Sub-Committee – Community Engagement Planning

Sub-Committee Purpose and Mandate

This sub-committee is charged with co-creating community education and community engagement events for the full Police Accountability Commission. Engagement will align with the PAC's approved Values and Goals, Agenda and Scope, and Community Engagement Framework, to promote public input into, and co-creation of, a new accountability system and oversight board for PPB.

The engagement events will vary in scope and size, but will generally seek to understand from community:

- Problems/ barriers to police accountability
- Recommendations on rebuilding trust, systems of accountability, and suggestions of promising practices

Sub-committee Membership

- A. Members of the Police Accountability Commission will be comprised of 4-10 voting members of the sub-committee. The Commission may also engage non-Commissioners in the work of the sub-committee.
- B. Commission members may add or remove themselves from membership of the sub-committee by notifying the sub-committee co-chairs, full commission co-chairs, and staff. Membership will be tracked to ensure quorum is met at all meetings.

Term of service

- A. The sub-committee will exist at least through the end of the Fact-Finding Phase (expected to end in July 2022).
- B. The PAC Co-Chairs for future phases of work may renew this sub-committee for that phase of work.
- C. The full commission may extend the sub-committee's work for any duration beyond the end of the Fact-Finding Phase at any time.

Sub-Committee – Research

Sub-Committee Purpose and Mandate

This sub-committee is charged with developing two draft documents to refer to the full Police Accountability Commission for full commission approval at the end of the Fact-Finding phase of work (expected to end in July 2022):

- Areas of Agreement on best practices from other jurisdictions
- Areas of Agreement on suggestions to consider from outside experts, academic research, etc.

The sub-committee may develop these draft documents through a combination of methods including full sub-committee discussion, drafting groups, and more, before referring them to the full commission in line with the PAC workplan for the Fact-Finding Phase.

Sub-committee Membership

- A. Members of the Police Accountability Commission will be comprised of 4-10 voting members of the sub-committee. The Commission may also engage non-Commissioners in the work of the sub-committee.
- B. Commission members may add or remove themselves from membership of the sub-committee by notifying the sub-committee co-chairs, full commission co-chairs, and staff. Membership will be tracked to ensure quorum is met at all meetings.

Term of service

- A. The sub-committee will exist through the end of the Fact-Finding Phase (expected to end in July 2022), and may dissolve earlier upon successfully referring the two Areas of Agreements document to the full PAC for consideration.
