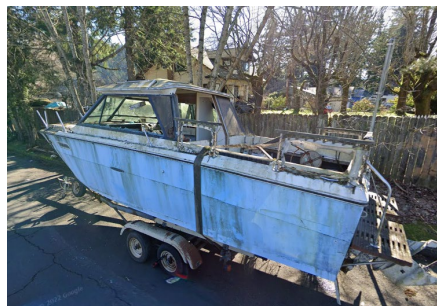
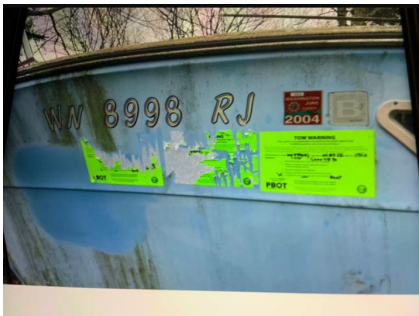

Re.: NOTICE OF SEIZURE OF VESSEL WA WN8998RJ

A boat approximately 23' in length, with registration number WA WN8998RJ was issued a pre-seizure notice by seized by the Portland Bureau of Transportation Parking Enforcement Division (Enforcement Agency) on May 4, 2022 for parking illegally in the public right-of-way, in violation of [Portland City Code 16.20.170](#) at the approximate location of 13600 SE Center ST Portland, OR 97236. In accordance with ORS 830.908 (1), the boat is considered an "Abandoned vessel" left without authorization on public or private land, the waters of this state, or any other water.

The enforcement agency proposes to seize the vessel by reason of being an abandoned vessel, a derelict vessel, or both. To avoid the seizure of this vessel it must be removed by June 6, 2022. If the vessel is seized, the owner will be liable for the costs of salvage, towing and storage of the vessel. The vessel is seized the vessel may be destroyed or sold if the costs of salvage, towing, storage, and disposal are not paid.

An owner of a vessel may request a hearing before an enforcement agency seizes a vessel under ORS 830.908 by submitting a request for hearing to the enforcement agency not more than 10 business days after the notice required by this section is given. The request must indicate if the owner contends that the vessel is not abandoned or derelict or indicate such other specific grounds on which seizure of the vessel is challenged.

You may request an appeal before a Code Hearings Officer under the provisions of Portland City Code Chapter 22.10. To arrange a hearing, you must submit and appeal hearing request online no later than 10 business days after the date of this determination. Your request must include a description of what you believe makes this determination invalid along with copies of any evidence you wish to submit. You may file your appeal at the address below:
