The 2035 Comprehensive Plan establishes that public rights-of-way provide multiple public services, including multimodal transportation and access, utilities, trees and greening, and community uses. Streets 2035 aims to create a framework that binds the various policies and design requirements related to each of these public services and guide consistent decision-making in both a development context and for capital projects. Matt will provide an update on the Streets 2035 work to date, highlight examples where limited space creates challenges for a variety of right-of-way priorities, and lead a discussion with the PAC around relevant decision-making factors.
