


### **Project Overview**

- Project funding from Fixing Our Streets gas tax to repave NE Killingsworth St from 53<sup>rd</sup> Ave to Cully Blvd.
- Repaving treatment will be micro-surfacing, which seals the roadway and extends the life of the pavement.
- The project includes ADA curb ramp upgrades and restriping.
- Opportunity to change the cross-section and improve safety along the corridor. Parkingprotected bike lanes are proposed for the street.
- Additional Fixing Our Streets funding will be allocated to pay for added costs of parking-protected bike lane including, extra striping, delineator posts, and parking signs.






#### **Existing Cross-section**






#### **Proposed Cross-section**

#### **Elements of Proposed Design Concept**






#### **Proposed Design Concept: 53rd - 57th**






### **Proposed Design Concept: 57th – 60th**



No changes to crossings at traffic signal




#### **Proposed Design Concept: 60<sup>th</sup> – 64th**

### **Parking Impacts**

- Proposed design requires removal of roughly 50% of the on-street parking.
- Parking study in Spring 2022 showed spare parking capacity on all but two blocks along the corridor.
- Post-project, most blocks will still have more capacity than demand, but some sections will likely have demand that exceeds new capacity during peak times:
  - South side from 42nd Avenue to 47th Avenue
  - South side from 48th to 49th Avenue
  - South side from 53rd to 54th Avenue
  - North side from 48th to 55th Avenue
  - North side from 60th to 62nd Avenue
- On these blocks, people may need to park in adjacent areas and walk further to their destinations.



#### **Public Involvement**

- Public survey period from September 1 October 15
  - Website and survey available in English and Spanish
  - Postcards went out to all Cully residents around Killingsworth
  - Results show strong public support for parking-protected bike lane proposal
- Contracting with Living Cully to conduct two meetings
  - One meeting is with Cully residents **today's meeting!**
  - One meeting is with Cully community-based organizations



- Project staff will recommend a decision to PBOT leadership on project scope in December 2022 and the project will move into design shortly after for construction in 2024.
- A separate public process will be conducted in 2023 for another Fixing Our Streets repaying project on NE Killingsworth St from Cully Blvd to Lombard St.
