Ashton Simpson, Executive Director and Scott Kocher, Oregon Walks Board Member will present the findings and recommendations of their “Fatal Pedestrian Crash Report,” which reviews police reports and available information for all 48 fatal pedestrian crashes in Portland from 2017-2019. The authors will summarize their most notable findings relating to infrastructure, other systemic factors, equity and the information that the public receives about crashes.
