Topic or Description Dash cams

How is this impacting your industry? Safety issue. Video evidence of crimes, abuse and damage to make it easier for riders and drivers to substantiate or refute claims.

Reason for consideration or change to the regulations? To make it safer for riders and drivers as a major deterrent for bad behavior

- Proposed solution:
- Safety issue for rider and driver.
 - Dash cam required to be active whenever a rider is in the car.
 - Must provide the video to PBOT, Ombuds, police, ride sharing companies when requested.
 - Legal issue of dash cams
 - Required, not required by PBOT?
 - Ride sharing companies can bulk order them saving drivers money,
 - New drivers could sign an agreement that they will get only 50% of their money until the camera is paid off. Cameras are about \$250 and could be paid off in the first few weeks.
 - Oregon law requires notification of anyone being filmed in a private space.
 - Ride sharing could contract with companies to install cameras if folks want to spend the extra money to keep wires from going anywhere.
 - Leveraging the buying power ride sharing companies is always a good option. Cost to them would be minimal other than additional paperwork for initial set up. Cost for them to "keep their drivers safe" would be will worth the money.
