INVESTIGATIVE CHRONOLOGY:

- Homicide Detectives notified at 2002 hours
- Detectives began to arrive on-scene at approximately 2040 hours
- Detectives ensured the crime scene was secured
- Detectives were advised of identities of the involved officer and witness officers
- Detectives ensured the involved officer and witness officers were separated, someone was assigned to observe them, and remained at the scene until instructed otherwise
- Detectives met with Officer Curtis Brown and his attorney along with criminalists to conduct weapons inspections and be photographed
- Detectives requested a voluntary statement from Officer Brown as well as on-scene walk-through
- Criminalists responded to Emanuel Hospital and processed MICHAEL TOWNSEND
- Detectives received a briefing from witness officer Officer Brett Emmons starting at approximately 2206 hours
- Homicide supervisors gave assignments to Portland Police Bureau Detectives and coordinated scene processing with the Forensic Evidence Division
- Detectives conducted scene walk-through with Officer Brett Emmons

INVESTIGATIVE CHRONOLOGY (CONT'D):

- Detectives with Portland Police Bureau conducted interviews with witness officers, civilians and personnel from Portland Fire & Rescue and American Medical Response
- Involved and witness officers were issued Communication Restriction Orders by Lieutenant Michaelson
- Gresham Police Department Major Crimes Team responded and collected video surveillance evidence
- Detectives walked through the scene with Criminalists identifying items of evidence, and searched MICHAEL TOWNSEND's motel room
- A door-to-door canvass for witnesses was conducted at the motel
- Non-witness officers advised to write supplemental reports regarding their actions and observations at the scene
- Following the incident, Detectives identified additional witnesses and conducted witness interviews
- Incident casebook forwarded to Senior Deputy District Attorney Nathan Vasquez for review
- On September 14, 2021, a Multnomah County Grand Jury heard evidence related to Officer Curtis Brown's use of deadly force. The Grand Jury determined that the use of deadly force against MICHAEL TOWNSEND was justified under criminal law and returned a Not True Bill.

DESCRIPTION OF SCENE:

The shooting occurred in the parking lot of the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street, at the southeast corner of the intersection of NE Grand Avenue and NE Holladay Street. The motel building is two stories tall, and the parking lot is open air. There is a stairwell for the second story at the east and west end of the parking lot. The motel room rented by MICHAEL TOWNSEND was near the top of the west stairwell. Two 9mm cartridge casings were in the parking lot near the base of the west stairwell, and a closed-eye needle screwdriver was found underneath a parked vehicle, nearby.

The Glock 19 handgun used by Officer Brown and the two 9mm cartridge casings and bullets were sent to the Oregon State Police (OSP) Forensics Laboratory. Dan Alessio who is a Forensic Scientist with OSP examined the firearm. The handgun was function checked, was determined to meet proper specifications, and was operable and capable of firing. The two 9mm cartridge casings were also examined and matched to the firearm of Officer Brown.

ADDITIONAL EXAMINATION:

The closed-eye needle screwdriver recovered from the scene was sent to the OSP Forensic Laboratory for DNA analysis. A DNA standard from MICHAEL TOWNSEND was submitted for comparison. OSP Forensic Scientist Adrianne Schackart examined a swab from the screwdriver handle and located a mixed DNA profile from two contributors, including MICHAEL TOWNSEND's DNA profile.

AUTOPSY FINDINGS:

Chief Deputy Oregon State Medical Examiner Sean Hurst, M.D., conducted the post-mortem examination of MICHAEL TOWNSEND on June 25, 2021. Dr. Hurst determined MICHAEL TOWNSEND's cause of death to be a gunshot wound to the chest and to the abdomen, and ruled his manner of death a homicide.

AUTOPSY FINDINGS (CONT'D):

The toxicology report for MICHAEL TOWNSEND showed the following substances detected in his blood: Methamphetamine, Amphetamine and Olanzapine (antipsychotic medication).

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

On June 24, 2021, at 1906 hours, Officer Emmons and Officer Brown were dispatched to the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street, to assist medical personnel regarding MICHAEL TOWNSEND, who called 911 reporting he was feeling suicidal and high on methamphetamine. MICHAEL TOWNSEND advised the 911-call taker he was "fist packing" a screwdriver; the call taker requested MICHAEL TOWNSEND separate himself from the screwdriver, and he agreed to do so.

At approximately 1912 hours, paramedics from Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) first arrived on-scene and went to the office looking for MICHAEL TOWNSEND, where he told the call taker he would be waiting. MICHAEL TOWNSEND had moved north of the motel property. A second 911 call was made from MICHAEL TOWNSEND while PF&R personnel were on-scene, reiterating he was feeling suicidal and high on methamphetamine. He requested an expedited police response.

MICHAEL TOWNSEND approached PF&R personnel who conversed with him. He appeared to be under the influence of methamphetamine, and at times was acting erratic. MICHAEL TOWNSEND walked off to the stairwell for the second floor stating he needed to go to his room. PF&R personnel asked him not to do so. Officer Emmons and Officer Brown arrived on-scene at approximately 1915 hours. Having ignored requests from PF&R personnel, MICHAEL TOWNSEND was on the second story walkway. Paramedics from American Medical Response (AMR) arrived.

Officer Emmons, who was the primary officer, contacted PF&R personnel and spoke with the motel manager while Officer Brown waited at his patrol vehicle. MICHAEL TOWNSEND walked to his room, but did not enter the room. Officer Emmons decided the officers would disengage and return later if MICHAEL TOWNSEND called 911 again. As personnel were beginning to leave, Officer Emmons saw MICHAEL TOWNSEND on the balcony near his room, and decided to make one more attempt to engage with MICHAEL TOWNSEND to determine if he would agree to be transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. MICHAEL TOWNSEND initially agreed, so the officers and medical personnel remained on-scene.

Officer Emmons, Officer Brown, PF&R and AMR personnel met with MICHAEL TOWNSEND at the base of the west stairwell. He sat on the stairs. Aware that MICHAEL TOWNSEND had reported having a screwdriver, Officer Emmons informed MICHAEL TOWNSEND he would need to be checked for weapons prior to transport in the ambulance, and explained why. Although the officers asked him several times not to do so, MICHAEL TOWNSEND kept reaching for his left pant pocket with his left hand. Officer Emmons explained to MICHAEL TOWNSEND he could go back to his motel room if he wanted and the officers would leave, otherwise he would need to be checked for weapons prior to medical transport. MICHAEL TOWNSEND became non-responsive, so the officers disengaged again.

As the officers began to walk away, but were still near MICHAEL TOWNSEND, he quickly stood up, removed a closed-eye needle screwdriver from his left pant pocket, and aggressively advanced towards Officer Brown, threatening to kill him. The officers retreated, giving MICHAEL TOWNSEND verbal commands to stop. MICHAEL TOWNSEND continued advancing toward Officer Brown, and it appeared MICHAEL TOWNSEND attempted to stab Officer Brown. In an immediate response to the threat, Officer Brown discharged his duty weapon twice, at approximately 1923 hours, striking MICHAEL TOWNSEND twice, and MICHAEL TOWNSEND fell to the ground. The screwdriver from his hand was now located on the ground within arms reach.

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY (CONT'D):

Officer Brown and Officer Emmons retreated to the cover of Officer Emmons' patrol car nearby. Officer Elias arrived on scene immediately after the shooting. Medical personnel quickly returned to their vehicles to obtain equipment. In an effort to make the scene safe for medical personnel to promptly render MICHAEL TOWNSEND aid, the officers approached MICHAEL TOWNSEND and Officer Emmons kicked the screwdriver away from MICHAEL TOWNSEND. AMR subsequently transported MICHAEL TOWNSEND to Emanuel Hospital, he underwent surgery, and he was pronounced deceased at approximately 1946 hours.

Video surveillance cameras at the motel recorded Officer Brown's use of deadly force, as well as the circumstances preceding the incident. Eight personnel from PF&R, four of whom happened to be stopped in their rig at a nearby intersection at the time of the incident, and three personnel from AMR, witnessed the incident.

On June 25, 2021, a post-mortem examination was conducted, and the Medical Examiner determined MICHAEL TOWNSEND died as a result of a gunshot wound to the chest and to the abdomen, and determined his death to be a homicide.

Throughout this investigation, the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office, specifically Senior Deputy District Attorney Nathan Vasquez, as well as the Oregon Department of Justice, were informed of the investigative findings. On September 14, 2021, a Multnomah County Grand Jury heard evidence related to Officer Brown's use of deadly force. The Grand Jury determined that the use of deadly force against MICHAEL TOWNSEND was justified under criminal law and returned a Not True Bill regarding any criminal culpability regarding the death of MICHAEL TOWNSEND.

This report details my initial response and actions at the scene, and interview of witness GIANCARLO SCROBOGNA.

Narrative:

On June 24th, 2021, I was contacted by Detective Sergeant Santos at approximately 1935 hours and directed to respond to 518 NE Holladay Street, to assist with an investigation related to a officer involved shooting. Upon arrival, I was present for the initial briefing given by uniform officers. After the briefing, I was assigned to interview a Portland Fire Fighter who was a witness to the shooting.

Detective Jones and I were assigned to interview PFB GIANCARLO SCROBOGNA, the interview was audio recorded. For full details read the attached transcription or listen to audio recording. At approximately 2227 hours, Detective Jones, Officer Habkirk (Union Representation), I met with PFB GIANCARLO SCROBOGNA while sitting in the firetruck. I explained to SCROBOGNA this interview would be recorded so it was in his own words. SCROBOGNA stated "Yes" that would be okay. SCROBOGNA stated he is assigned to truck #13 and is a firefighter (EMT). SCROBOGNA stated the truck received a call to check on a suicidal call, but the person calling had no plan. SCROBOGNA stated when the truck arrived (AMR) ambulance assisted with the call and Portland Police arrived about five seconds after the truck did. SCROBOGNA stated when the truck arrived he observed a guy pacing back and forth on the sidewalk in front of the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street. SCROBOGNA stated he was assigned to stay with the truck because they were concerned about the guy pacing back in forth by the fire truck. SCROBOGNA stated the guy walking back and forth was a male, white, 6 foot tall, with tattoos everywhere, and the guy appeared to be under the influence.

SCROBOGNA stated he asked the guy who was pacing back and forth if he was the person who had called 911. The subject told the fire fighters yes he was the one and that he wanted to go to the hospital. SCROBOGNA stated one the firefighters told the guy he needed to sit down so they could take his vital signs prior. The subject told the firefighters he needed to go to his room and grab something. SCROBOGNA stated his Lieutenant and two Portland Police Officers told the subject, that he couldn't go to his room. SCROBOGNA stated the subject was told multiple times not to go to his room, but he believed the subject made it to room 218.

SCROBOGNA stated the subject kept changing his mind if he wanted to go to the hospital or not. SCROBOGNA stated the subject at somepoint was able to go to his room and came back down to where all of them were at. SCROBOGNA stated the police officer explained to the subject if he wanted to go to the hospital, the officer would have to pat him down prior to going. SCROBOGNA stated the officers made it very clear that if you want to go to the hospital he was going to have to be searched. SCROBOGNA stated the subject became really upset with the situation. SCROBOGNA stated the subject started grinding his teeth and moving his hands while making a fist, the subject kept reaching for something in his pockets. SCROBOGNA stated the subject kept using both hands to reach into his pockets.

SCROBOGNA stated the subject looked like he wanted to punch something or someone. SCROBOGNA stated the officers told the subject multiple times he has to keep his hands out where they can see them. The officer then asked one more time if the subject wanted to go to the hospital. The subject stated nope he doesn't want to go to the hospital. SCROBOGNA stated that is when the subject got up from the stairs reached into his left pocket and pulled out a possible knife or screwdriver. The subject started walking aggressively towards the police officer. The officer repeatedly kept telling the guy to stop moving, stop moving, stop moving. The subject kept walking and the police officer fired shots. SCROBOGNA believed the officer fired the shots to protect the fire fighters because the subject was armed and charging at them as well. SCROBOGNA stated the subject was two feet away from when the officer fired his weapon. SCROBOGNA stated the officers made it very clear, telling the guy to stop and they did not want to hurt him.

SCROBOGNA stated the subject said something to the effect, "I'm going to kill you guys, you know fuck you guys, I am going to kill you." SCROBOGNA stated he heard the officer fire two shots. After the shooting, all of the firefighters moved back until officers made the scene safe and then they started treated the subject. SCROBOGNA stated he cut the shirt off of the

Summary

MICHAEL TOWNSEND was killed in an officer involved shooting at the Motel 6, 518 NE Holladay St. This report documents and interview with witness Officer Brett Emmons.

Narrative

On June 24, 2021 at approximately 2002 hours I was directed by Sergeant Joe Santos to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. I learned that a shooting occurred at the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay St, and the patient, later identified as MICHAEL TOWNSEND, was transported by ambulance to Emanuel Hospital for treatment. TOWNSEND was pronounced deceased at the hospital. Sergeant Santos directed Detective Anthony Merrill and I to respond to Emanuel Hospital to assist with interviews of the ambulance crew. Detective Jeff Sharp and Detective Chris Traynor assisted with interviews. See their reports for more information.

Detective Merrill and I were then assigned to interview witness Officer Brett Emmons at North Precinct. We met with Officer Emmons and his Attorney Traci Anderson at North Precinct. Officer Emmons was given a Communication Restriction Order by Lieutenant Michaelson. Detective Merrill took photos of Officer Emmons in uniform prior to him changing into street clothes. At approximately 2307 hours Detective Merrill and I conducted an interview with Officer Emmons in a small conference room at the precinct. Present for the interview was Ms. Anderson.

The interview was audio recorded and later archived in DIMS. The following is only a summary of the interview, and is not intended to be a verbatim or chronological account. For more information see the recording.

Officer Emmons said he was assigned today to work North Precinct afternoon shift in district 695. Officer Emmons said he was at a Lloyd District contact office taking a short break when he was dispatched with Officer Curtis Brown to a medical assist call. The call was at the Motel 6 located at NE Grand Ave and NE Holladay St, with which Officer Emmons said he was familiar.

Officer Emmons said the dispatch call notes stated that a white male subject, dressed in black, was high on methamphetamine and suicidal, but had no plan to harm himself. Officer Emmons said there was mention of the subject having a screwdriver but also that the screwdriver had been put away.

Officer Emmons said he and Officer Brown arrived at roughly the same time, and they pulled into the motel driveway off of NE Holladay St. Officer Emmons said a fire engine was already on scene and parked on NE Holladay St. Officer Emmons said firefighters were attempting to converse with who he believed was the suicidal subject (MICHAEL TOWNSEND) on the second floor balcony of the motel.

Officer Emmons said he spoke to the motel manager while Officer Brown contacted the firefighters. Officer Emmons learned that TOWNSEND was staying in room 218 and that he was the 911 caller. Officer Emmons said that TOWNSEND told firefighters he wanted to go to his room and wouldn't come downstairs to speak to the responders. TOWNSEND walked to his room, and Officer Emmons said he decided they should disengage, and would return later if TOWNSEND called 911 again.

Officer Emmons said he got in his car and drove west through the lot. Officer Emmons said he saw TOWNSEND on the balcony by room 218, and he seemed calm and relaxed. Officer Emmons said he thought he would make one more attempt

to engage with TOWNSEND to see if he wanted help. Officer Emmons said he stopped his car and asked TOWNSEND if he wanted help, and TOWNSEND told him he did want help.

TOWNSEND walked down the stairwell and sat down at the bottom of the stairs. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND told him he used a bunch of methamphetamine and was having a bad time or a bad high. Officer Emmons said he observed that TOWNSEND was fidgety, like he was high on methamphetamine, but was not aggressive or threatening.

Officer Emmons said he waved Officer Brown, the firefighters, and ambulance crew over to the stairwell, and told them that TOWNSEND wanted to go to the hospital. Officer Emmons said he and other responders were arranged in a semi-circle around the stairwell, which was underneath room 218. Officer Emmons said there were a couple of empty parking spaces in front of the stairwell.

Officer Emmons said he told TOWNSEND he would need to pat him down for weapons before he went into the ambulance, and asked if that was okay. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND reached his left hand to the left pocket of his shorts, and Officer Emmons asked him not to do that. Officer Emmons said he asked TOWNSEND about the pat down several times, and explained why he wanted to check TOWNSEND for weapons. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND didn't respond to these questions, but kept touching his pocket. Officer Emmons said he couldn't see a weapon, but thought there was a bulge in the pocket.

Officer Emmons said he told TOWNSEND he could go back to his room if he wanted, but if he wanted to go to the hospital he would need to be checked for weapons. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND didn't respond, and Officer Emmons said he decided they would disengage again. Officer Emmons said he didn't feel there was cause to take TOWNSEND into custody on a hold.

Officer Emmons said he backed away from the stairwell, and the firefighters and medics did as well. Officer Emmons said as he walked he moved behind Officer Brown. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND stood up, reached into his left short pocket and pulled out a shiny object. Officer Emmons said he couldn't tell if the object was a knife or screwdriver, but there was about four inches of shiny, pointy metal extending from TOWNSEND's left fist. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND took an athletic stance and held the metal object in front of his torso in a jabbing motion.

Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND focused directly on Officer Brown, who was approximately five to seven feet away from TOWNSEND, and advanced toward him. Officer Emmons said Officer Brown drew his firearm as TOWNSEND advanced on him. Officer Emmons said he had also started to draw his pistol, but switched to Taser when he saw that Officer Brown had his pistol out and aimed at TOWNSEND. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND yelled something like "I'll do it" or "Let's fucking do this" at Officer Brown. Officer Emmons said he believed TOWNSEND was trying to stab or kill Officer Brown.

Officer Emmons said as Officer Brown backed up, TOWNSEND closed the gap between them. Officer Emmons said as he brought his Taser up he saw and heard Officer Brown fire two to four shots. Officer Emmons did not fire his Taser. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND fell forward and then rolled onto his back, with the weapon at his right side. Officer Emmons said they retreated to the cover of his police car, and told TOWNSEND to roll away from the weapon. Officer Emmons said TOWNSEND writhed around but wasn't responsive to any commands.

Officer Emmons said he told medics to hold off on approaching until the weapon could be secured. Officer Emmons said Officer Jeff Elias arrived within seconds, and they approached TOWNSEND. Officer Emmons saw that the weapon was a screwdriver, and he kicked it away. Officer Emmons said he called for medics and began checking TOWNSEND for injuries. Officer Emmons said he located two apparent gunshot wounds on TOWNSEND's left side and armpit, and assisted in loading TOWNSEND onto the gurney.



When I arrived I contacted Officer Romanowski who told me that the deceased (Townsend, Michael M/W, 08/19/1980) was located in operating room #15. Officer Romanowski gave me a blue plastic hospital bag with Townsend's clothing inside it.

I was escorted to OR #15 by hospital staff, where I took overall and detailed digital photographs of Townsend. While awaiting the Deputy Medical Examiner to arrive, I took photographs of Townsend's clothing from the hospital bag. The bag contained a pair of shoes, a pair of socks, an undershirt and a t-shirt.

D.M.E. Tanner arrived and did a cursory examination of Townsend. I took additional photographs of Townsend at the direction of the D.M.E. During her exam a spend bullet was found under Townsend, which I collected. I also collected a pair of white shorts that were underneath Townsend.

The clothing and Emanuel bag were listed on PER #A193353 and the bullet was listed on PER #A193354. A copy of the receipts were given to the charge nurse at the hospital. I transported the items on #A193353 to hazardous material shed at Rivergate. The bullet was forwarded to the Propety Room via the FED's outgoing evidence locker.

Upon hearing that officers were involved in a shooting at 518 NE Holladay, I cleared off of an unrelated call in my district and headed to the shooting scene. While enroute I heard Sgt Sarah Taylor request that an officer respond to Emanuel Hospital. I went straight to the hospital and never made it to the actual shooting scene.

Upon arrival I learned that the patient had already been brought directly back to an Operating Room and was in surgery. Medical staff asked me if I knew the patient's name. I checked the original call and learned that Michael Townsend was his name. I relayed that information to hospital staff. When querying Michael Townsend in Regjin I observed a photo of a Michael R Townsend, date of birth 08/19/1980. A recent photo of him showed numerous facial tattoos, including "TRUST FAITH" where his eyebrows were, as well as spider web tattoos on the top of his forehead. Medical staff in the ER who saw the patient brought into the ER confirmed that the patient had these matching tattoos. I relayed this information to Sgt Santos on the phone. I learned the patient was pronounced deceased at 1946 hours. Some time later I was able to view the deceased in Operating Room 15, while waiting for the Medical Examiner to arrive. He matched the photo I saw in Regjin and had the same facial tattoos.

I also learned that the three AMR personnel who had brought Townsend in had been on scene at the call and witnessed the shooting take place. I walked out to the ambulance bay, where Medic 323 was parked . I briefly spoke with Medics Anton Svidenko, Russell Cooley, and AMR Intern David Pervere, asking them to remain on scene until Detectives arrive. I also asked them not to do any further cleaning of their ambulance until Detectives arrive, as I suspected that a Criminalist would be taking photos of the rig. They agreed and I returned to the Operating Room entrance.

Nurse Emily Colson handed me a blue plastic bag that contained Townsend's shoes and socks. I gave the bag to Criminalist Schleich, who had just arrived to photograph the deceased.

I remained on scene when Deputy Medical Examiner Desiree Tanner arrived. Once she was finished with her initial investigation, she removed the deceased and I cleared the hospital. Nurse Emily Colson was given a copy of the property receipt for Townsend's clothing, which was collected by Criminalist Schleich.

Context---

Upon arrival, I help set up crime scene tape near NE Pacific Ave and NE Grand Ave, then NE Pacific ave and NE 6th Ave, where I parked my patrol vehicle. I walked to NE Hollady and help set up tape near 6th/7th to block pedestrian access.

Lt. Crooker directed me to enter the crime scene and maintain the lobby area, as the call indicated the lobby may have been where the caller was. I signed in and the manager, IVO BCRUZ unlocked the lobby door to let me in.

IVO BCRUZ's statement--

IVO said that Firefighters had arrived and asked him if he called 9-1-1. IVO said a man (white male, skinny, bald, lots of tattoos, 5'9", 30s) outside of the lobby might have, and pointed him out to firefighters. IVO said the firefighters tried talking to the man, then he noticed the man go upstairs, but then IVO went back to doing his office work. I asked if the man had a weapon and IVO wasn't sure, but added his behavior was fidgety.

IVO heard two shots, but didn't see who shot. He then noticed the same man being loaded into an ambulance on a gurney.

I asked IVO if the man was in the lobby; IVO said no, the lobby has been locked and closed due to COVID and only staff occasionally enter. He indicated that since the incident the lobby had been locked and nobody tampered with the area inside.

Conclusion---

I remained on scene near the lobby and helped to keep upstairs motel guests away from the primary scene/lower parking lot area. Some of the residents provided their information as they left and returned to include the following:

Summary

On 062421, at approximately 2002 hours, I was notified by Detective Sergeant Santos that a Portland Police Officer was involved in a shooting. I was directed to respond to Emanuel Hospital in order to interview a medical unit who had witnessed the use of force. The lead investigator for this case is Detective Law and for further details refer to his reports. This report will detail the interview with ANTON SVIDENKO.

Interview with SVIDENKO

On 062421, at approximately 2100 hours, I spoke with ANTON SVIDENKO privately in my vehicle. The interview was audio recorded and will be later transcribed. For further details of the interview refer to the recorded interview and/or the transcript. The following will summarize the interview with SVIDENKO.


SVIDENKO told me that he was working as a paramedic and responded to the call that involved a subject who was suicidal and high on meth. SVIDENKO stated he was partnered with two other employees, who were RUSSEL COOLEY, and an intern named DAVID. SVIDENKO stated Portland Fire Bureau units and Portland Police units were already on the scene prior to the medical unit arrival. SVIDENKO stated he observed the subject, who at first appeared calm, depressed, and delusional. It should be noted this subject was later identified as MICHAEL RAY TOWNSEND.

SVIDENKO said TOWNSEND reached for his left pocket on several occasions and was told not to do so. SVIDENKO stated he moved back from TOWNSEND as he felt like something was going to happen. SVIDENKO said the PFB and PPB units were starting to leave as it did not appear that TOWNSEND was to be transported. SVIDENKO stated TOWNSEND appeared to become more tense with his muscles and focused on the PPB officers. TOWNSEND grabbed the object, which appeared to be a screwdriver, out of his left pocket and charged at the PPB Officer. SVIDENKO said the subject appeared aggressive and multiple people yelled stop to TOWNSEND but he moved quickly at the PPB Officer until the point shots were fired and TOWNSEND stopped.

I asked SVIDENKO if he could draw a map of the scene, which he did. The map will be scanned and attached to this report and the original will be placed into evidence. The interview of SVIDENKO will be uploaded to DIMS.

Summary

On 062421, PPB Officers were involved in a deadly use of force near the area of NE Grand Avenue and NE Holladay Street. I responded to assist the investigation. The lead investigator for this incident is Detective Law and for further details refer to his reports. This report will detail the interview with Officer Elias.

Interview of Officer Elias

On 062421, at approximately 2300 hours, Detective Traynor and I went to North Precinct where we were assigned to interview Officer Elias about what he witnessed in relation to the officer involved shooting. The interview was audio recorded and for complete details of the interview refer to the recording and/or the transcript. The following will summarize the interview with Officer Elias.

On 062421, at approximately 2324 hours, Detective Traynor and I met with Officer Elias along with union representative Officer Walter, and Officer Parker. Officer Elias explained he was aware of the call near the area of NE Grand Avenue and NE Holladay Street but he was not assigned to it. Officer Elias stated he was driving northbound on NE Grand Avenue approaching NE Holladay Street after purchasing coffee at a nearby establishment. Officer Elias stated he saw the emergency vehicles as he approached NE Holladay Street but was not planning to stop at the call. Officer Elias stated he was in the west most lane, stopped at a red light and talking on his cell phone. Officer Elias said he then heard a couple of gun shots at which time he exited his patrol vehicle and ran on foot to the scene.


Officer Elias stated he saw Officer Brown and Emmons in the parking lot area along with PFB personnel and AMR personnel and a subject on the ground. Officer Elias stated he ran back to his patrol car to obtain a less lethal weapon. Officer Elias stated when he returned to the scene a short time later a plan was developed to approach the subject on the ground. Officer Elias stated as they approached the subject he kicked a screwdriver away from the subject which was right next to him. Officer Elias said medical units were advised to come to the subject in order to transport him to a hospital. Officer Elias stated he learned Officer Brown had shot the subject and Officer Elias moved Officer Brown to a police car. Officer Elias said he saw the AMR ambulance was facing NE Grand Avenue and he moved a police car in the lot further north in the lot in order for the ambulance to make a quick route onto NE Grand Avenue. Officer Elias did not use his less lethal weapon during this incident.

The audio of the interview with Officer Elias will be uploaded to DIMS. It should be noted Officer Elias drew on a printed copy of a google map in order to assist this investigation. The map will be attached to this report.

NARRATIVE

On 06/24/21 at about 2025, Criminalist Jakubauskas and I arrived at the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. Sgt. Smith, of the Forensic Evidence Division, provided us with information (up to that point in time) about the shooting and he gave us our assignments. We entered the inner perimeter to assess the scene. We saw numbered placards 1 and 2. They were placed there by patrol to reference the locations of two shell casings. Officer Williams informed me that he has found a screw driver and he showed me its location under a parked car. Criminalist Jakubauskas made video and photo documentations of the scene. Numbered placards 3 and 4 and later lettered placard A were added to the scene to reference the locations of items of evidence and item of interest.

I created a scan plan, see attachment. With the assistance of Criminalist Jakubauskas and Officer Fox, a Leica C10 HDS scanner with serial #1261013 and iStar panoramic camera with serial #NCT-IS3013 were used to capture scan data and still images of the scene. A total of three (3) scan stations were created.

At about 2240, I collected the shell casings, pants, and screwdriver on the parking lot.

At about 2255, I went to Room #218 at the request of Sgt. Smith. After the lead detectives identify the items of evidence and Criminalist Jakubauskas made his photos, I collected the evidence listed on PERs A204257 and A204258. I gave the yellow copies of the receipts to Criminalist Jakubauskas to photograph and leave in the room.

At about 2305, I transported all the evidence that I have collected to the Forensic Evidence Division (FED). Criminalist Jakubauskas assisted me by photographing the pants and its contents, the screwdriver, the contents of the lower shelf under the TV (not including the coins), and miscellaneous paper from the bathroom.

I packaged the evidence listed on PERs A204236, A204257, and A204258. The evidence was delivered to the Property Room via FED outgoing locker. Criminalist Jakubauskas delivered the evidence listed on PER A204237 (the phone) to the Digital Forensics Unit.

On 06/25/21, I downloaded the data from the C10 scanner and I gave it to Criminalist Becker for processing.

Summary

I assisted on an Officer Involved Shooting investigation where a person, later identified as Townsend, Michael, had been shot and declared deceased. This report documents my actions at the scene.

Narrative

On June 24, 2021 at 1935 hours, I was notified by Homicide Detail Sergeant Joe Santos to respond to the Motel 6 at 518 NE Holladay, regarding an Officer Involved Shooting. I learned a person, later identified as Townsend, Michael, was deceased. I learned officer's responded to a dispatched call regarding a suicidal male who was high on methamphetamine. I learned one officer was involved as lethal force and identified as Officer Curtis Brown.

When I arrived at approximately 2030 hours, I could see a large crime scene cordoned off with crime scene tape. Due to the nature of the event, there was a large response of not only police personnel, but also representatives from the Mayor's office, the Portland Police Association, and District Attorney's office. Several anti-police protesters also began to arrive and border the crime scene to the point additional police resources were required to respond.

Detective Beniga and I were tasked with working the crime scene and worked with Criminalist Sergeant Smith and Criminalist's Powell, Outhaythip, and Jakubauskas to locate evidence. LEICA imaging was used to document the crime scene. Detective Beniga and I took measurements and Detective Beniga created a crime scene diagram, refer to his report.

Detective Beniga and I spoke to the motel manager, D'Cruz, Ivo. D'Cruz escorted us into the motel lobby and to where the video surveillance monitoring system was set up. D'Cruz briefly showed me how to control the video and found the incident involving the suicidal person and first responders. I noted "camera 5" was displaying the images of the parking lot and captured the interactions with Townsend and first responders. D'Cruz said that was the only working camera that captures the parking lot. I reviewed part of the video. First responders were on scene for quite a while, speaking with Townsend. At one point, Townsend is seen seated on the bottom of the western most staircase and the officers look as though they are finishing speaking to him and may be getting ready to clear the call. Suddenly Townsend jumps up with a sharp object in his left hand and charges Officer Brown, who then shoots Townsend.

Detective Beniga recorded a brief excerpt of the video with his cell phone, in order to show the lead investigators. The full video was later downloaded by Gresham Officer Wright.

While reviewing the video, D'Cruz told me the male in the video, checked into room number 218 as Michael Townsend. D'Cruz pulled up the motel check in and showed me Townsend was checked into their system at 4:16pm on June 24, 2021. D'Cruz told me they are not allowed to store photos or identification from guests. I photographed two screens showing the Motel 6 registrations related to Townsend and later put them into DIMS. D'Cruz said we could go into room 218 and provided me a room key card, which I provided to Detective Law.

When Detective Law, other investigators, and criminalist's were done in room 218, I returned the key card to D'Cruz.

On June 24, 2021 I was contacted by Detective Sergeant Santos at approximately 2002 hours, and directed to respond to the Motel 6 parking lot, located at 518 NE Holladay Street to investigate an Officer Involved Shooting. The initial information I received from Sergeant Santos was one subject was shot and was currently in surgery. Shortly thereafter, Sergeant Santos advised me that the subject had since died. I arrived on scene at approximately 2052 hours. I noted the scene was cordoned

off with crime scene tape and there were multiple uniform officers at the location. I observed several agitated protesters standing just outside the crime scene who were yelling at nearby police officers. I met with my Partner, Detective Law who had already been in contact with various people involved with the investigation.

Shortly after arriving on scene, Detective Law, Detective Foote and I went inside the mobile command post where we met with Officer Curtis Brown and his representative. I was present while Detective Law conducted a weapon and ammunition count with Officer Brown. See Detective Law's report for complete details.

After the weapons count, I attended a briefing conducted by Sergeant Santos. When this briefing concluded, I entered the crime scene (At approximately 2226 hours) where I met with Detective Law and Officer Emmons. After a brief walk through of the crime scene, I assisted Sergeant Santos and other police personnel with entering hotel room number 218 to make sure no one was inside. After the room was clear, I briefly looked around the room and then exited without collected any items.

This investigation is ongoing.

NARRATIVE

During the course of this investigation, I learned that a second fire truck may have been driving by the Motel 6 (518 NE Holladay St) at the time of the shooting. I viewed the video surveillance received from the Motel 6 and confirmed that while four members of Portland Fire Truck 13 were in the parking lot when the shooting occurred, a second fire truck was stopped on NE Grand Avenue (facing northbound) while waiting for a tri-met train to pass by. Based on this video, it appears that members of this second fire truck may have been in position to witness the shooting.

On June 28, 2021 I contacted the on-duty Lieutenant for Firehouse 13 (Identified as Brian Malloy) by phone. Lt Malloy checked the roster for the day of this incident and relayed to me that Portland Fire Engine 13 had passed by the incident and was occupied by four Fire Bureau members. Lt Malloy identified these four members as Mitch Keller, Spencer Gehring, Travis Blevins, and Jacob Gartland.

On June 28, 2021 at approximately 1010 hours, I called Jacob Gartland via phone and briefly spoke with him. This phone call was audio recorded in its entirety, however was not transcribed. During this brief phone conversation with Gartland, he informed me that he is currently on duty and was at the grocery store. Gartland and I arranged a time later in the day where he would be available to talk.

On June 28, 2021 at approximately 1250 hours, I called Jacob Gartland back. This phone call was audio recorded in its entirety and later transcribed. During this interview, Gartland was called away for a medical call, so the conversation quickly ended. On this same date at approximately 1317 hours, Gartland called me back and we continued the phone conversation. This phone call was also audio recorded in its entirety and later transcribed. The following is a brief summary of both interviews with Gartland and is not intended to be a complete account of all that was said. For complete details, refer to the transcription and/or audio recording.

Jacob Gartland told me that on the day this shooting took place, he was on duty with the Portland Fire Bureau and was working out of Fire Station 13. According to Gartland, Fire Station 13 has a Fire truck (Truck-13) and an Engine (Engine-13). On this date, Gartland was working on Engine 13 along with three other Portland Firemen who he identified as (Driver) Mitch Keller, (Front Passenger) Spencer Gehring, and (Back Driver's Side Passenger) Travis Blevins. Jacob was seated behind the front passenger. Gartland said he and the others on Engine 13 had just cleared a call and were driving north bound on NE Grand Avenue when they stopped for a red light next to the listed Motel 6. Gartland said he and his co-workers knew that Portland Fire Truck 13 were on a call at this Motel 6, so when they pulled up, they waved to their co-workers. Gartland noticed that his co-workers and at least one Police Officer were all talking to a subject who was likely seated on the stairwell of the motel. Gartland said this conversation appeared to be very casual in nature. Gartland was not able to see the subject they were talking to because of the stairwell and a vehicle parked between them.

As they remained stopped on NE Grand Avenue, Gartland heard his co-worker (Travis Blevins) say that one of the officers had his gun out. Gartland turned his attention back to the Motel 6 parking lot, where he noticed something had changed. Gartland observed the "Patient" had stood up and was walking towards the police officer who was now stepping backwards with his gun out. Gartland said that although he was 30'-40' feet away from the officers and "patient", he could tell that the "patient" was angry. Gartland said the incident happened so fast that he was not able to see if the "patient" had anything in his hands. Shortly after seeing this, Gartland heard 2 gunshots fired. Gartand believes the "patient" was approximately 10' away from the officer when the officer fired the two shots.

NARRATIVE

During the course of this investigation, Detective Law informed me that he read a news article on Koin.com which may have identified a possible witness to this shooting. I viewed this article (Dated June 26, 2021) which identified the witness as Kalli Temple who resides at the Louise Flowers building (located at 515 NE Holladay Street Portland, Oregon). In viewing this article, the writer wrote the following regarding Kalli Temple's observations:

"The guy was having a psychotic break," said the witness, Kalli Temple. "You could tell he wasn't all there."

Temple said she heard a commotion from her apartment at the Louise Flowers building and grabbed a pair of binoculars to get a better view of the man who, she said, was being led back into a second-floor room at the motel when the incident escalated.

"Dude wouldn't come in there. He went into another hotel room on the bottom," Temple said. "Cops got him out of there, he booked it and that's when the cops shot his a--."

Temple said the man was taken away by ambulance soon thereafter.

I checked the name Kalli Temple through the Portland Police Bureau's data base and found that she lives at 515 NE Holladay Street #1101 (Louise Flowers Building). On June 28, 2021 Detective Law and I responded to 515 NE Holladay Street #1101

in an attempt to speak with Kalli. Upon knocking on the door for room #1101, a female who identified herself as Kalli Temple answered the door. I identified myself to Kalli and asked if she would be willing to speak with me about the incident that occurred a few days prior. Kalli appeared very cooperative and invited Detective Law and I inside. When asked, Kalli agreed to provide a statement about her observations and allowed me to record the conversation. After speaking with Kalli for about three to four minutes, I began recording the conversation which was later transcribed. The following is a brief summary of Kalli's statement. For complete detail, refer to the audio recording and/or transcription.

Kalli told me that at the time of the shooting, she was inside her residence which is located on the 11th floor facing southbound towards the Motel 6 parking lot. While inside her residence, Kalli heard an argument from across the street so she looked outside to see what was happening. While looking outside, Kalli observed two while males at the motel 6. Kalli opened her window and could hear the two men arguing about one of them wanting to use the other person's Methamphetamine pipe.

Kalli described the first subject as a white male, thin with feathered blond hair.

Kalli described the second subject as a white male, heavy set with short hair. This subject was wearing a dark colored pair of pants and no shirt. Kalli had never seen this heavy set subject before, however identified him as the subject who was later shot by Police. This subject will hereinafter be referred to as MICHAEL TOWNSEND.

Prior to police arriving on scene, Kalli noticed TOWNSEND was waving around a knife or similar object. Kalli said it appeared as though TOWNSEND was trying to get the knife out of his hand, but for whatever reason was not able to do so.

A short time after she heard these two arguing, several police and fire personnel arrived and parked in or near the parking lot of the Motel 6. The police exited their patrol cars and approached TOWNSEND who was now seated on the stairwell located at the west end of the parking lot of the Motel 6. As Officers were talking to him, the above mentioned skinny subject ran off east bound on NE Holladay Street.

Kalli said she was not able to hear what was being said between the Police Officers and TOWNSEND. As the interaction continued, Kalli was able to hear TOWNSEND make several threatening comments to the police to include, "leave me alone" and "you'all are trying to arrest me". As this continued, TOWNSEND threatened to stab the Police Officers and said he was going to kill them.

Kalli heard several subjects at the Motel 6 trying to convince TOWNSEND to drop the knife, however he refused. At one point, TOWNSEND stood up and swung the knife at the officers. Kalli then observed a black Police Officer fire two to three shots at TOWNSEND. Kalli said she later told people inside her apartment building that "the police did what they had to do." Kalli followed this by saying, "Whatcha all going to do when you have a dude like that who's trying to kill ya'all".

Kalli told me that when the shooting occurred, she was inside the living room of her residence looking out the south facing window. I looked out this same window towards the Motel 6 and noticed that a majority of her line of sight to the Motel 6 parking lot was obstructed by large, mature trees. I asked Kalli about this. Kalli informed me that on the day of the shooting, it was very windy which caused the trees to sway back and forth which opened up her line of sight to the staircase of the Motel 6. I continued to look out this same window and noticed there was some wind blowing which was causing the trees to sway. However, the wind was not strong enough to open a line of sight to the stairwell.

Kalli said she has not watched any news on the shooting and has not watched any video surveillance from the incident. After the incident occurred, Kalli went downstairs and joined in with some of the protesters on the outside of the crime scene. While in this position, Kalli video taped the action using her cellphone. I observed these three video recordings on Kalli's phone and

noticed that all three were recorded well after the shooting and captured nothing of evidential value. I attempted to send these videos to my email, however the files were too large for her phone to send. I then used my phone to video record all three videos, which I later placed into DIMS.

I took several pictures from the inside of Kalli's residence, from both her living room window and bedroom window, looking out towards the Motel 6 in an attempt document her line of sight to the shooting. In addition, I video recorded a short (10 second) clip of the trees swaying to see if the line of sight ever opened up enough to see the stairwell of the Motel 6. In doing so, I was never able to see the middle or bottom of the stairwell.

I brought it to Kalli's attention that the news reported that Kalli told the reporter that the police shot the subject as he was running away from them. Kalli said this was not true. Kalli said when she told this to the news, she was telling them that the skinny subject (mentioned above) was the one who ran away, not TOWNSEND.

PORTLAND, Orc. (KOIN) — The Portland Police Bureau identified the man killed in last week's deadly officer involved shooting in Portland's Lloyd District Saturday.

According to an autopsy conducted by the Oregon State Medical Examiner, 40-year-old Michael Ray Townsend died as a result of a gunshot wound on Thursday, June 24.

The shooting happened in the 500 block of NE Holladay Street after police were called to do a welfare check on a man dressed in all black at a Motel 6, police said.

Officers and paramedies arrived and found the man. The shooting happened shortly after 7 p.m., officials said.

A witness told KOIN 6 the incident may have started as a fight between two men and one stabbed the other. The witness said police shot the stabbing suspect twice in the back in the parking lot of the Motel 6.

Another witness said she heard two shots and watched one officer fire on a man in the midst of a mental health crisis.

"The guy was having a psychotic break," said the witness, Kalli Temple. "You could tell he wasn't all there."

Temple said she heard a commotion from her apartment at the Louise Flowers building and grabbed a pair of binoculars to get a better view of the man who, she said, was being led back into a second-floor room at the motel when the incident escalated.

"Dude wouldn't come in there. He went into another hotel room on the bottom," Temple said, "Cops got him out of there, he booked it and that's when the cops shot his a—."

The tires on at least one PPB patrol car were punctured and a window was broken. Additional officers from across the city were called in to help with safety and security efforts.

The officer involved in the shooting–18-year-veteran Curtis Brown–is on administrative leave, standard protocol in these incidents.

This is the second fatal police shooting of 2021 following the death of Robert Delgado in Lents Park in April, which also drew protesters to the scene.

Narrative

On June 24, 2021 at approximately 2002 hours I was directed by Sergeant Joe Santos to assist with a fatal officer involved shooting investigation. I learned that a shooting occurred at the Motel 6, located at 518 NE Holladay St and the subject, later identified as MICHAEL TOWNSEND, was transported by ambulance to Emanuel Hospital. I also learned TOWNSEND subsequently was pronounced deceased at the ER. Sergeant Santos directed Detective JOE CORONA and I to respond to Emanuel Hospital to assist with interviews of the ambulance paramedics. Detective Jeff Sharp and Detective Chris Traynor assisted with interviews. See their reports for more information. The deceased subject will be referred to as TOWNSEND in this report.

Interview with AMR Paramedic RUSSELL COOLEY

Detective Corona and I contacted and interviewed AMR Paramedic RUSSELL COOLEY at approximately 2044 hours on June 24th, 2021 in my police detective's vehicle for privacy at Emanuel Hospital Emergency Room parking lot. I audio recorded this interview with my digital recorder, later uploaded the audio to the DIMS database to preserve it under Asset #L6S50208, and also had the audio transcribed. The following is a summary of the key points of this interview. Refer to the audio and or the transcript for this interview in its entirety.

COOLEY told me he responded with his coworkers, DAVID, who is a student, and ANTON, who is a paramedic, in their ambulance with call number, Medic #323. COOLEY told me they were working an 1830 to 0630 hours 12 hours shift. COOLEY told me he has been a medic for twenty years. COOLEY told me they responded to the Motel 6 to a 40 year old male subject, who was suicidal, under the influence of Methamphetamine, but not violent. COOLEY told me when they arrived at the scene that Portland Fire Bureau (PFB) Truck #13 was already there along with two (2) uniformed police officers. COOLEY told me initially PFB personnel told him they were clearing as the subject did not want their assistance, however a few moments later police officers indicated the subject changed his mind. COOLEY told me he was sitting on the push bumper of a patrol car about two vehicles back from the subject in the motel lot. COOLEY voluntarily drew a sketch per my request of the scene to illustrate the motel lot and the various personnel and subject's positions, (Exhibit 2, Item #1).

COOLEY told me he was behind one of the patrol officers, who had their back to COOLEY, while this officer engaged the subject, MICHAEL TOWNSEND. COOLEY noted the subject was sitting on the second to bottom step of the motel stairway near the southwest corner of the motel lot. COOLEY told me he is partially deaf in his left ear and there was loud traffic noise nearby so he could not hear the conversation between the police and TOWNSEND. COOLEY told me the officers were talking to TOWNSEND for a while and then all of sudden he noted all of the firemen and police officers who were standing in a semi-circle around the subject began to back away from TOWNSEND. COOLEY told me the officer with his back to COOLEY drew his service gun simultaneously. COOLEY told me the officers and firemen all backed away from TOWNSEND as TOWNSEND simultaneously got up quickly and advanced on them about three to four steps, specifically fixated on the officer with his back to COOLEY who had his service gun drawn. COOLEY believed the way all the police and fire personnel began to back up simultaneously meant it was for a safety purpose. COOLEY told me the officer said something to TOWNSEND during this interaction also, but he could not hear what he said.

COOLEY told me he could not believe how fast TOWNSEND closed the gap on the officer. COOLEY told me TOWNSEND also pulled something out and held it in front of his body in his left hand with his left arm up all the way above his head and aggressively advanced toward the officer while saying something to the officers. COOLEY told me he could not see what TOWNSEND was holding up above his head in his left hand. COOLEY told me TOWNSEND seemed to focus on the officer with his back to COOLEY in front of him. COOLEY described the second officer's position as off to the left or east side of the officer who had his back to COOLEY.

COOLEY told me the officer backed up about two steps and then fired his handgun two (2) to three (3) times at TOWNSEND who dropped to the ground. COOLEY told me he began to approach TOWNSEND to render medical aid, but was told by the second officer who did not shoot to wait while he got the the knife away from TOWNSEND. COOLEY told me even though the officer said a knife, COOLEY thought he recalled seeing something in the call notes about a screwdriver. COOLEY told us he never saw the knife or screwdriver the officer referred to, but he definitely believed TOWNSEND had something in his hand and was aggressively advancing towards the officer with it. COOLEY believed TOWNSEND was definitely going to assault the officer by how quickly he closed the distance and by his aggressive body language. COOLEY told me no more than 60 seconds went by after the shooting before the officers allowed COOLEY to render medical aid. COOLEY also pointed out that PFB Engine 13 also drove by northbound on NE Grand Ave right when this shooting occurred. COOLEY estimated from the time he arrived until the time the gunshots were fired was no more than five minutes. COOLEY told me TOWNSEND had been shot in his left axillary region or armpit area because he had his left arm raised up above his head when he aggressively advanced on the officer. COOLEY also thought TOWNSEND had another gunshot strike to his lower right belly. COOLEY told me TOWNSEND was not responsive when he tried to render medical care to him.

Assist Criminalist Alison Schleich & Medicolegal Dez Tanner in OR with deceased

At about 2130 hours, Detective Corona and I joined Criminalist Alison Schleich and Officer Dan Romanowski in the Emanuel Emergency Operating Room #15 where TOWNSEND had been pronounced deceased. Criminalist Schleich was directed by Sergeant Joe Santos to collect and photograph TOWNSEND'S clothing as evidence. Refer to Criminalist Schleich's police report for further details. Medicolegal Death Investigator Dez Tanner also arrived in OR #15 and examined TOWNSEND'S gunshot injuries and subsequently removed his body with our assistance at approximately 2206 hours. Detective Corona obtained MICHAEL TOWNSEND'S name and date of birth from Officer Dan Romanowski. Refer to Officer Romanowski and Detective Corona's reports for further details.

Interview with Witness Officer BRETT EMMONS at North Precinct

Detective Corona and I next responded to the scene at the Motel 6 and Sergeant Santos directed us to interview witness Officer Brett Emmons at North Precinct. We met with Officer Emmons and his Attorney Traci Anderson at North Precinct. Officer Emmons was given a Communication Restriction Order by Lieutenant Michaelson. I took photos of Officer Emmons in uniform prior to him changing into street clothes, (Exhibit 3). At approximately 2307 hours Detective Corona and I conducted an interview with Officer Emmons in a small conference room at the precinct. PPA Union Attorney Traci Anderson sat in on the interview as legal counsel for Officer Emmons. Refer to Detective Corona's police report for details of this interview.

Detective Corona and I next responded to the Detective Division for a debrief with all the other investigators.



At approximately 2002 hours, I was notified by Sergeant Santos regarding an officer involved shooting that occurred at the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street. I responded to the location to assist in the investigation. At approximately 2113 hours, Detective Hertzler and I contacted Mr. D'Cruz, who is the general manager of the motel regarding the surveillance video for the property. Mr. D'cruz allowed access for us to review the video and we determined the shooting occurred at 1955 hours (system displayed time). I recorded a short excerpt of the incident pending later acquisition by trained personnel. I noted the following difference between system displayed time and the current time: **Displayed Time: 2208 / Current Time: 2135.** I subsequently submitted the video excerpt into DIMS. For further details, refer to report by Detective Hertzler.

Detective Hertzler and I were subsequently assigned to assist FED personnel in documenting the crimes scene which I noted was at the west end of the Motel 6 parking lot. I observed the surveillance camera which captured the footage I had previously



reviewed was affixed at the rooftop of the Motel 6 building, east of the northwest corner of the building. The camera view is in a northeast direction. Four items of evidence were placarded and recovered by FED personnel. In addition, Criminalist Outhaythip documented the scene using the Leica scanning station. I later prepared a scene diagram and legend. Based upon my video review, I depicted the two PPB marked patrol vehicles, the AMR ambulance and PFB station 13 ladder truck relative locations at the time of the shooting occurrence. The depictions are approximate only. For details of the scene measurements, refer to Leica scan data.

NARRATIVE

During the course of this investigation, I learned that a second fire truck may have been driving by the Motel 6 (518 NE Holladay St) at the time of the shooting. Travis Blevins told me that on the day this shooting took place, he was on duty with the Portland Fire Bureau and was working on Fire Engine 13 with three other Portland Firemen who he identified as (Driver) Spencer Gehring, (Front Passenger) Mitch Keller, and (Rear Passenger) Jacob Gartland. Travis was positioned directly behind the driver's seat.

Travis said he and the others on Engine 13 were just clearing from an unrelated call and were heading back to their station when they stopped at a red light. While stopped for the light, he and the others on the engine noticed Portland Fire Truck-13 on a "behavior call" directly next to them. Travis looked out his window and noticed the four Portland Firemen from Truck-13 as well as a Portland Police Officer talking to an unknown person that he was not able to see. Travis recalled there was a white colored car parked between the "patient" and Engine-13, so he was not able to see what the "patient" was doing. Travis estimated he was approximately 50-60 feet away from the group.

Prior to their light turning green, Travis noticed that everyone in this group began backing up and saw the Police Officer pull out his gun. At this time, Travis was able to see the subject stand up and begin charging towards the Police Officer. Travis recalled the subject was walking towards the officer in a sideways motion. When the subject got to within about ten feet of the Police Officer, the officer fired two shots. Travis was not able to see if the subject had anything in his hands.

Immediately after the shots were fired, his light turned green and Engine 13 began driving away.

Blevins, and (Rear Passenger) Jacob Gartland. Mitch was positioned in the front passenger's seat. Just prior to the shooting, Mitch and the others on Portland Fire Engine-13 had just pulled up to a red light, where he noticed his co-workers on Portland Fire Truck-13 on an unrelated call directly next to them. Mitch said he looked over at his co-workers and noticed what he described to be a "stagnant scene". Mitch recalled seeing at least one Police Officer standing near the members of Truck-13. Mitch said things seemed pretty uneventful, so he wasn't paying much attention to what they were doing.

At some point, someone in his Engine crew said something was occurring next to them, so he looked over at the police officer and Truck-13. When he did this, he noticed a subject holding what appeared to be a knife in his hand. This subject began lunging forward while swinging the knife in a flailing type motion. Mitch noticed the police officer and others in the group began backing away from this subject, however he continued to progress on them. NARRATIVE:

During the course of this investigation, I viewed a report written by Officer Fox, DPSST #47852 on Portland Police case #21-171597. This report documented Officer Fox's canvassing of the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street immediately after the shooting occurred on June 24, 202. In viewing this report, I found that Officer Fox contacted a subject staying in room #215 of the Motel 6 who identified himself as Raymond Gains, DOB 09-02-86 with the phone number of 310-920-0657. Officer Fox documented that he spoke with Gains who stated that he "didn't see much" in regards to the shooting. Additionally, Officer Fox documented in this same report that Gains did not appear to be truthful about the other occupants inside of his hotel room.

On June 30, 2021 I attempted to speak with Raymond Gains about his observations. I called the phone number he provided to Officer Fox, however this number came up as disconnected or no longer in service. I checked Raymond Gains through the Portland Police data base, however did not find anyone with a matching or similar date of birth. I checked the phone number listed for Gains through the same Portland Police data base and did not find any record associated to this number.

I checked Raymond Gains with the date of birth of 09-02-86 through an on-line data base available to law enforcement (TLO), however no matches were found. I checked the phone number listed for Gains through the same data base and found several people associated to the phone number throughout the past several years, however none of these subjects had a similar name or date of birth as Gains.

On this same date, I called the same Motel 6 and spoke with the front desk employee who identified himself as Robert Alonzo. This phone call was not recorded. Alonzo told me that he was the person who checked Raymond Gains into the hotel last week and recalled dealing with him immediately after the shooting occurred. Alonzo said that when he checked Gains into the hotel, Gains used a California Driver's License as his identification. Alonzo looked Gains up in the Motel 6 data base and relayed his findings to me. Alonzo told me his data base showed the subject who checked into room # 215 was identified as Raymond Gaines, no date of birth or phone number was recorded, and the address of 1020 West Myrrh St in Compton, California. Alonzo said the computer did not show when Gains checked in or out of the hotel. However, Alonzo recalled that Gains checked out of his room one to two days after the shooting occurred and recalled that Gains told him he was returning back to California.

At this time, I am unaware of how to get in contact with Gains to obtain a statement from him.

SUMMARY

On June 24, 2021, MICHAEL TOWNSEND called 9-1-1 and reported he was suicidal and under the influence of methamphetamine. Paramedics from American Medical Response and Portland Fire & Rescue responded. Portland Police Officers Emmons and Brown were dispatched to assist. MICHAEL TOWNSEND was in front of an area motel. Attempts were made to have him voluntarily transported to the hospital by paramedics for a mental health evaluation, without success. The officers developed a plan with MICHAEL TOWNSEND for him to call 9-1-1 back when he was ready to go to the hospital. During the incident, as officers were disengaging from MICHAEL TOWNSEND to leave, he removed a sharp metal object from his pocket, advanced towards Officer Brown, and attempted to stab him. Officer Brown retreated and discharged his duty weapon twice, striking MICHAEL TOWNSEND. MICHAEL TOWNSEND was promptly given medical assistance and transported to a nearby hospital where he was pronounced deceased. Emergency medical personnel witnessed the incident, and it was captured on video surveillance. This report documents the initial steps of the investigation at the scene.

NARRATIVE

On June 24, 2021, at 2002 hours, I was notified by Sergeant Santos to respond to the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street, to investigate an Officer Involved Shooting at that location. Initial information from Sergeant Santos indicated one officer was involved, there were two witness officers, and the suspect was currently undergoing surgery at Emanuel Hospital. Prior to my arrival, Sergeant Santos updated me the suspect was pronounced deceased.

I arrived in the area at approximately 2045 hours and entered the southern perimeter for the scene at the intersection of NE Grand Avenue and NE Pacific Street. The intersection was closed to northbound pedestrian and motor vehicle traffic. Uniform officers were present, and a crowd had gathered at the intersection.

Several blocks surrounding the Motel 6 were cordoned off with yellow crime scene tape. Multiple uniform officers were on scene. An area within the parking lot of the Motel 6, designated as the inner crime scene, was marked with red crime scene tape. I verified the scene was secure. Personnel from Portland Fire & Rescue Station 13 were waiting near the motel.

Sergeant Santos and I met with Sergeant Taylor who was one of the patrol supervisor for the incident. I was advised Officer Brown was the involved officer, and Officers Emmons and Elias were witness officers. I later learned Officer Elias was in the area at the time of the incident and responded after hearing gunshots. I verified that the involved officer and witness officers were separated and someone was assigned to observe them. The officers were in uniform, and their marked police vehicles were at the scene. I confirmed with Officer Guevara that he had initiated a log of those entering the scene.

I met with Medicolegal Death Investigator (MDI) Tanner of the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office. MDI Tanner advised me the male suspect was tentatively identified as MICHAEL TOWNSEND, and that he was pronounced deceased at 1946 hours. MDI Tanner subsequently responded to Emanuel Hospital to conduct her initial examination of MICHAEL TOWNSEND. From MDI Tanner I later learned a projectile was observed from an x-ray of MICHAEL TOWNSEND at the hospital. The body of MICHAEL TOWNSEND was transported to the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office pending a post-mortem examination.

Criminalists Outhaythip and Jakubauskas of the Forensic Evidence Division began their documentation and processing of the scene under the supervision of Sergeant Smith. Sergeant Dunbard was also on scene. Sergeant Smith advised me that Criminalist Schleich responded to Emanuel Hospital to photograph MICHAEL TOWNSEND and collect his clothing. I later learned that Criminalist Schleich collected a spent bullet MDI Tanner found underneath MICHAEL TOWNSEND during her

examination (see Follow-Up Report by Criminalist Schleich for additional details).

Detectives Pontius and Foote assisted me at the scene. After consulting with Sergeant Santos, the decision was made to conduct a countdown of Officer Brown's duty weapon, and then issue Officer Brown a Communication Restriction Order (CRO). Detectives Pontius, Foote and I then coordinated with Criminalist Powell to conduct the countdown of Officer Brown in the Mobile Command Center (see my related Follow-Up report for the details of the weapon countdown and statements made by Officer Brown). Senior Deputy District Attorney Vasquez was present. Attorney Mike Staropoli represented Officer Brown. I determined Officer Brown discharged his duty weapon twice during the incident. Lieutenant Michaelson issued Officer Brown a CRO at the completion of the weapon countdown. Officer Brown was then transported from the scene.

Detectives Corona, Merrill, Traynor and Sharp responded to Emanuel Hospital and interviewed the paramedics from American Medical Response (AMR) whom witnessed the incident and transported MICHAEL TOWNSEND (see Follow-Up reports by Detectives Merrill, Traynor and Sharp for details of those interviews).

Detectives Beniga and Hertzler spoke with the manager of the Motel 6, IVO D'CRUZ, and learned that MICHAEL TOWNSEND had checked into the motel earlier that afternoon and rented room #218. Detective Beniga reviewed initial video surveillance footage of the incident from the Motel 6. The footage showed that MICHAEL TOWNSEND advanced towards Officer Brown and attempted to stab him, Officer Brown retreated, and then Officer Brown shot MICHAEL TOWNSEND. Detective Beniga recorded a excerpt of the video footage to preserve the video pending collection of the actual footage by a trained technician.

Detectives Beniga and Hertzler assisted Criminalists Outhaythip and Jakubauskas with the processing of the scene (see related Follow-Up reports by Detectives Beniga and Hertzler for details of their actions, as well as Detective Beniga's crime scene diagram).

Detectives Pontius, Foote and I met with Sergeant Santos and the remainder of the investigative team in the Mobile Command Center. Sergeant Santos had notified Sergeant McGowan of the Gresham Police Department (GPD) Major Crimes Team regarding the incident. Sergeant McGowan directed GPD Officer Wright respond to the scene to collect video surveillance evidence. I know Officer Wright has specialized training in video evidence collection.

At approximately 2206 hours, Officer Emmons provided investigators a briefing on the incident in the Mobile Command Center. Attorney Traci Anderson represented Officer Emmons. In part, I learned the following from Officer Emmons:

At 1906 hours on June 24, 2021, Officers Emmons and Brown were dispatched to the Motel 6 to assist medical personnel regarding MICHAEL TOWNSEND who called 9-1-1 reporting he was suicidal and under the influence of methamphetamine. Officer Emmons was the primary officer for the assist call, and Officer Brown was the cover officer. Upon their arrival, paramedics from Portland Fire & Rescue Station 13 were on scene talking to MICHAEL TOWNSEND, who was acting erratic. He was in front of the motel. Officer Emmons learned from the motel manager MICHAEL TOWNSEND had rented room #218. AMR paramedics arrived. Attempts were made to have MICHAEL TOWNSEND voluntarily transported to the hospital by paramedics for a mental health evaluation, without success. The officers developed a plan with MICHAEL TOWNSEND for him to call 9-1-1 back when he was ready to go to the hospital. During the incident, MICHAEL TOWNSEND did not comply with requests the officers made that he not reach into his pocket, and as officers were disengaging from MICHAEL TOWNSEND to leave, he removed a sharp metal object from his pocket, advanced towards

Officer Brown, and attempted to stab him. In response, Officer Brown discharged his duty weapon, striking MICHAEL TOWNSEND, who went to the ground. Emergency medical personnel were still on scene. Officer Elias arrived after the shooting. The officers approached MICHAEL TOWNSEND to make the scene safe for paramedics to render aid. The metal object MICHAEL TOWNSEND used as a weapon during the incident, which appeared to be a screwdriver, was laying on the ground near him, and Officer Emmons kicked the metal object to separate it from MICHAEL TOWNSEND when officers approached. MICHAEL TOWNSEND was promptly given medical assistance and AMR transported him from the scene.

At the conclusion of the briefing, Sergeant Santos made additional investigatory assignments. Detectives Samora, Kammerer, Winters, Jones, Sharp and Traynor interviewed the listed personnel from Portland Fire & Rescue Station 13 whom witnessed the incident (see Follow-Up reports by the Detectives Samora, Traynor, Winters and Jones for details of those interviews).

At the conclusion of the briefing, Officer Emmons conducted a walk-through of the scene. Also present were his attorney, Sergeant Santos, Detectives Foote, Pontius and I, and DDA Vasquez. Officer Emmons showed me the area of the parking lot at the motel where the incident occurred, near the west stairwell. At 2226 hours, we entered the red crime scene tape. I directed Officer Emmons to view the metal object with a handle Criminalists marked with Placard 4. That object was laying on the ground underneath the rear driver's side of a white Chevy Lumina with Oregon plate ZAN442. The Chevy Lumina was backed into a parking space near the base of the west stairwell (the vehicle was unrelated to the incident). Officer Emmons viewed the metal object and did not touch or disturb the item. Officer Emmons told me the metal object was the same item MICHAEL TOWNSEND attempted to stab Officer Brown with during the incident, which Officer Emmons kicked away from MICHAEL TOWNSEND post-shooting.

I allowed Officer Emmons to obtain his personal belongings from his marked police vehicle in the parking lot of the motel. Officers Emmons and Elias were transported to North Precinct and Detectives interviewed them. Detective Supervisor Daul coordinated the interviews. Detectives Corona and Merrill interviewed Officer Emmons, and Detectives Sharp and Traynor interviewed Officer Elias (see Follow-Up reports by Detectives Corona and Sharp for details of those interviews).

I further observed the scene with Detectives Pontius and Foote. In part, I noted the following: There were two stairwells accessing the second story of the motel, one at the east end of the parking lot and one near the west end. There were two 9mm cartridge casings laying on the ground near the westernmost storm drain cover. That storm drain cover was near the front end of the previously described Chevy Lumina. The cartridge casings were east of that storm drain cover, nearby. South of where the cartridge casings were located, closer to the base of the west stairwell, I observed a pair of pants and a belt on the ground. Those items had been removed from MICHAEL TOWNSEND when medical aid was rendered after the shooting. Criminalist Outhaythip located a cellphone in the pocket of the pants, and other items. Criminalist Outhaythip collected all of the items of evidence at the scene (see Follow-Up report by Criminalist Outhaythip for complete details).

Officer Fox advised me at the scene he and another officer were assigned by their supervisor to conduct a door-to-door canvass of the motel rooms for witnesses, which resulted in no new information.

A hostile crowd gathered in the area of NE Grand Avenue and NE Pacific Street while the scene was being processed. Citywide emergency police resources were summoned. Crowd control officers maintained the security of the scene and were subjected to projectiles. I saw an officer at one point that backed away from the crowd after being sprayed in the face with some sort of irritant. I also observed an unidentified drone flying above the scene for a period.

Crowd control efforts continued while investigators searched MICHAEL TOWNSEND's motel room and collected video surveillance footage from the motel.

At approximately 2248 hours, Detectives and Criminalists processed Room #218 after verifying no privacy interest existed. Detective Hertzler had obtained a room key from the manager. Criminalist Jakubauskas documented the room via photographs. Sergeant Santos, Detectives Foote, Pontius and I searched the room for anything possibly related to the investigation. No clothing or other personal items you would expect to find in a motel room were present. Among the items Criminalist Outhaythip collected from the room were a piece of paper bearing MICHAEL TOWNSEND's name and photograph on it, and an object partially wrapped in white tape (see Follow-Up report by Criminalist Outhaythip for complete details of the items collected). The white tape was visually consistent with the tape on the object MICHAEL TOWNSEND used as a weapon during the incident. We completed the search of Room #218 at approximately 2304 hours. Room #218 was then secured and the room key was returned to the manager.

GPD Officer Wright arrived on scene and was briefed on the incident. The manager at the Motel 6 granted Officer Wright access to the DVR for the video surveillance system. Officer Wright initiated the process of obtaining video footage of the incident, which I oversaw. Officer Wright maintained the video footage at the completion of the download.

Sergeant Santos directed the investigative team to clear the scene and proceed to the Detective Division. I cleared the scene at approximately 0120 hours.

I was briefed at the Detective Division on the details of the witness interviews. Officer Wright was also present. He provided me a copy of the video surveillance footage he obtained from the Motel 6. Officer Wright maintained the original footage, and later submitted the footage into evidence at GPD (see Officer Wright's report on GPD case number 21-26794 for additional details).

I conducted a cursory review of the incident footage that same morning. In part, I confirmed that MICHAEL TOWNSEND advanced towards Officer Brown and attempted to stab him, and Officer Brown retreated and discharged his weapon. The item MICHAEL TOWNSEND used as a weapon fell out of his hand onto the ground, and Officer Emmons kicked that object in the direction it was later recovered. A detailed review of the video footage of the incident will be documented in a separate report.

Detectives Pontius, Foote and I went to the Forensic Evidence Division (FED) and met with Criminalists Outhaythip and Jakubauskas. We viewed the weapon recovered from the scene. We determined through internet research the item was called a Closed-Eye Needle Screwdriver. The metal shank of the screwdriver measured approximately three inches in length, and it had a sharp point at the tip. Detectives Pontius, Foote and I returned to our office.

This investigation is ongoing.

SUMMARY

On June 24, 2021, MICHAEL TOWNSEND called 9-1-1 and reported he was suicidal and under the influence of methamphetamine. Paramedics from American Medical Response and Portland Fire & Rescue responded. Portland Police Officers Emmons and Brown were dispatched to assist. MICHAEL TOWNSEND was in front of an area motel. Attempts were made to have him voluntarily transported to the hospital by paramedics for a mental health evaluation, without success. The officers developed a plan with MICHAEL TOWNSEND for him to call 9-1-1 back when he was ready to go to the hospital. During the incident, as officers were disengaging from MICHAEL TOWNSEND to leave, he removed a sharp metal object from his pocket, advanced towards Officer Brown, and attempted to stab him. Officer Brown retreated and discharged his duty weapon twice, striking MICHAEL TOWNSEND. MICHAEL TOWNSEND was promptly given medical assistance and transported to a nearby hospital where he was pronounced deceased. Emergency medical personnel witnessed the incident, and it was captured on video surveillance. This report documents the countdown of Officer Brown's duty weapon at the scene, as well as the subsequent statements by Officer Brown.

NARRATIVE

On June 24, 2021, I responded to the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street to investigate an Officer Involved Shooting at that location. During the course of the investigation, at approximately 2105 hours, Detectives Pontius, Foote and I met with Officer Brown in the Mobile Command Center to conduct a weapon countdown. Also present were Officer Brown's attorney Mike Staropoli, Lieutenant Michaelson and Senior Deputy District Attorney Vasquez. Criminalist Powell photographed Officer Brown. Criminalist Powell was also present to document the weapon countdown via photographs.

At my direction, Officer Brown removed the magazine from his primary handgun in his holster. Officer Brown then handed the magazine to me, and I removed thirteen 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At full capacity, the magazine is capable of holding fifteen cartridges.

At my direction, Officer Brown then removed his primary handgun from its holster and handed it to me. I pulled the slide back, ejecting one 9mm cartridge from the chamber. This round was retrieved. I then locked the slide to the rear, and presented an empty handgun to Criminalist Powell. The handgun was a 9mm Glock Model 19, Serial #BGVE366, equipped with a flashlight.

I noted Officer Brown carried two spare magazines for his handgun, on his duty belt. At my direction, Officer Brown removed the spare magazine from the upper handgun magazine pouch on his duty belt and handed it to me. I then removed fifteen 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At full capacity, the magazine is capable of holding fifteen cartridges.

I then directed Officer Brown to remove the spare magazine from the lower handgun magazine pouch on his duty belt and hand it to me. I then removed fifteen 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At full capacity, the magazine is capable of holding fifteen cartridges.

I verified Officer Brown did not carry any other magazines for his duty handgun.

Officer Brown carried a second, backup handgun within a secure pouch on the left side of his duty belt. Officer Brown did not use his backup handgun during the incident. I conducted a countdown of the weapon nonetheless. At my direction, Officer Brown removed his backup handgun from the pouch and handed it to me. The handgun was a 9mm Glock Model 26, Serial #DSB825. I removed the magazine from the handgun. I pulled the slide back, ejecting one 9mm cartridge from the chamber. This round was retrieved. I then removed ten 9mm cartridges from the magazine, rendering it empty. At full capacity, the magazine is capable of holding ten cartridges.

I verified that Officer Brown did not carry any other firearms.

At the conclusion of the weapon countdown, I determined Officer Brown had fired his primary handgun two (2) times. Criminalist Powell collected Officer Brown's primary handgun, magazines, and cartridges. Criminalist Powell also collected Officer Brown's taser. I returned Officer Brown's backup handgun, magazine and cartridges to him.

I asked Officer Brown if he would be willing to conduct an on-scene briefing at this time, and Officer Brown replied, "At this time I respectfully invoke my constitutional rights, including but not limited to my right to remain silent, my right to be free from self-incrimination, my right to remain free from unreasonable search and seizure, and my right to have an attorney and have that attorney present." I asked Officer Brown if he would be willing to provide an interview at this time, and his response was the same.

Officer Brown was then issued a Communication Restriction Order by Lieutenant Michaelson.

SUMMARY

This report details my initial response and actions at the scene of an Officer Involved Shooting incident, as well as my interview with witness, PFB Lt. Aspen Breuer.

NARRATIVE

On June 24th, 2021, I was contacted by Detective Sergeant Santos at approximately 1935 hours and directed to respond to 518 NE Holladay Street, to assist with an investigation related to a officer involved shooting. At approximately 2045 hours, I arrived on scene and later attended a briefing by uniform officers who initially responded to the incident. After the briefing, my partner, Detective Kammerer, and I were tasked with interviewing Lt. Aspen Breuer, a member of the Portland Fire Bureau who had responded to the initial incident. The interview with Lt. Breuer was audio recorded and a copy of the recording was later placed in DIMS. [Note: For the ease of the reader, the following information is a summary of the interview. This summary may not follow the exact and precise chronological order of the interview as it progressed. Additionally, this summary does not contain each and every topic of discussion mentioned during the course of the interview. For additional information and specific details of the interview, to include the exact and precise chronological order of the interview as it progressed, and each and every topic covered during the course of the interview, please refer to the recording and/or transcript of the interview.]

Detective Kammerer and I conducted an interview with Lt. Aspen Breuer outside near his PFB rig, which was parked on the south curb line of NE Holladay Street, just east of NE Grand Avenue. The interview was away from and out of earshot from other members of the PFB that had responded to the incident. Lt. Breuer advised, he and his crew had been dispatched to the lobby of Motel 6 (518 NE Holladay Street) on a medical call. Lt. Breuer said dispatch had advised the subject of the medical call had admitted to drug use and suicidal ideation. Lt. Breuer said as they arrived at the location, he observed a male standing in the bushes of the median, which divides NE Holladay Street. Lt. Breuer said he exited the rig and watched the male walk behind their vehicle and toward their location. Lt. Breuer described the male's behavior "super aggressive" and mimicked the male's mannerisms by puffing up his chest, moving his arms aggressively and rubbing his hands quickly around his face and body. Lt. Breuer told us he got a weird feeling about the male and had concerns the male would try to break into their rig. He explained that due to the male's concerning behavior, he asked his driver to remain at the rig in order to protect the vehicle. He told us the male did not say anything to them and gave them no indication, at that moment, that he was the 911 caller.

Lt. Breuer said they went to the lobby of the Motel 6 and asked the clerk if he had called 911. He told us the clerk had no information about the 911 call or need for medical assistance. Lt. Breuer said he turned around and the male who had previously been in the medium was directly behind him. He continued to describe the male's behavior as concerning. He said he asked the male if he had called 911. He said the male confirmed he had called 911 and was suicidal. Lt. Breuer told us the male's behavior changed drastically and he appeared calm. He again mimicked the male's behavior by relaxing his shoulders. Lt. Breuer said he then had, what he described as, a "normal conversation." The male, later identified as MICHAEL TOWNSEND, told them he had used meth and other drugs and "was not feeling right." Lt. Breuer said during this calm conversation with TOWNSEND, two police officers arrived at the location and remained in the background while they spoke to TOWNSEND. He told us he did not observe any change in TOWNSEND'S behavior when the police arrived and did not observe any change in his behavior when AMR arrived. He said he continued to speak with TOWNSEND and at some point during their conversation, TOWNSEND said he wanted to get something from his room. Lt. Breuer said he asked TOWNSEND not to go to his room several times. He said TOWNSEND's demeanor changed back to aggressive mannerisms as he walked up the east staircase toward his room. He said TOWNSEND identified his room as #218. Lt. Breuer told us TOWNSEND's behavior was strange and he appeared under the influence of a drug, likely methamphetamine. Lt. Breuer said TOWNSEND continued to move toward his room and made statements that he was going to his room to get something. Lt. Breuer explained, he could not understand what item TOWNSEND wanted to retrieve from his room. He said at that time, they decided to leave due to TOWNSEND behavior. He said they (PFB) grabbed their medical kits and began to walk back toward their rig when a police officer (Officer Emmons) called them back and notified them that TOWNSEND said he wanted to go to the hospital.

Lt. Breuer said they walked back and TOWNSEND again said he was going to his room real quick. He said he watched as TOWNSEND walked past his room then down the west staircase toward their location. He said TOWNSEND then sat down at the bottom of the staircase. Lt. Breuer described TOWNSEND's behavior as calm. He told us the officer (Officer Emmons) spoke to TOWNSEND and the conversation appeared calm and normal. He said TOWNSEND agreed to go to the hospital. He said the officer (Officer Emmons) told TOWNSEND that it was normal protocol to pat him down before going in the ambulance. Lt. Breuer said TOWNSEND's behavior again changed and TOWNSEND began to clench and flex his muscles in his cheeks and body. He said the officer (Officer Emmons) repeated to TOWNSEND that he needed to do a pat down before he could be transported by AMR. He described the officer's (Officer Emmons) approach as "great" and told us the

officer phrased it in different ways. He said the officer (Officer Emmons) then explained to TOWNSEND that it was his (TOWNSEND's) choice and if he did not want to get patted down then he could go back to his room and they would leave. He said as the officer spoke to TOWNSEND, TOWNSEND started to move his left hand toward his left front pocket. He said the officers told him not to reach for his pocket. He said TOWNSEND would then move his hand away from the pocket and back to his initial position in between his legs. He said TOWNSED did this four to five more times with the officer telling him to stop reaching for his pocket. He said the officer (Officer Emmons) then decided they would disengage and he told TOWNSEND that he could call back if he changed his mind and wanted to go to the hospital. Lt. Breuer said as he began to turn away to leave, TOWNSEND quickly jumped up from his seated position and pulled his hands up quickly toward his head. He said he heard the officers shouting commands to "stop" and he then heard two gunshots.

Lt. Breuer told us the officer directly to his left (Officer Brown) was the officer he saw draw his weapon and fire two rounds. He said after the shots were fired, he got his team to a safe position. He said the officers notified them quickly the scene was safe and they began to render medical aid. He said they began to cut off TOWNSEND's clothing and he observed at least two gunshot wounds - one to the left side abdomen and one to the left side shoulder. Lt. Breuer told the scene quickly escalated as the occupants from the motel began to exit their rooms and yell at the first responders.

SUMMARY

This report documents my observations at the autopsy of MICHAEL TOWNSEND.

NARRATIVE

On June 25, 2021, I attended the post-mortem examination of MICHAEL TOWNSEND conducted by Dr. Sean Hurst of the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Officer. The examination began at approximately 0833 hours. Criminalist Powell documented the procedure via photographs and collected items of evidence (see Follow-Up report by Criminalist Powell for complete details). Senior Deputy District Attorney Vasquez was also present.

During his preliminary examination of MICHAEL TOWNSEND, Dr. Hurst noted MICHAEL TOWNSEND was unclothed and weighed 170 pounds and was 69" tall.

During his external and internal examination, Dr. Hurst noted the following gunshot wounds: Gunshot Wound A was a gunshot entrance wound to the left side of the abdomen. The bullet exited the opposite flank. Gunshot Wound B was a gunshot entrance wound to the posterior left arm. The bullet traveled through the arm, entered the left chest, and perforated the heart. The bullet was recovered from the right chest.

At the conclusion of his examination, Dr. Hurst ruled the cause of death to be a gunshot wound to the chest and to the abdomen. The post-mortem examination was concluded at 0945 hours. Refer to Dr. Hurt's official report on his examination for complete details.

This report documents my notification to MICHAEL TOWNSEND's family of his death.

NARRATIVE

On the afternoon of June 25, 2021, the identity of MICHAEL TOWNSEND was confirmed via fingerprints obtained at autopsy. Detectives had begun the process of locating information on his next of kin. I obtained a name and potential address from the Multnomah County Medical Examiner's Office for MICHAEL TOWNSEND's mother, LINDA TOWNSEND, in Knoxville, Tennessee. I contacted the Knoxville Police Department and requested assistance with locating LINDA TOWNSEND. Their efforts were unsuccessful.

Further database inquiries revealed an address for MICHEAL TOWNSEND's father, DONALD TOWNSEND, in Lenoir City, Tennessee. I contacted the Loudon County Sheriff's Office for assistance. Deputy Chance Gray assisted me. I instructed Deputy Gray notify DONALD TOWNSEND his son died resulting from of a police shooting. Deputy Gray told me he contacted DONALD TOWNSEND at his residence and made the notification at approximately 2100 hours on June 25, 2021.

I then contacted DONALD TOWNSEND by telephone. I introduced myself and offered my condolences. DONALD TOWNSEND asked if I could share any details about what occurred. Per standard practice of Detectives of the Homicide Detail in Officer Involved Shooting investigations, we normally only share specific details about the incident with family members at the completion of the Grand Jury process, to preserve the integrity of the process. However, at the time of my conversation with DONALD TOWNSEND, video surveillance footage of the incident had been released to the public at the direction of Portland Police Bureau Command. Additionally, the incident was widely reported by local media outlets, including misinformation about what took place. As a result, I provided DONALD TOWNSEND a more detailed account of the incident than normal.

DONALD TOWNSEND told me he and his son have been estranged since 2007, and he last spoke to MICHAEL TOWNSEND by phone approximately a year ago, when MICHAEL TOWNSEND asked for money. DONALD TOWNSEND did not have any information regarding his son's activities or contacts in the Portland area. DONALD TOWNSEND offered that he is supportive of the law enforcement profession.

Regarding the notification to LINDA TOWNSEND, DONALD TOWNSEND suggested he contact her first and tell her what happened. I provided DONALD TOWNSEND contact information for the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office so he and LINDA TOWNSEND could arrange for MICHAEL TOWNSEND's remains. I answered what other questions I could. I verified DONALD TOWNSEND had my contact information. I thanked DONALD TOWNSEND for his time and concluded the phone call.

I then contacted LINDA TOWNSEND by phone at approximately 2200 hours on June 25, 2021. I introduced myself, and I confirmed LINDA TOWNSEND had spoken with DONALD TOWNSEND. I offered my condolences.

LINDA TOWNSEND said MICHAEL TOWNSEND suffers from severe mental illness. She said she and DONALD TOWNSEND knew something like this would happen someday. She last saw her son 10 years ago but spoke to him somewhat regularly by phone. MICHAEL TOWNSEND contacted her approximately four days ago and asked her to wire him money so he could purchase a cellphone, which she did. She has since deleted the phone number he called from that day. LINDA TOWNSEND did not have any current information regarding her son's activities or contacts in the Portland area.

I explained the process moving forward, and answered what questions I could. I verified LINDA TOWNSEND had my contact information. I thanked her for her time and concluded the phone call.

After making the death notification, I notified Senior Deputy District Attorney Vasquez and provided him contact information for MICHAEL TOWNSEND's family so that an advocate from his office could speak with them.

SUMMARY

This report documents transferring of evidence related to the investigation of an Officer Involved Shooting to the Oregon State Police Forensic Laboratory for forensics examination.

NARRATIVE

On June 24, 2021, an Officer Involved Shooting occurred in the parking lot of the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street, resulting in the death of MICHAEL TOWNSEND. Homicide Detectives and Criminalists from the Forensic Evidence Division responded, began an investigation, and processed the scene. During the course of the ensuing investigation, several items of evidence were located and collected. Among these items was the duty handgun used by Officer Brown, the screwdriver MICHAEL TOWNSEND attempted to stab Officer Brown with during the incident, two 9mm cartridge casings, a bullet found under the body of MICHAEL TOWNSEND at the hospital, and a bullet and DNA sample (blood card) collected from MICHAEL TOWNSEND at autopsy. All items of evidence were submitted to the Portland Police Bureau's Property & Evidence Division.

On June 28, 2021, I contacted Forensic Scientists at the Oregon State Police Forensic Laboratory and arranged to deliver them evidence from this case for examination.

On June 29, 2021, at 1112 hours, I went to the Property & Evidence Division and met with Evidence Control Specialist Luiz. Mrs. Luiz transferred to my custody Officer Brown's duty weapon, the screwdriver, and other evidence (see attached Property/ Evidence Transfer Receipt for complete details).

I then delivered the evidence directly to the Oregon State Police Forensic Laboratory to be examined. I submitted the appropriate OSP Forensic Services Request forms (see attached).

SUMMARY

This report documents my review of items collected from MICHAEL TOWNSEND's clothing and his motel room, related to the investigation of an officer involved shooting.

NARRATIVE

On June 24, 2021, an Officer Involved Shooting occurred in the parking lot of the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street, resulting in the death of MICHAEL TOWNSEND. Homicide Detectives and Criminalists from the Forensic Evidence Division responded, began an investigation, and processed the scene. We determined MICHAEL TOWNSEND had rented a room at the motel, and a search of the room was conducted. Items collected included a printed document from Transition Projects with MICHAEL TOWNSEND's name and photograph on it, receipts, an unknown object partially wrapped in white tape, sticky notes with phone numbers on them, and a Portland Police Bureau business card that was found on the floor underneath the bead when the mattress was raised. The white tape on the object from the room appeared visually consistent with the white tape on the screwdriver MICHAEL TOWENSEND used during the incident. Items including a cellphone were collected from MICHAEL TOWNSEND's pants in the parking lot of the motel.

I later reviewed photographs of all the items collected from the search of the motel room and MICHAEL TOWNSEND's pants. Except for the paper with his name and photograph on it, and the object with white tape in the motel room, I did not locate any evidence directly related to this investigation. The business card also appeared unrelated. Another detective documented the analysis of MICHAEL TOWNSEND's cellphone.

This investigation is ongoing.

SUMMARY

This report documents my review of video surveillance evidence for this investigation.

NARRATIVE

On June 24, 2021, Homicide Detectives investigated an Officer Involved Shooting that occurred at the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street. Officer Wright assisted me at the scene and collected video surveillance evidence from the motel. I had directed Officer Wright to obtain only an excerpt of the footage. A hostile crowd had gathered during the investigation and officers held the perimeter pending the collection of the video. I had intended to obtain the entirety of the footage, showing when MICHAEL TOWNSEND checked into the motel that afternoon as well as his activities preceding the incident. Officer Wright had advised me it would have taken an extended period to download all the video. That was not feasible due to the circumstances at the scene.

Upon my later request, Forensic Video Evidence Technician Mark Weber collected additional video footage from the Motel 6 from June 24, 2021. Mark Weber also canvassed the area for additional video evidence. None was located. Refer to Mark Weber's Follow-Up report for additional information.

Mark Weber transferred the video footage he collected to the Digital Image Management System (DIMS) where it is retained as evidence. The time stamp on the DVR for the video was approximately thirty-three minutes ahead of the actual time. All available camera angles were obtained. None of the camera angles covered the room MICHAEL TOWNSEND rented (Room #218). I reviewed the video footage Officer Wright collected as well as the footage in DIMS.

Unless otherwise noted, the times listed below were converted from the DVR time to approximate the actual time. The following is a summary of what I observed in the video footage:

1610 hours - MICHAEL TOWNSEND arrived at the Motel 6. He had walked in from west of the intersection of NE Grand Avenue and NE Holladay Street. He was alone. He proceeded to the check-in window at the office and paid for a room with cash. He went up the east stairwell to the second floor walkway and stopped in front of a room (#208). A tree partially obstructed the view of that room. MICHAEL TOWNSEND contacted whomever answered the door for about a minute. He then proceeded toward Room #218.

Over the next few hours, MICHAEL TOWNSEND occasionally walked around at the motel property or sat at the top of the west stairwell.

1852 hours - MICHAEL TOWNSEND was seated at the top of the west stairwell for several minutes. He held an object in his left hand at one point that visually consistent with the closed-eye needle screwdriver recovered during this investigation, and he tapped the object against the handrail (DVR time stamp: 19:31:31).

1900 hours - MICHAEL TOWNSEND walked from the vicinity of Room #218 and proceeded to the east stairwell. He walked to the parking lot and remained near the office for several minutes. It appeared he was talking on his cellphone (MICHAEL TOWNSEND's first 9-1-1 call for this incident was at 1904 hours).

1912 hours - MICHAEL TOWNSEND had crossed to the center median of NE Holladay Street, north of the motel, and walked west. It appeared he was talking on his cellphone again for several minutes (MICHAEL TOWNSEND's second 9-1-1 call for this incident was at 1913 hours. His whereabouts during both 9-1-1 calls were recorded on the video). MICHAEL TOWNSEND continued west toward NE Grand Avenue. He stopped at the center median of NE Holladay Street just east of NE Grand Avenue.

1913 hours - Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) personnel arrived on scene. MICHAEL TOWNSEND was standing at the median. He walked toward the north side of fire truck and was momentarily out of camera view. He then walked to the southeast corner of NE Grand Avenue and NE Holladay Street.

Three PF&R personnel exited their truck and walked to the office (the forth PF&R employee joined the group later from the truck). MICHAEL TOWNSEND followed behind them from a distance and it appeared he was still on the phone. PF&R personnel contacted the manager (IVO D'CRUZ) in front of the office. MICHAEL TOWNSEND walked up to PF&R personnel and it appeared he briefly contacted them. MICHAEL TOWNSEND then he walked up the east stairwell, nearby. No one followed MICHAEL TOWNSEND up the stairwell.

1916 hours - Officer Emmons arrived at the motel (MICHAEL TOWNSEND was walking up the east stairwell at the time). Officer Emmons parked west of the office. Officer Brown arrived seconds later. He parked in front of the office. Both officers were operating fully marked Portland Police Bureau patrol vehicles and they were in uniform. Officer Brown remained by the driver's door of his vehicle.

MICHAEL TOWNSEND continued on the second floor walkway toward Room #218. It appeared one of the personnel from PF&R said something to MICHAEL TOWNSEND and MICHAEL TOWNSEND said something back. Officer Emmons briefly contacted PF&R personnel and then met with the manager in front of the office.

1917 hours - An ambulance from American Medical Response (AMR) arrived on scene. About a minute later, police, fire and medical personnel began returning to their vehicles to leave. Officer Emmons briefly stopped at his vehicle and looked in the

direction of the second floor where MICHAEL TOWNSEND had walked (MICHAEL TOWNSEND was out of camera view for approximately one minute during this time).

Officer Emmons then drove west in the parking lot and rolled down his driver's window. Officer Brown followed in his vehicle. MICHAEL TOWNSEND came to the top of the west stairwell and began walking down the stairs toward the parking lot. Officer Emmons stopped his vehicle north of the west stairwell, in excess of a car length away. Officer Emmons initially stayed in his vehicle. MICHAEL TOWNSEND approached the driver's side of Officer Emmons's vehicle and it appeared Officer Emmons motioned for MICHAEL TOWNSEND to return to the stairwell, which he did. Officer Emmons exited his vehicle and it appeared he motioned for PF&R and AMR personnel, whom were still on scene. MICHAEL TOWNSEND sat down on a stair at the base of the stairwell. A vehicle, identified as the above-listed Chevy Lumina, was backed into a parking space near the base of the stairwell.

1919 hours - Officers Emmons and Brown contacted MICHAEL TOWNSEND at the base of the stairwell. The demeanor of the officers appeared relaxed. Four PF&R personnel joined them. AMR repositioned the ambulance in the parking lot. Officer Emmons walked off and met with AMR personnel who were to the east. PF&R personnel contacted MICHAEL TOWNSEND. Officer Brown stayed back. Two AMR paramedics returned with Officer Emmons to the stairwell (the third person from AMR waited at Officer Brown's vehicle). PF&R personnel continued their contact with MICHAEL TOWNSEND.

MICHAEL TOWNSEND appeared to reach into his left front pant pocket with his left hand. He was still seated on the stairs. The two AMR paramedics were standing nearby, partially out of camera view. Officers Emmons and Brown appeared to talk to MICHAEL TOWNSEND.

At one point, it appeared Officers Emmons and Brown turned to leave. MICHAEL TOWNSEND again reached into his left front pant pocket with his left hand. The officers reacted. MICHAEL TOWNSEND quickly stood up and advanced toward Officer Brown with what appeared to be a metal object in his left hand. Officer Brown drew his firearm and retreated. MICHAEL TOWNSEND continued to advance toward Officer Brown, and it appeared he attempted to stab Officer Brown. Officer Brown discharged his duty weapon, striking MICHAEL TOWNSEND (1923 hours). MICHAEL TOWNSEND fell to the ground in the parking lot. The metal object from his left hand was now on the ground near him.

Medical personnel returned to their respective vehicles and obtained equipment. Officer Emmons and Brown re-grouped on the passenger side of Officer Emmons' vehicle, and it appeared they made a plan to contact MICHAEL TOWNSEND. A second PF&R truck had stopped on NE Grand Avenue near the motel at the time of the incident.

1924 hours - Officer Elias arrived on scene and met with Officers Emmons and Brown, and they immediately approached MICHAEL TOWNSEND. Officer Emmons kicked the metal object on the ground near MICHAEL TOWNSEND, away from him. The object traveled along the ground in the direction of the rear of the Chevy Lumina. Medical personnel rendered aid to MICHAEL TOWNSEND. AMR subsequently transported him. Officers began securing the scene.

SUMMARY

This report documents my actions at the scene of a fatal officer involved shooting that occurred at 518 NE Holladay Street.

NARRATIVE

On Thursday, June 24, 2021 at approximately 2002 hours, Sergeant Santos directed me to respond to 518 NE Holladay Street to assist with the investigation of an officer involved shooting. The initial information I received was that one officer was involved and two officers were witnesses. The individual who was shot was transported to Emanuel Hospital. Sergeant Santos indicated that Detective Law, Detective Pontius and I would be the lead investigators on the case. I arrived at the scene at approximately 2108 hours and noted the scene was cordoned off by crime scene tape. Uniformed officers were protecting the perimeter of the scene and a crowd gathered to the south of the scene. The crowd was yelling and used loud speakers and other noise producing devices. Updates given on North Dispatch indicated that gathered crowd was hostile.

Shortly after I arrived, I met with Detectives Law and Pontius in the mobile command center, and I was present for the weapons countdown of the involved officer, Officer Brown (refer to Detective Law's Follow-Up report for additional information).

After the round count with Officer Brown, I attended an investigative briefing provided by Officer Emmons. The briefing took place inside of the mobile command center. Officer Emmon's attorney, Traci Anderson, was also present for the briefing.

At the conclusion of the briefing, Detectives Law, Pontius and I entered the crime scene at approximately 2226 hours. We conducted a scene walkthrough with Officer Emmon's and his attorney. After the walkthrough, Detectives Law, Pontius and I observed the scene in detail.

I was present for the search of Motel 6 room number 218, a room rented by MICHAEL TOWNSEND. I entered the room at approximately 2248 hours and assisted with the search. The search was completed at approximately 2304 hours.

I took no other investigative actions at the scene and cleared. I later attended an incident debrief at the Detective Division.

SUMMARY

This report documents a transfer of evidence and an initial review of MICHAEL TOWNSEND'S cellular phone and the associated phone extraction.

NARRATIVE

On June 25, 2021, Detective Law informed me that Detective Stenzel completed a cellular phone extraction (image download) of MICHAEL TOWNSEND'S cellular phone. At approximately 1615 hours, I retrieved the physical phone and the associated download from secured DFU locker #7. I transported the items to my desk where I completed an initial review of the physical phone and the associated extraction.

During my initial review of the phone download, I noted that the phone contained approximately 150 contacts. I noted that the phone call logs contained minimal information and only appeared to contain outgoing calls to numbers associated with service for the phone, along with two outgoing calls to 911 on June 24, 2021.

The phone appeared to be connected with a Google account under the name "Mike Cullen" with an associated email,

I extracted physical reports from the download of the call logs and contacts, which are attached to this report for reference.

The initial review did not uncover any photos, text messages or other significant activity and appeared to be a new device to the user. A review of the physical phone found the same.

At the conclusion of the review, I packaged and sealed the physical phone in it's original packing and transferred it to into evidence at Central Precinct. I documented the DVD-R containing the phone extraction on Property and Evidence Receipt #A196676 and placed it into evidence at Central Precinct. A copy of the extraction was made for the investigative binder.

During this investigation, I obtained and reviewed the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) records from the Bureau of Emergency Communications (BOEC) as well as the dispatch recordings and the recorded 9-1-1 calls made by MICHAEL TOWNSEND.

The first 9-1-1 call MICHAEL TOWNSEND made was at 1904 hours. In summary, MICHAEL TOWNSEND reported he was at the Motel 6 high on methamphetamine and feeling suicidal. He requested the police respond also. He initially denied having any weapons. Later, he offered that he was "fist packing a screwdriver." The dispatcher asked MICHAEL TOWNSEND to put the screwdriver down, away from him, and he agreed to do so. MICHAEL TOWNSEND said he was waiting inside the lobby.

Note: MICHAEL TOWNSEND was captured on video surveillance at the Motel 6 for the duration of the first 9-1-1 call. He walked around in front of the motel near the office. At no point did it appear he put down a screwdriver or separate himself from one.

The second 9-1-1 call was made at 1913 hours (see supplemental CAD for PP21-171606). In summary, MICHAEL TOWNSEND requested the police and an ambulance to the Motel 6 because he was feeling suicidal and was high on methamphetamine. He said he was in Room #218. He told the dispatcher at one point to the send the police immediately because there was some sort of incident in Room #220, although he was not sure what was going on in there. He reiterated that the police needed to respond now, because he was "trippin'." MICHAEL TOWNSEND then greeted a group in the background, presumably from Portland Fire & Rescue, and a male asked if he called 9-1-1. MICHAEL TOWNSEND acknowledged he did, because he was feeling suicidal. MICHAEL TOWNSEND said he was going to check on something in Room #218, and the call subsequently ended.

Note: MICHAEL TOWNSEND was captured on video surveillance at the Motel 6 for the duration of the second 9-1-1 call. He walked around north of the motel property for a majority of the call, he entered the parking lot by the office and briefly contacted Portland Fire & Rescue personnel, and then went up the east stairwell. It appears he feigned the incident in Room #220 in an effort to expedite the police response.

Please refer to the recordings of the 9-1-1 calls and transcript for complete details.

Per the dispatch recordings and CAD, Officer Emmons (Unit 695) and Officer Brown (Unit 693) were dispatched to the incident at 1906 hours. Officers Emmons and Brown arrived at 1915 hours. At 1923 hours, Officer Emmons (Unit 695) advised that shots were fired, the suspect possibly had a screwdriver, he was down on the ground in the parking lot, and medical was on scene. At 1924 hours, Officer Elias (Unit 585) advised they got the screwdriver away from the suspect and medical was tending to him.

This report details my initial response and actions at the scene, and interview of witness KEVYN SMOOT.

Narrative:

On June 24th, 2021, I was contacted by Detective Sergeant Santos at approximately 1935 hours and directed to respond to 518 NE Holladay Street, to assist with an investigation related to a officer involved shooting. Upon arrival, I was present for the initial briefing given by uniform officers. After the briefing, I was assigned to interview a Portland Fire Fighter who was a witness to the shooting.

Detective William Winters and I were assigned to interview PFB Kevyn Smoot, the interview was audio recorded. For full details read the attached transcription or listen to audio recording. At approximately 2250 hours, Detective Winters, Officer Ryan Reagan (Union Representation), I met with PFB Kevyn Smoot while sitting in the firetruck. I explained to Smoot this interview would be recorded. Smoot stated "Yes" that would be okay. Smoot stated he is assigned to truck #13 and is a firefighter (EMT). Smoot stated the truck received a call to check on a potentially suicidal subject. Smoot stated he arrived with several other firefighters. Smoot contacted a white male that looked anxious and agitated. The male appeared to be under the influence of meth. Smoot spoke with the male in the parking lot of the Motel 6. The male told Smoot he was feeling suicidal. A short time later the male said he wanted to get something out of his room and walked up the stairs to the second floor of the motel. Smoot and the others on scene let the male go. Smoot told me two PPB officers were on scene and he (Smoot) informed the officers of what the male had said.

Smoot went on to tell me the male made it to a room but did not enter. The male stopped and walked back down the stairs and sat at the bottom of the stairs. Smoot told me the two PPB officers were present when he (Smoot) re-engaged the male in a conversation. Smoot told the male he was not in trouble and laid out transportation options to the male if he wanted a ride to the hospital. The male stated he took a lot of meth. The male made the decision he wanted to go to the hospital and one of the PPB officers asked to pat the male down for weapons. The male did not respond to the PPB officer. The male told Smoot again he wanted to go to the hospital. While Smoot was talking to the male the male had his hands around his waist. The PPB officer told the male a few times to not touch his pockets.

Smoot said he and the other firefighters took a step back because he felt the scene had changed. One of the PPB officers said the male could stay if the male did not want to be pat down. Smoot said when he took a step back the male reached towards his pocket and one of the PPB officers told him to take his hand away from his pocket. The male stood up and pulled something out of his pocket. It looked like a sharp tool and he was holding it aggressively. The male became verbally abusive and moved quickly towards them (the officers)..."that's when it happened". Smoot went on to tell me he thought the male was trying to hurt someone, maybe the first person he got to. Smoot said he heard two or three gunshots. Smoot said he and other firefighters performed first aide on the male once the scene was safe.

Summary:

On June 24th, 2021 Officer Curtis Brown was involved in a deadly force encounter with Michael Townsend who was armed with a closed-eye needle screwdriver. This report documents the release of an image of the screwdriver and a video of the deadly force encounter to the media by the PIO.

Narrative:

On June 25th, 2021 I was contacted by PPB PIO Sergeant Kevin Allen. Sergeant Allen told me I was being directed by Chief Lovell to release an image of the weapon Michael Townsend was armed with and a video from the Motel 6 capturing the shooting incident. I contacted Chris Wormdahl and asked for a non-watermarked image of DIMS asset number L6P80129 for media release. Wormdahl emailed me the requested image and I forwarded it to Sergeant Allen.

I next directed Detective Travis Law to make a copy of the Motel 6 surveillance video obtained from Detective Wright with the Gresham PD. Detective Law made a copy of the video, placed it in a sealed envelope, and provided it to me to turn over to Sergeant Allen. Instead of releasing this version of the surveillance video from the Motel 6 the decision was made by the PIO's Office and the Chief to release a video Detective Beniga took of the surveillance footage with his bureau issued phone. Detective Beniga took this video at the scene of the shooting and placed it into DIMS, asset number L6P50022. I returned the unopened envelope containing the surveillance footage to Detective Law to maintain in his case file.

This report document the interview of witness SPENCER GEHRING from Portland Fire & Rescue, regarding his observations of the Officer Involved Shooting that occurred on June 24, 2021 in the parking lot of the Motel 6 located at 518 NE Holladay Street.

NARRATIVE

SPENCER GEHRING from Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) Station 13 was identified as a potential witness during this investigation. I interviewed SPENCER GEHRING by phone on July 26, 2021 at approximately 1531 hours. Prior to starting the interview, I had activated my digital recorder. Because the interview was recorded in its entirety, and later transcribed, what follows is a summary of SPENCER GEHRING's statements.

On the evening of June 24, 2021, SPENCER GEHRING and three of his coworkers in Engine 13 were pulling up to the intersection of NE Grand Avenue and NE Holladay Street from the south. SPENCER GEHRING was driving. PF&R personnel from Truck 13 and police were in the parking lot of the Motel 6. One of his engine mates mentioned that he saw an officer in the parking lot drawn his gun. SPENCER GEHRING then observed an officer fire two gunshots. His view of the motel parking lot was obscured. He did not observe what the suspect was doing. I thanked SPENCER GEHRING for his time, concluded the interview, and deactivated my recorder.

On July 26, 2021, I transferred the recording of the interview of SPENCER GEHRING to the Digital Image Management System (DIMS) where it is retained as evidence (Asset: L7Q50059).

I met with Detective Law and Detective Pontius at the 600 block of N Grand. Using a Nikon D700 camera, I took overall digital photographs of Officer Curtis. Next I photographed and collected Officer Brown's duty weapon with one round in the chamber and a magazine with thirteen rounds. Next I collected a magazine with fifteen rounds from his top magazine pouch and a magazine with fifteen rounds from his bottom magazine pouch. His taser with two cartridges was also collected. These items were listed on PPB Property Receipt #A121297.

I also photographed Officer Brown's' secondary hand gun, the 9mm round from its chamber, and its magazine with ten 9mm rounds.

The items listed on PPB Property Receipt #A121297 were placed in the PPB Property Room via the FED outgoing locker.

The photographs were entered into the PPB Digital Imaging Management System (DIMS).

Medical will respond to that but they generally ask for police to accompany them just as like a safety precaution.

So it was a medical assist call. Um, I'd just, I finished the water I was drinking at the contact office, took a minute or two, I used the restroom before I left just in case this call took a while and then uh, headed towards the call.

I checked the map as I was leaving because I was pretty close to the call, it was at this Motel 6 at Grand and Holladay, I can picture it exactly, I've been there numerous times. Um, I was pretty close to it, I didn't know exactly where Officer BROWN was so I checked the map, he was super close, he was coming down MLK, just like a – I don't know, probably similar timing to me once we converged so.

I was enroute and I was actually turning from uh, Multnomah Street onto southbound uh, MLK and I saw Officer BROWN was driving south, he was like waiting to continue through the intersection on MLK so I knew he was right with me so it was perfect timing. And uh, I was driving uh, eastbound here on Holladay and Officer BROWN was in his car somewhere like immediately behind me and I knew there was this driveway here and in the - so - I'll get back, so we got dispatched to this call.

Corona:

Um-hm.

Emmons:

The call was specifically, and this is not verbatim, this is what I remember from the radio dispatch was uh, they sending me, 695 and they were sending um, Officer BROWN 693 as my cover officer and it was a suicidal male at this Motel 6 uh, no plan of how to hurt himself, not mention of weapons. Um, and waiting in the lobby area. I didn't know there was like a lobby you could go inside of but I knew where the manager's office was so I could picture kind of where he would, where he should be, where I thought he would be based on that.

Um, and it was like no plan how to kill himself, not acting aggressive and thinking back on it I'm a little unclear who called because it sounded like a third-party caller, like maybe on his behalf. Um, but then I'll, I'll get to my confusion later on. But um, as far as I know just one caller so – and then pretty quickly after that there was only one radio update that I remember between the initial dispatch and my arrival.

And it was right after the initial dispatch, the one update was uh, that he had, he did have a screwdriver at one point but he put that away somewhere away from him and that he didn't have it on him anymore. And so I'm a less-lethal operator so I carry a .40 millimeter less-lethal launcher and so when we're going to these types of calls that's something I do think about is if this person is armed, you know with like a, a blunt object, a sh- a sharp object, something that's not a firearm, sometimes the less-lethal is a good tool to have so we can get more distance from that person while we try to communicate. But that kind of alleviated um, or this information sort of alleviated that thought for me so he did have a screwdriver at one point even though that wasn't mentioned initially. But, but now he's put it away and he doesn't even have it on him is kind of what the transmission was so I said cool. We don't need to even get the less-lethal out, at this point knowing that he's separated from it oftentimes bringing that launcher out, it looks really intimidating to people and it just escalates situations if it's not actually needed. So I made a conscious decision to, to not take it out based on that update. That's the last update I remember so. Sorry I jumped around a bit there.

Corona:

No, no worries.

Emmons:

But getting back to the arrival. Um, I knew, so I'm pulling up, I see that fire truck, lights are on and uh, I know that just east of that fire truck there's a

driveway that goes into the parking lot and its right next to the manager's office where the guy is supposed to be so that's, you know I'm like, I know exactly where to go.

So we go up to the driveway, I see the fire fighters, you know, I don't know five or six of them standing outside and they're sort of like shouting, not like – just, just because they're talking across a distance, so they're talking loudly to someone that I think is sort of walking up the stairs. And I wasn't sure initially if this was the suicidal subject or someone else, but I kind of put it together 'cause he fit the description of, I think it was, I think it was radio that was like white male, all black clothing, fit that description. And they were sort of telling him, like hey come on down and we'll help you, something to that effect, I don't remember verbatim and he's, I think he was saying he wanted to go to his room and uh, and then Officer BROWN at some point was also there out of his car on foot.

He started talking to the fire fighters, getting information from them and so I figured I'll go talk to the manager. I saw the manager standing outside, I recognized him 'cause I've talked to him before. So I was like okay Officer BROWN can talk to fire, get whatever information he needs from them, I'll just talk to the manager really quick. I asked the manager, does that guy have a room here? He said yeah he's in room 218 and I asked him uh, if he called, like I asked the manager, did you call or did the guy call and he said the guy called. Um, so uh, I think that was all I, I asked him. I don't know, I, those were the questions, that might not be the exact order but that's the information I sought from the manager.

I overheard Officer BROWN talking to fire and the fire fighters were kind of like a little agitated which is unusual to me, normally they're very calm in these types of things, this is a routine call for them just as much as it is for us. Like it's not anything that's unusual or particularly critical as far as stuff, you know that's a lower frequency type of event. This is like something we do often. So I, I was just listening to them and they were saying, you know we're trying to ask him, we're trying to tell him, you know we're here to help and he keeps saying he wants to go to his room and one of the fire fighters told BROWN, he's like it's pissing me off because that's makes us really nervous when someone wants to like really adamantly go to their room. Um, and it, when I heard, I saw that they seemed nervous, I heard them say that and that made me a little nervous too 'cause this is a suicidal guy and sometimes suicidal people can uh, you know become erratic and, you know make weird decisions and I don't know what he's trying to access in his room.

So I was like huh, that's weird. Um, and that made me a little nervous and so by now uh, the subject of the call, he's on the second floor – all the hotel rooms, you

know are exterior doors it has that second floor outside walkway. So he's up on there and he's walking, he's on that and he's walking away from us. Uh, and the manager had told me he stays in room 218 and then he's walking away from us and I think, I don't remember the exact words I said to him and I don't remember this conversation verbatim at all, but the, the gist of it was, I think I said something to similar to, hey man do you want help or do you not want help and I think he said something kind of like uh, I want to go to my room and I, and I said something similar to uh, that's fine but if you want help you can't go to your room you've gotta come down here and talk to me and, and then he said, he got to, I think he was like getting to his room door and he said I want to go, I I need to go in here and get something, but I couldn't hear what he said. He just, he said I want to go in here and get and then there was some other noise and I couldn't hear what he said and I was like okay.

Well the fire fighters offered this guy help, he asked for help, the fire fighters offered him help, we showed up, I offered him help and he's saying that instead of help he wants to go to his room. The fire fighters are nervous in the way, like this – oh sorry one other factor here. The, the call had said this guy was high and his behavior to me was pretty consistent with what I've observed with like meth intoxication so kind of erratic, pressurized speech, sort of hard to converse with and track a conversation and uh, sort of like, you know fast unpredictable movements and he is behaving in such a way we're like he doesn't even know what he's doing or why he's doing it. So that all just kind of comes together to make me a little nervous and I'm thinking okay right now we're here 'cause this guy asked us for help. There's no PC for any crime and for me, I'm not at a threshold where I'm thinking of like a POH, a mental health hold, because he said he's high, he said uh, that he wants help but now he's leaving the source of that help. Um, and furthermore if he is feeling suicidal he took the stop to call us so he's capable of carrying out like a safe plan for himself. He's just changing his mind

So I'm not at a threshold for like a POH so right now in my mind I really don't have any legal authority, I'm just checking on this guy and if he doesn't want anything to do with me that's his right.

So that though, lack of authority right here, coupled with the fact the fire fighters are nervous about him wanting to go back into his room and it's making me feel nervous too and I can't exactly quantify that to tell you the truth. But um, I decided, you know what we should just leave for now. He's kind of already disengaging from us, he's hard to converse with, he's not really giving me much, let's just disengage and I did, I don't think I even communicated that to him because he was so committed to getting into his room. I said that's, you know I, I didn't say, I thought to myself, that's fine.

I told the fire fighters, I think the AMR medics were there and I told Officer BROWN, I said alright um, he doesn't want our help, he's going away from us, let's be done, we're gonna leave. If he calls back we're, we'll, we'll come back.

So my car was parked in the parking lot facing westbound and -

Corona: Would you uh, would you mind?

Emmons: You want me to draw that?

Corona: Yeah draw where it is.

Emmons: Yeah. So this, that's me.

Corona: Okay.

Emmons: Um, and then I think, I don't know in what order but I think the ambulance was

somewhere like here and Officer BROWN's car was maybe somewhere in here too. And so I couldn't back out so I was like oh I'll just drive west through the parking lot. Room 218 is roughly maybe in this area. On the second floor and I was driving, so to leave I drove my car this way. My window was down um, and I was just driving west through the parking lot and I just looked up at this guy. He was at his room door, 218, and he stopped fiddling with the room door and he kind of turned, like really conversationally, like kind of relaxed and lucid for a moment. He was, I think maybe hands on the railing or something like kind of passive and relaxed and he looked at me like he was wanting to engage in a conversation again. And so I was like man I'm right here, I'll just give him another chance.

So I said, I said hey man do you want help or do you not want help and he said I, I want help and I said okay come on down the stairs. Don't go in your room, come on down the stairs and I'll, we'll talk and I'll get you some help. So he came down the stairs and he was like fidgety in a way that people who are high on meth are fidgety and he was a little erratic in his movement, but not aggressive at this time. So he comes down and I'm just in my car right now. I don't see any indication that he's armed, the last mention of any weapon from the call was that he had gotten rid of that and his hands are open so in my mind his only thr- the only threat he presents to me is like if he were to try to fight me with his hands.

Um, and so I'm just in my car trying to engage him for a second and I figure if he gets weird I can just take off and deal with it a different way. So I'm in my car for a second, window down, still talking to him. He gets to the bottom of the stairs and I said hey man I'm happy to help you, can you go sit on that curb? Something to that effect um, and as a little side note here, when I get into these conversations I'm not, having a hard time rem-remembering them like verbatim.

So I'd stepped away, I flag over Officer BROWN, the fire fighters and the ambulance medics, the AMR medics were still kind of in that driveway where I drew these two vehicles here. And uh, I said hey guys sorry he changed his mind, he does want to go. Uh, let's, you know — let's get him a ride.

So I go back over to him and then Officer BROWN and the fire fighters join me and the AMR medics get in their ambulance and sort of pull it as far into the parking lot as they can, but my car had moved to like here so further west in the parking lot and now this would be Officer BROWN's car. So – sorry I don't know how to draw it 'cause it's changing.

And so obviously these cars were not like that, from the picture. But in fact right at the bottom of the stairs there was like two or three open spaces right around the stairs so it was kind of an open space where we could talk to him.

Um, and so we were right at the stairs talking to him. He's sitting down, hands are visible um, you know I'm still thinking the last mention of a weapon is that he doesn't have it any more. Um, and he hasn't done anything crazy as far as like that would cause me to think that he still had some other weapon on him.

Um, uh, so we're talking to him uh, Officer BROWN's with me at this point, the fire fighters are with us at this point and the medics are bringing their ambulance up as close as they can. And I see them kind of park and so I tell the subject, I said hey, I'm just gonna go talk to the medics really quick, or maybe I told that to Officer BROWN. I don't know, I told that, I said that to someone, I'm gonna go talk to the medics.

So I go over there to the medics back here so I step away from the subject uh, and I tell 'em hey, he said he took some meth, he's high, it's not a good high and he's feeling suicidal. He wants to go to the hospital for the suicidality and they said okay we can do that.

Um, I walk back up and I ask him his first name, just so I could talk to him and he, I said uh, hey, I never got your name, what's your first name? He said uh, my name's MICHAEL. Said MICHAEL uh, these medics are more than happy to give you a ride to the hospital, do you mind if I do a pat down on ya before you go with them? It's just something I do to make sure everyone's safe, they're here to help ya, it's my job to make sure they're safe. You seem like you're being cool, I just gotta check, do you mind? And he got really nervous. He kind of, he looked around, he sort of um, he had been more like, I think he, before he was more like elbows on his knees and he sort of sat up a little bit and sort of looked around. And, and then he like touched his, with his left hand he touched his front left pocket. Which uh, to me is like, you know he's indexing something that he's nervous about whether it be a weapon or drugs. And that made me nervous. I said don't worry about that, I'll take care of that part, don't, don't touch your pockets or anything and so he stopped. And I said are you, I think I asked him again, something like so are you okay with the pat down, can I do that? And he got sort of nervous. I don't remember if he said anything um, but I think, I think at that point he again, like after a second or two, I think, you know I gave some more explanation, it's just a check, it's no big deal, I was trying to put him at

He touched the pocket again and I said, stop touching your pocket. Um, and then so he stopped, he said oh sorry or something to that effect and then he said I'm really hot, can I take my shirt off? Which was another uh, I just remembered

from like training at basic police academy at pre-assault indicators is like indexing possible weapons, removing garments uh, oddly is something that people do before they fight and so that again like kind of elevated my concern even further. And I'm still thinking right now, I'm like okay uh, this guy is now kind of indexing a pocket and talking about removing a garment and it's making me concerned that he's, these are like pre-assault indicators and I kind of, I thought about just going hands on with him and preventing that, but I went back to where we're at with legal authority. This is still a voluntary situation. No PC for a crime still, I, I, I'm still not at a, like a POH threshold. And uh, for, for me anyways, you know. He's still, he's at that point where he knows that he needs help and he's seeking it out, so to me he's carrying out that plan, I'm not thinking POH so I, you know I don't really think I have what I need to, he's not actively assaulting me right now, this isn't like self-defense if I were to touch him at this point.

So I gave him one more chance, I said don't do that, let's just get you in the ambulance first and then we can get you comfortable, can I do that pat down? I think I asked him one more time and then he touched his pocket again. So I kind of got closer to him so I could, I wanted to limit the space between us. We were already like close, so it wasn't like I was so far away that I had an advantage, you know a time advantage if he were to start doing something. I was close enough where I didn't have that time advantage 'cause we're at talking distance and there was, there wasn't like a threat before.

And so I, I just took another step towards him so that if he, you know escalated to a point where he does become a threat I can just close (hand slap noise) that gap and control him. And I said stop touching your pocket. He touched his pocket again, I said stop touching your pocket you're making me really nervous and I reiterate to him, I said do you want to go to the hospital or not? You can stay in your room, I don't remember the exact words. I said you can stay in your room, you can go in the hospital, I'm totally fine either way but I need you to know and if you're going to the hospital I need to do that pat down, something like that. And he, he paused, he didn't really respond, he didn't really give me a yes or no.

So we're back to this point where we were earlier when I first got there where I'm, I'm like okay he's asking for help, we're here to give him the help. He's not really taking it and now he's doing a bunch of stuff to make me nervous about my safety and the safety of everyone that's here. And so I told cur- uh, Officer BROWN, the fire fighters and the medics, I said okay we're gonna leave again, we're, I'm — oh I, I told him actually first. I told MICHAEL, I said hey, if you need more time to think about this that's fine, you can take, we'll leave, you can take some time and call us back, that's totally cool and he just didn't really respond. And again we're at this point where I'm just feeling odd about his

And so we started to step away um, I was sort of, so if the stair - if the stairs ended like right here, if the stairs ended like right there I was kind of standing in that spot and Officer BROWN was like here, MICHAEL was on the stairs and then other, everyone else was sort of around us. Emmons:

Um, and so as I say that, I sort of, I, I said that, I communicated that plan to everyone um, and so I just, I started to step behind Officer BROWN and leave. Fire guys are leaving, AMR is leaving and Officer BROWN starts to step away and I'm like, I like had kind of looped around Officer BROWN like that and now Officer BROWN's going like that 'cause my car's here, his car is back there and uh, I was like a little further.

And uh, and then I look at MICHAEL 'cause as soon as we started to move he reached for that left pocket again, left front pocket with his left hand and he actually started to reach in it and he started to stand up. So I started to, I wasn't like running but I started to move a little quicker, my shoulders were like turned away from him. So I wasn't back-peddling, so I could move pretty well still and I was watching him and he got up and he was still just a few feet from Officer BROWN.

Um, he stood up and he pulled like a metallic object, like a, you know a long, thin, metallic object out of his hand. Or out of his uh, pocket, it was in his left hand I think and he was holding it, you know like so that it was protruding. He had his left hand in a fist, the object was protruding from like the thumb side of his fist and he was holding it in sort of like a jabbing uh, position. As he stood up he assumed like an athletic bend knees, you know bent hips stance weight, weight forward on his toes and uh, he started to – not like, he wasn't running but he was moving decisively towards Officer BROWN and Officer BROWN is starting to back pedal.

And so I see this metallic object protruding from his left fist and it's, I wouldn't say there's probably like four or so inches of something metal sticking out from his fist and uh, I'm trying to figure out is this a, is it a knife or a screwdriver and I think I remembered the mention of a screwdriver so I had screwdriver in my mind but it was glistening and metal and I just could tell it was like something long and pointy.

Um, and so now um, Officer BROWN initially is probably like, I don't know, a few, five, five to seven feet away from MICHAEL and he starts back-peddling as he draws his gun and he uh, Officer BROWN is moving kind of like northeast. And he's just moved a few feet at this point and MICHAEL has also moved a few feet towards him so they're both moving but the distance is sort of, sort of like not improving. Um, Officer BROWN is not able to gain more distance 'cause he's moving backwards. He's observing this threat and MICHAEL is moving forwards in an athletic manner, like he has all the advantage in the world.

Um, MICHAEL was very much fixated on Officer BROWN and so I had, I had had a little more time I think and I wasn't, I didn't get stuck back-peddling just 'cause of how the kind of logistics of it played out. So I was able to move a little

quicker probably. So I was like maybe 15 feet away from MICHAEL and I turned and I'm, I was looking at them, they're both sort of moving away from the stairwell, sort of northeast, sort of in this five to seven foot range from each other. Really close. And I saw, I started to reach for my gun, I think I had my hand on my gun and maybe the hood down, maybe breaking the second retention and I'm looking and I see Officer BROWN has his gun all the way out, all the way up on target and so he has lethal cover on this guy. And uh, you know MICHAEL is very much focused on and aggressing towards specifically Officer BROWN, not as much me.

And so Officer BROWN has lethal cover out and I'm thinking in my mind, like, I'm like dude we have to shoot this guy. Um, it was like a training scenario almost the way it, it looked to me and uh, I just really, I, like we had to um, I, like I said I reached for my gun initially, broke both retentions and I, I just had, like time slowed down and I had this really conscious thought, like I was starting to get my gun out, I see that he has lethal cover, usually we try to have some type of less-lethal coverage if we can, we're already behind the power curve here, the time, you know advantage here but um, I don't know, I just had this thought, I was like maybe I could do something different and prevent this. Like I know how this is going and it needs to go that way cause I can see right here MICHAEL is an immediate threat of, you know death or serious physical injury to, to quote our directive, to um, Officer BROWN.

So like, I'm like dude this is totally gonna end up that way and I just want to prevent it. Um, not because it shouldn't happen, not because it didn't need to happen, but uh, you know it's just you don't want to see that happen. Uh, I don't want to see my co-worker go through that and so uh, I thought for a moment, can I just go hands on with MICHAEL? No that's not gonna be a good option. Uh, that, that's, you know it's a four inches of metal that I can see, it's pointy, it's a screwdriver or a knife. I've got like a couple millimeters of tissue between my skin and my carotid artery, I'm not willing to take on that risk for this guy that was asking for our help. Um, and so that's not an option, that's way too dangerous for me. Uh, and I'm not sure I could even get there in time.

Um, and so I thought the only thing I could try right now as a reactionary option is my taser so I started to draw my taser, I already made the decision as soon as I have this thing out I'm gonna shoot my taser at this guy uh, there's absolutely no time to do anything else other than shoot him. Um, which in my mind is still our primary option as far as like remaining safe. I'm just really trying to scramble to try something knowing that Officer BROWN has that option covered and I, you know I trust his decision making.

Um, so I'm trying to get my taser out and I'm like as soon as this thing is out and on, like I'm spotting on MICHAEL where I can hit my probes uh, and then, and

then I heard and saw Officer BROWN's shots so. Um, so it seemed like maybe three or so shots. Uh, no less than two, no more than four I guess I would say. I don't know exactly how many um, and, you know they were five to seven feet away from each other when that happened. Uh, at best and pretty, I mean it was, you know I don't know within a second that MICHAEL went down to the ground. I could see that Officer BROWN wasn't stabbed, he prevented that from happening to himself and I saw him back away, kind of out of my field of view, it seems like maybe towards the black uh, back of my police car and I, I continued to move away like to the north and got behind the hood of my police car.

So I'm, my police car is in the parking lot facing west, I'm on the north side of my police car looking across the hood, I'm looking to the south and I can see MICHAEL and he ends up on the ground. He's sort of on his back and I see, now I can identify it's a screwdriver sitting right next to him. And uh, I just called out to him, I was like uh, I don't remember exactly what I said, something like MICHAEL we're gonna try and get you some help, can you try to roll away from that screwdriver um, you know he didn't give me much. His eyes were open and he was sort of writhing but he wasn't verbally responsive. So I try, I tried again, I said MICHAEL talk to me or something like that. Then uh, I put the information out on the radio, I said um, I think I said, you know 695 shots fired, there's a suspect down, white male or something, I think I gave his description maybe. Screwdriver is next to him uh, officers are okay and I think I said, you know let's start getting some more officers here so we can come up with a plan for rendering aid. I think I said that on the radio, don't exactly remember because as soon as I was done with that transmission Officer BROWN has, had found his way to me and I, and then I started talking to him about the plan to render aid.

I said okay um, I think we can probably get up there pretty quick and render him aid. The, the screwdriver is right, right there, I think we can secure that but we probably need to get up to him quickly. And I didn't know this but Officer BROWN informed me, he said um, alright let's wait just a second, Officer ELIAS is almost here and let's just get at least him here and we can talk about other resources before we, before we do that. We need to make sure we're safe. I said that sounds good.

Um, and it seemed like a second later I looked over to the west and Officer ELIAS was walking up. He had his less-lethal .40 millimeter launcher and so I said, I said to him, I said hey, JEFF uh, he needs help pretty quick um, I think, it looked like to me he was starting to lose consciousness, like I think his eyes were closed now and he stopped moving as much. Said we need to get him some help quickly uh, I think we can get up there and take care of that screwdriver and then get him help.

Um, Officer ELIAS and I think Officer BROWN also in some way indicated that that was good and so I turned around to the medics, I said hey, guys we're gonna go up there and take care of that screwdriver and then we'll call you up to come work on him.

Um, we went up uh, I just, I kicked the screwdriver away just so I could be certain that MICHAEL wasn't gonna like reanimate and grab it. Um, and um, and then the, I called the medics over. So they came over and while they were walking over to us, you know it only took a couple seconds but um, I th- I couldn't see like any of his, MICHAEL's injuries, he was in all black clothing, like a t-shirt and um, black pants. And so I just lifted his t-shirt up to start to look for wounds and I saw a bullet strike uh, or yeah a bullet like puncture to, I think it was like his lower left abdomen, one to his lower right abdomen and that's all I could see initially. And um, it's easy for me to treat in the field with like a tourniquet so I just ripped that pant leg open. By then a fire fighter got there, he cut the rest of the pants off and it was really fast. They got all the clothes ripped off, I pointed out the wounds that I had observed to them to make sure they knew where they were. Um, I helped them put MICHAEL onto one of those fabric foldable litters and then I helped them lift him onto the gurney and when we were doing that I saw an- I thought what looked like another bullet strike to like his left armpit so I just indicated that to them. They loaded him up, took him away.

I looked around for a second, I made sure that there was no people that I could notice like coming into the crime scene. There was some people yelling at us like they were mad at us and um, so I just kind of looked to make sure they weren't messing with evidence uh, but I didn't really engage them and I just went and grabbed some crime scene tape and started taping up an inner crime scene and uh, while I was doing that I just was looking around for like the next officer or supervisor that I saw so I could get, you know separated and, and wait for this whole process.

So uh, I was just doing that, I saw ELIAS and I said hey, I think I need to get separated out, I was a witness here and he's like okay here I'll put you in my car and then Sergeant TAYLOR was walking up and I, so I just addressed her instead, I said hey, Sarg, like I'm a witness, I don't know what you need to do with me and then right then Officer RAPHAEL pulled up so they put me in his car. And then it was, you know then it was just, that was it as far as my involvement.

Report Appendix

The following includes supplemental information on the analysis performed and definitions of some commonly-used terms. Please contact this analyst with any specific questions regarding the DNA analysis in this case.

General Information

A complete record of the **chain of custody** maintained by the laboratory is available upon request.

A differential extraction is designed to physically separate the DNA in epithelial cells from the DNA in sperm cells, in samples which potentially contain a mixture of sperm and other cell types. As a result, separate "epithelial cell" and "sperm cell" DNA fractions are generated. Incomplete separation can occur and fractions may contain both sperm DNA and epithelial cell DNA.

A DNA extract is a small volume of liquid containing DNA in its purified form that is created during the DNA analysis process. This extract may be consumed during testing to optimize DNA profiling results. DNA extracts may be discarded at the completion of testing if there is evidence remaining to resample should future testing be needed.

Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR)-based **Short Tandem Repeat (STR) typing** uses the GlobalFiler[™] PCR Amplification Kit. This kit is used to analyze 22 different DNA locations possessed by both males and females in addition to two locations that are male-specific.

CODIS is the acronym for the COmbined DNA Index System, administered by the FBI. CODIS links DNA evidence profiles with other evidence profiles and also with individuals who are required by law to submit their samples to the State and National DNA databases. DNA profiles may be submitted to CODIS at both the state and national levels depending upon the case scenario and/or the nature of the profile. Profiles submitted at the National level are searched against profiles in all other participating states. All profiles suitable for entry into and searching within CODIS will be submitted to the database. If the above report does not list CODIS entry for a profile for which you believe CODIS entry is appropriate, please contact the reporting analyst for further information.

Y-STR analysis is a specialized type of DNA analysis which can specifically target male DNA in mixtures with high levels of female DNA. This type of analysis tests male-specific STRs, not present in females, which are inherited from father to son, and should be identical for all male relatives of the paternal line.

DNA profile interpretation and the calculation of likelihood ratios was facilitated by the use of the STRmix™ software program.

The DNA unit employs a **team-based approach** to casework analysis; therefore, portions of the analytical work in this case may have been performed by someone other than the analyst who signed this report. Please contact this analyst for additional information as needed

Profile Interpretation

A limited DNA profile is a profile having DNA typing information at seven or fewer DNA locations

A partial DNA profile is a profile having DNA typing information at sixteen or fewer DNA locations

A DNA mixture is a sample containing DNA from more than one donor

An individual may be **assumed** to be a contributor when their contribution to a DNA mixture is reasonably expected based upon sample recovery location. For example, an individual may be assumed to have contributed DNA to a sample recovered from their own body, or a sample recovered from an item they regularly use. Prior to making an assumption during profile interpretation, a DNA analyst will first ensure that the assumption is appropriate based upon the DNA testing results obtained from the evidence item and the individual's DNA standard.

A major contributor is an individual in a DNA mixture profile who is donating a greater proportion of DNA to a mixture than another individual or individuals.

Minor contributors are present when a major contributor has been identified, and are individuals donating a lesser proportion of DNA to a mixture than another individual or individuals.

A match occurs when the DNA types detected in an evidence sample are the same as the DNA types detected in another sample at all corresponding tested locations. If a match is reported between a single source DNA profile and a reference standard, any other standards submitted in the case have been compared and are excluded as contributors of the profile.

An individual **cannot be excluded** as a contributor to a DNA mixture when the DNA types in the individual's DNA standard are included in the list of DNA types making up the evidence profile.

An individual is **excluded** as a contributor to a DNA profile when the DNA types in the individual's reference DNA standard are not included in the list of DNA types making up the evidence profile.

A mixture is too complex for interpretation when the number of contributors is such that no conclusions can be drawn from interpretation

An evidence profile is insufficient for comparison when there is not enough information about one or more contributors to the DNA profile to draw a conclusion

In DNA mixtures of closely-related individuals (such as parents, offspring, and siblings), false inclusions of other closely-related family members can occur due to the elevated sharing of genetic information between relatives
