Annual Business Permits Change

PBOT is in the process of moving to a rolling annual permit cycle for business permits, like the resident permits. Currently, annual business permits are on a fixed cycle beginning on Sept. 1 with a fixed expiration date of Aug. 31. Once the business permits are transitioned to a rolling year cycle, business permits will expire one year after the date of purchase.

Starting March 1, Zone M business customers will apply for zone parking permits on a rolling permit cycle. The Parking Permits team will send communications to current Zone M business customers. If you have questions about this change, please email PBOTParkingPermits@portlandoregon.gov.
