No Turn on Red and Pedestrian Head Starts ([website](#))

The project to add "no turn on red" signs and pedestrian head starts to 15 intersections in the Northwest pedestrian district is nearly complete. All signs have been installed. All accessible pedestrian signals (APS push buttons) have been installed. All but two of the signal controllers have been updated. The final two controllers have been tested and are due to be installed and programmed at 23rd Avenue & Lovejoy and 23rd Avenue & Northrup with pedestrian head starts within the next three weeks.

Answers to Committee Questions

How many parking stalls are on a typical block face in NW?

On average, there are about **6 parking stalls on a short north/south block face** and about **16 spaces on an average long east/west block face**. Types of areas excluded from the calculation include all forms of no parking (no parking any time, fire hydrants, bike corrals, driveways, etc.), stall types where the general public cannot park (taxi, carshare, etc.), and areas designated as truck loading all hours all days.
