Annual Business Permits Change

PBOT is in the process of moving to a rolling annual permit cycle for business permits, like the resident permits. Currently, annual business permits are on a fixed cycle beginning on Sept. 1 with a fixed expiration date of Aug. 31. Once the business permits are transitioned to a rolling year cycle, business permits will expire one year after the date of purchase.

Starting March 1, Zone M business customers will apply for zone parking permits on a rolling permit cycle. The Parking Permits team will send communications to current Zone M business customers. If you have questions about this change, please email PBOTParkingPermits@portlandoregon.gov.

The design has been finalized and essentially is unchanged from the original scope. The project is the solicitation process and construction should start in late spring and take no more than a year. A construction schedule will be shared once a contractor has been selected.

The committee was concerned about a potential left turn prohibition for cars traveling westbound on W Burnside onto SW St. Clair; however, this left turn will still be allowed.
