6:40-7:15 – Fixing Our Streets (35 min)

In May 2016, Portland voters approved a new \$0.10 per gallon fuel tax for repairing streets. This was the first local funding source in the city's history dedicated to the city's transportation system. In May 2020, Portlanders resoundingly approved a four-year renewal of Fixing Our Streets. Building on the demonstrated success of the original Fixing Our Streets program, the program's renewal is providing approximately \$74.5 million in street repair and traffic safety projects and services. [The list of projects and services](#) includes \$25 million dedicated to paving, \$5 million for new traffic signals, \$4.5 million for sidewalks, and \$4.5 million for street lighting, and millions more for better and safer access to schools, transit, and community services for Portland's kids, seniors, and families.

PBOT Project Manager Nicole Peirce will brief the PAC on the Fixing Our Streets program and projects, describe how these projects were selected, and provide a preview of the pedestrian-related projects the PAC can look forward to seeing at future meetings.

The 2040 Portland Freight Plan (2040Freight) is about planning how to move goods through the city while meeting our goals for a safe multimodal system that supports economic prosperity, human and environmental health, equity, and resilience. Project manager, Francesca Jones, will ask the committee for their feedback about which goal areas are the most important and why -especially from the perspective of pedestrians and freight. Feedback will help shape the plan's strategies and actions as well as prioritization of infrastructure needs.
