Re: Intersection Improvement Project, NW 24th Avenue and NW Vaughn Street

Dear NW Neighbor,

I am writing to notify you of an upcoming change to the intersection of NW 24th Avenue and NW Vaughn Street. The project will improve safety and reduce cut-through traffic on neighborhood streets in the Northwest District, creating a safer, more comfortable connection.

This intersection was identified in the Northwest in Motion plan (portland.gov/NWIM) for safety improvements. The project will make it easier for people on foot and bike to cross NW Vaughn. People driving on NW 24th approaching NW Vaughn will be able to make right turns only at the intersection. People driving on NW Vaughn will be able to make right turns onto to NW 24th. Please see the included image (next page) for an overhead plan view of the changes.

These changes will initially be installed using more temporary materials. PBOT will monitor the impacts and effectiveness before moving to permanent materials. Project evaluation will take place a minimum of six months after construction.

Construction is expected to begin as early as July, 2023 but may begin later in the year based on contractor availability and weather. Learn more at portland.gov/transportation/NW24TH.

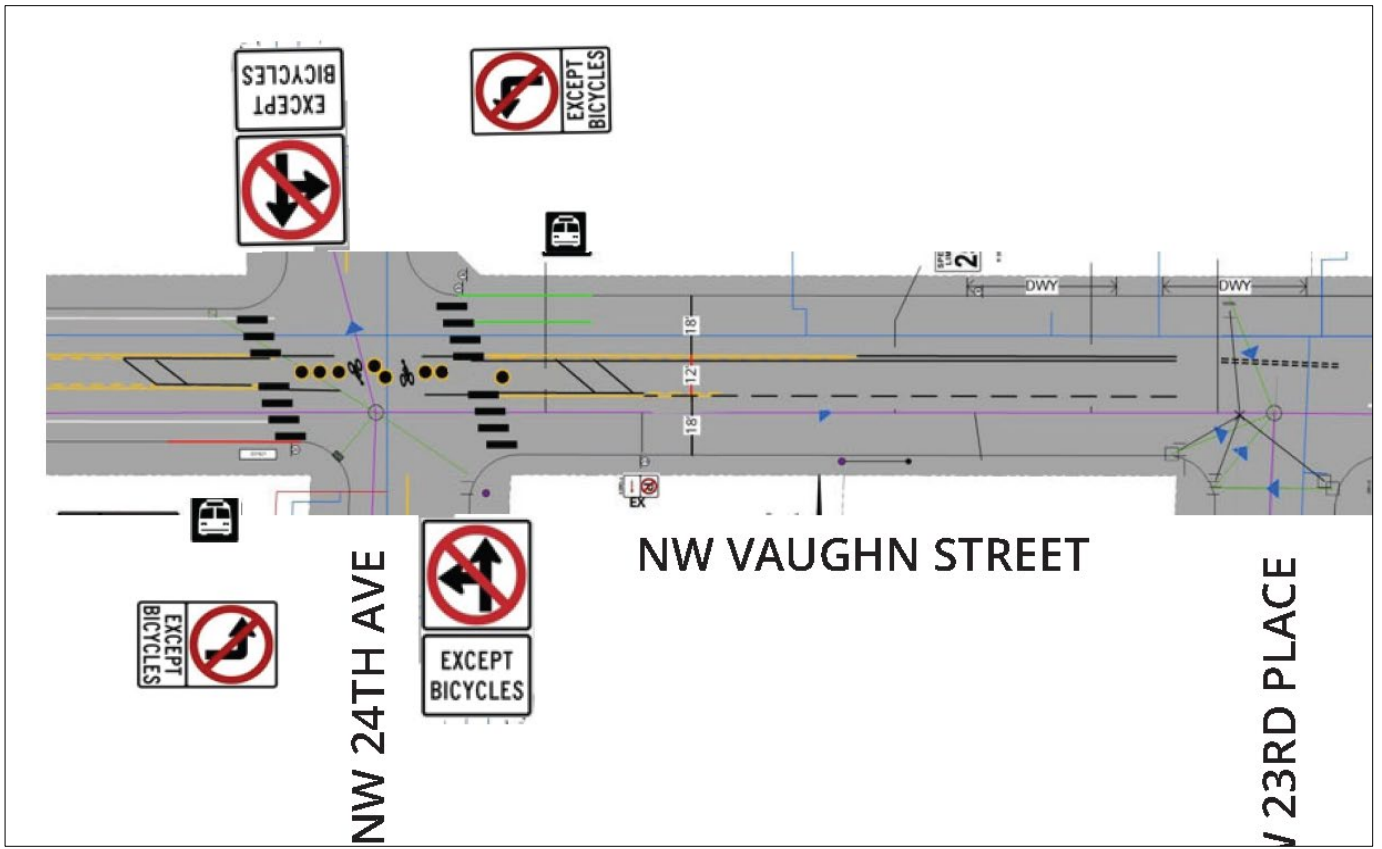
