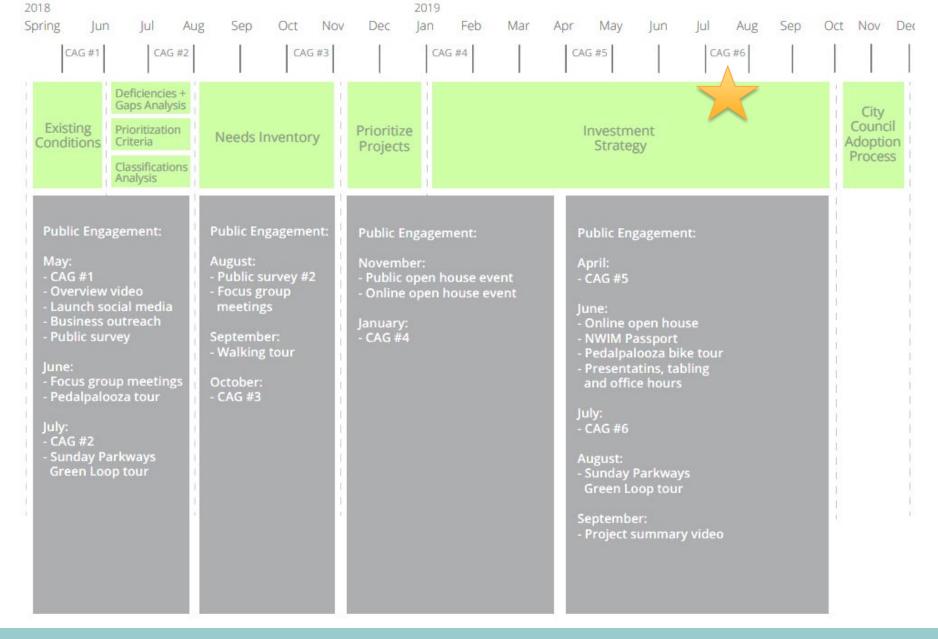

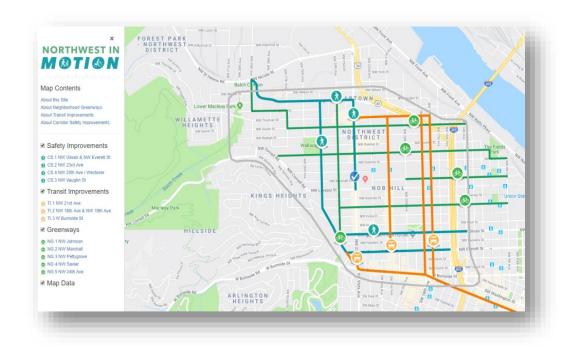

Public Involvement Update

Overarching Key Themes:

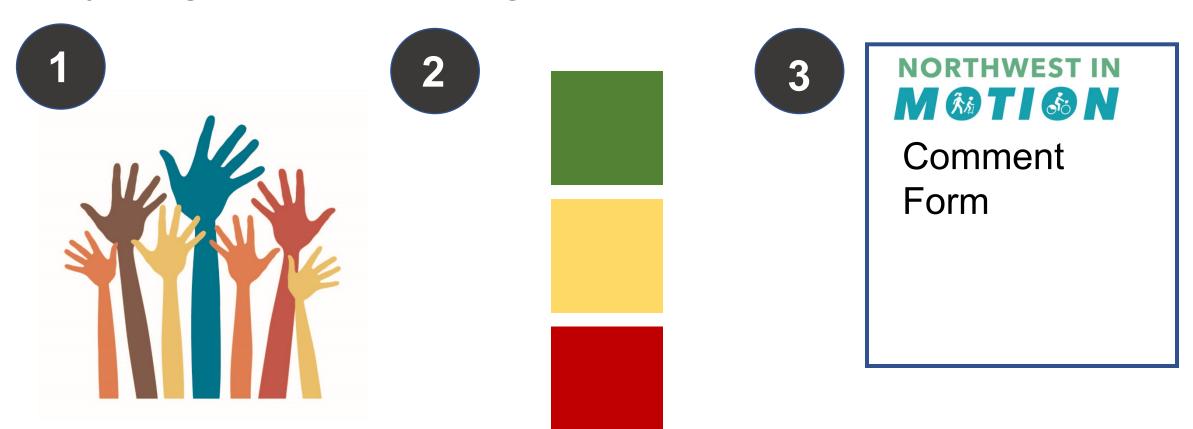
- Lots of overall support, with MANY ideas for adjustments
- Most agree that it does not feel safe riding a bike on existing NW streets
- There is a lot of demand for improved pedestrian crossings
- Bus stops feel hidden
- Many concerns that diverters will add to already congested streets
- Some concerns about how projects will affect business access
- Mixed feelings: Some would like to the plan to go further and others are worried about making it harder for drivers





NWIM Draft Projects

Ways to give feedback tonight:





STEP #1

Reinforce existing edges. I-405, NW Cornell, & NW Vaughn street define the edges of Northwest. These natural edges can be strengtened to redirect through traffic to collectors and traffic calm the neighborhood as a whole.

Measure traffic volumes & speeds.

Engage with neighborhoods as additional traffic diverters are planned in order to meet neighborhood greenway standards.

STEP #2

Strategically consider additional traffic pattern changes. The initial round of traffic diverters are designed to reduce regional trips on Northwest streets. However, additional diverters may be required to meet greenway standards. Locations for additional diverters are identified for each of the five Tier 1 Neighborhood Greenway projects.

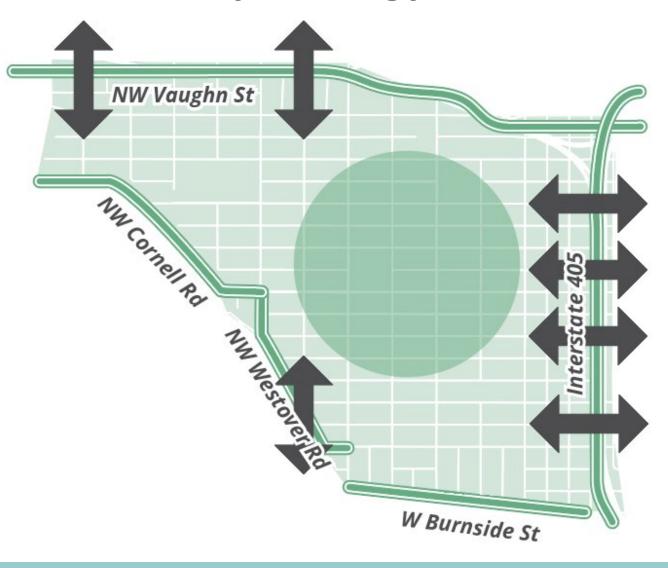

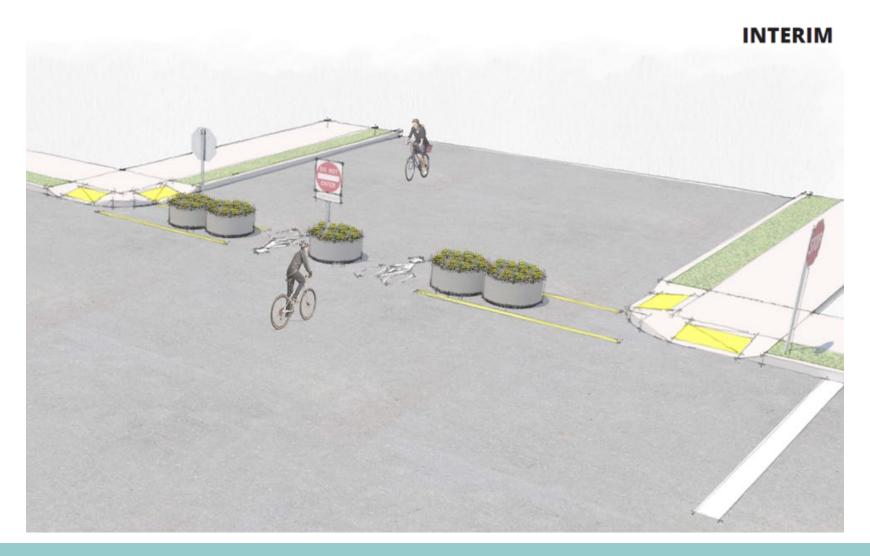






















Scooter and bike parking hubs at the intersection of NW 21st Ave and NW 23rd Ave

Between NW 17th Ave and NW 18th Ave, eastbound vehicle movements are restricted, while allowing bikes to travel in both directions. Alternating one-way streets with contraflow bike lane between NW 11th Ave and NW 18th Ave (see detail on next page).



Potential Updates



Monitor traffic volumes and speeds on Kearney and mitigate if necessary (marked crosswalks, speed bumps, diversion, etc)









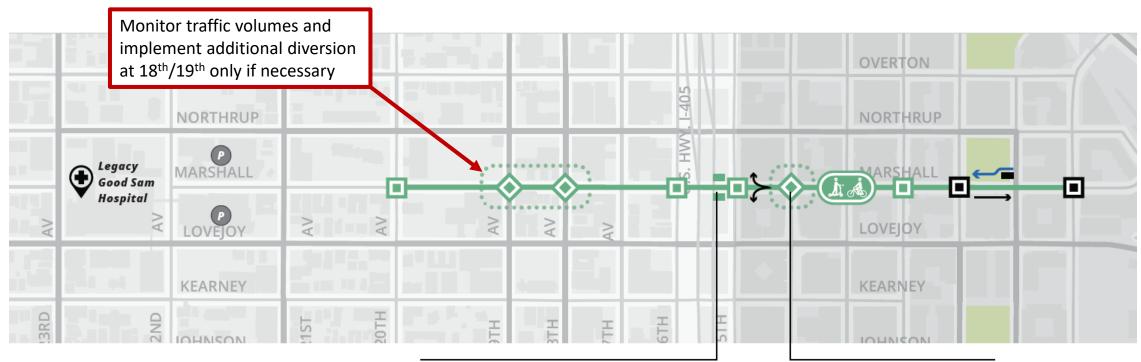

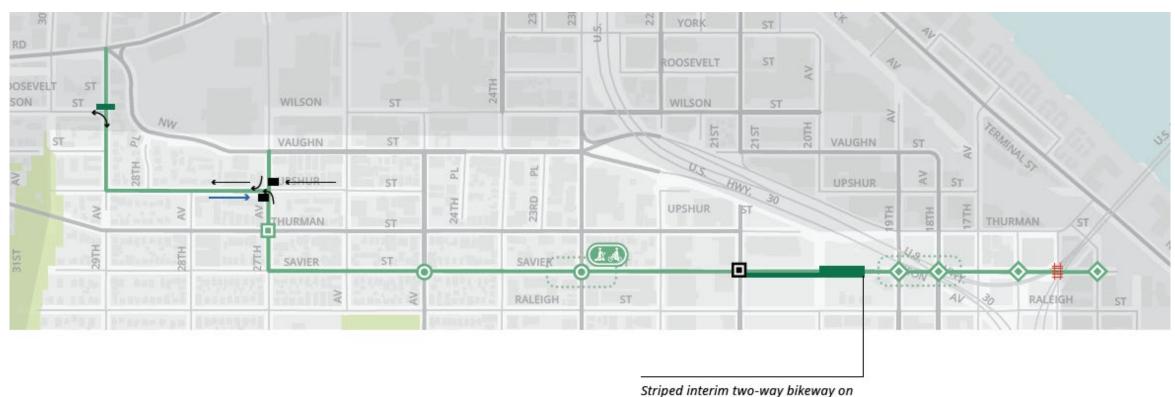

Savier Neighborhood Greenway Phasing





















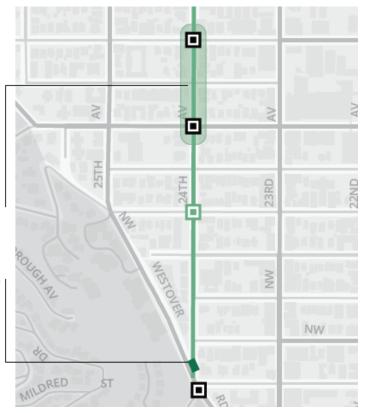


A proposed traffic diverter and crossing improvement limits access to NW 24th Ave from NW Vaughn.



Traffic diversion is required on NW
24th Ave north of NW Lovejoy St
to meet Neighborhood Greenway
standards. Two alternative strategies
are detailed on the next page.

Full closure of NW 24th Ave at NW Westover Rd / Flanders St preserves local access and creates a low-stress connection between two great bikeways.

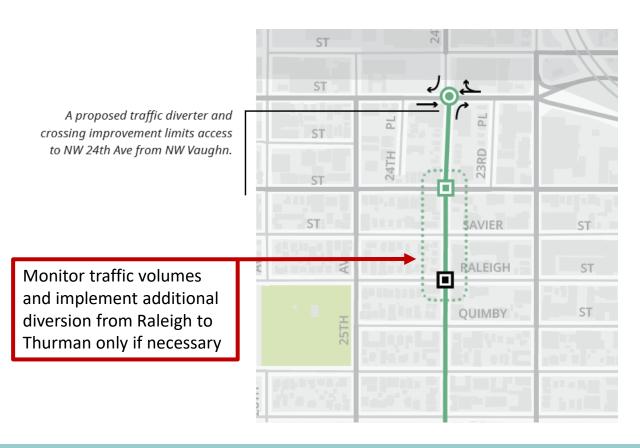

Monitor traffic volumes and implement additional diversion around Lovejoy only if necessary

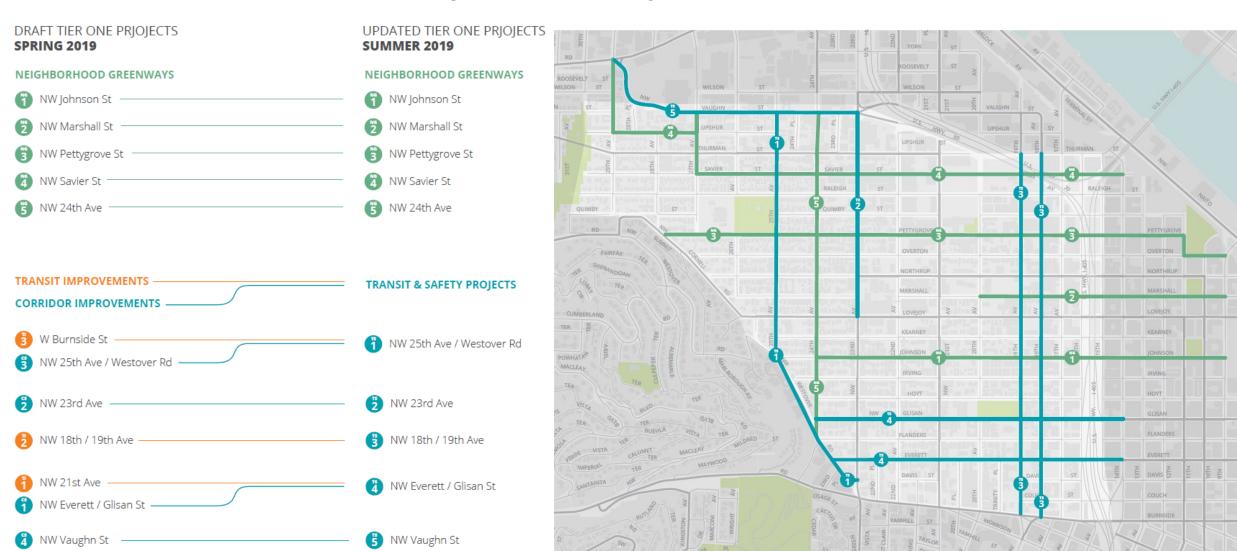

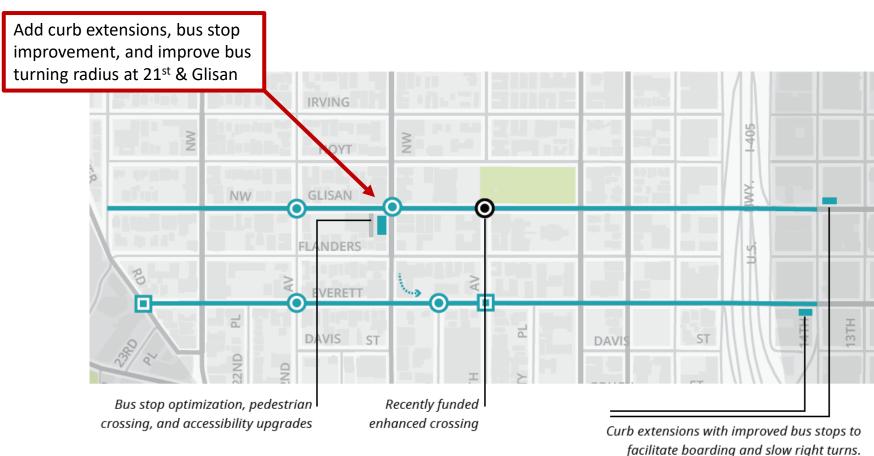
Curb extensions with improved bus stops to facilitate boarding and slow right turns.





Potential Updates







CS.1 NW Glisan / Everett St

- Measure current bike volumes on NW Everett St to establish a baseline for future comparison.
- 2 Establish objective measurements with clear thresholds for bike volumes to support a decision whether bike lane should remain.
- Fully implement neighborhood greenway on NW Flanders St.
- Measure bike volumes on NW Everett St after an agreed upon period of time.

* If bike volumes do not meet thresholds.

Engage the public and determine new cross section on NW Everett St. Use of the space could be repurposed for:

- 1) on-street parking
- 2) transit priority lanes
- 3) shared turn and bike lane
- 4) vehicle travel lanes*

^{*} if vehicle travel lanes are chosen, improved pedestrian crossings will be required to ensure safety and access of people walking is not compromised.

Multimodal evaluation needed to inform any future redesign of Everett St after Flanders Bikeway implementation

Potential Updates



- Establish a baseline of comparison, by measuring current traffic conditions on NW Everett, including:
 - Vehicle Traffic Volumes
 - Transit Ridership & Delay
 - Bicycle & E-Scooter Volumes
 - Safety & Crash Data
- Fully implement planned neighborhood greenway on NW Flanders & pedestrian crossing improvements on NW Everett & Glisan St.
- Wait for one year to allow traffic behavior to adjust to new conditions.
- Measure and re-assess traffic conditions for all metrics listed in 'step 1'.

If new traffic measurements indicate major changes in travel behavior or significant increases in delay for any given mode, a new cross-section should be considered.

Engage the public and determine a new cross section for NW Everett St. A decision to repurpose space on this busy corridor should be based in observable data, adopted policy, and reflect the demands placed on the street by all roadway users.





Curb extensions shorten the distance for people crossing busy streets.



Pedestrian scale lighting will be added at **all** new crosswalks that include civil improvements (curb extensions, refuge islands, etc) and do not meet lighting guidelines

Pedestrian scale lighting at marked crosswalk help improve visibility.

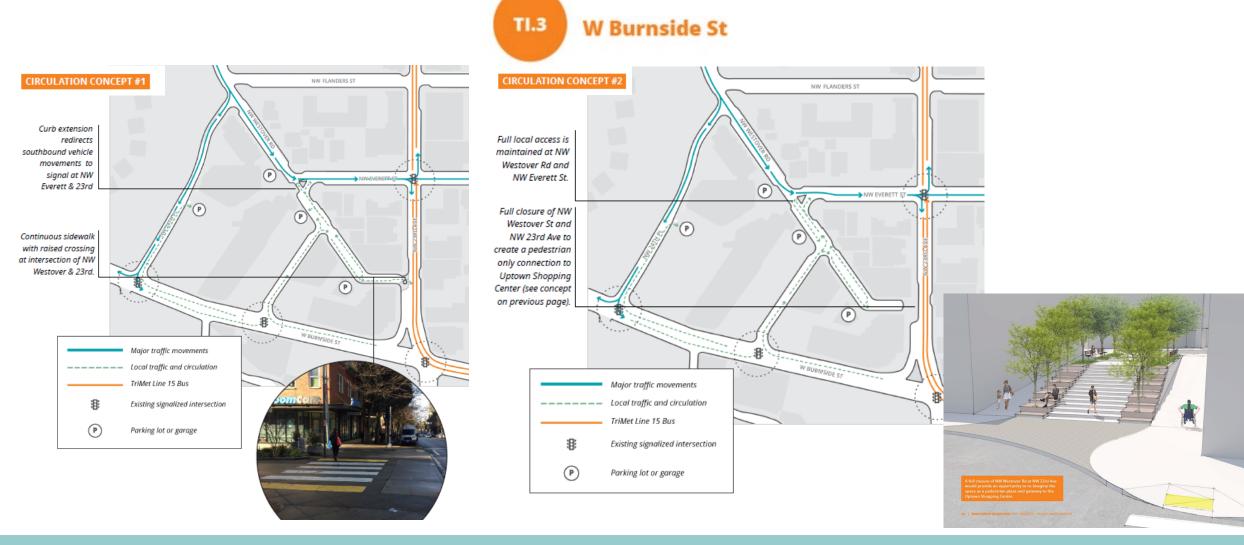

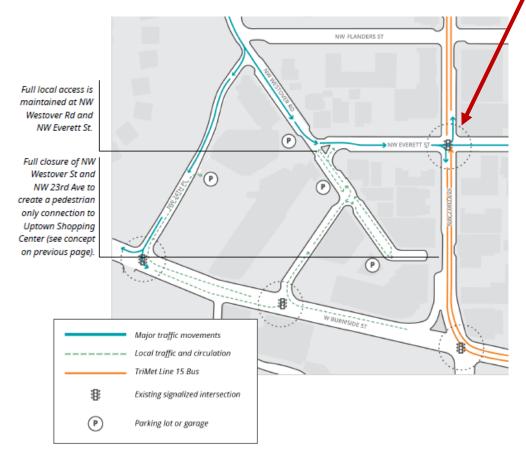
Move forward with full closure of Westover at 23rd on an interim basis, measure impacts, and adjust if necessary before deciding whether to make permanent

Add right-turn pocket on Everett St approaching 23rd Ave to handle additional traffic from Westover Rd









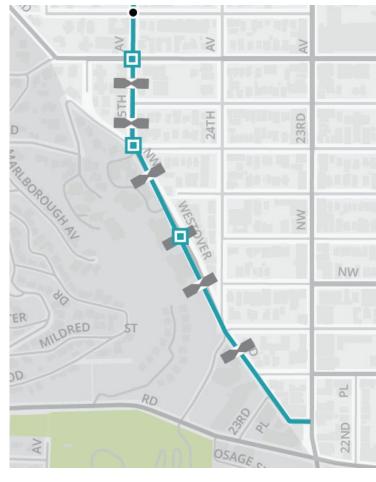

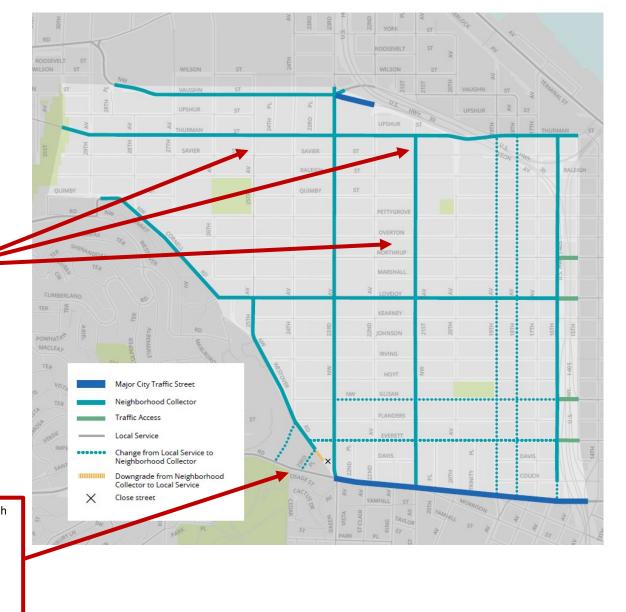




Potential Street Classification Updates

Retain the Local Service Traffic Classifications on 25th Ave, Northrup St, and Raleigh St

Upgrade 23rd Place and 24th Place to Neighborhood Collector, and downgrade Westover Rd approaching 23rd Ave to Local Service



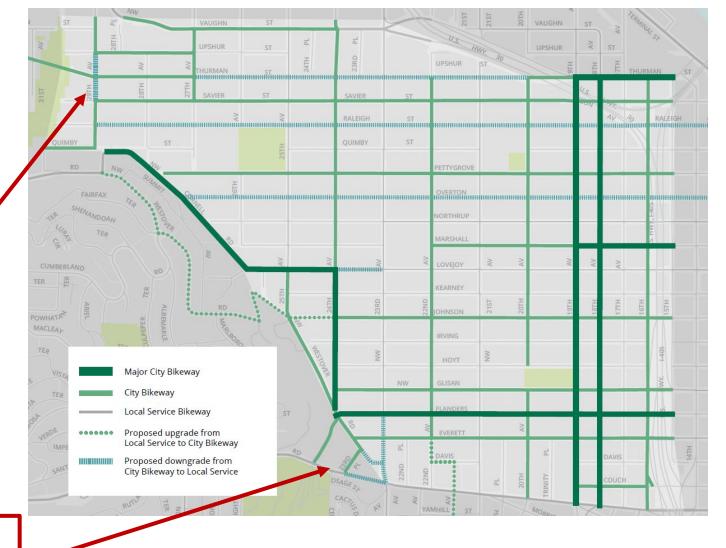




Potential Street Classification Updates

Adjust City Bikeway network to account for steep grade along 29th Ave and need for access to Forest Park via Thurman St Bridge

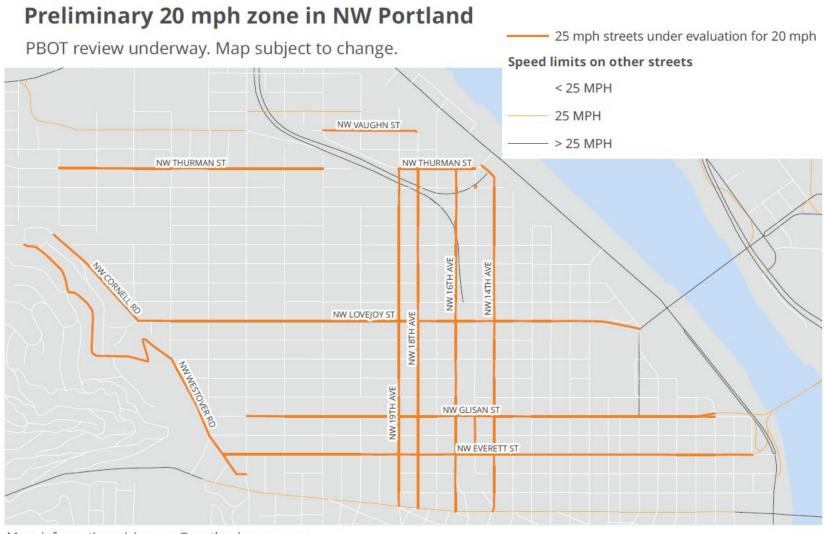
Adjust City Bikeway network to emphasize 23rd Place and 24th Place as main connections to/from W Burnside and Washington Park







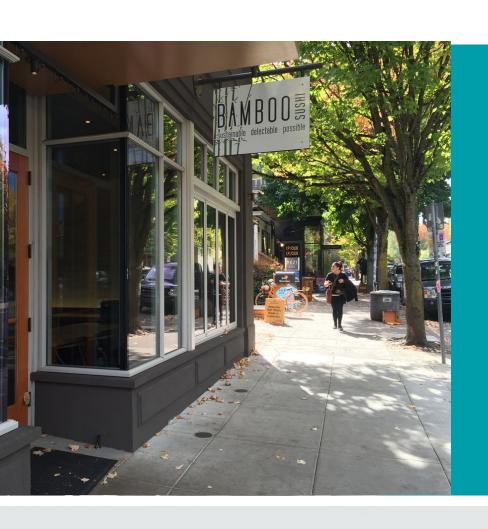

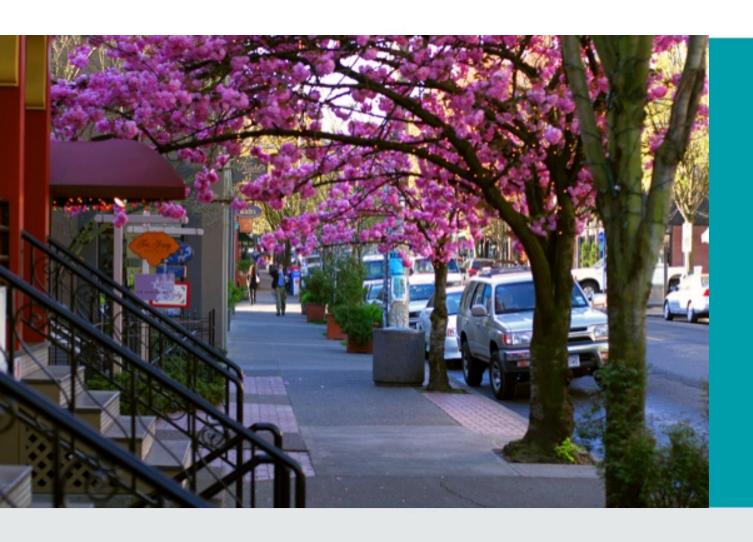






Next Steps
