# ZERO-EMISSION DELIVERY ZONE PILOT PROJECT

This loading zone is part of PBOT's temporary, 6-month demonstration project.

Starting September 19, 2024, five existing truck loading zones (*out of 532 loading zones downtown*) will be temporarily reprioritized for zero-emission commercial vehicle access only.

## Why is PBOT testing a Zero-Emission Delivery Zone?



75% of loading zones in the project area are used improperly.



Transportation causes >40% of greenhouse gas emissions in Portland.



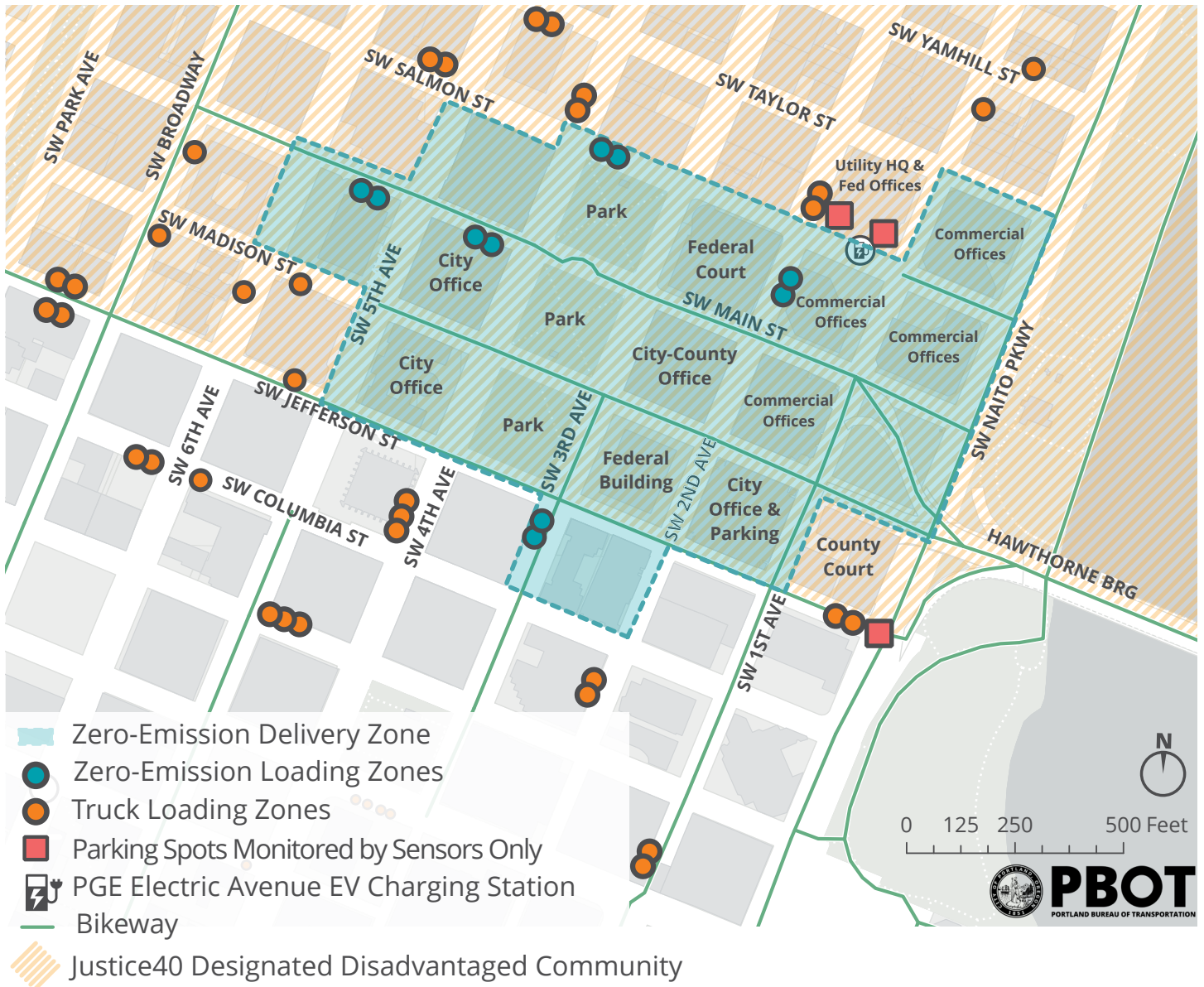
Over 92% of downtown urban deliveries are made in vehicles types that can be electrified.



Nearly 40% of Portlanders of Color live close to the city's biggest sources of air pollution.



PBOT's 2040 Freight Plan identified strategies to promote sustainable delivery as a key action item.
