

IMPORTANT NOTICE
PARKING PERMIT GUIDELINES BEGINNING IN MAY 2022

The Central Eastside Industrial Council has recommended to the Portland Bureau of Transportation no changes to the on-street permit parking system in 2022-23.

The permit system guidelines for the Central Eastside Industrial District are outlined below and will start with the next permit renewal in **May 2022**. If you have questions about these guidelines, please contact programs@ceic.cc

Historically Pre-Qualified

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Zone N permits not renewed during the 2020-2021 or 2021 - 2022 permit year will be eligible for renewal the following year.
- Zone N permit eligibility in permit year 2022-2023 will be based on permits issued in 2019-2020.
- Zone N and Zone G permits may be used to park in either permit zone area.

Nontransferable

- Zone N and G permits will remain nontransferable from one permit holder to another. Since the permit is issued to the tenants and not the building owner, the sale of a building will not impact the building tenant from receiving their Zone N historically pre-qualified permits as long as the tenant remains at the same address.
- Permits are transferrable between employees of the same business.

Continue Attrition

- As permit stalls are replaced with time stay or meters following best practices for managing the permit system both Zone N and G permit areas will experience attrition. PBOT will conduct occupancy counts of the on-street system and determine blocks that will shift from permit to time stay or meters. Although no sunset date has been set for either zone, it is anticipated there will be substantially reduced parking available for permits over the next five years.
- The TPAC, PBOT, and CEIC will review the permit system annually to determine what actions will be necessary to address parking needs district-wide including sun setting the permit system. This year, there will be increased enforcement to ensure more stalls are available.

Reduced permit availability

- Both Zone G and N will limit permits to 70% FTE in 2022. Future permits issuance may be reduced based on data and best practices for managing the area.
- Similar reductions may apply to residents if future code allows for this.

Guest permits

- Annual guest permits will no longer be available in Zone G and N.
- Businesses and residents may apply for up to 10 books of daily guest permits with a maximum of 10 books per permit year per address.

Permit fee

- Based on public feedback and in light of the impacts from COVID-19, the annual permit fee will remain \$370 for 2022-2023.
