stairwells are secured at the third floor, allowing only egress from the stairwells on the first floor. The parking floors are accessed via a ramp on NW 14th Avenue, near the northwest corner of the building. The stairwell where the confrontation occurred is located at the southwest corner of the building. The stairs in this stairwell consist of two sets of stairs between each floor, with a landing between each set of stairs, and doors accessing the floor on every other landing. A series of tubular metal railings lines the inside edge of

the stairway to prevent anyone using the stairs from falling down the open central area. A short metal lip lines the base of the inside edge of the stairs. Due to the layout of the stairs and railing, it is possible to stand on the stairs and/or the landing and look up or down through the central area and observe at least two floors away. In this stairwell, on the landing between the seventh and eighth floors I observed the following: one 9mm shell casing, two Less Lethal expended munition pieces, and one Less Lethal expended casing. I also observed what appeared to be two blue circular marks on the floor of the landing next to the metal lip between the two sets of stairs. These marks appear consistent with Less Lethal foam round impacts.

On the stairs leading from the landing between the seventh and eighth floors to the landing on the seventh floor, I observed the following: three Less Lethal expended munition pieces, and two Less Lethal expended casings. On the landing on the seventh floor, I observed the following: one Less Lethal expended munition piece. On the landing between the seventh and sixth floors, I observed the following: one Less Lethal expended casing. On the landing on the sixth floor, and the stairs immediately above and below that landing, I observed the following: one Less Lethal expended munition piece, one intact Less Lethal expended munition, one black-handled knife with a partially serrated and approximately four-inch long black blade, a red woman's purse, an apparently used and uncapped syringe, a portable speaker, red-colored clothing, a pair of women's athletic shoes, a black cloth bag, and a small penlight. I also observed a significant amount of blood spatter on the walls next to the doorway, and between the sixth floor and the landing between the sixth and seventh floors. This blood spatter was consistent with lower velocity cast-off blood, and not high velocity spatter. The body of the deceased was also located on the sixth floor landing. He was lying on his left side, face down, with his right arm partially behind his back and his knees bent. A significant amount of blood was pooled under the deceased. On the fifth floor landing, I observed what appeared to be a woman's yellow-metal charm bracelet (please refer to Supplemental Reports by Detective Beniga, as well as Criminalists Berg and Becker for complete details of the scene).

At 1848 hours, Medicolegal Death Investigator (MDI) Bellant arrived onscene and entered the stairwell to begin his preliminary investigation. MDI Bellant located one gunshot wound to the head of the deceased. At 1930 hours, MDI Bellant arranged for the deceased to be transported from the scene to the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Officer pending a post-mortem examination.

All of the previously described items of evidence were collected by Criminalists with the Forensic Evidence Division (see Supplemental Reports by members of the Forensic Evidence Division for complete details). I retrieved the scene log from Officer Li, and Detective Slater and I cleared the scene at 2000 hours.

This investigation is ongoing.

At the conclusion of the weapon countdowns, we determined Officer Wells had not fired her handgun. The Glock handgun, magazines, and cartridges were all returned to Officer Wells.

I asked Officer Wells if she would be willing to conduct an on-scene briefing at this time, and Officer Wells replied, via her attorney, "No, at this time, I respectfully invoke my Federal and State constitutional rights, including but not limited to my right to remain silent and my right to counsel." I asked Officer Wells if she would be willing to provide an interview at this time, and she replied, "No, at this time, I respectfully invoke my Federal and State constitutional rights, including but not limited to my right to remain silent and my right to counsel."

Officer Wells later consented to a scene walkthrough, as well as an interview (see Supplemental Reports regarding the details of the walkthrough and interview). Officer Wells was later issued a Communication Restriction Order by Sergeant Santos.

NARRATIVE

On June 9th, 2019, Detective Slater and I responded to 1331 NW Lovejoy Street to investigate an Officer Involved Shooting.

During the course of our investigation, at approximately 1250 hours, Detective Slater and I met with Officer Oldham and his attorney, Mr. Myers. Officer Oldham was photographed by Criminalist Berg, who was also present to document the weapon countdowns via photographs.

I noted Officer Oldham carried two spare magazines for his handgun on his duty belt. At my direction, Officer Oldham removed the spare magazine from the upper handgun magazine pouch on his duty belt and handed it to me. I then removed seventeen 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At normal capacity, the magazine is capable of holding seventeen cartridges. I then directed Officer Oldham to remove the spare magazine from the lower handgun magazine pouch on his duty belt and hand it to me. I then removed seventeen 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At normal capacity, the magazine is capable of holding seventeen cartridges.

At my direction, Officer Oldham removed the magazine from the handgun in his holster. Officer Oldham then handed the magazine to me and I removed seventeen 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At normal capacity, the magazine is capable of holding seventeen cartridges.

At my direction, Officer Oldham then removed his handgun from its holster and handed it to me. I pulled the slide back, ejecting one 9mm cartridge from the chamber. This round was retrieved. I then locked the slide to the rear, and presented an empty handgun to Criminalist Berg. The handgun was a lighted 9mm Glock Model 17, SN #GCT427.

At my direction, Officer Oldham handed me the LMT 40mm launcher in his possession. The buttstock pouch on the launcher contained two spare 40mm "eXactiMpack" cartridges, which I removed from the pouch. I then opened the breech on the launcher, exposing one live 40mm "eXactiMpack" cartridge. I removed the cartridge and left the breech open, and presented an empty launcher to Criminalist Berg. The launcher was a LMT 40mm Less Lethal launcher, SN #FW14940.

At my direction, Officer Oldham then handed me the drop pouch for the launcher. I noted the drop pouch contained no spare 40mm "eXactiMpack" cartridges, and was empty. At full capacity, the drop pouch is capable of holding five cartridges. Each LMT Less Lethal launcher is equipped with two cartridges in the buttstock pouch, and a drop pouch containing five cartridges, for a total of seven.

Through Mr. Myers, Officer Oldham confirmed he loads each of his handgun magazines with seventeen cartridges, and then, after loading his handgun, tops off the magazine in the handgun. I verified Officer Oldham did not carry any other magazines for his handgun, nor did he carry any other firearms. At the conclusion of the weapon countdowns, we determined Officer Oldham had fired his Less Lethal launcher four times and had not fired his handgun. The Less Lethal launcher, drop pouch, and 40mm cartridges were all collected by Criminalist Berg. The Glock handgun, magazines, and cartridges were all returned to Officer Oldham.

The procedure was documented via photographs by Criminalist Ware, and items of evidence were collected by Criminalist McIntyre (see Supplemental Reports by Criminalist Ware and Criminalist McIntyre for complete details). Deputy District Attorney Marrero and Officer Vanblokland were also present.

During his preliminary examination of DAVID DOWNS, Dr. Nelson noted DAVID DOWNS was clothed as follows: a pair of camouflage pants over a pair of grey slacks with a black leather belt; a red "Rip City" t-shirt; a pair of brown hiking shoes; and a pair of black socks. During his external examination, Dr. Nelson noted an abrasion on the right shin.

During his external and internal examination, Dr. Nelson also noted a gunshot wound to the head, located high in the forehead, and slightly left of center. The wound track for the gunshot wound penetrated into the brain, causing multiple skull fractures, with a trajectory of front to back, and above to below, with minimal horizontal deviation. A fired bullet was recovered from the inside of the skull at the back of the head.

At the conclusion of his examination, Dr. Nelson concluded the gunshot wound to the head was fatal, and determined the cause of death to be that gunshot wound. The post-mortem examination was concluded at 1015 hours.

Enforcement Database System (LEDS) and learned he was on parole in the state of California and had a valid Parole Violation warrant. I then spoke with Parole Agent III Jennifer Cross, who supervises the Redding Parole Unit of the California State Parole Office and learned the following: DAVID WAYNE DOWNS had been paroled from prison in California on November 17th, 2018, where he had been incarcerated for Failure to Register as a sex offender. After failing to report upon release, a warrant was issued for his arrest on November 20th, 2018.

PA III Cross was able to provide me with next of kin information for DAVID WAYNE DOWNS in the form of a wife. I left a voicemail message at the number provided but never received a response. Using a commercially available database, Detective Slater was able to locate a likely mother for DAVID WAYNE DOWNS. At 1520 hours on June 10th, 2019, I spoke with DIANE LOVINS, and after verifying she was the mother of DAVID WAYNE DOWNS, I informed her he was deceased and had been shot by the police while holding a female hostage with a knife.

DIANE LOVINS was understandably upset at the death of her son, and told me she had expected a call at some point in her life that her son had been killed. DIANE LOVINS said DAVID WAYNE DOWNS had been "born bad" and was the complete opposite of her other son. DIANE LOVINS said she had not spoken with DAVID WAYNE DOWNS in several years. DIANE LOVINS said she had obtained protective orders against DAVID WAYNE DOWNS for herself and her other son, saying he had tried to kill them in the past, and describing him as "a really bad guy."

Before concluding my conversation with DIANE LOVINS I explained to her I would pass on her contact information to the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office so they could contact her in order to make arrangements for DAVID WAYNE DOWNS' body. After concluding my conversation with DIANE LOVINS, I contacted the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office and spoke with Medicolegal Death Investigator (MDI) Tom Chappell. I explained to MDI Chappell the deceased from the earlier post-mortem examination had been positively identified as DAVID WAYNE DOWNS. I also explained to MDI Chappell I had notified DAVID WAYNE DOWNS' mother of his death, and passed on to MDI Chappell her contact information.

SUMMARY

Central Precinct officers received a 911 call regarding a disturbance in the stairwell of a building located at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. Officers Kirby-Glatkowski, Wells, and Oldham all responded to the call, and eventually made contact with

two subjects in the stairwell, one male and one female, later identified as DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON respectively. During that contact, the officers observed BETHANIE JOHNSON was bleeding from her face/neck area, was in the corner of the stairwell landing, and appeared to be a hostage. The officers also observed DAVID DOWNS was holding a knife in one hand and what he claimed was a detonator for a bomb in the other hand. DAVID DOWNS was directed several times to drop the knife, which he refused to do. Concerned for BETHANIE JOHNSON's safety, Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal launcher four separate times, with no effect. DAVID DOWNS then grabbed BETHANIE JOHNSON, keeping her between himself and the officers, and holding the knife to her throat and the "detonator" over his head. Officers Wells and Kirby-Glatkowski discussed the need to use lethal force against DAVID DOWNS to save BETHANIE JOHNSON's life, and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski ultimately discharged his handgun once, striking DAVID DOWNS in the head and fatally wounding him. BETHANIE JOHNSON was then rescued and transported to the hospital for treatment for her injuries. This report documents the interview of Officer Wells.

NARRATIVE

On June 9th, 2019, at 0945 hours, Officers Kirby-Glatkowski, Wells, and Oldham all responded to a 911 call regarding a disturbance in the stairwell of a building located at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. The officers, as well as other assisting officers, made contact with two subjects in the stairwell, one male and one female, later identified as DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON respectively. During that contact, the officers observed BETHANIE JOHNSON was bleeding from her face/neck area, was in the corner of the stairwell landing, and appeared to be a hostage. The officers also observed DAVID DOWNS was holding a knife in one hand and what he claimed was a detonator for a bomb in the other hand. DAVID DOWNS was directed several times to drop the knife, which he refused to do. Concerned for BETHANIE JOHNSON's safety, Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal launcher four separate times, with no effect. DAVID DOWNS then grabbed BETHANIE JOHNSON, keeping her between himself and the officers, and holding the knife to her throat and the "detonator" over his head. Officers Wells and Kirby-Glatkowski discussed the need to use lethal force against DAVID DOWNS to save BETHANIE JOHNSON's life, and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski ultimately discharged his handgun once, striking DAVID DOWNS in the head and fatally wounding him. BETHANIE JOHNSON was then rescued and transported to the hospital for treatment for her injuries. Officer Wells was assigned an attorney, Ms. Robbins, at the scene and provided a statement later that day.

On June 9th, 2019, at 1445 hours, Detective Slater and I met with Officer Wells and her attorney, Nicole Robbins, at the Detective Division. We escorted Officer Wells and Ms. Robbins to the small conference room in the Detective Division.

Prior to the interview, I activated a digital recorder. Because the interview was recorded in its entirety, what follows is a brief summary of Officer Wells' statements.

Officer Wells was working a partner car with Officer Flohr, and they were dispatched to 1331 NW Lovejoy on a report of a disturbance in the southwest corner stairwell. Upon arrival, after learning of the update regarding the suspect being armed with a knife and bomb, and having a hostage, Officer Wells requested additional units to assist, including Less Lethal. Once Officer Wells had a team assembled, consisting of Herself, Officer Flohr, Officer Quinsland, Officer Kirby-Glatkowski, and Officer Oldham, they proceeded to the ninth floor of the building in order to work their way down and locate the disturbance. Once on the ninth floor, Officer Wells stealthily opened the stairwell door, and could immediately hear a male voice below her. Officer Wells proceeded to the railing and looked down and saw a person later identified as DAVID WAYNE DOWNS standing at the stair railing a few levels below her. Officer Wells made the decision to move closer to get a better idea of what was occurring.

Still maintaining stealth, Officer Wells and the team proceeded down the stairs, maintaining visual contact with DAVID WAYNE DOWNS, who was seemingly unaware of their presence. DAVID WAYNE DOWNS stayed in his same position, and when Officer Wells arrived at the next stair level, she could see a knife in his right hand. DAVID WAYNE DOWNS removed his jacket, and looked up and saw the officers. Officer Wells immediately identified herself and told DAVID

WAYNE DOWNS to drop the knife, which he did not do. Officer Wells continued to challenge DAVID WAYNE DOWNS, and he backed away from the railing and began to pace on the landing he was on, staring at the officers and making grunting noises. Officer Wells and the team proceeded further down the stairs, stopping at the landing where the shooting later occurred. DAVID WAYNE DOWNS was still ignoring the commands to drop the off, and Officer Wells clarified he may be shot if he did not drop the knife, and DAVID WAYNE DOWNS said, "Shoot me."

One of the other officers lowered themselves down on the landing, and announced they could see a naked female also on the landing. Officer Wells lowered herself on the landing, and saw a half-naked terrified looking bloody female, later identified as BETHANIE JOHNSON, standing with her back in the corner of the landing, looking down and not speaking. It was immediately apparent to Officer Wells BETHANIE JOHNSON did not want to be there, but she was unable to leave.

Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal twice, without any apparent effect on DAVID WAYNE DOWNS. Officer Wells pointed her firearm at DAVID WAYNE DOWNS and was squeezing the trigger to fire when she became concerned her point of aim, center mass, would not sufficiently prevent DAVID WAYNE DOWNS from being able to stab and kill BETHANIE JOHNSON. Officer Wells repositioned so she could aim her firearm at DAVID WAYNE DOWNS' head, and Officer Oldham deployed a third Less Lethal round, again with no apparent effect. Officer Wells announced to her team her intention to shoot DAVID WAYNE DOWNS and Officer Oldham asked to deploy a fourth Less Lethal round, which he did, again with no apparent effect.

DAVID WAYNE DOWNS then grabbed BETHANIE JOHNSON with one hand and pulled her over in front of himself, holding the knife in his right hand up by her torso, and holding what he claimed was a bomb or a detonator for a bomb over his head in his left hand, and was continuing to ignore commands and make grunting noises and yelling, "Shoot me!" Officer Wells requested an AR rifle operator, and Officer Flohr left to go back to street level and retrieve an AR operator. Officer Kirby-Glatkowski wanted to move closer down the stairs to address DAVID WAYNE DOWNS, and Officer Wells told him they would address DAVID WAYNE DOWNS from their current position. Officer Wells and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski discussed the necessity for a head shot and who had the best shot. Based on the position of Officer Wells, DAVID WAYNE DOWNS, and BETHANIE JOHNSON, Officer Wells only had a sight picture of DAVID WAYNE DOWNS' forehead, and was concerned for the safety of BETHANIE JOHNSON if she were to take the shot, and she communicated this to Officer Kirby-Glatkowski.

BETHANIE JOHNSON suddenly slumped down, exposing a significant amount of DAVID WAYNE DOWNS' head to Officer Wells, giving her increased confidence in her ability to make a head shot without needlessly endangering BETHANIE JOHNSON. Officer Wells and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski again discussed who had a better shot, and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski announced he would shoot, and Officer Wells told Officer Kirby-Glatkowski to take the shot and she would be ready for a second shot if needed. Officer Kirby-Glatkowski then fired once and DAVID WAYNE DOWNS immediately collapsed to the floor of the landing. Officer Wells and the team then proceeded down the stairs to rescue BETHANIE JOHNSON. When Officer Wells arrived on the landing, she could immediately see DAVID WAYNE DOWNS was shot in the head and deceased. Officer Oldham took BEHTANIE JOHNSON to street level for medical treatment for her injuries, and the remainder of the team assembled on the sixth floor parking garage, immediately outside the stairwell door. Medical personnel responded and verified DAVID WAYNE DOWNS was deceased.

At the conclusion of the interview, I deactivated the digital recorder. I later copied the recording of the interview onto a CD-R, which was then receipted on Portland Police Bureau Property/Evidence Receipt #A106813, which I then placed into the Property Evidence Division as evidence.

Kammerer: Alright this is Detective Erik Kammerer with the Portland Police Bureau. Today is June 9th, 2019, it is currently 1449 hours. I'm in the small conference room of the Detective Division on the 13th floor of the Justice Center. Also present is Detective Mark Slater and we are here regarding Portland Police Bureau case number 19-191233, which is an officer involved shooting that occurred earlier today. Uh, we are here to interview Officer CASSANDRA WELLS who is also accompanied by her attorney, Nicky Robbins. And you understand this conversation is being recorded Officer WELLS?

Wells: Yes.

Kammerer: And you're okay with that?

Wells: Yes.

Kammerer: Ms. Robbins?

Robbins: Yes.

Kammerer: Okay. Um, so if you wouldn't mind um, just tell me a little bit about uh, yourself, how long you've been employed here, what kind of law enforcement experience you have and any kind of relevant training you may have had.

Wells: Okay um, in September it'll be 13 years since I've been hired as a police officer. The end of September. Um, before that I was a Portland Police Cadet at Central. Um, I don't remember how many years. Um, so I got hired in 2006, went to Basic Academy in Salem. I think I was like the second or third class at the new facility and then went straight to the Advanced Academy which was 16 weeks. Um, went through FTEP and got assigned to SE Precinct, day shift and then afternoons. When SE Precinct was disbanded I came to Central afternoons and then went to Central Precinct Street Crimes Unit. Um, I think in 2010 for two years and then from there I went to Mounted Patrol Unit for five and a half years. And towards the end when it was getting disbanded um, they cut the unit so I went, I went back to the street for six months on Central days and then I was asked to go back to horses to help disband the unit for about six months. And then I came back to Central days on patrol and have been back here for two and a half years. Um, after horses I um, became a taser instructor, detached and then I became a control tactics instructor, also detached. And then I became a coach and then I became a patrol tactics instructor, detached.

Kammerer: Okay and do you have any certifications or training in any of the uh, various uh, weapons that the Portland Police Bureau uses or uh, any of the other items that we normally carry?

Wells: Um – no. I usually carry a shotgun but when I'm in a partner car I don't bring it out.

Kammerer: Okay so you're not certified for the less-lethal?

Wells: No, no A-R, I'm not ECIT.

Kammerer: Okay um, have you ever received any uh, CIT training?

Wells: Yes.

Kammerer: Okay and then um, I believe you said you were a coach?

Wells: I am.

Kammerer: And do you have a trainee assigned to you right now?

Wells: Uh, Dina Kashuba but she's a Phase-Five and I was working a trade day today.

Kammerer: So what, what does that uh, both of those things, what does that mean uh, you're a, she's, your trainee is a Phase-Five?

Wells: So a Phase-Five is a trainee who is uh, is solo status. So she um, works a car by herself but she still has a coach assigned to her um, through the rest of her probation.

Kammerer: Okay and then you worked a trade day today, what does that mean?

Wells: Um, that means I worked for somebody who couldn't get vacation time off.

Kammerer: Okay so it's normally your day off today but you were working?

Wells: Right, yes.

Kammerer: Okay and where, what district were you in today?

Wells: 821.

Kammerer: And is that normally where you work?

Wells: I am the 821 district car.

Kammerer: Okay and were you by yourself today or with somebody else?

Wells: Uh, AMELIA FLOHR and I partnered up because she was 822.

Kammerer: Okay so you were working the same car?

Wells: A partner car.

Kammerer: Both districts.

Wells: I was driving.

Kammerer: Okay.

Wells: Yup.

Kammerer: Okay.

Wells: Taking care of all of 20's.

Kammerer: And then what happened today?

Wells: Um, can I go off this for times?

Kammerer: Uh, you're referring to the CAD printout that you have?

Wells: Yes.

Kammerer: Yes.

Wells: So around um, 9:43 or nine, probably 9:44 um, AMELIA and I get dispatched to 1331 NW Lovejoy and the only information that was first given to us was hearing sounds of a fight from the southwest corner stairwell. Um, the caller thought that it was near the fourth or fifth floors. Um, so I, I was driving and we were talking about where this was. We weren't very far away and I said I'm pretty sure this is the apartments, which I was assuming it was the apartments above Safeway. I'd never been up there so I wasn't 100 percent sure. Um, I said I'm pretty sure this is the apartments above Safeway because I know the Safeway address is 1303 on Lovejoy and I know that Safeway um, takes that whole block. Um, so I'm literally pulling up onto 13th and basically Lovejoy. I'm parking when I hear a CAD update, it makes like a little noise when we get updates. And I said AMELIA we just got an update, pull that up.

So she hits the chronological button, I think it is, to pull up the update and I'm parking and reading it and the update read, from, so per complainant call-back. So the caller called 9-1-1 back, the complainant yelled at where he was hearing

the people, one of them said "tell the cops I'm waiting for them, I've got a hostage and a 33-baker," which is a bomb "and also," and then it says, "also mentioned having a knife." Um, so we're arriving on-scene right when that update came up.

We get out of the car, I get on the radio, I said 821, we saw the update let's get some more cars started this way until I can advise further. Um, so even though I haven't been above Safeway except in the parking garage before um, I assumed that it was a locked entrance to get in. So I tell, I asked Dispatch if they're still on the phone with the caller, they say they're not. I say, AMELIA call the caller to figure out how we can get inside. Because we knew he was saying it was the southwest stairwell so I knew it was gonna be at 14 and Lovejoy but I didn't know how the best access of how to get there.

So she's getting on the phone with him um, security exits out of Safeway and I stop him and I said hey do you know if, 'cause there's no addresses for 1331, I said is 1331 on Lovejoy above you? And he's like I think so and I said how do we get up there? And he um, I think he said you might be able to through the garage but you need an access key fob. He said I k now there's an entrance at 13 and Marshall. I said okay. AMELIA's on the phone with the caller. I, I said AMELIA have them meet us at 13 and Marshall. Um, so she, she hangs up with him and we start walking down Marshall. I believe QUINSLAND arrives and as we're walking KIRBY pulls up. KIRBY is KIRBY-GLATKOWSKI, I call him KIRBY. Um, KIRBY pulls up and the caller runs up behind us and then AMELIA recognizes that it's the caller and she says, are you MIKE? And MIKE um, I was trying to coordinate things on the air, someone asked if we wanted a less-lethal at some point I think before that and I said yes. And I had updated, we're meeting the caller at 13 and Marshall to gain access um, prior to that portion that I just said.

Um, sorry I'm trying to think. So um, got less-lethal on the way. I heard um, supervisor said they're enroute. Um, the caller runs up behind us and he looks upset and he's like looking all around and pointing. He's like it's the stairwell over this way and he's just talking really fast and I'm trying to coordinate things on the radio so AMELIA starts talking to him. Um, and we walk over to 13 and Marshall together as KIRBY had pulled up and got out. And I stop him, I said can you, can we gain access here? He's like well I don't know and he's talking really fast and to me he just seems a little bit um, rushed and panicked. Um, and I said well let's go in here he's, and he's like well it's all the way at the other end and he's talking really fast and I said, okay is there a better access and he's like yeah around the corner on 14th. And he takes off running, the caller does. And then KIRBY takes off running him and so I just got a sense of like urgency and panic from this caller. Um, even though he, from what I remember in the call, he didn't see anybody, he was just hearing stuff.

So I'm like, I, I look at AMELIA and we were just talking about how we had to go pee, I know this is horrible (laugh). So I'm like well I, I guess we're running and I'm like I guess we're running, this isn't good for our bladders and I start running behind them. QUINSLAND starts running behind us so it's KIRBY, the caller, me and AMELIA and then QUINSLAND behind me. We turn, we go to 14th and we're running towards Lovejoy and I yell at them to stop. I'm like you guys need to stop and slow this down and I tell the caller, I'm like I'm primary on this call, I need to hear everything that you're saying. And then I get on the air and I say access is gonna be at 14 and Lovejoy for any other units coming.

Um, Officer MOUSSALLEM who I call MOOSE showed up about the time we got to the 14 and Lovejoy entrance. And so I stopped, I stopped the caller and I, and I think AMELIA was also starting to ask him questions like where for sure it is, because I'm the one like trying to get resources there and directing people. He opens the doors for us to the lobby that leads to the elevators and I'm like okay stop, I'm like so when we get in these elevators, I'm like where, I was trying to figure out where the exits where. To me that was the most important for the stairwell. I said where are the exits to the stairwell? And there was an exit right on Lovejoy at 14th that was next to the lobby he had opened for us. And I said are there any other exit points and do you need the access card? Someone asked him if you needed the access card to get back into the stairwell. So from what we got from him, if you were in the stairwell you could leave the stairwell but you couldn't get back into like the main elevator portion of the lobby. Um, and then if you left the stairwell you couldn't get back in unless like you were um, at all unless you had an access code key. I said is there any other exits that these people could take? He said maybe the third floor, they might be able to get into Safeway.

Um, OLDHAM went um, code right past us and MOOSE said I'm gonna go flag OLDHAM 'cause OLDHAM had the less-lethal. Um, so MOOSE goes to find OLDHAM. Uh, we start developing a plan in the lobby. I said I'm gonna need one person to stay on Lovejoy to watch the exit onto Lovejoy in case people came down the stairs. Um, the security guard that I had initially talked to was walking up the street so I stopped him real quick and I said there might be access from the third floor into Safeway, I need you to go back in Safeway and watch that area. I'm gonna send the next officer to you in case these people come out into Safeway. So he said okay, I got on the radio and I said I need the next officer to go into Safeway, there might be an exit from the stairwell in there and I don't know who said that they would do that.

Um, so OLDHAM gets there, we have a little meeting. The, the, the complainant is trying to get us to get in the elevator and I said we're not going up yet, you need to wait. So we formulate a plan, I said I need a volunteer to stay at this exit door. Um, MOOSE volunteered um, I told the complainant that he wasn't coming up with us. He told us how to use the access card. He told us that the top floor was

nine and we could get to the stairwell from there. And then I told him um, and through this whole thing he was like super panicked. Um, so I felt that there was a sense of urgency for us to get up there and see what was going on.

Um, I told him, I said you need to stay in the lobby with Officer MOOSE and if another resident, 'cause I still thought it was apartments, I said if another resident comes down you need to ask them to wait so we have another access card in case we need to get other officers up there. 'Cause the five of us are going up and we didn't have ways for anyone else to get up.

Um, so as we're getting in the elevator I think Sergeant HILL got on the air and asked how many less-lethals I had and I said I have one, we made a plan, we're going up and we're going up to the ninth floor, we'll update you from there. So Officer QUINSLAND, Officer KIRBY, myself, Officer FLOHR and um, OLDHAM went up the elevator to nine.

We actually hit seven because someone said let's just start on seven and I said no we're going up to nine 'cause I wanted to start at the top and work our way down. Um, because I don't know if these people are moving in the stairwell.

So the seventh floor opened up and I noticed it was businesses. Didn't hear anything, we didn't get out. We went up to nine, doors opened, the stairwell is basically straight in front of, a little to the right. I think we were on the far left elevator. Um, we stopped right at the door and I said, okay quiet. I listened, we didn't hear anything out there. Um, someone said let's designate roles and I said, and KIRBY said do you want to do the talking? So, indicating that if someone was in there I'm, I'm lead, I would start talking to them, giving commands if needed. I'm like yes, OLDHAM was clearly less-lethal or 40 mill, he was the only one that had it. I said I need someone for the radio so QUINSLAND volunteered to give updates on the radio. Um, we didn't designate um, a taser or less-lethal at that time. Um, I know we had a sense of urgency from the caller but no one ever had eyes on the situation so um, we weren't positive of what was gonna happen once we were in there.

And so I looked through the window and we could stairs going up, a small little landing and then stairs going down. So I opened the door slightly and I could hear a male's voice and I could clear- I could hear that he was below us. Um, and I communicated that with them so someone got on the air, probably QUINSLAND um, and gave that update. I said, okay guys be quiet um, we make entry. Someone hit the, the bar, it's like one of those bars you push and I'm like shhh. 'Cause I didn't want whoever was in there to know that we were there yet. Um, so we could have the advantage.

So we didn't even clear the stairs upstairs 'cause we could hear him down. So I'm lead, I walk to the railing um, and you can see straight down all the way down the nine floors. Um, or however far the stairs go. And I could see a male, a white male um, he was semi-balding and I could tell he had clothes on. Um, and he was just kind of like swaying. He was looking around, looking down. At one point he started looking up and I said AMELIA back up. Um, because we were pretty far away from him so I communicated one person to my group and I said about five floors down. Um, 'cause I was just estimating so from what I could see of the stairwell you had the main portion where you could access like a door and then you would go down half a flight and it was a landing without a door. Um, so I estimated about five levels down.

Um, and I said we need to move and get closer to get better eyes. So um, I think I had my gun out at that point. As soon as I heard a voice or maybe before when I opened the door I took my gun out, just because I had, the caller said that someone yelled about a 33-Baker and possibly having a knife.

Um, so I just had it at the depressed ready. I was walking down the stairs and peeking over. Um, he was, the male, couldn't make out anything he was saying. I was hearing noises um, he was kind of still at the same spot but shifting back and forth and al- or side-to-side and a little back and forth. Um, I don't know how many stairs down I walked, maybe two and when I say how many down, like not a full flight but the landing and then the next level. And I saw that he had a knife in his right hand and I said, he has a knife and um, I, it was, it looked like a folding knife. Um, black, it was at least three inches long, I could see the tip of it was sharp. Um, and he was still at the same spot. He was like right up against the railing where you can look down or up.

Um, and then at some point he took off his jacket and I noticed he had like a bright orange shirt on. Um, I think about at that time when he took his jacket off he looked up and saw us and I said, Portland Police you need to drop the knife, drop the knife now. Um, he um, we were still a little far away and I said we need to get closer you guys. So we go down the flight again. Um, he still had the knife in his hand, he's holding it like this and kind of like level with his body. I'm telling him you need to drop the knife, Portland Police.

When we get, I believe when we get to where um, the shooting eventually happens um, somebody dropped down, 'cause I couldn't, I'm like I don't see anybody else, do you guys see anything 'cause I'm looking over the railing and challenging him at this point. Um, and he's, he kind of backs up a little off the railing and, you know he's still pacing. He's staring directly at me or at us. Um, kind of making like grunting noises.

I said Portland Police, drop the knife um, and someone said give him a force warning and I said um, so I gave him a force warning. I said if um, if you don't drop the knife force may be used against you and I said something like um, I might shoot you or you may be shot and he says, shoot me. And then um, someone dropped down to get a better view and said there's a naked female. And he holds up his left hand like he, and I could see something in his hand. It kind of looked like a pen um, that you write with but it wasn't really long enough to be a pen 'cause his whole palm was pretty much covering it except by his thumb and he was holding it like you could push the button that was on the edge of this tool or whatever he had and he says I have a bomb and he holds it like this and he's holding the knife out to his side kind of like and he's staring right at us.

Um, I'd given the force warning, I drop down to um, try to get a better angle and a better shot on this guy and when I drop down I can see the female. She is half naked, covered in blood, at least her face and it kind of looked bloody chest and her arms. She's standing up with her back in a corner and they're pretty close to each other. Um, she has her arms up covering her chest. She's looking down, she's not saying a word and she's sucked so far into that corner she couldn't get in that corner any more. And there was like um, stuff around her.

Um, and even though she wasn't looking at us just her body position and how like you could tell she's like trying to get away from him and she can't because she's in a corner. Um, anyway I, we didn't know how injured she was, we could just tell she was bloody. Um, but just based on all of that she looked terrified.

Um, he kind of moved back a little bit from the rail, sorry.

Kammerer: That's okay.

Robbins: You want to take a little break?

Wells: No I'm fine.

Robbins: Okay.

Wells: Um, so I had dropped down on my knees and had my gun either on the floor or the metal railing right above 'cause it was slotted so there's like five metal railings. Um, I think OLDHAM had already, it was communicated, someone's on the radio giving updates of there's a hostage. Um, I'm still yelling at him to drop the knife. Um, OLDHAM says he's gonna deploy less-lethal. He deploys less-lethal, I have no idea if it hits him. I think OLDHAM is to my right or I think he was right above me shooting over the rail 'cause my right ear starts ringing as soon as he deploys it.

I remember him communicating that he's reloading 'cause you can only deploy one at a time. Um, I'm still, the guy is a little back away from the rail now like between the wall and the rail and he's still staring at us.

Um, OLDHAM deploys another less-lethal, I have no idea if it hits him, the guy's behavior doesn't change, he doesn't flinch. Um, I – at one point between less-lethal deployments I was pulling my trigger to shoot this guy and then I stopped because I was afraid that if I shot him in the chest he would turn and stab her. So then I was trying to, you know him moving and shooting between these rails and having a good shot um, and so I started trying to move to a head shot position. Um, OLDHAM deploys another less-lethal, I start saying we're gonna have to kill this guy 'cause I know the less-lethal's not working. There's been at least three. I'm telling people we're gonna need to kill this guy, I'm gonna shoot him.

Um, I said I'm gonna shoot him and OLDHAM says let me try one more less-lethal and that might've been when I was pulling the trigger and I said okay he's gonna try another less-lethal and at that point I still had a body shot and again I was afraid that it wouldn't drop him right away and he would turn and stab her because they were so close. I mean all he had to do was turn his body and his arm and stab her.

Um, so he deploys his last less-lethal, so four. Again no effect and then in a second he um, is behind her and has her in front of him. Um, I think he grabbed her, all he had to do is reach over, grabbed her and pulled her in front of him. He still had the knife in his right hand which was wrapped around her waist so his knife was now on, like on her left side. He was holding what he was claiming was a bomb up over her head.

Um, and now it's a head shot but her head is at least at his nose and I think I said get the fucking A-R in here right now, we need an A-R, get it in here. And AMELIA I think had been down to my right and I see the, the card key from my, you know vision and she's like I'll go get him. So she takes that card key and disappears up the stairs.

I felt like KIRBY was over me trying to get a shot from above me. Um, and he says I want to move down a, I want to move down one more flight and I said no we're not going anywhere, it's happening from here. Um, I said it's too risky, we're not moving.

Um, so the head shot that I had um, he was still moving around with her making grunting sounds, she was not saying anything. She was still looking down um, she just had like a grimace, like terrified expression on her face. Um, he, when he had her he said shoot me, I know he said shoot me at least one more time.

Um, somebody asked him for his name and I said we're gonna shoot this guy and, and this happened all so fast. I mean it seem, it's hard to tell a story when its like, you know it happened in a minute.

Um, so then KIRBY said you don't have a good shot, you don't have a good shot and I said, I know she's in the way and like I need that fuckin' A-R in here now. Um, and I told KIRBY, I'm like KIRBY like I have the, his forehead shot, that's all I got and I don't want to miss and hit her. And he's like I know I don't have a good shot either and then he drops down right next to me and she kind of starts like dropping down on his body so now her head is like at his mouth so we have um, more of a head shot. And uh, my fingers on the trigger ready and I said um, I said something like one of us is, I said we have to, we have to shoot this guy. Um, and then KIRBY shoots um, AMELIA wasn't back yet and the guy just collapses and blood starts pouring from his head. The female is still standing there, someone yells get her outta there. Uh, we take off down the stairs um, I think KIRBY first and then like QUINSLAND's right next to him and I'm behind him and then OLDHAM's behind me and I yell, I'm like get out of the way, get out of the way to the female. She runs, I think behind the guy and then down to the next floor. OLDHAM goes after her. Um, KIRBY jumps over the guy and so I and bloods just pouring from his head and he had kind of fallen over.

Um, KIRBY grabs onto, someone said get the knife and I don't know if someone kicked the knife or when he dropped it it landed on that fir- I think it was on the first stair down from us. Um, but we saw the knife there. Um, KIRBY grabs the guy's, I think right arm to kind of, 'cause his other arm was under him with the thing that he said he had a bomb with. Um, and I said, I gave KIRBY a hug and we held, hugged for like a minute and he said I never wanted to have to kill somebody and I said I know but it needed done

Wells: But I, I think too that, I felt like my team also knew that I was down there with lethal and I was saying I'm gonna shoot this guy. Kammerer: So other than your initial um, statement of Portland Police drop the knife, which I think you said you did a couple of times um, was anybody else uh, giving him direction to drop the knife after that?

Um, I think, I think somebody at some point had said, also told him, drop the knife. I think I even might've said um, you need to move away from her. Um, but I don't, besides those and then

SUMMARY

Central Precinct officers received a 911 call regarding a disturbance in the stairwell of a building located at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. Officers Kirby-Glatkowski, Wells, and Oldham all responded to the call, and eventually made contact with two subjects in the stairwell, one male and one female, later identified as DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON respectively. During that contact, the officers observed BETHANIE JOHNSON was bleeding from her face/neck area, was in the corner of the stairwell landing, and appeared to be a hostage. The officers also observed DAVID DOWNS was holding a knife in one hand and what he claimed was a detonator for a bomb in the other hand. DAVID DOWNS was directed several times to drop the knife, which he refused to do. Concerned for BETHANIE JOHNSON's safety, Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal launcher four separate times, with no effect. DAVID DOWNS then grabbed BETHANIE JOHNSON, keeping her between himself and the officers, and holding the knife to her throat and the "detonator" over his head. Officers Wells and Kirby-Glatkowski discussed the need to use lethal force against DAVID DOWNS to save BETHANIE JOHNSON's life, and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski ultimately discharged his handgun once, striking DAVID DOWNS in the head and fatally wounding him. BETHANIE JOHNSON was then rescued and transported to the hospital for treatment for her injuries. This report documents the interview of GREG MEYER, who overheard the disturbance in the stairwell.

NARRATIVE

On June 9th, 2019, at 0945 hours, Officers Kirby-Glatkowski, Wells, and Oldham all responded to a 911 call regarding a disturbance in the stairwell of a building located at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street. The officers, as well as other assisting officers, made contact with two subjects in the stairwell, one male and one female, later identified as DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON respectively. During that contact, the officers observed BETHANIE JOHNSON was bleeding from her face/neck area, was in the corner of the stairwell landing, and appeared to be a hostage. The officers also observed DAVID DOWNS was holding a knife in one hand and what he claimed was a detonator for a bomb in the other hand. DAVID DOWNS was directed several times to drop the knife, which he refused to do. Concerned for BETHANIE JOHNSON's safety, Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal launcher four separate times, with no effect. On June 11th, 2019, Detective Stenzel informed me had learned third-hand of a potential witness to the events leading up to the shooting, and provided me with contact information for that person, GREG MEYER. On June 11th, 2019, at 1505 hours, I called GREG MEYER. Prior to the interview, I activated a digital recorder. Because the interview was recorded in its entirety, what follows is a brief summary of GREG MEYER's statements.

GREG MEYER had been at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street on the seventh floor watering the plants there when he heard what sounded to him like a female crying and pleading, and a male yelling loudly. GREG MEYER believed the sound was coming

from the stairs nearby, but he did not want to go down the stairs and place himself into a dangerous situation, so he "banged the door a couple times" thinking that would stop whatever was going on in the stairs. GREG MEYER returned to watering the plants and heard the male voice address him in a threatening manner. GREG MEYER then heard another male voice from one of the floors above him yelling at the male in the stairway (later determined to be EDWARD CONNORS), and heard the male in the stairway also yell at EDWARD CONNORS in a threatening manner. GREG MEYER was unable to determine the exact content of what the male voice in the stairway was yelling, but thought he heard the word "knife" and could tell by the tone of the voice it was threatening. GREG MEYER then left a short time later and went to the Montgomery Park Building prior to police arriving at 1331 NW Lovejoy Street.

At the conclusion of the interview, I deactivated the digital recorder. I later copied the recording of the interview onto a CD-R, which was then receipted on Portland Police Bureau Property/Evidence Receipt #A106815, which I then placed into the Property Evidence Division as evidence.

Please refer to the attached transcript for a verbatim account of the interview. This investigation is ongoing.

On June 10th, 2019, at the post-mortem examination of DAVID WAYNE DOWNS, a fired bullet was collected by Criminalist McIntyre and transferred to the Portland Police Bureau Property Evidence Division on Portland Police Bureau Property/Evidence Receipt #A135087 (see Supplemental Reports from the Forensic Evidence Division for complete details).

On June 12th, 2019, I arranged for the following items to be transferred from the Property Evidence Division to the Oregon State Police Forensics Lab to be examined: Officer Kirby-Glatkowski's handgun, magazines, and ammunition, the 9mm shell casing, and the fired bullet. I received notification from Evidence Control Specialist (ECS) Winchester he would submit the items to the Oregon State Police Forensics Lab for examination.

On June 27th, 2019, I read a report authored by Forensic Scientist Travis Gover, of the Oregon State Police Forensics Lab, dated June 26th, 2019. The report is summarized as follows: the Glock 17 firearm collected from Officer Kirby-Glatkowski was test fired and found to be operable. Based on microscopic comparison, the 9mm casing and fired bullet were both fired from Officer Kirby-Glatkowski's Glock handgun.

The officers, as well as other assisting officers, made contact with two subjects in the stairwell, one male and one female, later identified as DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON respectively. During that contact, the officers observed BETHANIE JOHNSON was bleeding from her face/neck area, was in the corner of the stairwell landing, and appeared to be a hostage. The officers also observed DAVID DOWNS was holding a knife in one hand and what he claimed was a detonator for a bomb in the other hand. DAVID DOWNS was directed several times to drop the knife, which he refused to do. Concerned for BETHANIE JOHNSON's safety, Officer Oldham deployed his Less Lethal launcher four separate times, with no effect. DAVID DOWNS then grabbed BETHANIE JOHNSON, keeping her between himself and the officers, and holding the knife to her throat and the "detonator" over his head. Officers Wells and Kirby-Glatkowski discussed the need to use lethal force against DAVID DOWNS to save BETHANIE JOHNSON's life, and Officer Kirby-Glatkowski ultimately discharged his handgun once, striking DAVID DOWNS in the head and fatally wounding him. BETHANIE JOHNSON was then rescued and transported to the hospital for treatment for her injuries.

On June 9th, 2019, Detective Stenzel met with store personnel at the Safeway located on the first and second floors of 1331 NW Lovejoy Street, and arranged for them to retrieve surveillance video from that day. Detective Stenzel left four USB drives, and asked them to call when they were ready. Due to his workload, Detective Stenzel was unable to return for the surveillance video. On June 28th, 2019, Sergeant Hughes told me she had received a phone call from Officer Sahli, who had been conducting work on a different case at the Safeway at 1331 NW Lovejoy, and learned of the surveillance video. Sergeant Hughes directed Officer Sahli to collect the surveillance video and bring it to the Detective Division. On June 28th, 2019, Officer Sahli delivered to me the surveillance video from Safeway in the form of four USB drives. When I reviewed the contents of the four USB drives, I learned they were all empty and contained no data. I then contacted CASSANDRA HALL, the manager at Safeway, and informed her. She assured me she would have one of her employees, "SEAN" collect the surveillance video for me, and said she would have him call me. Later that same day, "SEAN" called me and said he would collect the requested surveillance video for me. On July 10th, 2019, I spoke with "SEAN" again via telephone who told me he would be dropping the video off for me at the front desk of Central Precinct later that day. That same day, I received a call from Central Desk, saying "SEAN" had dropped off video for me. I then retrieved one Sandisk USB drive in a labeled and stapled CD sleeve. Also written on the sleeve was the password for the secured and encrypted files, [REDACTED]

Upon viewing the surveillance video for June 9th, 2019, I observed the following: At 08:35:58 hours on the camera labeled "Parking Entrance", DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON can be seen entering the parking structure from NW 14th Avenue; at 08:36:12 hours on the camera labeled "Ramp", DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON can be seen entering the frame and ascending the parking garage ramp to the 4th floor; at 08:36:45 hours on the camera labeled "4th Exit", DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON can be seen walking across the 4th floor parking lot toward the stairwell; t 08:36:49 hours on the camera labeled "Emergency Stairs", DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON can be seen walking toward the stairwell door; and at 08:37:02 hours on the camera labeled "Parking Entrance", DAVID DOWNS and BETHANIE JOHNSON can be seen entering the stairwell and out of camera view.

I later copied the contents of the USB drive, and placed the original into the Property Evidence Division as evidence, on Portland Police Bureau Property/Evidence Receipt #A106816.

This investigation is ongoing.

On June 9th, 2019, I received a page to respond to the area of NW 13th and Lovejoy on a report of an officer involved shooting. At the location, I learned that the shooting took place in the stairwell of The Lovejoy building located at 1331 NW Lovejoy. I reached out to Mr. Wilken who identified himself as the Director of Security for Unico Properties, which is contracted for The Lovejoy. Mr. Wilken advised that there were a number of surveillance cameras on the property that are intended to capture people coming and going from the property. Based on the information available to me at the time, Mr. Wilken agreed to download video within the time frame relevant to the subjects arrival on the property. Mr. Wilken advised that the video would be available once it had finished.

I contacted Mr. Labianco who is one of the managers at the Safeway (1303 NW Lovejoy). The Safeway was closed after being evacuated based on a threat of an explosive. Mr. Labianco walked me around the premises, looking for potential avenues of entry into the stairwell where the shooting took place. There was no obvious route of entry from the Safeway, but Mr. Labianco agreed to facilitate the download of their security cameras for the past 24 hours and provide them when it's finished.

I canvassed the adjacent area for any obvious external cameras but did not locate any at that time. I advised Detectives Slater and Kammerer of the status of the video.
