Narrative

On October 10, 2018, Detective Sharp and I responded to NE Precinct where we conducted interviews of PPB personnel who were witnesses to the officer involved shooting which occurred at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, room # 16. I interviewed Sgt. McConnell who was a witness to the shooting which took place at the Del Rancho Motel; located at the above listed address. Sgt. McConnell's interview was recoded and a copy of his interview has been included in the case file. Following is brief summary of Sgt. McConnell's interview.

On October 10, 2018, at approximative 0915 hours, Sgt. McConnell received a consultation call from Acting Lt. Nice regarding a hostage situation which was unfolding at the Del Rancho Motel. Sgt. McConnell then directed members of SERT to the location of the Del Rancho Motel in anticipation of a SERT activation. Once staged with other SERT members near the Del Rancho Motel, Sgt. McConnell received an official notification of a "full" SERT activation. Sgt. McConnell was in charge of

McConnell then helped deliver equipment to other members of SERT and consulted with Sgt. Livingston regarding the need for additional resources. While engaged in these activities, Sgt. McConnell heard a single gun shot come from the south side of the motel. Sgt. McConnell was on the west end of the motel when he heard the shot and then immediately assisted the make entry into room #16 of the Del Rancho Motel. Sgt. McConnell did not enter room # 16 as the scene was

made safe by members

Sgt.

Sgt. McConnell then went to the south side of the motel to check on Officers Vanblokland and Harris. Sgt. McConnell found these two officers standing in the bed of a truck and he determined who was the involved officer (Vanblokland) and who was the witness officer (Harris). Sgt. McConnell instructed the Officers not to discuss the incident with each other or anyone else. Sgt. McConnell also assigned Officer Mele to guard Officer Vanblokland's AR-15 rifle, which Officer Vanblokland had placed on his "go bag." Sgt. McConnell then had Officer Harris and Officer Vanblokland separate and he also ensured they were each paired with one of the responding officers. Sgt. McConnell noted that Officers Vanblokland and Harris were placed into separate patrol vehicles while the scene at the Del Rancho Motel was processed.

On October 10th, 2018 I was tasked with assisting with an Officer involved shooting investigation. I drove to North Precinct to "greet" Officers who witnessed the event. The following Officers arrived at the North Precinct conference room. Once in the room Sergeant Roberts and I ensured they did not discuss the incident with fellow witness officers prior to being interviewed by detectives. After their interview I issued each officer a Communication Restriction Order (CRO). I gave each Officer the pink copy of the CRO and provided the white and yellow copies to Sergeant Hughes with the homicide detail. The times next to each Officer indicate the time they arrived to the North Precinct Community room and the time they were issued a CRO. Once the CRO's were issued each Officer was released to their respective responsibility units.

As a member of the Portland Police Bureau SERT team I was part of a full team activation to 7622 SE 82nd avenue room 16 to a report of male armed with a knife holding a female against her will inside location. While enroute to the call it was broadcasted that the male suspect had stated that he would kill the female. At the scene I was assigned to the SERT

, which was to the right of the man door marked #16. Patrol was able to evacuate the surrounding rooms of occupants and hotel staff provided SERT with key cards and physical keys to the rooms. The SERT was able to move inside room #17, which if looking at side one, is one room to the left of the target location (room#16). While inside room #17 I heard what sounded like furniture and or large heavy objects being moved inside room #16. From my training and experience I reasonably believe that the sounds I heard coming from inside room #16 were consistent with a person barricading or fortifying the location. It was broadcasted over the net that the suspect had made statements to police that he would "slice her throat".

While in position inside room #17 I heard what I recognized to be a single gunshot, and a execute order was given to make a crisis entry.

see that a mattress from a bed had been set up to block or barricade

the window. I was able to see that large items had been placed in the path of the main entry (front door) and that it would not allow the door to swing completely open. I transitioned from the window port and made entry into the location and removed a metal bedframe that had been wedged in behind the main door, and pushed back a dresser to help clear a path for other SERT members to gain access. I pushed deep into the location and saw a male laying on the floor holding a knife. I located the female hostage, quickly checked her condition for injuries, asked her if she could walk, guided her out of the location and delivered her to SERT medics. I stayed on scene until released by detectives.

On 10/10/18 I was ordered by the Detective Division to submit a written report of my actions during this incident. The following a brief summary and narrative of my actions during this activation.

On 10/10/18 I was assigned to the Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) as the team Commander. On this date at approximately 0923 I received a text/page from BOEC stating "CNT PAGE,3907 NICE ASKING FOR CNT TO RESPOND, PPB 18-347005, DEL RANCHO MOTEL, 7622 SE 82ND AVE#16. SERT CONSULT BEING DONE NOW."

I then responded to the Del Rancho Motel and met with the on-scene Incident Commander (IC) Sergeant Kyle Nice. After conferring with Sergeant NICE he related to me that it was his decision to activate SERT/CNT. I then requested via BOEC to activate SERT/CNT per IC Sergeant NICE and provided a safe route in and staging location.

As CNT was responding and enroute I learned that Officer Jordan Zaitz was the communication officer being utilized by uniform patrol, based upon this I directed her to provide all the information she had to Sergeant Troy King as soon as he arrived.

When the Critical Incident Commander (CIC) arrived, Assistant Chief Jami Resch, I met with her and Lieutenant Chris Lindsey. At this point, I apprised Lt. Lindsey of my actions listed above, I transferred team commander duties to Lt. Lindsey, and I entered the role of coach to Lt. Lindsey.

As role of coach I monitored the radio net CNT was operating on (**COMP**) and was present to coach and observe Lt. Lindsey perform the role as CNT Team Commander.

AS CNT progressed through normal protocol for a call out, I heard what sounded like a single gunshot followed by a radio transmission that the subject was down.

This report is only a summary report.

A male suspect had attempted to stab a subject nearby then forced a female into a hotel room, while threatening her with a knife. He then yelled to police that if they came in, he would kill the female.

Upon arrival, Officer Asheim, Officer Hoerauf,

My role was as a SERT K9 Handler, assigned to prevent the suspect from escaping if he fled out the back.

As I stood by in my position, I heard officers update that they were hearing noises inside that sounded like the suspect was barricading the hotel room. They advised also that the suspect had cracked the front door briefly, then slammed it shut. I also heard an officer radio that they could see a mattress propped up against one of the back windows. From my position, I could see the windows, but could not see inside due to my angle and distance.

I heard SERT members in the front advise that

A short time later, I heard what sounded like a rifle shot east and south of me. I knew there was an additional team set up in that position, so I assumed a shot had been taken. A few seconds later, I heard Officer VanBlokland radio that a shot had been taken and the suspect appeared to be down.

I then heard out front and the entry team advised they were entering the room. They then advised the suspect was down and the female was unharmed.

I remained on-scene until I was advised I could clear the scene by Sgt. McConnell. See additional Officers' reports for further details.

SERT CALL-OUT TO 7622 SE 82ND

8 On 10/10/18 at approximately 0911 hrs I was working as a member of the Special Emergency Reaction Team. We were deployed in North Precinct to serve a search warrant when a request was made for a SERT consult by East Precinct. We completed our search warrant service and drove to the location of the call, the Del Rancho Motel at 7622 SE 82nd Ave. A disturbance was reported in which is was reported a man armed with a knife had taken a woman against her will in to room #16 at this location.

I arrived at approximately 0943 hrs and I was first assigned to near the front door of room #16. I was then relieved from this position and sent with Officers Hoerauf and Davidson to the backside of the location as a containment team. We had a 40mm less lethal launcher, a halligan tool, and our rifles. Ofc. Davidson also had his police K-9 with him. We were on the southwest corner of the motel, behind the offices of the location. Room #16 was to our east and we were watching the windows in case anyone came outside.

After being in this position I heard radio traffic that there was probable cause to arrest the suspect for Assault II. He was described as bald white male, in a camouflage shirt, blue jeans and shoes. I never saw this suspect from my position. At another point I heard that the suspect was threatening to kill the woman in his motel room.

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I heard a single shot from a weapon to our south and then one of the windows break on the back of the suspect room. I then heard over the radio that another operator had shot the suspect. I could then hear operators on the front of the motel room performing a rescue and updating that the woman hostage was okay. They quickly requested medical for the suspect also. I did not enter the room at any time. Sgt. McConnell then came to our position and I briefed him on what I saw and did. We were later relieved by a uniform officer from East Precinct and told that we could secure our gear. Eventually we were told to secure from the scene and returned to the Tactical Operations Division offices. I returned there and completed this report prior to leaving. Nothing further at this time. Refer to reports from other officers for further information.

My partner and I responded to 7622 SE 82nd Ave to assist other officers onscene with a disturbance involving a weapon and possible hostage. On arrival I assisted as cover for my partner who was less lethal operator. We were across the parking lot to the north. The subject in #16 came to door and was yelling and screaming and acting very erratic. Ofc. Higginbotham from a distance was trying to speak with him and deescalate the situation but he kept yelling and slamming the door. I wasn't able to make out exactly what subject was saying, but something similar to , I'll kill her. It appeared the last time he shut the door he was likely barracading himself inside. Sgt. Hansen and Sgt. Nice were onscene and I was assigned to stay with my partner as cover and be part of a custody team if needed. Sqt. Nice had us move back and shortly after SERT arrived and relieved us. I exited the parking lot. I was reassigned to take the northeast side of the complex for containment along with my partner and Ofc. Ramic. I stayed at location and heard a noise similar to a qunshot but was not sure. Shortly after we were cleared from our position to help with outside perimeter. I assisted with outside perimeter until resassigned to the south end of the building to relieve Ofc. Mele and Ofc. Ramic with crime scene protection and log. Ofc Lyons assisted me on this post at 1228. I kept the log until releived by Det. Kammerer and gave him the crime scene log for the south end location. I assited with breaking down the scene per Sgt. Hansen and exited location.

On listed date and time I responded with Officer Young to this location after the primary officer asked for a less lethal certified officer to respond. We arrived to find the primary and his partner in the parking lot of this location attempting to deescalate the suspect. The suspect was yelling at the officers, making nonsense statements about things such as the primary officer going to prison. The suspect would emerge slightly from the room and yell to us, then reenter the room and slam the door with great force.

- At one point he stated that if we came closer he was going to kill "her". I broadcast this information to dispatch.
- At another point the suspect reentered the room and we could hear loud sounds that indicated to me he was barricading the door to the room from the inside. I broadcast this information to dispatch.
- Sgt Nice was on scene and directed us all to fall back and take positions of cover, then moved officers without a specific task to a location outside of sight of the suspect in an attempt to deescalate the situation.
- SERT arrived quickly and we were removed from the immediate area. Soon after, SERT requested myself and Officers Young and Ramic take a less lethal and move to a position on the southeast corner of the north building of the complex. We were to act as containment should the suspect break out and flee to the east. We were in this location when the shot was taken.

Shortly after we moved to the west end of the parking lot and began to assist in establishing the crime scene. I started a crime scene log and handed it off to Officer Reando as he had also started one. I then moved to the south side of the motel, assisted with securing Officer Mele's AR15, then took over the access of the south alley behind the motel from SERT officers. I remained at this post until the crime scene was broken down.

On 101018 at 0942 SERT was activated to assist East Precinct with a hostage situation at the Del Rio Motel, 7622 SE 82nd. While enroute we learned that a male subject who was involved in a assault with a knife had fled to the Del Rio, grabbed a woman and forced her into a room with a knife.

On scene I was part of the and assisted in organizing the plan to rescue the victim if the needed. We monitored the radio for updates as we continued to work on our plan and evacuate near by units. During this time I heard a officer state that he had shot the suspect and we then initiated our rescue plan into the location.

I was one of the last to the door and as I began to enter I heard that the victim was safe and the suspect was down not moving. I then stepped back out and directed our PFB SERT medics up to the front to render aid to the suspect.

I took no further action at the scene and was released by detectives.

completed a search warrant when we were requested at the scene of a disturbance at 7622 SE 82nd Ave #16. When I arrived, I was assigned to lead **sector** rescue team. After assembling the **sector** team, we moved to hotel room #17 which was adjacent to the target room where we continued planning and organizing a rescue if it became necessary.

I heard a gunshot and it was broadcasted on the police radio that a shot was taken at the suspect by an officer. Upon hearing this, I moved with the rescue team to the door to #16. Two officers used a door ramming device to force open the front door. The front door was barricaded with a mattress, boxspring, bed frame, and small dresser. An officer deployed a FSDD inside the door.

We pushed our way through the barricades and made our way into the room. I was second through the door. I saw that Officer Townley, who was first through the door, went directly to a female who was standing in the back right corner of the room. Seeing that the female was safe, I moved toward the bathroom which was in the back left corner. As I arrived in the bathroom, I observed the suspect on the floor of the bathroom. It appeared the suspect had been shot in the head. It appeared to me that he was dead. In his right hand he was holding a knife. A PFB SERT Medic later declared the suspect deceased. I then left the room along with everyone else.

On 10/10/18 at 0911hrs I heard dispatch send officers to a fight call at the 7-11 located at SE 82nd and Flavel St. As officers arrived onscene they watched the suspect from the fight appear to take a hostage and go into Room 16 of the Del Rancho Motel.

- I started to make my way to the area to assist. Upon arrival I saw several officers in the parking lot of the Del Rancho Motel. The suspect's room was facing north. I did not see the suspect, identified as Sam Rice, as a car was blocking the doorway but I could hear him yelling and slamming the door repeatedly.
- I went to the Motel Office to try and find a phone number for Sam Rice or his girlfriend and suspected hostage, Talon Ochoa-Bailey. I tried calling two numbers in RegJin and was not successful.

Inside the office I called the room number from the office phone. Someone picked up but said nothing. I could hear Rice yelling from what sounded like across the room. He screamed orders to hang up the phone. I tried several times to get Talon to just tell me she was okay and she wouldn't answer the question. I made the assumption she was the one who answered. I heard a click and was disconnected. I called back again and after a few rings it started making funny noises. The office manager told me that means they either have the phone off the hook or unplugged from the wall.

Next I texted the phone number documented on their paperwork. That number was 971-292-0106. At 0936hrs I texted, "Talon are you okay?". At 0937hrs I said, "we need to know you are safe and we'll take a huge step back". I waited several minutes with no response. At 0949hrs I received "yes go away". I didn't respond and was with CNT in their van when I received another text saying "Go away".

I was offering what I knew to CNT when I was told the suspect was down. At that point I stayed on the perimeter, drove officers to retrieve cars and assisted by delivering information when asked. I took a screen shot of the text messages and placed them into DIMS.

I cleared once command told me I was okay to do so.

RESPONSE TO SERT CALLOUT

On 10/10/2018 at approximately 0930. I was assigned as a member of the Special Emergency Reaction Team and became aware of a SERT consultation in East precinct. I responded to the area of the call from North precinct during the consultation. At 0942, I received a page through BOEC that advised of the callout location, Del Rancho Motel located at 7622 SE 82nd ave. # 16. Details were that an armed and high Subject took a hostage.

Upon arrival I consulted with Sgt. Mcconnell and was

with Ofc. Asheim, and Ofc. Davidson who had his Canine partner on the 3/4 side of room #16 between the south door or the managers office and suspects "3" side windows. I brought a 40mm Less Lethal Multi-Launcher and halligan tool

Over the course of the incident, I heard numerous radio updates that the suspect had threatened to kill the woman inside. I learned there was PC to arrest the suspect for an assault involving a knife. Ofc. Asheim and I discussed how to define the event considering the suspects mindset, DV component and other factors that would influence our decision making and use of force.

A short time later, I heard a single gunshot come from Ofc. Vanblokland and Ofc. L. Harris position. I could not see them based on obstructions between us. I observed some glass from the suspects window shatter outward in conjunction with the shot. I heard Ofc. Vanblokland indicate they had taken a Sniper shot.

Other SERT members secured the woman from the Hotel Room. I stayed at that location until I was directed out of the scene.

SERT CALLOUT / HOSTAGE INCIDEN

On the listed date and time I was assigned to the Tactical Operations Division, Special Emergency Reaction Team (SERT). I was serving an unrelated search warrant when I received information that there was a hostage situation at the Del Rancho Motel (7622 SE 82nd Ave). Due to the situation, SERT responded to the incident directly from the warrant we were serving.

I was

. We received a callout page at 0943.

While enroute to the incident I learned the following information. I learned that a white male subject had been at a 7-11 threatening someone with a knife. The same subject then retreated to the Del Rancho Motel, room #16, and pulled a female into the room with him. Responding Officers were reporting that the subject was threatening to kill the female if the Officers attempted to come into his room. Officers on scene were reporting that the male was very agitated and that he made multiple threats to kill the woman. The male was identified as Samuel Rice; the female was identified as Talon Ochoa.

Once on scene, my assignment was to enter the room and save the hostage if it was determined that her life was in immediate danger. While onscene we continued to build our plan in an effort to increase our chances of success. I knew that other team members were surrounding the location in an attempt to see inside; I knew that team members **see inside** in an effort to increase our ability to make entry into the room and I knew that the Crisis Negotiation Team was attempting to speak to the subject in an effort to resolve the situation. As this was taking place, we formulated our entry plan to include the following: I was to be the first person in the door, SGT Frankus was to be the second person in the door, and Detective Gradwahl was to be the third person in the door. Additionally, Detective Gradwahl

prior to our entry. while we get safely into the room.

As we formalized this plan, we moved into the room adjacent to Rice's room. As we stood in the adjacent room, I could hear noises inside Rice's room that sounded consistent with barricading. I heard over the radio multiple times that Rice was on and off the phone with CNT; my impression of those interactions was that negotiations were not progressing in a positive manner. I then heard over the radio that Rice was threatening to cut the female's throat and kill her.

The next thing I heard was what sounded like a gun shot. I then heard the command to initiate our entry plan. I heard an got is as I approached the door to room 16. got it open approximately 1 foot. Rice had barricaded the door with a mattress, box springs, and a dresser. I pushed through the barricade and could see the female hostage to the back right of the room. I believed that she was the only hostage in the room. I went directly to her in an effort to protect her from Rice. As I moved to her I asked her where Rice was and she pointed to the bathroom entrance. I looked in that direction and could see that he was laying on the bathroom floor. I could see blood on the floor.

I stayed with the hostage for approximately 1 minute and then handed her off to Officer Sparling who escorted her out of the room. Medics responded to the scene and determined that Rice was deceased. I could see that he was holding a large knife in his hand.

I went outside the room and waited for Detectives to arrive.

NARRATIVE:

Detective Gradwahl interview:

On October 10, 2018, at 1342 hours, Detective Prosser and I interviewed Detective Gradwahl in the small conference room at North Precinct. Portland Police Bureau Union representative Detective Myers was present during the interview. The interview was audio recorded with Detective Gradwahl's permission, and I have placed a CD copy of the interview into evidence, as noted on exhibit 1, item 1. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to transcripts for full details.

On October 10, 2018, Detective Gradwahl and additional Special Emergency Response Team (SERT) operators responded to Del Rancho Motel, which is located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, Room #16, Portland, Oregon, in response to a full team SERT notification. Upon arrival from the South on Northbound SE 82nd Avenue, Detective Gradwahl made contact with supervisors on scene. Gradwahl and additional SERT operators were assigned to a team and began evacuating guests from rooms at the motel. Detective Gradwahl assisted with evacuating occupants from the room to the west of room #16, and then met with additional SERT operators.

Detective Gradwahl and additional SERT operators staged a **second of** in the event they needed to make entry into room #16, if called upon. The SERT personal on the **second** with Detective Gradwahl were Officer Townley, Sergeant Frankus, Officer Churella, Officer Sparling, and Officer Corno. Officer Townley was assigned as #1, Sergeant Frankus was assigned as #2, Detective Gradwahl was assigned as #3, Officer Churella and Officer Gryphon were assigned as a two person team **second** to make entry. Officer Sparling was assigned to bring **second** and Officer Corno was assigned to assist Officer Sparling.

While in room #17, Detective Gradwahl could hear loud sounds coming from room #16. Detective Gradwahl believed the subject in room #16 was barricading the front door. Detective Gradwahl heard an **sector sector**, that they observed a mattress being placed against a window in room #16. Detective Gradwahl heard a deep sound coming from inside room #16.

Detective Gradwahl then heard what sounded like a gun shot from the south and then shortly after, it was broadcast that a sniper shot was taken. The command "execute" was then broadcast. Detective Gradwahl along with the began entry into room #16. Officer Churella and Officer Gryphon began to make entry into room #16. It took three strikes on the door before the they could make entry. Upon the third strike, the door was open enough that Detective Gradwahl could into room #16, and the team made entry.

Upon entry, Detective Gradwahl was the third SERT operator into the room and he observed a female to the back right of the room in the southwest corner and he observed a male lying on the floor in the bathroom. Detective Gradwahl observed blood in the ear area of the male and observed a knife clutched in the male's hand. Detective Gradwahl said the knife was silver in color with a black handle. Detective Gradwahl believed the knife was in the male's right hand and he stayed with the male until medical personal arrived.

We concluded the interview at 1407 hours.

Officer Huntinghouse Interview:

On October 10, 2018, at 1421 hours, Detective Prosser and I interviewed Officer Huntinghouse in the small conference room at North Precinct. Portland Police Bureau Union representative Detective Myers was present during the interview. The interview was audio recored with Officer Huntinghouse's permission, and I have placed a CD copy of the interview into evidence, as noted on exhibit 1, item 4. The following is a summary of the interview.

On October 10, 2018, Officer Huntinghouse responded to The Del Rancho Motel, which is located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, Portland, Oregon, to assist. Upon arrival he was tasked by Sergeant Nice to go to the 7-11, which is located at 7501 SE 82nd Avenue, Portland, Oregon, to review video to see if a weapon was involved on the previous disturbance. Officer Huntinghouse spoke with the 7-11 employee "Awan", who gave him permission to review the video surveillance. Officer Huntinghouse reviewed the video surveillance. Awan told Officer Huntinghouse the suspect attempted to stab a victim with a knife and he described the knife to Officer Huntinghouse.

Officer Huntinghouse then contacted the victim "Peason" at his residence located 80102 SE Malden Ct, Portland, Oregon. Peason told Officer Huntinghouse that while waiting in line at the 7-11, a female "cut" in front of him. Peason told the female to go to the end of the line. The female's boyfriend became upset and said, "I will gut you." Peason told Officer Huntinghouse the male had a knife and tried to stab him and Peason defended himself. Peason punched the male's hand which caused him to drop the knife. He said the male then ran from the store and Peason picked up the knife and placed it on the counter near the clerk. Peason told Officer Huntinghouse the male then came back and grabbed the knife and left the store.

Officer Huntinghouse contacted Sergeant Nice at the Del Rancho and gave him the information he learned. Officer Huntinghouse also broadcast the information on the radio through BOEC. SERT operators arrived and he was moved back away from the Del Rancho. Officer Huntinghouse said he then heard "a pop." Officer Huntinghouse was then tasked to secure the scene with red crime scene tape. Officer Huntinghouse will be uploading the surveillance video from 7-11 onto DIMS, and will be writing a report, see PP18-681478.

We concluded the interview at 1429 hours.

On October 10, 2018, Detective Crockett and I were assigned to interview Officer Snitily. Officer Snitily witnessed an officer involved shooting that occurred at the Del Rancho Motel located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, #16, Portland, Oregon. Detectives Broughton and Beniga are the primary investigators, Portland Police Bureau (PPB) case number 18-347005.

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Interview with Officer Thomas Snitily

On October 10, 2018, at 1349 hours, Detective Crockett and I interviewed Officer Snitily in the presence of Officer Kenney, who was Officer Snitily's union representative. I recorded the interview on my digital recorder. The recording was transcribed and the transcript was attached to this report. The recording was placed into the PPB Digital Image Management System (DIMS) as evidence. The following is a summary of the interview. The summary does not cover every topic discussed and is not in sequential order of the interview. For a complete record please refer to the recording and transcript.

Officer Snitily is a member of the Portland Police Bureau's Special Emergency Response Team (SERT). Officer Snitily was inside room #15, which is one room to the west of room #16 at the Del Rancho Motel located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, Portland, Oregon,

bathroom where he saw a hand of someone on the floor. Officer Snitily did not enter room #16.

During our interview, Officer Snitily wrote on a printout of an aerial map of the scene. Officer Snitily signed and dated the back of the map. A copy of the map is attached to this report. On October 12, 2018, I placed the original map into the property room at Central Precinct. Please see receipt number A084374, item #1.




IMAGE ATTACHMENT (2733667) MAP - BACK

On 10/10/2018 at about 1030 hours, Detective Sergeant Cory Roberts requested I assist the Homicide Detail with an Officer Involved Shooting Investigation. I was directed to respond to North Precinct where I was later tasked with interviewing Portland Police Sergeant Don Livingston. At about 1325 hours, Detective Arjay Dran and I met with Sergeant Livingston in the North Precinct roll call room for the interview. Also present was Union Representation, Officer Jason Walters. The following is a summary of the interview and not intended to be verbatim. Review the audio recording for further details and the full record.

Sergeant Livingston advised he worked as a full time SERT Sergeant. He explained earlier, he and his team were finishing up with an unrelated search warrant assignment when he learned East Precinct patrol officers were requesting a SERT consultation. He told me Portland Police Sergeant Pete McConnell conducted the phone call consultation, and they ended up responding to stage as events and details were unfolding. At some point after arrival, Sergeant Livingston said he spoke directly with Portland Police Acting Lieutenant Kyle Nice and learned they had a hostage situation. Sergeant Livingston advised he learned that a man, later identified as SAM RICE, had attempted to stab another male at the nearby 7-11 and then retreated to the Del Rancho Hotel, Room #16. He told me he learned RICE had forced his girlfriend, later identified as TALON OCHOA-BAILEY into the room and learned RICE had threatened to harm her with a knife.

Sergeant Livingston explained his role and responsibilities. In summary, he told me he was working on setting up a team," which would allow for quick and immediate entry to the dwelling to try and rescue potential victim(s) if they learned there was an imminent attack. Sergeant Livingston said he was working on getting additional resources to include the Washington County "TNT" equivalent SERT team, along with tools from their own vehicles. While working to get a piece of equipment to one of his teams, he told me he heard a single muffled shot. He told me moments later he heard via radio a SERT member state he had taken a shot. Sergeant Livingston stated this action required his team to immediately make entry so they can render aid to potentially any victim(s). He said they tried to enter through the front door, but it was barricaded with a mattress and furniture. He believed he was the fourth person to enter the room. He told me he found RICE on the floor with what appeared to be a severe wound to his head. He told me he saw another officer assisting OCHOA-BAILEY out of the room. Sergeant Livingston stated he requested a medic to examine RICE and ascertain his condition. The medic pronounced RICE deceased. Sergeant Livingston said he and his team exited the room, and he separated his team members for investigatory purposes.

I asked Sergeant Livingston if he ever heard, seen, observed and/or witnessed anything regarding RICE or OCHOA-BAILEY's actions. Sergeant Livingston said no. I asked him if he gave or heard anyone give any orders in regards to authorizing a "shot of opportunity." Sergeant Livingston said he never gave the order, nor ever heard the order given. During the interview, a Google Ariel Map was used as reference. Sergeant Livingston circled where he believed the referenced room was. He placed a "1" where he believed he initially spoke with Acting Lieutenant Nice and a "2" where he spent much of this time coordinating resources, etc. He placed a box where his vehicle was parked. Sergeant Livingston initialed the map. I later submitted the CD with the interview recording and the ariel map into evidence under Property and Evidence Receipt #A083812.



Summary

On 10-10-18, there was an officer involved shooting near the area of 7622 SE 82nd Avenue. For details about this incident refer to previously completed reports. I assisted the investigation into the officer involved shooting. I was directed by Sergeant Roberts to conduct an interview with Officer Dalberg. Officer Dalberg was working as a SERT Intelligence Officer during the aforementioned call and was tasked with relaying information gathered from the CNT team members to the SERT team members. This report will detail the interview with Officer Dalberg.

Interview of Officer Dalberg

On 10-10-18, Detective Dolbey and I spoke with Officer Dalberg. Officer Dalberg was accompanied with Officer Habkirk as his union representative. The interview was audio recorded and for complete details refer to the transcript of the interview. In summary, Officer Dalberg explained he was working as a SERT Intelligence Officer. He stated part of his duties related to the aforementioned incident was to provide SERT Officers with information gathered from CNT. Officer Dalberg positioned himself with the CNT team which was stagged blocks from where the suspect was located at. Officer Dalberg said he provided members of the SERT team a cell phone photo of the suspect. Officer Dalberg further stated he was able to hear portions of phone calls between a CNT member and the suspect. Officer Dalberg stated he relayed information from those conversations to SERT members. Officer Dalberg said heard the suspect make threats and that he was screaming and yelling.

For further details of Officer Dalberg's interview refer to the transcript.

On October 10, 2018, I assisted the Portland Police Bureau's Homicide Detail with regard to an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) at the Del Rancho Motel, located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, Portland, Oregon. Sergeant Roberts, DPSST #29901 requested that I partner with Detective McCormick, DPSST #28717 and respond to North Precinct in order to conduct witness officer interviews.

Sergeant Roberts assigned Detective McCormick and me to conduct interviews with witness officers, Lieutenant Bates, DPSST #31070 and Acting Lieutenant Nice, DPSST #26853. I was the primary interviewer for Lieutenant Bates and Detective McCormick was the primary interviewer for Acting Lieutenant Nice. It should be noted that Detective McCormick and I used two audio recorders for our interviews in the event one of the recorders failed we would have the interview captured on the secondary recorder.

Please refer to Detective McCormick's report for details about Acting Lieutenant Nice's interview.

Interview with Lieutenant Bates:

At about 1510 hours (on 10/10/18), Detective McCormick and I interviewed Lieutenant Bates at the Portland Police Bureau's North Precinct, in the Detective Coordination Team's office. Lieutenant Morgan, DPSST #38846 was also present as Lieutenant Bates' Portland Police Commanding Officers Association representative.

I notified Lieutenant Bates that the interview would be recorded audibly in its entirety. I also notified Lieutenant Bates that I would be recording the interview with a secondary device in case one of the recording devices failed. The duplicate recordings were copied for the case file and a copy from my iPhone recorder was placed into evidence at the Central Precinct satellite property room, on PER #A054471/Item #1. It should be noted that details of the interview were summarized for this report. When appropriate, quotes are used. However, for specific information with regard to the exact wording refer to the typed transcription and/or the recording of the interview.

Lieutenant Bates told me that he heard the negotiation between SAMUEL RICE and the Portland Police Bureau's negotiator, Officer Weinberger, DPSST #47656. Lieutenant Bates felt that he heard important information verbalized by SAMUEL RICE that Officer Weinberger did not hear. Lieutenant Bates told me that SAMUEL RICE stated something similar to, "I'm gonna cut her throat." Lieutenant Bates suggested that Officer Weinberger did not hear the statement because he (Officer Weinberger) was talking at the same time as SAMUEL RICE made the statement.

Lieutenant Bates told me he relayed the information to Sergeant Steinbronn, DPSST #32940, who in turn broadcasted the information on the CNT radio net.

Lieutenant Bates said the conversation between SAMUEL RICE and Officer Weinberger was recorded and they played the recording back once the incident was over. Lieutenant Bates confirmed that the recording documented the same information that he had relayed to Sergeant Steinbronn. Lieutenant Bates indicated that he believed SAMUEL RICE was shot with in one to two minutes from when he (Lt. Bates) relayed the information to Sergeant Steinbronn.

It was also noted in the interview that Lieutenant Bates merely passed on the information he heard and that he did not give any orders to take action as a result of SAMUEL RICE'S comment.

This concludes my report.

On the listed date and time I responded to the listed location as a member of the Crisis Negotiation Team.

Upon arrival I acted as the CNT Commander for the event while Sgt King acted as the intelligence coordinator, and Sgt Steinbronn acted as the negotiation sergeant. The duties of the CNT Commander include providing direction for the negotiation team, provide intelligence and options to the SERT Lieutenant and Critical Incident Commander. The information I provided to LT Dakin and A/C Resch was being provided to me by Sgt King and Sgt Steinbronn. LT Dakin and Assistant Chief Resch and I then established a command post and I began providing information to A/C Resch and LT Dakin.

The negotiation team established communication with RICE, whom they described as being very agitated while talking excessively. At one point during the event, it was relayed to me from Sergeant Steinbronn that RICE had made a threat to harm OCHOA by cutting her throat. I informed LT Dakin and A/C Resch of the statement made by RICE.

As we were still gathering information, a member of the SERT inner perimeter fired a shot at RICE. See case file for additional information.

I sent an email to an email address on the sign (vmhydroponics@gmail.com) and received a call back the following day from the owner, Heidi Huyen. Ms. Huyen allowed me to download what recorded video the business had. The timestamp on the video was 28 minutes faster than actual time.

I observed north-facing external cameras on the building to the south bearing the sign "The Sting Pub" located at 7737 SE 82nd Avenue in Portland. I knocked on the door but received no response. I called the number listed for them on a google.com search (503-771-0096) but received no response. I noticed a small sign hung in a east facing window that stated the business was closed for remodeling.

This report details my response to assist in an Officer Involved Shooting incident. I assisted by responding to the scene, sitting in a briefing with initial responding patrol officers, briefing additional investigators at North Precinct to conduct follow up interviews with witness officers, and interviewing two witness police officers. Refer to all additional police reports for additional details.

Narrative

On October 10th, 2018 at approximately 1040 hours, Detective Sergeant Ken Whattam directed Detective Vince Cui and I to respond to the "Del Rancho Motel" located at 7622 SE 82nd Ave concerning an Officer Involved Shooting incident that had just occurred associated with room #16. Detective Cui and I responded and arrived at the scene at approximately 1102 hours. I saw that SE 82nd Avenue in the area of the "Del Rancho Motel" was taped off with crime scene tape. Detective Cui and I observed the scene from the outer crime scene area and conferred with our supervisors. I saw the mobile command precinct was staged on SE 82nd Ave in front of the motel. At about 1144 hours, Detective Cui and I sat in on a briefing inside the mobile command precinct along with several other investigators assisting in this investigation.

During this briefing, I learned from Acting Lieutenant Kyle Nice that SAM RICE allegedly threatened another male subject inside the 7-11, (Refer PPB Case #18-681478), with a knife and subsequently left the store with his girlfriend, TALON OCHOA-BAILEY, and walked toward their room #16 at the "Del Rancho Motel" across SE 82nd Ave. I learned that uniformed patrol responded and contacted both RICE and OCHOA-BAILEY near their room. RICE was uncooperative with patrol, forcibly took OCHOA-BAILEY with him into room #16, and barricaded himself and OCHOA-BAILEY inside their room. I learned SERT and CNT were later activated and subsequently an officer involved shooting occurred resulting in RICE being shot by SERT and being pronounced deceased at the scene inside room #16.

Detective Sergeant Michele Hughes directed Detective Cui and I to respond to North Precinct to conduct a briefing with Detective Sergeant Cory Roberts to several additional investigators so they could conduct interviews with witness officers. Detective Sergeant Hughes then directed Detective Cui and I to both interview Lieutenant James Dakin and Officer Leo Harris at North Precinct along with their PPA Union representatives. I conducted the interview with Lieutenant James Dakin and Detective Cui conducted the interview with Officer Leo Harris. Refer to Detective Cui's report for details of Officer Leo Harris' interview.

Interview with Lieutenant JAMES DAKIN

On October 10th, 2018 at about 1354 hours, Detective Cui and I contacted Lieutenant James Dakin and his Portland Police Association Union Representative Lieutenant Craig Morgan in the North Precinct Community Conference Room. We escorted them to the North Precinct lobby, front small conference room to conduct an audio recorded interview with Lieutenant Dakin as a witness officer to this Officer Involved Shooting. Both Lieutenants Dakin and Morgan verbally consented to a recorded interview. I recorded this interview with my digital recorder and later down-loaded the recording onto a CD-R, (Exhibit 1, Item #1) and had it transcribed, (Exhibit 2). Refer to the audio recording and or transcript for this interview in its entirety. The following is a summary of the key points of this interview.

Lieutenant Dakin told us he is assigned to the Tactical Operations Division and SERT. Lt. Dakin told us on October 10th, 2018 he was assigned to assist on two search warrants in the early morning hours with SERT. Lt. Dakin told us he later returned to North Precinct for a break when he learned about a hostage/kidnap incident at knife point at the "Del Rancho Motel". Lt. Dakin told us SERT Sergeants Don Livingston and Pete McConnell were coordinating a SERT consult with East Precinct Acting Lieutenant Kyle Nice concerning this incident. Lt. Dakin told us Sgt. Livingston assigned Sgt. McConnell to conduct the consult with Acting Lieutenant Kyle Nice. Lt. Dakin told us the Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) began to respond to this incident and Lt. Dakin and SERT accompanied CNT as this incident sounded like a legitimate hostage/kidnap at knife point and both of their teams frequently deploy together. Lt. Dakin told me he called and notified Assistant Chief Jamie Resch, who was also assigned to the earlier morning search warrants, and that she responded to this incident also from North Precinct.

Lieutenant Dakin told us he initially responded at approximately 0930 hours to the Johnson Creek Fred Meyer's parking lot as an initial staging location, but realized there was not enough space. Lt. Dakin told us he next learned this incident had escalated from a SERT consultation to an actual SERT call out/page at approximately 0943 hours. Lt. Dakin told us

Lt. Dakin told us Lt. Chris Lindsey/CNT and Assistant Chief Jamie Resch who assumed the Critical Incident Commander (CIC) role responded to his location and this became their command post. Lt. Dakin told us the

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initial CIC, Acting Lieutenant Kyle Nice, responded to their location and briefed them on the incident. Lt. Dakin told us he

. Lt. Dakin

told us Sergeant Troy King/CNT and Lieutenant Art Nakurmura/CNT joined them at the command post. It should be noted, I furnished Lt. Dakin with a color overhead Google map printout of the overall scene and asked him to mark it to illustrate their location, (Exhibit 1, Item #2). Lt. Dakin marked their command post location with an X on the map. Lt. Dakin also told us Lieutenants Jason Pearce/SERT and Jay Bates/CNT who were training also were in the area of the command post, along with Transit Commander Mike Frome who was in CIC training.

Lieutenant Dakin told us at about 1003 hours, Assistant Chief Jamie Resch authorized CNT to call into the suspect, RICE. Lt. Dakin told us Sgt. Livingston notified them at about 1008 hours that all the motel rooms had been evacuated. Lt. Dakin told us at about 1009 hours, the team Team was ready with the exception of to be completed. Lt. Dakin told us at about 1009 hours, Sgt. Livingston radioed that due to this being a legitimate hostage at knife point situation his

At about 1009 hours, Lt. Dakin told us he asked CIC Assistant Chief Resch if she heard Sgt. Livingston's advisement and Assistant Chief Resch replied yes and approved Sgt. Livingston's advisement to Lt. Dakin. Lt. Dakin told us he could not broadcast this on the air because it was tied up with other communications.

Lieutenant Dakin told us he was monitoring two different radio nets, including SERT Intel and CNT and he recalled hearing on one of these radios at about 1013 hours that they had an open phone line with RICE and he was rambling about, "Stacking" and or "Formations". Lt. Dakin also recalled hearing at about 1013 hours on one of the radio nets that the phone line was still open and RICE was saying something similar to, "If you don't leave I will cut her throat". Lt. Dakin told us he recalled hearing this a couple of times.

Lt. Dakin told us Acting Lieutenant Kyle Nice briefed them at about 1014 hours regarding prior history and interaction with the suspect, SAM RICE, and the victim, TALON OCHOA-BAILEY, his girlfriend. Lt. Dakin told us Acting Lt. Nice told them in the past during domestic violence incidents involving these two subjects that when police backed off RICE would usually calm down, however as they backed off during this incident, Lt. Nice told them they could hear RICE quickly barricaded the hotel room door. Additionally, Lt. Dakin told us Acting Lt. Nice told them probable cause for Attempt Assault in the Second Degree existed for RICE associated with the earlier incident at the 7-11 and RICE had an outstanding warrant for Criminal Mischief in the Second Degree. Lt. Dakin told us he radioed out this information to SERT. At about 1014 hours, Lt. Dakin also told us Acting Lt. Nice told them the victim, TALON OCHOA-BAILEY, would usually talk to the police during previous domestic violence incidents between she and RICE, but she did not during this incident after being barricaded inside room #16.

Lt. Dakin described to us "appropriate initiative", where

SERT operatives on the "IP" team are allowed to take certain steps as police officers observing the incident directly when there is no time to radio out their observations, but potentially need to react by using force to protect others from violence, assault, or possible death. Lt. Dakin also told us Sgt. Livingston requested over the radio that Lt. Dakin get them more resources from Washington County Sheriff's Office. Lt. Dakin described how he was distracted by this task at one point as he made phone calls to WCSO Commander John Coch with TNT.

At about 1015 hours, Lt. Dakin told us he heard one single gunshot. Lt. Dakin told us he next immediately heard Sgt. Don Livingston radio, "Execute, execute, execute!" Lt. Dakin told us he almost simultaneously heard the "boom" sound of the

Lt. Dakin told us at about 1016 hours, he heard on the Radio the SUBJECT was down and Medical was ordered in. Lt. Dakin told us he instantly saw Medic 99 truck move in toward the motel room. Lt. Dakin told us he also heard the Radio transmission that the hostage was safe. Lt. Dakin told us, at about 1017 hours medics were on the scene with RICE and he was subsequently pronounced deceased. Lt. Dakin told us at about 1017 hours, Sgt. Livingston radioed he was moving the sector of the parking lot.

Lt. Dakin told us at about 1018 hours, Assistant Chief Resch radioed Acting Assistant Chief Michael Krantz and Deputy Chief Robert Day to notify them of the Officer Involved Shooting. Lt. Dakin also told us at about 1018 hours, he heard Sgt. Pete McConnell radio that he was moving to the sniper team to check on them. Lt. Dakin told us at about 1018 hours, he and Assistant Chief Resch moved up to check on the SERT Team, but that they remained in the outer crime scene and did not enter the inner crime scene. Lt. Dakin told us he checked with Sgt. Don Livingston to see if they needed any resources and Sgt. Livingston requested water, which they had delivered to them. Lt. Dakin also ensured the SERT officers stayed in the immediate area and did not discuss the incident with one another. Lt. Dakin told us that Acting Assistant Chief Krantz ensured that Lt. Dakin and Assistant Chief Resch did not discuss this incident also. Lt. Dakin also assigned Lieutenant Jason Pearce to assign a member to the **McContext for the state of the state o**

In conclusion, Lieutenant Dakin told us this was a very fast moving incident. Lt. Dakin also confirmed there was no order given by any command staff to shoot the suspect.

We ended our interview at approximately 1456 hours.



NARRATIVE

On Wednesday (10/10/18) at approximately 1100 hours, I was informed of an officer involved shooting and was told to report to North Precinct for investigative support where I partnered with Detective Eric McDaniel. At North Precinct, we were assigned to interview A/LT Kyle NICE, who was accompanied by his PPA union representative, Officer Scott ROBERTSON. We met in the North Precinct DCT/Community Room where both Detective McDANIEL and I recorded the interview.

What follows is a brief summary of the interview and does not include every topic of discussion mentioned, and may not reflect the precise chronology of conversational progression. A/LT NICE also annotated a provided map (attached in RMS, submitted on Property/Evidence Receipt #A084239.)

A/LT NICE told me he was the acting lieutenant and responded to a disturbance call at the Del Rancho motel. Upon arrival, A/LT NICE assessed the situation, activated SERT, managed resources, and oversaw initial attempted communication attempts with TALON and RICE. A/LT NICE expressed concern over the safety of TALON based on her unwillingness to speak with the police during the Del Rancho incident.

A/LT NICE told me he was familiar with both TALON and RICE from a disturbance call two weeks earlier (refer case #18-311315). Officers effectively communicated with TALON on the prior call. TALON assured the police she was safe and A/LT NICE wrote a "Supervisory Disengagement Report" (attached in RMS) at the conclusion of that call.

A/LT NICE attempted to de-escalate the Del Rancho incident by pulling back officers to give RICE space to calm down. When communication officers were unable to reach TALON, A/LT NICE adjusted the plan to include resources which may be needed for hostage rescue. SERT personnel arrived and deployed a short time later.

For a complete account of A/LT NICE's involvement, read the transcript (attached in RMS) or listen to the audio recording (submitted on Property/Evidence Receipt #A084239).



Summary:

On October 10, 2018 at approximately 0911 hours, Tariq AWAN called 911 to report a fight between two subjects in the 7-11 store located at 7501 Southeast 82nd Avenue. Portland Police Bureau Uniformed officers responded to the store and later identified Samuel RICE and Ronald PEARSON as being involved in the fight. Uniformed personnel identified Talon 0CHOA-BAILEY as being associated with RICE. Uniformed personnel located RICE and OCHOA-BAILEY across the street from the 7-11 store at the Del Rancho Motel located at 7622 Southeast 82nd Avenue. Uniform personnel subsequently learned RICE was armed with a knife. Uniform personnel attempted to speak to RICE on the grounds of the motel and saw RICE forcibly take OCHOA-BAILEY hostage in room 16. RICE threatened to kill OCHOA-BAILEY. The Portland Police Bureau Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT), and Special Emergency Reaction Team (SERT) were activated. During the ensuing standoff between RICE and Portland Police personnel, RICE was shot and killed.

Narrative:

On October 10, 2018 at approximately 1038 hours, I received a page from Sergeant Michele Hughes directing me to respond to Southeast 82nd and Southeast Flavel Street to investigate an officer involved shooting. While I was responding to the location, I learned the following: Officer Kelly Vanblokland, as a sniper with the Special Emergency Reaction Team (SERT),

shot and fatally wounded Samuel RICE. Officer Leo Harris was a witness officer. I learned that officers Vanblokland and Harris had been separated from one another at the conclusion of the tactical event that lead to the shooting.

I arrived on scene at approximately 1105 hours and approached the scene from the south. I saw several blocks of Southeast 82nd Avenue between Southeast Malden Court and Southeast Flavel Street were occupied by a variety of police vehicles to include SERT armored vehicles, a mobile precinct, as well as numerous marked and unmarked police vehicles. Detective Kammerer was on scene prior to me working as an intelligence officer with SERT. Detective Kammerer provided me with a list of individuals who could provide background information on the details of the radio call and CNT/SERT activation. Detective Kammerer directed Forensic Evidence Division Personnel to take initial overall photos of the scene to document where SERT armor, SERT ambulance, and other police vehicles were located. Once the initial overall photos were taken, the SERT armor, ambulance, and other police were released from the scene.

I learned the following from an onscene briefing, speaking to police personnel at the scene, detectives at a post incident briefing, listening to dispatch recordings, and reading the transcribed interviews and police reports mentioned below.

On October 10, 2018 at approximately 0911 hours, Portland Police Officers Higginbotham and Date responded to the 7-11 store at 7501 Southeast 82nd Avenue for a call of a disturbance. Officers Higginbotham and Dale were directed to speak to an individual who was a witness to the disturbance at 7-11. Officers Higginbotham and Dale subsequently made contact with RICE and OCHOA-BAILEY at the Del Rancho Motel at 7622 Southeast 82nd Avenue. Officer Higginbotham asked RICE his name. RICE told him his name was "Aaron Lex Luther" then changed his name to "Aaron Diesel". Officer Higginbotham and Dale saw RICE take OCHOA-BAILEY hostage in room 16 at the Del Rancho.

Additional uniform personnel arrived and began developing a plan to negotiate with RICE. Sergeant Hansen arrived and directed uniform personnel in establishing a custody team should RICE come out of room 16. Sergeant Hansen initiated a CNT callout. As a result of the CNT callout, Lieutenant Nakamura requested a limited deployment of SERT members to support CNT.

Officer Huntinghouse went to the 7-11 store where the radio call originated and spoke with the manager, Tariq AWAN. Officer Huntinghouse learned from AWAN that there had been a disturbance in the store earlier during which the suspect pulled a knife out and attempted to stab someone. AWAN described the knife used by the suspect as a household kitchen knife. AWAN gave Officer Huntinghouse the contact information for the other party in the fight, Ronald PEARSON.

Officer Huntinghouse spoke with PEARSON and learned the following. PEARSON told Officer Huntinghouse he was standing in line at 7-11 when a female cut in front of him. PEARSON said he got into a brief argument with a male who PEARSON assumed was the female's boyfriend. PEARSON said the male pulled out a knife and tried to stab him. PEARSON said he got into a fight with the male. PEARSON said he knocked the knife out the male's hand. PEARSON said the male left without the knife. PEARSON said he put the knife on the store counter but the male returned a short time later and retrieved the knife. Officer Huntinghouse returned to the Del Rancho Motel and shared the information he learned from AWAN and PEARSON with the uniformed personnel at the Del Rancho Motel.

Acting Lieutenant Nice responded to the scene and designated himself as the Incident Commander (IC). Acting Lieutenant Nice requested a SERT member call him for a consultation. SERT Sergeant McConnell consulted with Acting/Lieutenant Nice on the phone. SERT was finishing a warrant several miles north of the Del Rancho Motel. Based on the information Sergeant McConnell learned from Acting Lieutenant Nice, he and Sergeant Livingston directed SERT personnel to respond to and stage in the area of the Del Ranch Motel. While SERT was enroute to the Del Rancho Motel, uniform personnel initiated a full SERT call out.

Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) personnel began arriving at the Del Rancho Motel and began attempting contact with RICE.

While SERT members were enroute to the location, Sergeants Livingston and McConnell were making plans and assignments for a team. As SERT personnel arrived, they began to take up positions consistent with the plans that had been made enroute to the location. SERT personnel relieved uniform personnel and adjusted their positions as needed.

At approximately 1000 hours the Bureau of Emergency Communications (BOEC), received an open cell phone call from (971) 292-0111. The cell phone number matched BOEC call history from a female staying in room 16. BOEC received a call (971) 292-0111 from "Aaron Diesel". Officer Weinberger from CNT was able to speak with RICE on the phone for a brief period of time. RICE ended the phone call with Officer Weinberger by telling him in part, "Go fuck yourself, go, go fuck yourself dude or I'm gonna cut her throat." I later had transcribed the phone call between Officer Weinberger and RICE as well as the 911 call "Aaron Diesel" made to 911 at attached it to this report. Refer to the CNT audio recording, 911 call recording, and transcripts for details on RICE'S phone calls. Officer Watts gave gave me a thumbdrive containing audio and video that was recorded during the incident. SERT personnel occupied rooms 15 and 17 of the Del Rancho Motel to stage personnel for a rescue team. Both uniform and SERT personnel reported hearing sounds consistent with furniture being moved around inside room 16. Officers Vanblokland and Harris deployed to a position on the south side of room 16. A short time after SERT personnel deployed to areas around room 16, Officer Vanblokland broadcast he had taken a sniper shot on the south side of room 16. Upon hearing the sniper shot had been taken, Sergeant Livingston told the team to initiate a hostage rescue in room 16. The hostage rescue included an SERT personnel found the door to room 16 barricaded from the inside with items from the room.

As soon as OCHOA-BAILEY was rescued from room 16, SERT personnel requested their SERT medics come to room 16 to provide medical aid to RICE. SERT Medic Jay Fink pronounced RICE deceased.

Detective Stenzel collected video from several locations and processed several cell phones. Refer to Detective Stenzel's report for details on video collection and cell phone processing. I later reviewed the video and contents of the cell phones. Refer to separate report by writer for details on video and cell phone review.

At the conclusion of the oncsene briefing, investigative assignments were made. The following Portland Police Personnel were interviewed by Detective Division personnel at North Precinct. Officer Huntinghouse, Officer Higginbotham, Officer D. Dale, and Acting/Lieutenant Nice were interviewed by detectives to provide background information on the uniformed personnel response to incident. Officer Leo Harris was interviewed by detectives as a witness member to Officer Vanblokland's shooting. Sergeants McConnell, Livingston, Detective Gradwahl, Officers Snitily and Dalberg, and Paramedic Jay Fink (Portland SERT Medic) were interviewed by detectives to provide background information on the SERT response. Lieutenants Bates and Dakin and Assistant Chief Resch were interviewed by detectives to provide background information on the overall supervision of the CNT/SERT response.

The above named personnel were directed to proceed to North Precinct when they were released from the scene. Sergeants Roberts and Santos facilitated detective interviews and monitored the above mentioned personnel at North Precinct to ensure they did not speak about the incident. Sergeant Santos issued Communication Rescindment Orders (CRO) to the above named personnel after they were interviewed by Detective Division Personnel.

Detectives Posey and Odil interviewed civilian witnesses, Starla STARN, Ronald PEARSON, Roberta STEWART, and Andrew ENGLISH. PEARSON is the victim in the assault that occurred at the 7-11. STEWART and STARN were witnesses

to the assault at 7-11. Detective Posey documented the interviews with STARN, PEARSON, and STEWART on Portland Police Case number 18-681478. ENGLISH witnessed RICE and OCHOA-BAILEY engaged in a disturbance in the parking lot of the Del Rancho Motel shortly before the assault at 7-11 occurred. Detective Posey documented the interview with ENGLISH on case number 18-347005. Refer to Detective Posey's reports, the audio recordings, and transcripts, for details on the interviews of STARN, PEARSON, STEWART, and ENGLISH.

At approximately 1240 hours, Detective Beniga and I conducted a weapons countdown of Officer Vanblokland's Glock handgun and AR-15 rifle magazines. Officer Vanblokland was represented by his attorney, Michael Staropoli, during the countdown. Criminalists Nebling and Becker documented the countdown. Deputy District Attorney David Hannon was present during the countdown. At the conclusion of the countdown, Officer Vanblokland declined to give a voluntary interview or participate in a voluntary walk through. Sergeant Hughes issued a CRO to Officer Vanblokland. Refer to Detective Beniga's report for details on Officer Vanblokland's weapons countdown for further.

At approximately 1314 hours, Detective Beniga and I conducted a weapons countdown Officer Leo Harris' Glock handgun, AR-15 rifle, extra AR-15 magazines, and an extra Glock magazine. Officer Harris was represented by his attorney, Anil Karia, during the countdown. Criminalists Nebling and Becker documented the countdown. Deputy District Attorney David Hannon was present during the countdown. At the conclusion of the countdown, Officer Harris participated in a walk through with Detective Beniga, Detective Kammerer, Mr. Karia, Deputy District Attorney Hannon, and me. At the conclusion of Officer Harris' walk through, Sergeant Hughes issued Officer Harris a CRO.

At approximately 1343 hours, I entered the north side of the crime scene through the parking lot area of the Del Rancho Motel. I viewed room 16 and saw RICE laying on his back in the bathroom of room 16 holding a knife in his right hand. The knife appeared to be consistent with a standard kitchen or steak knife. I saw photo placards 1 through 3, as well at five photo placards labeled "A" through "E". Photo placard 1 marked a cellular phone, photo placard 2 marked a marijuana pipe, and photo placard 3 marked the knife in RICE'S right hand. The lettered photo placards were as follows:

Once the crime scene was processed and evidence was collected, Detective Kammerer collected photo placards A through C and disposed of them.

Detective Stenzel later processed the cellular phone marked by photo placard 1. I reviewed the contents of the phone and noted the phone number associated to it was (971) 292-0111.

At approximately 1448 hours, I entered the south side of the crime scene through a parking lot on the south side of the Del Rancho Motel. I saw a pickup truck with paneling on the sides. In the back of the pickup truck, I saw a tripod with bag labeled "F" that belonged to Officer Harris. I saw another gear bag labeled "G" that belonged to Officer Vanblockland. I saw a bolt action rifle in Officer Vanblokland's gear bag. Photo placard 4 was Officer Vanblokland's AR-15 rifle. Photo Placard 5 was a spent shell casing that was consistent with the caliber of Officer Vanblokland's rifle. Forensic Evidence Division Personnel collected the items marked with photo placards 1 through 5 as evidence. I later took Officer Vanblokland's rifle and the shell casing to the Oregon State Police Crime lab. Refer to separate report by writer for details on the Oregon State Police Crime Lab submissions.

Once the crime scene on the south side of the Del Rancho Motel was processed and evidence was collected, Detective Kammerer collected photo placards "F" and "G", including Officer Vanblokland's bolt action rifle, and returned them to SERT personnel.

At approximately 1500 hours, Detective Kammerer collected Officer Vanblokland's AR-15 rifle and took it to the mobile precinct. Detective Beniga and I were present with Detective Kammerer when he conducted a countdown of Officer Vanblokland's AR-15. Criminalists Becker and Tsukimura documented the countdown. Refer to Detective Kammerers report for further details.

At approximately 1543 hours, I was present when Deputy Medical Examiner Donielle Auguston examined and removed RICE from the scene. I saw what appeared to be a gunshot wound in the area of RICE'S right eye.

At approximately 1700 hours, Detective Beniga and I cleared the crime scene.

At approximately 2130 hours, Detective Beniga and I met with RICE'S family.

On October 11, 2018, at approximately 0900 hours, Detective Beniga and I attended a post mortem exam of RICE. Doctor Rebecca Millius performed the exam and was assisted by pathology assistant Tommy Bottomly. Portland Police Officer Gabriel Hertzler and Deputy District Attorney Hannon also attended the post mortem exam of RICE. At the conclusion of the exam, Doctor Millius ruled the case of RICE'S death as a gunshot wound to the head, and the manner of his death a homicide. Criminalist Shearer collected evidence and Criminalist Tsukimura took photo graphs at the exam. Among the items of evidence collected at the exam were two bullet fragments. I later sent the bullet fragments to the Oregon State Police Crime lab. Refer to separate report by writer for details on the Oregon State Police Crime Lab submissions.

As a member of the Special Emergency Reaction Team I was with the team serving a warrant when we began heading toward the address 7622 SE 82nd Ave, which we were told was a hotel, and that the incident was in #16.

While enroute the information I was told and heard via the radio was that a male subject had attempted to stab someone at a 7Eleven and then taken a female into a hotel room with a knife and yelled at officers that he would kill her if they tried to come in. At some point it was updated that the subject was also possibly barricading the door to the room.

As we arrived I was initially designated as a part of the **second second** as the less lethal operator.

As we moved up toward the hotel room, Ofc. Gryphon was watching the door and window of the hotel room and did not have a less lethal operator so I moved over with him so that we had a less lethal option at the front door.

While I was there Ofc. Thurman came to relieve Ofc. Gryphon and Sgt. Foxworth also joined us.

As we were watching the front of the hotel room. I heard what sounded like a gun shot. I heard what sounded like a female scream from the direction of the hotel room. I heard an operator come over the air and say that they had taken a shot and the suspect was down.

I saw a team of SERT members come from the room adjacent to #16 and make entry into the hotel room.

I moved up with the less lethal to see if I was needed. Shortly after I moved toward the front of the hotel room I saw a female come out of the hotel room.

I did not enter the hotel room. I heard them ask for medical to check the female and suspect as soon as the scene was safe for our medics to come in.

I remained on-scene until released.

On October 10, 2018 I was called to assist with an officer involved shooting at the Del Rancho Motel 7622 SE 82nd Avenue. While at this location I assisted with interviewing citizens who had potential information regarding the incident.

Deputy Odil and I contacted ANDREW ENGLISH at his new motel room across the street at the Dar-Ron Motel unit #206.

ENGLISH told us he and his fiancée (Roberta Stewart) were staying at the Del Rancho Motel in unit #11. ENGLISH said he was notified by his fiancé that some type of disturbance was taking place in the parking lot and he should look at what's happening.

ENGLISH said he stepped outside and saw two officers making contact with a guy and girl in the parking lot of the Del Rancho Motel. ENGLISH said the officers were trying to defuse the situation with the male subject, but the male subject grabbed the female and used her as a shield between him and the officers. ENGLISH said the male subject told the officers he was going to kill the girl and himself.

ENGLISH said the male and female subject ran away from the officers to unit #16. ENGLISH said he heard the door of the bathroom slam shut and thought the girl had run inside of it. ENGLISH said he heard a lot of pounding and thought the male subject was trying to get into the bathroom after her.

ENGLISH said he was evacuated out of the motel a short time later.

Summary

This report details an interview with SERT Officer Leo Harris, who was partnered with SERT Officer Kelly Vanblokland, regarding his observations during a deadly force encounter on October 10, 2018 involving SAMUEL RICE at the Del Rancho Motel, located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue.

Narrative

On October 10, 2018, I responded to an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) at the Del Rancho Motel located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue. I arrived onscene at 1059 hours and attended an onscene briefing given by Sgt. Kyle Nice (the initial onscene supervisor) and SERT Sgt. Don Livingston (the overall SERT onscene supervisor). From the briefing, I learned Samuel Rice and his girlfriend Talon Ochoa-Bailey were involved in an incident at the 7-11 located on the corner of SE 82nd Ave and SE Flavel St where Rice threatened and attempted to assault another patron with a large knife. Rice was seen forcing Ochoa-Bailey into Room 16 at the Del Rancho Motel, located across the street from the 7-11. East Precinct officers attempted to speak with Rice, who threatened to kill Ochoa-Bailey. Officers reported Rice was barricading himself in the room and refused to allow Ochoa-Bailey to leave. SERT was consulted and responded to the motel, where they took over tactical responsibility from the officers.

Per SERT Sgt. Livingston, an IP (Inner Perimeter) team was deployed which included Officers Harris and Vanblokland. The IP team engaged Rice and an entry team secured the motel room, releasing Ochoa-Bailey. I was told Ofc. Vanblokland fired his weapon once during the engagement. Ofc. Harris was present with Ofc. Vanblokland when the shot was fired.

Sgt. Hughes directed Det. Merrill and myself to respond to North Precinct to conduct interviews. Det. Merrill was the primary interviewer for Lt. James Dakin, the SERT commander who was onscene at the time of the engagement. Please refer to Det. Merrill's report for further details.

I was the primary interviewer for Ofc. Harris' interview. At the interview, Ofc. Harris was represented by Portland Police Association (PPA) representative Ofc. Ryan Regan. The interview was recorded via a digital recorder and a copy was submitted as evidence under PED Receipt #A106332. For complete details, please refer to the recording and/or transcript.

OFFICER LEO HARRIS STATEMENT

Ofc. Harris briefly described his time on SERT and the duties/responsibilities of being on the IP team. On the day of the engagement, Ofc. Harris said SERT had just completed two warrants when he

overheard on the radio that East Precinct was responding to a possible hostage/kidnapping incident. Ofc. Harris mentioned Sgt. P. McConnell doing a consult with East Precinct and the decision to head towards the incident.

As they got close to the incident location, Ofc. Harris said it became a full SERT activation and he was partnered with Ofc. Vanblokland. Ofc. Harris mentioned they were given information related to Rice's behavior and the earlier incident, as well as sent a photo of Rice via cell phone.

During our interview, Ofc. Harris was given an overhead map of the location to point out their location. Ofc. Harris described taking a position 25-30 yards south of the motel in an adjacent lot. Ofc. Harris said they were in the process of finding an elevated position to get a view of the target location, and ended up on the back of a flatbed truck that was parked next to a Conex box. Ofc. Harris stated SERT members positioned in the rooms next to #16 pointed out the target location, which included two windows that faced south.

Ofc. Harris stated the subject looked out one of the windows and obviously saw them because he gestured at them with his middle finger. Ofc Harris mentioned this window appeared to be partially blocked by a mattress because the subject was holding it down when he was looking out the window. Ofc. Harris used the back of the map he used to identify his positon to draw a sketch of his view. In the sketch, the initial window he saw the subject at was towards the west (closest to 82nd Ave). Ofc. Harris talked about how he felt the situation appeared to him to be escalating because of the subject's behavior. Ofc. Harris described his thought process about how he felt the subject could be engaged if they had another opportunity.

Ofc. Harris said the subject showed himself a second time in the window to the east. He described the subject sliding open this other window which eliminated a glass barrier. Ofc. Harris said he heard Ofc. Vanblokland fire a single shot from his AR15

Ofc. Harris stated the subject went down after the shot and he could tell the entry team was making their way into the room. Ofc. Harris remarked that he was happy when heard the victim was safe.

After the shot was taken, Ofc. Harris said they remained at their position until Sgt. McConnell came and give them direction. Ofc. Harris stated he left his scope in place as Ofc. Vanblokland did with his rifle. After they were relieved by a precinct officer, Ofc. Harris was separated and eventually reported to North Precinct for his interview. It was understanding that Ofc. Harris provided a walk-through with the primary investigators prior to his interview with us.

NARRATIVE:

On October 10, 2018, I was assigned to assist members of the Portland Police Bureau's Homicide Detail with the investigation of an officer involved shooting that occurred on the same date, at approximately 1015 hours, at the Del Rancho Motel, which is located at 7622 SE 82nd Avenue, Portland, Oregon. At approximately 1515 hours, I was assigned to interview Assistant Chief J. Resch, who was the Critical Incident Commander of the SERT/CNT call out at the Del Rancho Motel that resulted in the officer involved shooting. The interview was conducted inside the roll call room of North Precinct. Also present in the interview were my partner, Detective T. Harris, and Nicole Robbins who was the attorney representing Assistant Chief Resch. The interview was recorded and later transcribed. The following is a brief summary of the interview and it is not necessarily in chronological order. For complete details, please refer to the CD/transcription.

SUMMARY of ASSISTANT CHIEF RESCH INTERVIEW:

Assistant Chief Resch told me she was the Critical Incident Commander (CIC) for SERT/CNT on a warrant service unrelated to this event, on the morning of October 10, 2018. Assistant Chief Resch said while they were wrapping up at that scene East Precinct requested a SERT consult in reference to a call they were on and she believed Sergeant McConnell of SERT handled the request. Assistant Chief Resch said SERT/CNT decided to respond to the area of the call and stage at the Johnson Creek Fred Meyer store, awaiting formal activation. Assistant Chief Resch said that while she was en route to the staging location, SERT/CNT were formally activated to assist with the call, so she bypassed the original staging location and went to the area of SE 82nd Avenue and SE Malden Street where the command post was going to be established. Assistant Chief Resch said she was monitoring the mathematical and heard this incident stemmed from a disturbance at the nearby 7-11 involving a man with a knife and that later evolved into a possible hostage situation at the Del Rancho Motel.

Assistant Chief Resch said once she was briefed by Sergeant K. Nice on the initial details of the call, she took over command of the incident. Assistant Chief Resch said SERT was creating a manual and had made a request to establish


Assistant Chief Resch said she

granted that request. Assistant Chief Resch said SERT was operating under "standard rules of engagement" which meant the team members operated under Oregon Revised Statutes, Federal Laws, and Portland Police Bureau Directives. Assistant Chief Resch did not give any orders or commands, nor did she order for a "shot of opportunity" which she explained to mean shoot on sight. Assistant Chief Resch said she heard a single shot fired and via radio learned it was from a sniper. Assistant Chief Resch said her role at that point was to make appropriate notifications and scene security. Assistant Chief Resch said once those tasks were completed, she passed command to Commander Krantz.

On 10/10/18, Criminalist Greaves and I responded to the Del Rancho Motel to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. Acting Sergeant Criminalist Nebling assigned us to operate the laser scanner. A scan plan was created. A Leica C10 HDS scanner with serial #1261013 and iStar panoramic camera with serial #NCT-IS3013 were used to capture the scan data and panoramic still images of the scene. Photographs of the laser scanner locations were made. A total of eleven (11) scan stations were created. Data from scan stations 3, 4, and 6 were incomplete. Their data will be retained, but they will not be used in the final processing.


Before we cleared from the scene, I was asked by one of the detectives on scene to photograph the injuries to the victim's left lower leg. Several photos were made with and without a photo scale. The captured still images were uploaded into DIMS.

SUMMARY

On October 10, 2018, the Portland Police Special Emergency Reaction Team (SERT) was called out to the Del Rancho Motel regarding a subject who had barricaded himself in room #16 and was holding a female hostage. The suspect was believed to be armed with a knife. Portland Police Officers were initially called to the 7-11 located across the street from the Del Rancho Motel on the report of an assault where the suspect attempted to stab a customer while in the store. Officers responded to the 7-11 and attempted to contact the suspect who was accompanied by a female. The suspect forced the female inside room #16 of the Del Rancho Motel and refused to come out of the room. Members of the SERT Team responded to the motel and ultimately made entry into room #16. The suspect was later identified as Samuel Rice and the female was identified as Talon Ochoa. Refer to the responding officers and detectives reports for information concerning the initial call and the use of force.

Sergeant Hughes asked Detective Jones and I to interview Talon Ochoa. This report contains a summary of Talon Ochoa's statement; the complete interviews can be reviewed on a DVD that was submitted into evidence on the listed receipt. The interviews were also transcribed and will be available for review.

NARRATIVE

On October 10, 2018, Detective Jones and I conducted three recorded interviews with Talon Ochoa throughout the day. Two of the interviews were recorded in a patrol car at the scene and the final interview was conducted at the Portland Police Detective Division. It should be noted that during the interviews Ms. Ochoa had difficulty providing a chronological sequence of events as to what transpired at the 7-11 and inside the motel room.

However, in summary of the three interviews, Ms. Ochoa ultimately stated that on the morning of October 10, 2018, Sam Rice pulled a kitchen style knife on a male who was unknown to either of them while at the 7-11 that was located across the street from the Del Rancho Motel. Ms. Ochoa said during the altercation at the 7-11 she was aware that the store clerk/ owner called the police. Ms. Ochoa said after the altercation in the 7-11 ended she and Sam walked across the street and were standing in front of the office of the Del Rancho Motel when they observed a police car arrive and park on the north side of the 7-11 on SE Flavel St. Ms. Ochoa said she observed two uniformed police officers get out of the police car. Ms. Ochoa said the two police officers attempted to contact her and Sam while they were standing in front of the Del Rancho Motel office. Ms. Ochoa explained that she and Sam were standing at the office because they had locked themselves out of their room and needed a room key. Ms. Ochoa said once the police tried to contact them Sam pushed her toward their motel room, #16, and then kicked the door open to gain entry and get away from the police. Ms. Ochoa said while they were inside their motel room Sam threatened to cut her throat, cut his throat, cut his ears off and also refused to let her leave the room. Ms. Ochoa said Sam barricaded the door with a bed and also put a mattress up in front of the front window. Ms. Ochoa said she was scared and believed Sam would hurt her, she also said she attempted to leave the room but was unable to move the mattress he had blocking the door. Ms. Ochoa said she was not free to leave the room and believed Sam would hurt her if she tried. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was aware that the police were outside and wanted them to leave. Ms. Ochoa said she overheard Sam talking to the police on the phone and heard him say he wanted money, specifically \$10,000.00. Ms. Ochoa said Sam believed he could start over and if he got the money he'd let her go. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was holding the knife in the motel room for approximately twenty minutes. Ms. Ochoa said she was standing next to the bed in the bedroom when Sam went to the bathroom to look out the window to see where the police were when she heard a single gunshot. Ms. Ochoa said the police then forced the door open. Ms. Ochoa said she didn't see Sam get shot but saw him lying on the bathroom floor and saw blood.

First Recording (28:53 duration):

On October 10, 2018, at approximately 1000 hours, I contacted Talon Ochoa in the parking lot of the Del Rancho Motel where I introduced myself to her and explained that I wanted to speak with her about what happened this morning which she agreed to. Detective Jones and I walked Ms. Ochoa to a uniform patrol car that was parked on SE 82nd Ave. and had her take a seat in the front passenger seat of the vehicle. Detective Jones explained to Ms. Ochoa that we wanted to record the interview for accuracy purposes which she agreed to. At approximately 1015 hours Detective Jones activated an audio recording device and started the interview. Ms. Ochoa told us the following.

Ms. Ochoa said this morning she and her boyfriend, Samuel Rice, walked across the street to the 7-11 to get something to eat. Ms. Ochoa said while the two of them were inside the 7-11 she was waiting in line to pay for her food when she attempted to cut in front of someone who was standing in line in front of her. Ms. Ochoa said the guy got mad at her and wouldn't let her cut in front of him. Ms. Ochoa said the guy "got in her face" which caused Sam to get mad. Ms. Ochoa said Sam pulled a knife on the guy to protect her. Ms. Ochoa said Sam's knife was approximately a foot long kitchen style knife and that he had been carrying the knife in his pocket. Ms. Ochoa said after Sam pulled the knife on the guy the guy pushed Sam to the ground. Ms. Ochoa initially said that after Sam got pushed to the ground the two of them left the 7-11 and walked back across the street to their room at the Del Rancho Motel.

Ms. Ochoa explained that she and Sam had been in a relationship for almost a year and the two of them were currently homeless. Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam got a room at the Del Rancho Motel on October 4, 2018 and had been staying in room #16 since that day. Ms. Ochoa said she had never seen the guy at the 7-11 before today and didn't know him.

Ms. Ochoa said once she and Sam got back to their motel room Sam blocked the door with the bed. Ms. Ochoa initially said she didn't know why Sam was blocking the door. Ms. Ochoa said she went to the bathroom and took a shower. Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam weren't arguing inside the motel room and continued to offer no explanation as to why Sam was blocking the door with the bed. Ms. Ochoa also said that no one followed them from the 7-11 or chased after them.

Detective Jones asked Ms. Ochoa if she tried to call 911 and she said Sam did and the people at the 7-11. Ms. Ochoa said while she and Sam were in the 7-11 the clerk called the police after Sam pulled the knife on the guy. Ms. Ochoa said she knew the clerk was calling the police because she saw him on the phone. Ms. Ochoa initially said Sam didn't know the police were called but added that Sam later called the police on his cell phone. Ms. Ochoa said she didn't know why Sam called the police. Ms. Ochoa described their motel room, #16, as being one bedroom with two beds and a bathroom.

After listening to Ms. Ochoa's answers to our initial questions I believed she was being evasive with her responses due to information I learned while at the scene as to what occurred inside the 7-11. Based off this belief I asked Ms. Ochoa some follow-up questions for clarification purposes. I explained to Ms. Ochoa that the 7-11 had surveillance videos inside the store that we were going to watch and that she needed to be honest with us. Ms. Ochoa said Sam pulled the knife on the guy and held it out in front of him. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was standing approximately one foot away from the guy when he pulled the knife on him. Ms. Ochoa said the knife was a kitchen style knife with a plastic handle and was approximately one foot long. Ms. Ochoa said once Sam pulled the knife. Ms. Ochoa said Sam picked the knife up prior to them leaving the 7-11. Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam walked across the street and went in their room.

Ms. Ochoa said Sam didn't use any drugs other than cigarettes and "weed." Ms. Ochoa said Sam had a disability but didn't know what it was.

I asked Ms. Ochoa when she first realized that the police were trying to speak with her and Sam or when they were first contacted by the police. Ms. Ochoa initially said she didn't know and then said about an hour ago. Ms. Ochoa explained that

Sam was very frustrated and that she was trying to calm him down in the motel room. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was upset because they were living in a motel and were struggling financially. Ms. Ochoa now said the police being there also upset Sam and that he'd seen the police outside. Ms. Ochoa said the police were trying to talk to Sam and believed they told him to come outside and talk. Ms. Ochoa said Sam wanted the police to go away and didn't want to go outside. Ms. Ochoa said Sam called the police "again" and told them he wanted money. Ms. Ochoa said Sam's knife was in the bathroom at this point. Ms. Ochoa said she was aware that the police had been there for about an hour after she got out of the shower.

Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam had been in a relationship for almost a year and there was no history of domestic violence between them. Ms. Ochoa said prior to today Sam had never threatened to hurt her.

Ms. Ochoa said she believed Sam would have hurt her if she tried to leave the motel room today. Ms. Ochoa said Sam told her he'd cut her throat if she tried to leave. Ms. Ochoa said she was scared of Sam today. Ms. Ochoa said Sam carries a knife "sometimes" to protect her. Ms. Ochoa said neither she nor Sam were contacted by the police in the parking lot and were contacted by the police when they were inside the motel room.

I explained to Ms. Ochoa that we wanted to go inside her motel room, #16, to collect evidence and asked her for her consent, she said, "yes."

Detective Jones stopped the recording at approximately 1052 hours.

Second Recording (12:41 duration):

At approximately 1109 hours, Detective Jones and I resumed the recording and continued the interview in the previously mentioned police car. Ms. Ochoa provided us with consent to search her phone and the motel room and signed consent forms for both. I submitted the consent forms into evidence on the listed receipt.

I then asked Ms. Ochoa to explain to me where she was in the room when it ended. Ms. Ochoa said she was sitting down on the bed next to the window and the bathroom door. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was sitting in a chair next to the desk. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was smoking a cigarette to calm down and he called the police "again" and said he needed money then hung up the phone. Ms. Ochoa said Sam then tried to find her wallet so he could get her bank card so she could call her bank. Ms. Ochoa said she wasn't sure why he wanted her to call her bank. Ms. Ochoa said she was trying to get her socks and shoes on but he wouldn't let her go outside. Ms. Ochoa said Sam had the door blocked with the bed and the nightstand and was also standing in front of the door. Ms. Ochoa said she sat back down on the bed and was trying to relax. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was in the bathroom and looked out the window to see if the police had left. Ms. Ochoa said this was when Sam was shot by the police. Ms. Ochoa said Sam had the knife with him in the bathroom when he was shot. Ms. Ochoa said she was standing next to the bed when she heard a single gunshot and when she went to the bathroom she saw Sam on the ground and blood started to come out.

I asked Ms. Ochoa if Sam ever called her his "hostage" and she said she thought so but wasn't positive. Ms. Ochoa repeated that she wasn't free to leave and thought Sam would cut her throat if she tried. Ms. Ochoa said neither she nor Sam called anyone other than 911 while they were inside the motel room.

Detective Jones stopped the recording at approximately 1117 hours.

Detective Jones contacted the manager of the Del Rancho Motel and got a refund for Ms. Ochoa in the amount of \$360.00. Detective Jones listed the money on property/evidence receipt #A086059 and then returned the money to Ms. Ochoa and had her sign the form.

Ms. Ochoa agreed to ride downtown with Detective Jones and I to conduct another interview.

Third Recording (50:00 duration):

At approximately 1347 hours, Detective Jones and I interviewed Ms. Ochoa in interview room #2 at the Portland Police Bureau Detective Division. Prior to starting the interview, I activated an audio/visual recording device and recorded the interview. Ms. Ochoa's statement was fairly consistent with her prior statement, however, she added some additional information that contradicted her prior statement.

Ms. Ochoa said she checked into the Del Rancho Motel on October 4, 2018 with Sam and it was just the two of them staying in room #16. I showed Ms. Ochoa an aerial map of the area surrounding the Del Rancho Motel and then pointed out where the 7-11 was located and the Del Rancho Motel.

Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam went to the 7-11 to get food and while inside the store Sam got into an altercation with a guy. Ms. Ochoa now said that when Sam pulled the knife on the guy the guy took the knife from Sam and then gave the knife back to Sam. Ms. Ochoa said the guy hit Sam in the head while Sam was on the ground. Later in the interview, Ms. Ochoa said the guy knocked the knife out of Sam's hand and Sam bent down and picked the knife up.

Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam were walking across the street back to the Del Rancho Motel when she observed the police arrive at the 7-11. Ms. Ochoa said they observed two police officers walk inside the 7-11. Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam were standing in front of the Del Rancho Motel office when two police officers walked over to them. Ms. Ochoa said the police officers tried to talk to Sam and Sam told them he needed money and needed to move out of the state. Ms. Ochoa said the police officers within a few feet of her and Sam when they talked to them. Ms. Ochoa said Sam told the police officers to back off. Ms. Ochoa said Sam pushed her to their room and then kicked the door open to get the two of them inside. Ms. Ochoa said she and Sam went in the room and Sam shut the door.

I drew a rough diagram of room #16 at the Del Rancho Motel and showed it to Ms. Ochoa. Ms. Ochoa said Sam was upset and angry when they got back to their motel room. Ms. Ochoa said Sam refused to let her leave while they were inside room #16 and was afraid Sam might hurt her.

Ms. Ochoa said while Sam was in the bathroom he opened the window and she heard a gunshot. Ms. Ochoa said she never went inside the bathroom after she heard the gunshot.

Ms. Ochoa said she went to Rex Putnam High School and graduated in 2007 and was able to read and write. Ms. Ochoa said she wasn't aware of Sam having any mental illness.

Ms. Ochoa said she called her friend "Dieter" after the shooting.

Detective Jones and I stopped the interview and then drove Ms. Ochoa back to the Del Rancho Motel where we helped her gather her belongings from her room.

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



approximately 2:17 PM. Also present for the interview was Detective Crocket and Officer Zach King.

The following is a summary of statements made during the interview. It does not include all comments made during the interview, nor does it necessarily reflect the chronology of the discussion. Refer to the recording for the full content of the interview.

Firefighter Fink told me that he is employed with the Portland Fire Bureau but works in the role as a medic with Portland Police Bureau's SERT as a medic. He has done this for approximately 10 years. Firefighter Fink is medically trained to the level of Paramedic.

Firefighter Fink responded with PPB SERT to 7762 SE 82nd Avenue in Portland, Oregon on report of a possible hostage situation.

He and another SERT medic were discussing their plan for the operation when Firefighter Fink heard a gunshot. Shortly after hearing the gunshot he heard the call for medic's to respond so he ran to the front entry of the room. SERT members had Firefighter Fink stage there until they cleared the hotel room. A female exited the room and he did not notice any apparent sign of injury to her. SERT members requested him into the room. The room was disheveled and it was apparent the male had made preparations to barricade himself in the room. He was directed to the deceased male, who was in the bathroom. He described the male as his feet pointing kind of towards the bathroom and lying in a somewhat supine position. The male's head was turned and there was a large, expanding pool of blood around his head. He noticed blood coming out of the male's ear. The male had no respirations. The male was still clutching a black knife in his right hand. It appeared that the male had died immediately and Firefighter Fink pronounced him dead. Firefighter Fink was unsure of the time but thought it may have been recorded over the radio. Firefighter Fink did not have to move or manipulate the patient to determine the male to be deceased.

Firefighter Fink believed that SERT made the effort to have him respond into the room as quickly as practicable so that he could render aid without delay. Firefighter Fink does not believe that any medical aid could have been provided to the deceased to prevent his death.

This concluded my interview with Firefighter Fink.

An audio copy of this interview has been provided to Detective Broughton. Additionally, a copy of this audio has been placed into evidence at The Oregon State Police Portland Area Command as JTHE-1.

NARRATIVE:

On October 10, 2018 Detective Reynolds and I were assigned to interview Officer Higginbotham and Officer Dale at North Precinct regarding the OIS that had occurred earlier this day at the Del Rancho Motel. **BELOW IS ONLY A SUMMARY. SEE TRANSCRIPTS FOR COMPLETE INTERVIEWS.**

Detective Reynolds and I first spoke with Officer Higginbotham in an interview room at North Precinct. **In summary** Officer Higginbotham told us he and his partner, Officer Dale, responded to a call of two people fighting inside the 7-11 at 7501 SE 82nd Ave. They arrived on scene and were directed to a witness who told them this guy (later identified as SAMUEL RICE) tried to slash a woman in the stomach with a knife and pointed the them across the street. Officer Higginbotham told us the two were at the base of the stairs from the office of the Del Rancho.

Officer Higginbotham told us he and his partner (Officer Dale) walked across the street and Officer Higginbotham engaged Samuel Rice in conversation. Officer Higginbotham described Samuel Rice as very animated, very agitated and kind of speaking nonsensical. Officer Higginbotham articulated the exchange (see transcript) and he drew an "X" with a circle on the map of where he was when he first started speaking to Samuel Rice. Officer Higginbotham told us Samuel Rice

eventually went into room 16 and she (Talon) continued to walk past. Samuel Rice first tried to open it (door to room 16) and apparently did not have the key. Samuel Rice eventually got inside by taking long runs, 15 feet, at the door and then hitting it with his shoulder. After about 3 to 5 seconds of being in the room, Samuel Rice came back out and grabbed her (Talon) around the waist and pulled her, one arm around her waist and one around her neck and shoulders and pulled her backwards into the room. Officer Higginbotham continued to attempt to communicate with Samuel Rice who made death threats and wanted Officer Higginbotham to come over and stand in the doorway so he (Samuel Rice) could bash his head in. Officer Higginbotham and other arriving officers set up and communicated different plans to deal with the evolving situation.

Officer Higginbotham told us Samuel Rice started putting something up against the window, possibly a mattress. Officer Higginbotham continued to attempt to communicate and he could hear Samuel Rice yelling inside and what sounded like furniture being pushed up against the wall. SERT arrived and Officer Higginbotham assisted in helping tenants out of the nearby rooms. Officer Higginbotham went to speak to CNT and heard what sounded like

Detective Reynolds and I next spoke with Officer Dale in an interview room at North Precinct. **In summary**, Officer Dale told us they responded to a fight at the 7-11. They were pointed towards a guy across the street who they were told had been waiving a knife around. Officer Dale told us he went with Officer Higginbotham across the street and Officer Higginbotham called out to the two. Officer Dale said he saw him (Samuel Rice) push in the room and she (Talon) went past the room. Samuel Rice came back out and grabbed her from behind and then dragged her into the room and shut the door. Samuel Rice came out yelling and screaming and Officer Higginbotham was trying to engage/communicate with him. At one point Samuel Rice "...go ahead, shoot me". Officer Dale helped evacuate other rooms and went to the CNT truck. **SEE TRANSCRIPT FOR COMPLETE INTERVIEW.**

I edited the taped transcripts and put the above exhibits into evidence.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

During a SERT activation at SE 82nd Avenue and SE Flavel Street, Officer Vanblokland fatally shot SAMUEL RICE. This report documents the countdown of Officer Vanblokland's bolt-action rifle at the scene, as well as my actions at the scene.

NARRATIVE

On October 10th, 2018, at approximately 1030 hours, I was directed by Sergeant Hughes to assist with investigating an Officer Involved Shooting at SE 82nd Avenue and SE Flavel Street. Officer Vanblokland, during his role as a sniper with the Special Emergency Reaction Team (SERT), shot and fatally wounded SAMULE RICE. As a sniper with SERT, Officer Vanblokland deploys with both a semi-automatic rifle in .223 caliber and a bolt-action rifle in .308 caliber. As part of my duties assisting with investigating the shooting, I was directed to locate and identify items of evidence, as well as perform a countdown of the bolt-action rifle, which was reportedly not used.

At approximately 1600 hours, I retrieved Officer Vanblokland's bolt-action rifle from the side pouch of the drag bag in the back of the red Ford pickup on the south side of the Del Rancho motel. I noted the rifle was a Remington Model 700 .308 caliber bolt-action rifle. Criminalist Tsukimura was also present to document the weapon countdown via photographs.

I noted Officer Vanblokland carried five .308 caliber cartridges in a sleeve on the butt of the rifle. At full capacity the sleeve is capable of holding five cartridges. I pulled the bolt to the rear, exposing an empty chamber in the rifle. I then verified the internal magazine for the rifle was empty. At full capacity, the internal magazine is capable of holding four cartridges.

I then looked through the drag bag, marked with Placard G. No other ammunition was located inside the bag.

At the conclusion of the weapon countdown, we determined Officer Vanblokland had not fired his bolt-action rifle. I then returned the bolt-action rifle to the pouch on the side of the drag bag, and collected the bag and rifle, as well as the tripod and case marked with Placard F. These items were later returned to Officer Vanblokland. I informed Detective Broughton of the results of the weapon countdown.

This investigation is ongoing.

We arrived, came from the south uh, northbound on 82nd Avenue and stopped in the area of SE Malden uh, Street and from that timeframe there um, SERT operators started getting in positons and meeting with supervisors to see how we could provide assistance.

I was part of a team that initially started uh, evacuating some rooms that were just west of the target location, being motel room number 16. Once we evacuated the rooms to the west later, met up with other SERT operators and we moved to a room just to the east of room number 16, which was room number 17 that we ended up entering. At that point myself's typically there um, our lieutenant, the CNT lieutenant, CNT sergeant and then the overall critical incident commander. Once that brief is complete the critical incident commander usually assumes responsibility of the call and comes over the radio and lets everybody know that he or she is in charge. 

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

Dolbey:	Okay this is Detective Dolbey. We're at North Precinct, today is October the 10 th . Uh, we are here to discuss the incident that occurred at 7622 SE 82 nd Avenue. It evolved around room 16 of the Del Rancho Motel uh, again which is located on SE 82 nd Avenue. Present in the room with me is Detective Sharp uh, Sergeant McCONNELL, Mr. Walters, Officer Walters representing as a union represent, representing um, Sergeant McCONNELL and if you would just go around the room and please acknowledge that this conversation is being recorded and give me your name and DPSST number please.
McConnell:	Uh, my name is PETE McCONNELL, M-C-C-O-N-N-E-L-L, I'm a sergeant uh, with SERT. Uh, BPST 28715 and I acknowledge this is being recorded.
Walters:	Jason Walters, 33522, PPA rep and I acknowledge this is being recorded.
Sharp:	And Detective Jeff Sharp uh, number 34582 and yes I know this is being recorded.
Dolbey:	And again Detective Dolbey, 29984. Okay Sergeant McCONNELL if you will just uh, begin by giving us an overview of what you were doing this morning that led to this call.
McConnell:	Uh, this morning I was working uh, as a member of SERT. Uh, we had been executing uh, two search warrants for a um, We were just finishing up executing our second search warrant uh, at approximately 9:30, give or take. Uh, when uh, myself and Sergeant DON LIVINGSTON received a page from dispatch for a SERT sergeant consult. Uh, with instructions to call Sergeant KYLE NICE of East Precinct. Uh, Sergeant LIVINGSTON was uh, actively involved in the clear of the house at our search warrant so he asked me to contact Sergeant NICE, which I did.
Dolbey:	Okay.
McConnell:	Op, sorry do you want me to expand a little bit?
Dolbey:	Yeah, yeah. Um, so you get on the phone with uh, Sergeant NICE, as you said and what's the conversation you have with him?
McConnell:	Uh, so that page came out at 9:19 uh, in the morning. Uh, I called Sergeant NICE back, I told him it was Sergeant McCONNELL calling. He told me that he wanted to give me the heads up that uh, there was a potential hostage situation in

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East Precinct where a uh, male with a knife had grabbed a female and retreated into a hotel room. Uh, he didn't have much more information than that, it sounded like he was still enroute to the call. Um, I told him that we were actively finishing up a warrant and that we could be there shortly if he wanted to activate us. Um, and he said he would uh, let me know on that and then proceeded to the call. That ended our conversation. Uh, so based on the information that he gave me uh, being a uh, kind of high level um, high uh, danger to life event I let Sergeant LIVINGSTON know. Um, we had actually cleared our inner perimeter officers, that they could pull back from their responsibilities of the warrant so I uh, we had left our big equipment van at the precinct so I asked for one of them to head to the precinct to get the van and start heading this way and we started rearranging our equipment so that we could leave the search warrant quickly and head out uh, to that area and stage close by in case we, we were needed. Uh, and or activated I guess I should say, to respond to the scene.

Dolbey:

Okay and was your team that you'd just described, you know getting the extra equipment, were you able to set up uh, or before this became a full call-out?

McConnell: Yes. So um, we essentially uh, loaded up in our two pieces of armor. Um, and uh, we uh, started going out uh, Killingsworth and decided to take I-205 to Johnson Creek and that would put us close to the scene. Uh, but at this point we still had not officially been activated so our plan was to stage um, in one of the business lots there um, until we were officially activated. Um, uh, Sergeant LIVINGSTON and I talked via phone and, and he was making arrangements with command as that was going on. Um, as we're enroute um, a dispatcher came up on our net which is different than the precinct net and we were monitoring uh. what's called And the dispatcher gave a synopsis of the call. Um, somewhere in there, there had been information that possibly prior to taking this uh, woman into the hotel room at knife point that the individual had stabbed someone at a business somewhere else in the area. At least that was the information that we received while we were enroute to Johnson Creek. Um, I learned that CNT, at least my belief was they had been activated and I heard someone from CNT uh, which I kind of thought was uh, Sergeant TROY KING but it might've been uh, Lieutenant NAKAMURA um, but in any case um, someone was kind of asking a clarifying question that, you know CNT had been activated but SERT had not been activated yet. It seemed like they were working through getting SERT activated. Um, right about the time we arrived at Johnson Creek um, we'd secured a staging area or planned a staging area. I believe it was DON LIVINGSTON got on the radio and said we've now been officially actiactivated and so we just proceeded uh, north on 82nd. Uh, I got on my phone and looked for kind of the closest area we could get to without being in sight of the area we were going which was the Del Rancho Motel at 7622 SE 82nd. Um, and I gave instruction to uh, Detective BILLY WINTERS who was driving the bear cat at the time, where to stop. Uh, DON advised me via radio and later uh, via face

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that uh, he had already put together a, **Second and u**h, with the members of SERT in his piece of armor and they had a plan to, to move up closer to where they needed to be to deal with the situation if the need arose. Uh, so my role in this was to organize the IP or inner perimeter and get them positioned during the event.

Dolbey: Okay so when you stop are you in visual contact with Sergeant LIVINGSTON's team or not?

McConnell: Uh, we stopped uh, I stop- or the bear cat stopped and the bear truck, where Sergeant LIVINGSTON was, was right behind me. Um, we uh, needed to get permission from the IC to deploy. So DON and I talked very briefly. I told him I was gonna run the IP, he said he was gonna move forward and uh, talk to the IC. At that point I realized I'd like to deploy my folks I really need to know where the problem is so I just went up with him. Um, we kind of got separated in the parking lot.

> The Del Rancho Motel basically has two buildings in it that run uh, east and west and when I came into the parking lot um, uh, I saw uniform officers kind of in front of the northern building focused on the building to the south. So um, I saw DON uh, go up and meet with um, I believe it was Sergeant NICE who was the IC at this point in time. Uh, I kind of got the lay of the land. I talked to uniform officer. Uh, 'cause at this point while I knew it was the Del Rancho Motel, even though it might've been broadcast I didn't realize which uh, room it was. Uh, so I had a brief conversation, I believe it was with othe- Officer HIGGINBOTHAM and learned it was unit 16 where the male had retreated with the female at knifepoint and I, I learned where 16 was. I put eyes on it.

> Um, I got a brief description of the suspect from um, Officer HIGGINBOTHAM. Uh, I put some of that description out, I think I uh, in the confusion I'd forgotten the clothing description. But I gave, over the radio, just a brief description of a white male, 6'3"-ish, 230-ish pounds. Uh, I think I said um, bald uh, bald head was in 16 with the female. And then once I had an understanding of uh, what the problem was or where the location was I went back around the corner to the front of the motel and started looking at the resources I had as the inner perimeter sergeant.

> Uh, the only uh, inner perimeter officer that I had initially was Officer CHRIS GRYPHON um, who I directed to go off of what we would call side one or the front door side of room 16. Um, I called him up to the front of the motel, I told him where 16 was, I pointed him that way. I basically direct him to get directly off of um, the front door and front window of unit 16 um, and take a position that he felt was safe and I would get him a partner when I could. Uh, because he had a, uh, the correct (unintelligible) system. He had a, a scope on his rifle um, and

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had the right, right tools for that job. Um, ultimately I saw what we call our

Uh, I saw that Officer CHARLIE ASHEIM was part of that and he is assigned to the IP and there were still unassigned, what we would call entry folks from my piece of armor that didn't have a job so I, I brought two of those up. It was Officer AARON SPARLING and I think Detective TODD GRADWAHL and uh, briefly talked to Sergeant FRANKUS. Replaced uh, CHARLIE ASHEIM with those two officers and put CHARLIE with um, Officer CHRIS GRYPHON.

Um, as I was going on uh, I met with the manager

Um, in case the officers uh, wanted to go in there to stay out of sight. Um, Sergeant FRANKUS told me that he wanted

Um, other IP members arrive um, uh, two that got there were Officer KELLY VANBLOCKLAND and Officer LEO HARRIS. Um, I directed them to uh, well let me back up before that. Um, at some point in time we needed to get just eyes on side three and so Officer TIM HOERAUF and Officer, I can't remember who was with him at the moment but uh, I directed him to get eyes on side three. Uh, which they did um, by going through the manager's office and staying at the western end of the building so they're looking back eastbound. So if something or someone were to come out of unit 16 into the short grassy alleyway between the south side of the building and the fence line at the south side of the property they would see it but they couldn't see in the windows into unit 16 if that makes sense.

Ultimately that position that I'm talking about, that ended up being Officer TIM HOERAUF, Officer CHARLIE ASHEIM and K-9 Officer BEN DAVIDSON. So I knew they were there and had containment on side three. Um -

Sharp: And what does side three mean?

McConnell:

Dolbey: ...I'm sorry, would that be on the south side of the building? In this case?

McConnell: Yes this would be on the south side of the building.

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Dolbey: Okay, side three is on the south side, got it.

McConnell: Yes. Um, so now I had IP coverage um, on side one um, that was Officer CHRIS GRYPHON um, somewhere in this Officer JUSTIN THURMAN had arrived and he's on the IP so I directed him to go to side one with Officer CHRIS GRYPHON and ki- K-9 Officer GORE was already up at side one and so he was with their position. So once those officers were there uniform officers started backing out. Um, Sergeant DERRICK FOXWORTH arrived, he's on the IP. Um, I initially asked him to take two operators and a K-9 and go to the eastern part of uh, the um, parking lot as kind of a blocking position in case anyone came out of 16 and ran to the east. Um, as it ended up we ran out of people. There wasn't enough people to man that position so I contacted the uniform sergeant. Got three uniform officers to post themselves at what would be the eastern end of the northern building. If that makes sense. So that was taken care of. I, I believe Sergeant FOXWORTH ended up with Officer THURMAN and Officer GRYPHON.

Um, Officers LEO HARRIS and Officer KELLY VANBLOKLAND arrived and I told them the problem, the lay of the land, where unit 16 was and it was kind of in the middle of the building that I described. At that point in time, looking at it from the backside or the side three side I couldn't tell you which windows were um, belonged to unit 16. But I told Officers HARRIS and VANBLOCKLAND that we would get that uh, figured out and I'm looking um, in the area ultimately where their final position was and I could see that um, there was a building. And I can give you the address of that, sorry. Uh, so the building it's 7720 SE 82nd. which is labeled as VM Indoor Garden Supply. I pointed out the roof of that building. Um, there's a parking lot to the uh, kind of the northeast of that property. Of that, that address I gave you. There's some connex's there, I pointed that out as possibly an area that they might be able to see the side three windows to unit 16 and I basically directed them to take a position off of side three that would give them the best advantage to look into those windows. So they would have a different look then Officer HOERAUF, ASHEIM and K-9 Officer DAVIDSON. Um, I saw them deploy to that area, I didn't see where they went but I knew they were in that area.

Um, I went back to the front and uh, I could see that our um, uh, entry team had now moved around the parking lot and uh, I believe they were in unit 17. Um, from where I had first seen 'em. Um, I knew that uh, Officer TOM SNITILY was in unit 15 preparing um.

that we use in this type of situation. This being a, a hostage situation where someone's life is threatened and we may need to get into a uh, room very quickly from as many different angles as we can to prevent the loss of life. Uh, he had told me that he had, I believe he had and he needed uh,

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Uh, somewhere during this um, Sergeant LIVINGSTON and I had a brief face-toface conversation um, you know maybe 30 seconds to a minute. Um, you know we talked about how we were running out of bodies. We had two officers coming from training uh, a distance away. Um, we talked about uh, requesting assistance from the Washington County Sheriff's Office Tactical Negotiations Team or SWAT team. Uh, we put that request on the radio for two snipers and four uh, entry officers. Uh, my intent there was that they could fill some of these holes that we couldn't fill at the moment. Uh, we talked about the seriousness of the event. Um, while somewhere in here my belief is that the information we received on um, uh, the suspect uh, stabbing someone prior to uh, grabbing the female at knifepoint and retreating into the apartment. Uh, that ended up not being true but in my conversation with Officer HIGGINBOTHAM he had indicated to me that the suspect had attempted to stab somebody prior to uh, retreating into the hotel. In my, the way I took that from Officer HIGGINBOTHAM was in the, somewhere on the hotel grounds the suspect had tried to stab somebody else prior to taking the female hostage. Uh, so we discussed that. Um, we discussed um, you know briefly rules of engagement. Uh, and we were gonna stay under what we would call standard rules. So how we would normally operate under Directive uh, 10.10. Um, I can't remember anything else specific in that conversation. Um -

Dolbey: Can, can I take this time and go back and ask some questions. Maybe you can fill in some of the information here. Um, it sounds like you were very busy setting up your teams on the one and on the three side of the building. Um, during that time, while you're doing all of that do you, did you receive any photos of the suspect and that hostage?

McConnell: Uh, I did. Um, somewhere and I think it was on the radio prior to actually receiving the photo and I may have received the photo and just not realized it. Uh, but we did get the suspect's name of, which I think I, I wrote down in my notebook. Uh, and then I receive a text from uh, uh, from one of our intel folks. Um, with a photograph which is a, it looks like a picture taken off a uh, Portland uh, MDC. Uh, and it uh, (pause) it shows uh, you know a white male, bald and so I believed that to be the suspect.

Dolbey:Okay.McConnell:Uh, in this.Dolbey:Do you know if anyone else on your team got those pictures as well?McConnell:Uh, I know, I was told that they were being sent out in blocks of four or five.

Dolbey: Okay.

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McConnell:	On this specific text that I received it's addressed to JOHN DALBERG, TOM SNITILY, JOE CHURELLA, DON LIVINGSTON and JIM TOWNLEY.

I don' know what the content um, of that conversation was or what was broadcast on the radio. Um, just going back, since I brought it up it kind of reminds me. Um, you know obviously CNT is a, is a part of, you know the package that we respond with. Um, we had CNT officers out at the earlier warrant so I knew that there were some CNT officers there. Um, and the primary route to talk to somebody in this type of event is normally by phone and on the radio I heard that was happening, but just in case uh, that wasn't gonna be successful Sergeant HOLBROOK came up and I said hey can you get a face-to-face team ready and move them up on side one just in case communications are unsuccessful or break down on the phone. You know we have that option readily available. Uh, and my belief is that he got that uh, taken care of. Um, I saw him move up to the front. I think he got the people that he need. I don't know that he actually got up to the side one part but that was just kind of the thought process.

So I turned and ran to see if I could assist there since I didn't have a specific role.

Um, I got there and I saw Officer AARON SPARLING uh,

Um, I

stayed there briefly and uh, tried to cover him. There was a, what I initially thought was just a curtain over the window and it ended up, I believe it was like a, a white mattress um, over the, over the window so I couldn't really see in. Uh, initially I thought the front door was open and so I started to move over uh, to the end of what we would call the stack or the line of officers going in.

Um, and then I, I realized that it wasn't really moving and it looked like to me that the door was about halfway open and something was behind it. Which I think was the mattress which was preventing us the easy access from getting in there. Um, at some point in time uh, the door was open enough that officers made it in there. Um, I never made it into the room. I didn't really see anything um, I never saw the suspect.

Um, at one point later in the event I saw a female being uh, directed, heard on the radio that we have the hostage and then I saw a female being escorted out of the room. Um, I didn't have a role there so um, I started facilitating medical to uh, render aid to the suspect.

Um, I believe I got on the radio and asked for the medics to, I think I said just walk up. I'd actually met with um, two of our uh, fire medics that were on-scene which is uh, uh, Firefighter JAY FINK and Firefighter JAROD BORLAND. Um, and I had positioned them in the bear cat at that point in time. Uh, because we didn't have any operators left to staff that and I asked one to be the driver and one to be the medic in it in case we needed that armor brought up quickly. Um, and they knew where the, essentially the problem was. Uh, so I actually asked them to walk up or run up and I backed out into the parking lot so I could see the area I expected 'em. Um, I don't know if they heard on the radio or what but they ended up driving the bear cat up and then jumping out. Or somebody drove the bear cat up and then I see them appear. So maybe I have that wrong but essentially they appeared right where I thought they were, I'm just not sure if they ran or in the bear cat.

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Uh, I directed 'em uh, to just outside of 16. Uh, I asked, I don't know if it was clear voice or on the radio, is it safe for the medics to come in? Uh, at some point I got the all, all clear that it was okay for medics to come in so those two medics were brought up in short order and entered the apartment.

Um, at that point in time um, I still had no job on the scene, there was no use for me there so I looked at Sergeant LIVINGSTON. Uh, I don't remember if he was inside or outside and I told him, hey I'm gonna go to side three and uh, you know work on that scene and, and figure out uh, who had been involved in this event.

Uh, he acknowledged that so I walked around the uh, um, uh, the building um, I think I just went directly to uh, Officer VANBLOCKLAND and Officer HARRIS's position. I didn't necessarily know where it was but I went through the fence uh,

north side of the uh, address I gave you earlier.

Um, I found them standing, I mentioned these connexs that I'd pointed out to 'em that might give 'em a position of advantage. If you just went five feet north of those connexs there was a red truck backed in next to them that had a three to four foot high like wooden railing bed in the back and that's where Officer VANBLOCKLAND and Officer HARRIS were.

Um, and uh, I asked uh, which officer was involved and Officer VANBLOCKLAND indicated to me that he had been the officer that had fired the shot. Um, I asked Officer HARRIS if he was involved and he said he was only a witness. Um, so at that point in time um, I don't think I asked him, I might've asked him, I don't remember honestly. I think it was Officer HARRIS indicated um, 'cause I'm standing at the, basically the bed of the truck on a black mat, that the shell casing should be somewhere further east in the grassy area. Um, I briefly looked in that area, I didn't see shell casing but it was, you know six to 12 inch tall grass and that wasn't necessarily my priority at the time. Essentially the crime scene was already contained because it's a secure parking lot with the exception of the entry way that I came through

Um, so I directed the officers not to talk to each other um, and stood by with them uh, the entire time. Officer VANBLOCKLAND indicated the weapon that he had used was an AR-15 type rifle. Um, he has different weapon systems so I don't know if it was his 223M4 or if it was a 308 caliber LaRue but it's an AR-15 type platform that I saw sitting on what I would call his drag bag which is a, a term for a backpack that typically carries a, a 308 type rifle. Uh, so I directed him just to leave it there, not to touch it. Um, I called for a uniform, two uniform officers uh, to come set up a secure crime scene and Officer uh, RAMICK and Officer MELE (sp?) from East Precinct uh, responded.

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I directed them to set up red tape um, across the um, entry way to the um, the gate and then all the way around the connexs and to the fence line. Um, and they did that um, and then at that point in time I had uh, wait let me back up. Um, I wanted to uh, place both of the officers, the involved officer and the witness officer in a vehicle with a off- in a, with an officer with them so I also coordinated um, two of our uh, TIC qualified officers um, that were not involved uh, in the uh, in the event. Meaning like involved members in the event and so initially it was Officer BRYSON and uh, Officer THURMAN that came and so um, once, once they were ready and had cars and I had Officer uh, RAMICK and Officer MELE there I had uh, Officer HARRIS and Officer uh, VANBLOCKLAND climb down out of the truck. Um, Officer HARRIS brought his rifle that he had with him, because he was not the involved member. We left Officer VANBLOCKLAND's rifle right where it was when I got there.

Uh, we went to the front of the truck uh, I briefed Officer MELE and Officer RAMICK on their responsibilities. Um, I brought Officer MELE to the mat that I had been standing on and told him he needed to stay here and guard that rifle because it was a loaded rifle. Um, and that somewhere in this grass probably is a shell casing and not to tramp over that area and he acknowledged that.

And then as I escorted uh, Officer VANBLOCKLAND and Officer HARRIS out I posted Officer uh, RAMICK at the uh, second piece of red tape that they had put across, probably about 15 feet east of the first red tape and that he was to maintain the crime scene log. Uh, we didn't have an actual log at the moment so I had him uh, write uh, his name, Officer MELE's name, my name, Officer HARRIS's name and Officer VANBLOCKLAND's name uh, in his notebook, which he did.

Um, shortly after that, maybe 20 minutes or so later Officer THURMAN's not a TIC qualified officer so Officer CHAD GRA-GRADWAHL replaced Officer THURMAN and then remained with Officer VANBLOCKLAND through the rest of the event until he was uh, released at the scene by detectives.

Uh, I went back and made sure uh, that Officer MELE and Officer um, RAMICK understood. Um, we had an officer bring them an official crime scene log which Officer RAMICK uh, transferred the names that he had put in his notebook onto the log and he maintained that.

Um, Officer MELE, because the event was still kind of ongoing when, when he responded, he responded and he was wearing his uh, street AR-15 rifle. Um, so at

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some point in time I went back and took Officer MELE's rifle from him and gave it uh, to Officer BROWN who put it in a car but that was not the rifle used in this event and that was not in the crime scene when I got there.

Um, the only thing I, I think I didn't mention is um, Officers ASHEIM uh, Officer HOERAUF and K-9 Officer DAVIDSON stayed at their side three post. Um, I talked to them about what they had seen and they had only heard a shot. Um, and I consulted with homicide detectives at the scene and they felt they were not uh, witness members so uh, I got permission to relieve them from their position but because that visually kind of controlled the alley on the south side of the building that housed 16 uh, we positioned uh, uniform Officer BROWN there. (cell phone noise)

Dolbey: We can stop if you need to take it?

McConnell: (<u>Unintelligible</u>), sorry. Uh, we positioned Officer BROWN there and he maintained that post to make sure no uh, civilians wandered into the south side of that building um, until the event was done I believe.

Dolbey: Okay um, and approximately how long did, were you on scene after you heard the shot? Approx?

- McConnell: How, how long was I?
- **Dolbey:** Yeah, on the scene?
- McConnell: At the scene?

Dolbey: Yeah.

McConnell: Um, I was uh, there, that's a good question. I don't know the exact time but I can you that I, I stayed out there, I had been released to come back to North but I'm, I was the only sergeant left out there and we still had members of SERT that were at the scene. Um, we actually had several but at the end it ended up being Officer VANBLOCKLAND and Officer GRADWAHL and Officer HARRIS and Officer BRYSON and so I stayed out there to make sure they were taken care of. Um, ultimately I left once Officer VANBLOCKLAND had been released from the scene. Um, I uh, I coordinated a car being brought out to me and then I picked up Officer GRADWAHL after Officer VANBLOCKLAND was uh, dropped off and came here and uh, I think that was probably about 15 to 20 minutes before Officer HARRIS was released from the scene.

Higginbotham: And I sent STRAWN around to the back because I, I learned from the hotel manager that, or motel manager that there were two windows on the backside uh, for the bathroom and a, another room. So it, we could have a little bit of containment on, on him so he couldn't go out the back windows. Um, let's see, so then we learned uh, that her name was TALON um, I can't remember, I think it was TALON TIARA, I don't remember what her last name was.

Reynolds: Was it TALON OCHOA-BAILEY?

Higginbotham: Yes.

Reynolds: Okay.

Higginbotham: And uh, so I asked uh, you know I had dispatch run the name to see if we could come up with any associates of hers so that we can, you know maybe try and start phone dialog or, you know something else along those lines.
