

Peninsula Crossing Trail Neighbors,

The **Safe Rest Village** program (SafeRestVillages.org) is moving forward with the development of the Peninsula Crossing Safe Rest Village on nearby City-owned property. Safe Rest Villages are managed outdoor shelters offering those experiencing homelessness basic amenities, on-site 24/7 staffing, and mental and behavioral health support, all with a goal of **helping them transition to their next step off the streets.**

The **Peninsula Crossing Safe Rest Village** will be developed in several phases. We have already begun some digging to make utility connections. Soon you will see fences going up on a portion of the site, in early February, as the first phase of construction begins.

The Village will be a temporary use on portions of the City-owned property, next to the trail between Princeton and Oberlin Streets. The **Portland Housing Bureau** is in the process of selecting a developer to build affordable housing on this property in the coming years.

For many months, outreach staff have been visiting those unhoused neighbors living on the property, offering them shelter and services. Outreach will continue as construction moves forward. The Belmont Goats will be relocated to a different part of the same property.
