



Landscape Monitoring Report

The purpose of the monitoring report is to determine whether required plants have become established during the monitoring period and are being maintained in a manner that will support long-term survival. Plants that die must be replaced in-kind. Information must be provided to demonstrate these requirements are met. The guidance below is provided to help applicants satisfy this requirement.

- Photographs of the planting area
 - Site plan showing the location and direction of photos
 - Photos of all trees planted

Maintenance activities to support the planting area. Note the use of pesticides and fungicides is not allowed. Check each that occurred during the monitoring period:

- Irrigation.** New plants must be manually watered during the first growing season; watering must be done as necessary for survival in subsequent seasons.
- Nuisance plant removal.** Nuisance plants must be removed from the mitigation area at installation and continuously maintained. Examples of nuisance plants include English ivy, Himalayan blackberry, reed canarygrass, teasel, clematis.
- Removal of supports.** Plant supports may be used only when necessary due to extreme winds. Supports must be removed as soon as the plant can support itself.
- Other.** Provide a written description of other activities. Attach additional sheets if necessary.
