OVERVIEW

- **Correction to 3/24/20 Situation Report: Multnomah County has no open drive-through testing facilities at this time.**

- **The National Guard (more than 10,000 troops) is activated in 32 states, providing medical testing, assessments, logistics, planning and liaison support.**
- **New unemployment [claims in Oregon increased](#) nearly 1,500% last week. The state received 76,500 new claims last week compared to 4,900 the prior week. The**

previous 1-week record was set in December 2008 with 21,000 claims during the Great Recession. Nationally, a record 3.3 million Americans applied for unemployment benefits, surpassing the previous record of 695,000 set in 1982.

- On March 23, Governor Brown issued the “Stay Home. Save Lives” Executive Order, directing everyone in Oregon to stay at home to the maximum extent possible and adding to the list of businesses that will be temporarily closed to stop the spread of COVID 19. - Oregon Food Bank: While some pantries have closed, many are still open and have adjusted to box pick-up and/or drive thru. 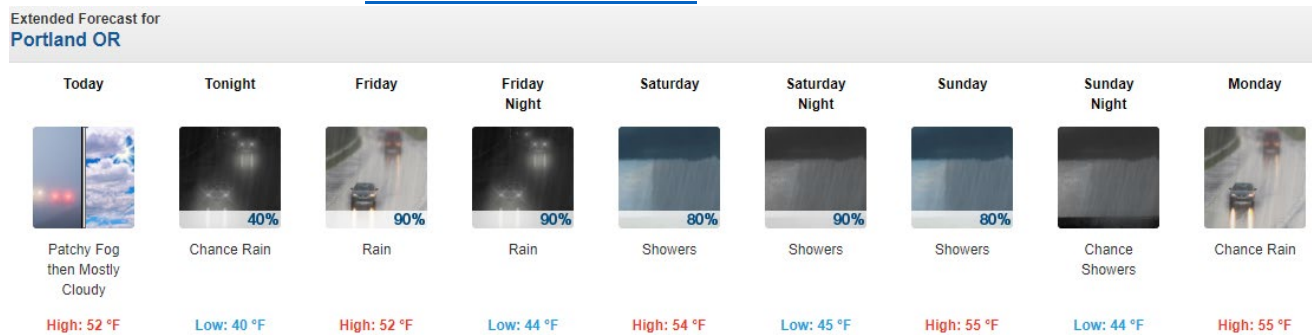

- **Equity Message from Dr. Markisha Smith: [Video update](#) from Director Dr. Smith, Office of Equity and Human Rights on equity efforts embedded in City of Portland's COVID-19 response.**
- **JVIC:** The Joint (City-County) Volunteer Information Center (VIC) is operational. Email account is jvic@portlandoregon.gov. Purpose of the center is to help people volunteer in effective, safe and organized ways, according to identified needs and resources. **The website is live: <https://multco.us/novel-coronavirus-covid-19/donate-volunteer-slow-spread-covid-19> and a call center is planned to be running by 3/30.**
- **Programming Changes impacting Houseless:** Joint Office of Homeless Services is working with community partners to collect and share an updated list of programming changes that affect providers who work with people experiencing homelessness. See [website for updates](#); contact JOHSadmin@multco.us and support@211info.org with program updates. A motel-based respite program is being set up to provide individual rooms for people already in the shelter system who are symptomatic with respiratory illness and can't remain in shelters.
- **City Emergency Funding:** [City Council approved \\$3M in emergency funding](#). Estimated \$2M approved for emergency response and \$1M for small businesses.
- **Residential Rent Relief:** Understand the City of Portland residential [eviction moratorium](#).
- **Commercial Rent Relief:** City Commercial Rent Relief: City of Portland will invite City commercial tenants that have experienced a decline in revenue of 10% or more to apply for a three-month rent deferral. City commercial tenants are being contacted directly.
- **Hand Sanitizer:** City is in the process of receiving a bulk supply of hand sanitizer for *all City staff* (for use in City buildings) through a local distillery. More information about that will be coming directly from your bureau. Please save empty bottles so that they can be refilled.

- **Governor's Executive Order:** The City is assessing any impacts to City operations from the Governor's Executive Order. For the time being, current operations are continuing as before, except that playgrounds, skate parks, and sports courts will be closed. Individual bureaus may announce additional closures in the coming days. The Portland Police Bureau has already issued a [press release](#) about their enforcement, which will emphasize education:
- **Parks Access and Supplies:**
 - **Park road gates will be closed at [10 local parks](#) to help maintain social distancing. Parks remain open for walking, rolling, or strolling.**
 - Parks **installed 1,850 signs at closed** Parks facilities (skateparks, fields, sport courts, etc.).
 - Working to open & maintain all Parks restrooms by March 30 (54 restrooms).
 - **Soap and trash cans have been installed in almost all public restrooms, but theft has become an issue and crews are striving to replenish supplies.**
- **COVID-19 Communication:** **Portland NET volunteers are posting COVID-19 informational poster throughout the community today (3/26), additional posters are planned for printing and distribution.** Essential COVID-19 information posters to be distributed by NET; plan and organization of distribution are in progress. Flyers & posters to be printed for handout at food banks, Trimet, etc. Translation and interpretation of essential COVID messaging is in progress.
- **Portland Police Sunshine Division:** Food box requests up six times over year prior. Financial support needs are urgent. For anyone who is able to help Sunshine Division's crisis response efforts, please text "SUPPORTSUNSHINE" to 44-321, or visit [this link](#) to give today.
- **Crime and Call Trends:**
 - **Domestic violence arrests for 3/12-3/23 were up 27% from previous year (from 30 to 38).**
 - **Suicide threats are up 41% from 2019 and up 23% from ten days prior to the state of emergency.**
- **Customer Service Call Center:** The PWB and BES Customer Service Call Center is open: 503-823-7770 from Monday through Friday, 9am to 4pm. For 24-hour automated service, press 1. Customers may also email PWBCustomerService@portlandoregon.gov . Although the Customer Service Center is closed to walk-in customers at the Interstate location at 664 N. Tillamook St, customers may use the drop box at this location to make payments by check or money order.
- **BDS Permitting:** Bureau of Development Services has limited staff available for permit intake by appointment only (up to two cases per appointment). Appointments consist of plan drop off only, not an in-person meeting with staff. Applicants will drop off a completed application along with all submittal materials during this appointment. Customers needing to schedule an appointment should email BDS@portlandoregon.gov

or call 503-823-7300 and leave a message.

- **SW Boones Ferry Closure:** Beginning March 30th full [road closure](#) for SW Boones Ferry Road between SW Arnold St and SW Comus Ct for up to 7 months.
- **Portland Streetcar:** Service reduced to every 20 minutes on weekdays.
- **Aerial Tram:** PBOT & OHSU have limited Portland Aerial Tram capacity to no more than 10 people at a time in each of the two cabins; access is limited to OHSU ID badges, VA Portland Health Care System employee cards, Shriner's Hospitals for Children – Portland employee cards, Patients of OHSU, VA Portland and Shriner's Hospital.
- **Urgent Street Maintenance:** issues can be called in to (503) 823-1700. The line is staffed 24/7.
- **Child Care:**
 - The State Office of Child Care (OCC) created process for licensed childcare providers, public schools, and employers to launch new, emergency childcare facilities. [Essential workers are prioritized](#) to receive Emergency Child Care.
 - Essential employees from the community can access childcare at the Champions Childcare phone number 1-800-246-2154 (translation available), through 211, and websites listed in the Resources section.
- **Prosper Portland:** is updating business support capabilities, see [here](#) for most updated info and/or sign up on the email newsletter. Prosper adopted [Resolution No.7363](#) to authorize creation of \$2M Portland Small Business Relief Fund.
- Many facilities and events have been closed or cancelled. [The Oregonian is maintaining a regularly updated list.](#)

KEY FACILITY STATUS UPDATES

All City buildings are closed to the public and open to essential employees.

CRITICAL RESOURCES

- **Parks Cleaning Supplies:** Parks is developing a cleaning supply resource plan to forecast resource needs. The current burn rate will result in critically low supplies within the next 14 days. Also working on replenishing stolen supplies of soap and trash cans from opened public bathrooms.
- **ECC Ordering Process:** The ECC has an emergency ordering process in place to help City bureaus acquire COVID-19 related resources, including both staff and materials. To request resources, complete and fill out a Resource Request Form (213RR) in Microsoft Excel. Email the completed form to ECCLogistics@portlandoregon.gov.

CITY STAFF RESOURCES AND REMINDERS

- **City Staff Volunteering at Shelters:** All regular and limited duration City employees, both represented and non-represented, are [urged to apply](#) for shelter volunteering. Assignments anticipated to last 30 days. Staff will be able to maintain their current rate of pay and status during volunteer periods.
- **Union Letter of Agreement:** On 3/25, the City authorized a [Letter of Agreement](#) between the City and City Unions related to Personal Protective Equipment provision, Vacation Caps and COVID-19 Related Leave.
- **Spending Decisions:** Bureau directors and finance managers can and should make spending decisions within their existing resources, as they see fit. If those financial decisions will lead to over-expending the bureau’s current year expense budget, the bureau MUST submit a request through ECC Logistics at ECCLogistics@portlandoregon.gov so that requests can be prioritized and signed off on centrally.
- **Public Meeting Requirements:** Reminder that employees still need to adhere to public meeting requirements if meeting with public advisory boards or committees:

- **External Recruitments:** Bureau of Human Resources has suspended external recruitments.
- **Overtime Clarification for Salaried Workers:** Clarification for salaried workers who are now working more than their normal schedule: staff are being paid for extra hours at *straight* time, not time and a half.
- **BTS HelpDesk: The Comm Center, Customer Service HelpDesk and ECC support are staffed by minimal essential employees only, the remainder are teleworking:**
 - The HelpDesk is **now receiving inbound calls with limited support staff.**
 - **Secure Remote Access Unavailable from 7-8pm Thursday, March 26 (excludes Police)**
 - To request assistance from the HelpDesk, submit your ticket through the [Technology Portal](#) to get the fastest response. You can also email the HelpDesk at btshelpdesk@portlandoregon.gov. Tickets received by email are prioritized after those received from the [Technology Portal](#). Desktop Support activities are being redirected to responding to HelpDesk tickets.
 - Onsite support will only be available to support critical public safety functions. Assistance for all others will be provided remotely as best we can.
 - The [Technology for Telework resource page](#) is being updated frequently.
- **Internet Bandwidth: To maximize City bandwidth capacity, a change will be implemented after regular business hours on 3/26 that will have some impact on Office365 (O365) user connecting to the City network through VPN and to O365 users who have not set up multifactor authentication.** Help preserve the City's internet capacity, which is used by Public Safety bureaus as well as all other City functions. Only log in to Secure Remote Access (to VPN with an RSA Token) when you need to use it and then log back out to free up capacity. [Find out more about logging in and logging out of Secure Remote Access.](#)
- **RSA Tokens and Laptops:** BTS is meeting high priority service requests for Essential Functions
 - Core challenge is RSA token delivery and limited availability of laptops or City managed workstations available for telework
 - BTS is prioritizing distribution in alignment with Mayor Essential Functions and services
 - BTS is communicating with City priority 'operational' bureaus to address remote access requirements
 - BTS Procurement is about six weeks out for new laptop orders.

OPERATIONAL PERIOD COMMAND EMPHASIS (3/20/20 1700 - 3/27/20 1700):

1. Directly protect human life and public health, including the safety and health of City employees.

2. Minimize economic and legal losses to the City.
3. Support the delivery of services that the City and public depends on in an emergency.
4. Minimize non-essential efforts and make wise use of resources in anticipation of a long-duration incident.
5. Uphold confidence in City government and demonstrate a unified City effort in response by following established chains of command and agreed-upon processes for decision-making and communication.
6. Support long-term recovery planning and economic assistance to affected communities by maintaining frequent and open communication between the ECC and Prosper Portland, the Mayor's office, and state and federal agencies working on economic recovery efforts.

ECC OBJECTIVES (3/20/20 1700 - 3/27/20 1700)

1. Maintain and share situational awareness of the City's operational status: track bureau operations and COOP status, bureau response actions, constrained resources, and daily sick absenteeism at a bureau level. Issue a citywide Situation Status Report COB every Tuesday and Thursday. (Planning – Situation Unit)
2. Ensure there is a full ECC staff roster for the next day by the end of each day and an 80% complete staffing schedule for each week on Monday. Issue a daily org chart and comms list. Issue a new ECC Action Plan weekly on Friday. (Planning – Resource Unit)
3. Keep ECC clean and safe by keeping sufficient cleaning supplies available (Logistics) and ensuring all ECC responders follow established safety protocols. (Safety)
4. Track incident costs, budget for forecasted costs, provide expense and time tracking guidelines; track expenditures and cost projections daily. (Finance)
5. Provide accurate and frequent internal and external communications that is accessible in all preferred formats. Respond to media inquiries. Hold press conferences with interpretation. Create elected official talking points. Maintain City coronavirus website. Release a Citywide email daily. Manage and respond timely to questions from employees and the public. (JIC)
6. Open a shelter staffed with City of Portland employees at the East Portland Community Center by 3/27/2020 and support the Parks Incident Command Post to relocate if necessary. (Shelter Task Force)
7. Ensure all essential employees who cannot work from home have a safe, accessible, and functional workspace. Meet established recovery time objectives for Citywide essential functions. (Coordination - COOP strike team).
8. Translate COVID-19 safety poster into at least 20 additional languages and distribute broadly virtually and 5,000 in the community by 3/27/2020. (Coordination - Poster Strike Team)
9. Establish a Joint City-County Volunteer Information Center (VIC), provide contact information to others, and begin matching offers of assistance and requests for assistance by 3/27/2020. (VIC)

10. Support the state efforts to meet childcare needs for essential workers. Anticipating that the State may not be able to meet all City needs, develop a plan to ensure childcare for 50 children of City essential workers by 3/30/2020. (Coordination - Childcare Strike Team)
