



### 3. Good Neighbor Agreement Process

- a. Dan Speicher described the expected outcomes and overall process to build towards a Good Neighbor Agreement with the Site Advisory Group. The Good Neighbor Agreement will reflect input from the community and is intended to document the Water Bureau's commitments to filtration facility neighbors throughout the life of the project.
  - i. Dan described the nature of the Water Bureau's commitment and anticipated ways the agreement will be used throughout the life of the project. He noted the proposed organization and topical focus of the agreement and shared sample language for communications and design-related topics. He also described the timeline for developing draft agreement content and inviting Site Advisor input.
  - ii. Site Advisors were asked to share input on the proposed process and sample language to develop the Good Neighbor Agreement. Discussion included a suggestion to review other agreements, concerns about the filtration facility being a tourist attraction, and interest in continuing to hear more from other Site Advisors.

### 4. Feedback and Comments

- a. Bonita opened up the floor to additional feedback, comments, and discussion from Site Advisors and other guests attending the teleconference.
  - i. Discussion included interest in the location of the facility entries and the type of traffic that would use those routes during construction and operation, considerations for different types of communication with neighbors, and interest in more information about construction and the pipe route decision process and locations.
