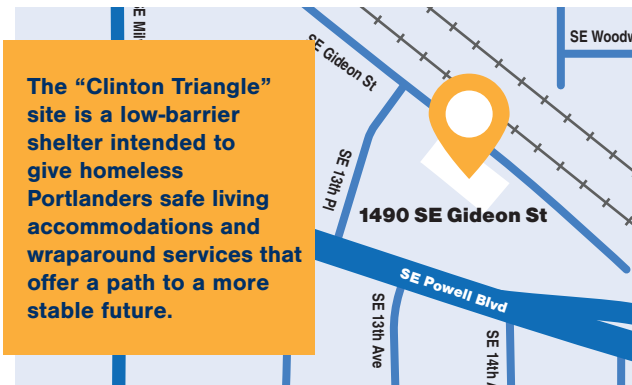

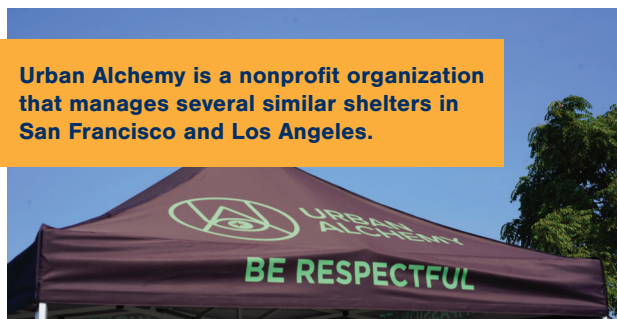
Alternative Shelters are one element of the Mayor Ted Wheeler’s plan to address the homeless crisis in the City of Portland.



THE SHELTER:

- Clinton Triangle is located between SE Gideon Street, SE 13th Place, and Powell Boulevard.
- The site is managed and operated by non-profit organization Urban Alchemy. Learn more about their mission online: urban-alchemy.us
- Urban Alchemy is a 24/7 operation with 1 staff member for every 15 guests.
- 140 locally made “tiny home” pods offer up to 180 unsheltered Portlanders a safe space with a bed, linens, and hygiene products.
- The site is for adults (age 18+); couples are allowed, and some will share pods. Pets are also welcome.
- City, county, and non-profit outreach workers provide referrals to the site to people experiencing houselessness across Portland. The shelter does not accept walk-in guests.
- Guests have access to on-site showers, bathrooms, laundry, storage, Wi-Fi and at least one meal per day.

- Guests are connected with social services, medical professionals, and housing navigators. They are also be encouraged to attend daily support groups and activities such as gardening.
- There are no strict requirements for how long guests can remain at the location, though the intention is for individuals to use the site temporarily before transitioning to other housing or care.
- There is no strict site curfew. Weapons and open drug use at the site are not allowed. Guests are required to check in and out of the location every time they enter and exit.



SUPPORT FOR THE NEIGHBORHOOD:

- Over three months and 10+ meetings, the City engaged with your neighborhood associations to establish a Good Neighbor Agreement which, in part, commits to requiring Urban Alchemy staff monitor a 1,000 foot perimeter surrounding Clinton Triangle.
- Unsanctioned camping is prohibited inside the 1,000 feet perimeter.
- Urban Alchemy staff have a daily and nightly presence in the surrounding area during their walking rounds (you may have already noticed the folks in black and green t-shirts). It’s their job to engage with unsheltered individuals throughout the neighborhoods, including on safe route to school paths.



WHAT’S NEXT?

- The City intends to build up to five additional alternative shelter sites that can host up to 200 individuals each in other areas across the City.
- The Mayor’s Office staff will continue to meet with nearby Neighborhood Associations to monitor the progress and impact of the Clinton Triangle site.
- Other elements of Mayor Wheeler’s plan includes incentivizing 20,000 units of affordable housing, promoting employment programs for homeless individuals, and fostering legal diversion programs for people experiencing homelessness.
