<u>122nd Avenue Plan (6:55-7:40)</u>	6:55
For the last few years PBOT has been working with the community to develop a comprehensive plan for 122 nd Avenue. The goals of the plan are to increase safety for all users of the right of way, improve walking and bicycling access, and support better transit. The plan's recommendations aim to address the high rate of serious injuries and fatalities, increase comfort for those travelling along and across the street; and complement the transformation of the street into a Civic Corridor. PBOT staff will provide an overview of the draft plan and proposed recommendations and highlight some of the already-funded projects. PBOT staff seek feedback from committee members on the draft plan and funded projects along the corridor.
