This activity is designed to be enjoyed by curious learners and creative thinkers.

<p><i>Biodiversity (n):</i> the variety of life in a specific habitat or ecosystem.</p> <p>Is this park biodiverse? How many species can you count? Is this important?</p>	<p>Do trees 'breathe' oxygen like humans do?</p> <p>Investigate areas of the tree you think might be breathing.</p>	<p>Notice how many insects are crawling or flying on a tree. Are they helping or hurting it?</p>
<p>Twitter time!  </p> <p>Listen super closely for 30 seconds. Any birds sound familiar to you? Whistle or hum back their call to them.</p>	<p>Try to find this cone! Its seeds can grow into the State tree of Oregon.</p> 	<p>Notice which trees have leaves that are not green. </p> <p>Are they still producing food for the tree?</p> 
<p>Plant Life Cycle Yoga!</p> <p>Use your whole body to curl up like a seed and sprout your way through the stem, leaf, flower, and fruit life stages!</p>	<p>Artist in Residence:</p> <p>Bring one plant part home with you to sketch as accurately as possible.</p> 	<p>Carefully dissect a seed or cone and imagine what role each of these parts plays in allowing the tree to grow.</p>
